His daughters Wind Chill and Oriental Oak ran 1-2 in the Gr2 Wilgerbosdrift SA Oaks, while Al Sahem became Silvano's 20th individual Gr1 winner when winning the SA Derby. Silvano's son Janoobi won the Gr2 Daisy Guineas on Sunday to become a dual Guineas winner. To crown it all, Marinaresco became Silvano's fourth graded winner on the weekend when winning Sunday's Gr2 Drill Hall Stakes.

On Champions Day, the Scott Bros bred Talktothestars ran a storming second to Rafeef in the Gr1 Computaform Sprint. Earlier their top stallion Mogok's progressive son Pagoda ran a cracking second in the Gr1 SA Derby.

Jockey Fortune signed an Admission of Guilt and was fined R2000. When assessing the penalty, the Board took into consideration that

Jockey Fortune used his crop in the back hand position, however he struck this filly nine times on consecutive strides.

At Turffontein on 27 April, S'manga Khumalo was charged with a contravention of Rule 58.10.2 in that he used his crop with excessive frequency whilst riding the horse Purple Diamond. He was fined R4000.

At Turffontein on 1 May, Anton Marcus was charged with a contravention of Rule 58.10.2 in that he struck Walker on its head in the concluding stages of the race. Jockey Marcus signed an Admission of Guilt and was fined R5000. When deciding on this penalty, the Board took into consideration that this was accidental and that there was no intent involved.



Galileo (Sadler's Wells) sired a stakes double on Sunday, taking his total number of stakes winners to 237 after the Aidan O'Brientrained Winter (3 f ex Laddies Poker Two by Choisir) won the Gr1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. The result also provided Galileo with his 64th Gr1 winner. Earlier in the afternoon, Mayfair Speculators' Douglas Macarthur (3 c ex Alluring Park by Green Desert) won the Gr3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial Stakes at Leopardstown, becoming his sire's 236th stakes winner. Galileo was also responsible for Saturday's Gr1 2000 Guineas winner Churchill.

Daisy Guineas winner Gr2 Janoobi (Silvano – Shasta Daisy) has booked his ticket to Dubai, according to trainer Mike de Kock. The dual Guineas winner could be lengths better if he just learns to settle.

4yo Gr1 Computaform Sprint winner Rafeef (Redoute's Choice -National Colour) will stay in South Africa to take up stud duties. "He's a man, he's becoming coltish and I don't think it will be long before he goes to stud," predicted Mike de Kock after Champions Day.

news that Saturday's The impressive Gr1 SA Nursery winner Mustaageem (Redoute"s Choice - National Colour) could be winging his way overseas, will be a disappointment for local fans. "It would be great to have Mustaageem as a stallion here one day, we need National Colour's speed, for one, but I have a feeling I will get a call to ship this one out in due course," Mike de Kock said.
