

Scottsville Racecourse in the KwaZulu-Natal capital city of Pietermaritzburg celebrates 55 years of high quality speed racing with four action-packed Gr1 sprints on Saturday 27 May.

Africa's Mecca of sprint racing plays host to the Tsogo Sun Sprint raceday, a festival that attracts the cream of South Africa's equine fast set.

All four Gr1 contests boast a long and illustrious

The Tsogo Sun Sprint, which started life as the Gilbevs Stakes back in 1962, is the oldest of the four races. The first sponsored race in KZN, it was run at the outset for the princely sum of R7000.

The inaugural running of the Gilbeys was won by Mr Chris Saunders' Zealous after a rare tussle with Blithe in the final stages, prevailing by a head. Zealous was bred by the Birch Bros, trained by Fred Rickaby and ridden by Duncan Alexander, A report suggests that "the hero of the race was Inverthorn (9st 3lb) who was only beaten about a length and a half, trying to give the winner two stone."

The Tsogo Sun Gold Medallion had its inaugural running a year later in 1963, as the Smirnoff Plate, when it was won by Mr C.T. Tehini's Ptolemy, trained by L Coetzee and ridden to victory by Bennie Little. Ptolemy proved quite a versatile horse, winning

both the SA and Cape Derby as a 3yo and finishing a close third in the 1964 Rothmans July.

A year later came the Allan Robertson, originally named The Breeders' Champion Fillies Stakes. It was won in the first year by Raymond & Graeme Ellis' Fantastic, trained by Joe Joseph and ridden by Charlie Barends. The stake was a generous R5000 and the SA Racehorse reports that "Certain prominent breeders kindly donated free services to their stallions to be selected by the owner of the winning filly."

Known at times as the City of Pietermaritzburg Fillies Sprint, the SA Fillies Sprint is the youngest of the four Gr1's.

First run as the Scott Bros Fillies Stakes, it was inaugurated in 1971 and won by owner/trainer JV Goss's Swan Song, ridden by Brian Passmore.

Today

The 2017 renewal promises to be one of the greatest ever, with top-class campaigners like Trip To Heaven, Talktothestars, Always In Charge, Attenborough, Barbosa, Lord Balmoral and Moofeed among the 32 entries for the R1 million Tsogo Sun Sprint.

The grand dame of sprinting fillies, Captain Al's good daughter Carry On Alice, is likely to take her place in the final field for the R750 000 SA Fillies Sprint along with The Secret Is Out, Green Pepper, Vision To Kill, Live Life, Exquisite Touch, Real Princess, Joan Ranger and Jo's Bond.

Star fillies and mares Bela-Bela, Just Sensual, Dawn Calling and Sail using the race as part of their SA Champions Season preparation programme.

The 2yo contests are packed with potential future champions with runners like Woljayrine, Sir Frenchie and Varallo, the first three past the post in the Godolphin Barb Stakes matching strides in the R750 000 Tsogo Sun Gold Medallion with Naafer- runner up to the sensational Mustaaqeem in the Gauteng Nursery.

The first four past the post in the Strelitzia, Neptune's Rain, Made In Hollywood, Gold Image and Princess Peach, could renew their battle in the R750 000 Allan Robertson Championship and match their talents with the Pretty Polly Stakes and Gauteng Fillies Nursery winner Princess Peach and the Tony Ruffel Stakes winner Daring Diva.

Supplementary entries close at 11h00 on Friday 19 May. Declarations close at 10h00 on Monday 22 May. Watch this space for the race news and previews!

Who Grabbed The 100-1?

Finding a July winner at 50-1 is a Gr1 moment for any punter. It may well be long after the money was spent, but a decent ante-post strike will surely rank as a favourite punting memory for anybody who has been in this game for longer than five minutes.

Ante-post betting is an untapped reservoir of marketing opportunities for the racing gods and while fashion may grab a sector of the market, what better way to create genuine interest from early on as horses progress and prices fluctuate?

What makes a bet 'Ante Post' is that there is no refund if the horse does

not run.

In the normal course of events, bets are placed after the field is confirmed and should your horse be a non-runner for any reason, a deduction is claimed from the winner to refund your bet.

With 47 entrants in the 2017 Gr1 Vodacom Durban July basket, there has been some support for Drill Hall Stakes winner Marinaresco to favourite at 6/1. The recent SA Derby winner Al Sahem has come in at 8/1 with a guaranteed place.

What about taking a position on Hat Puntano – he may be value at 20/1 even though expressly left out of the big-race log pending runs which show his well-being and stamina beyond 1600m.

The 3yo's Africa Rising and Copper Force come into the betting at 25/1 and there is some interest in Justin Snaith's Krambambul from 100/1 into 25/1.

The balance of the chief protagonists have all drifted out.

Rain Disrupts KZN Racing

More than 200mm has fallen over Greyville since last Friday and with Wednesday being the first day of sunshine, a decision regarding the Betting World 1900 race meeting will be made closer to the time.

The Greyvile turf track will need ideal weather conditions for it to dry sufficiently.

The wet weather has disrupted the preparation of horses in the province and the race meeting scheduled for Scottsville on Wednesday 17 May was moved to Saturday 20 May 2017.

A track inspection was carried out on Tuesday morning by the Track Manager and a Trainer from Ashburton and it was agreed that there was no prospect of the race meeting going ahead as planned.

"Fortunately Turffontein is a standalone meeting on Saturday and hence, with the blessing of Phumelela, we have made the decision to postpone to this date," said Gold Circle Racing Executive Raf Sheik.

"For this reason we have kept Sunday as a Plan B option should the track require more time," added Sheik. "With our major race days on the horizon, we are very mindful that we need to avoid causing excessive damage to the racing surfaces while at the same keeping the disruption to the planned racing programmes to an absolute minimum.

July Breakpoint

Gr2 Betting World 1900 Greyville

It's a likely case of a Vodacom Durban July make or break for at least eleven of the fifteen runners in Friday evening's R500 000 Gr2 Betting World 1900.

This event is one of the big race panel's 'winner gets preferred consideration status' pointers and with relatively little time left to the 1 July goal, the heat will be on.

Despite the important status of the race, it is ironically not a July winner platform in the ordinary course of history. We have to go all the way back to Bold Silvano in 2010 to find a horse that went on to achieve the double.

The 1900 is weighted according to merit rating bands, with the winner limited to a maximum 6

point penalty – unless otherwise requested. There will also be no rating increase for placed horses.

The July log was published last Tuesday and in this line-up, Elusive Silva and It's My Turn, both from the Justin Snaith stable, along with the Geoff Woodruff-trained Master Switch are in the top 20, with another Snaith runner, Prince Of Wales, on the outside looking in for a big race run.

So there is plenty to play for.

Bernard Fayd'herbe has been in a rich vein of form and he rides topweighted It's My Turn.

The lightly raced 2016 Investec Cape Derby winner ran a good third in the Peninsula Handicap but had nothing to offer late in the Met where he ran 5,65 lengths off Whisky Baron.

He is in 18th place on the log and a decent showing here from this class galloper could go some way to cementing his claims after a good fourth in the July last year.

Mike de Kock and Callan Murray team up with Jubilee Line, a 4yo son of Dynasty who has been a touch disappointing recently. He did run a nice race last Thursday at the Vaal when conceding 5kgs and being beaten 1,40 lengths by Amsterdam in an MR 86 Handicap.

That may not be July winning credentials, but the run will have brought him on.

Ten Gun Salute was in desperate need of the run when finishing over 12 lengths behind Marinaresco in the Drill Hall Stakes a fortnight ago.

This will be more his game over the 500m further and vast improve-

ment can be expected from a gelding that was only a few lengths short on some big occasions last season.

Dean Kannemeyer's Mr Winsome won the Listed Michael Roberts Handicap and is one of the most consistent handicappers around.

He is interestingly not a July entry and trainer Kannemeyer told the Sporting Post that the intention was to aim him at the staying features in the season rather. He could be the dark horse and surprise this lot as he comes in fit.

Sean Tarry's Serissa is a hardknocking 7yo stayer who made the pace in this race last year, before fading out.

He could fulfil that role again but seems better over slightly further.

Anton Marcus takes the ride on Summer Cup third-placer Master Switch, who fills 20th position on the July log.

He ran a good race after a 4 month break when looming dangerously and only being run out of it late in the Drum Star Handicap. Expect a big run on Friday.

Joey Ramsden's Macduff has his first run since finishing second last in the Sun Met.

Nicely drawn at 2, he is likely to need the run and looks outgunned here.

Glen Kotzen's Gr3 Chairman's Cup winner Banner Hill won a cracker after a three month break last time over a distance thought to be short of his best.

The son of Tiger Hill stays well and faces his biggest test to date here – but it may be a twisted benefit that his wide draw will add to his test his stamina and he could run on into the place money, if the second- run-after-a-rest syndrome doesn't grab him.

The second of the Woodruff runners, Go Direct is a low-profile progressive 4yo, who shows signs of heading in the right direction.


He meets his stablemate Master Switch on a kg worse terms after getting up late to beat him by a head last time. He also has a wide draw to contend with, but is familiar with Greyville.

The Judpot gelding Rocketball has done very little since his nerve wracking second to Abashiri in the final leg of the SA Triple Crown over a year ago. He looks like an optimistic July entry at this stage.

Prince Of Wales had his first start in KZN when a 2 length third behind stablemate Elusive Silva in the Sledgehammer last time.

He showed up well in the Cape summer and looks a scopy sort who will be out to produce a forward showing and break into the top 20 on the log.

His exciting stablemate Elusive Silva came out after a ten month break following his success in the Winter Derby to

The son of Silvano is highly regarded and well drawn with the services of Anthony Delpech, he must be a serious contender.

Tilbury Fort pulled up lame and making respiratory noises after the SA Classic.

The son of Horse Chestnut managed a decent enough fourth behind Janoobi in the SA Guineas, but worryingly was also reported lame there. He enjoys the best of the draw here and the services of S'manga Khuma-

Gr3 Winter Classic

A disappointingly small field of seven face the starter for the second leg of the Cape Winter Series at Kenilworth on Sunday. Justin Snaith and owner Fred Crabbia will be rubbing their hands in glee as African Night Sky takes his next step to Winter Triple Crown glory.

The Highlands, Part Of Ridgemont, sponsored R250 000 Gr3 Winter Classic looks to be tailormade for the Dynasty gelding African Night Sky who trotted up in the first leg over 200m shorter last month.

Carrying a 1kg penalty for that victory, Bernard Fayd'herbe will be given a similar opportunity to ride a confident waiting race, in a race where pace — or a lack of it- could well play a role.

Being out of a Cozzene mare who won to 2450m, African Night Sky should have no issues with the extra and goes for his fourth career win.

Candice Bass-Robinson's yard has been in a rich vein of feature form and Our Mate Art is the first of their duo.

The son of Artie Schiller tried his heart out but had no answer to African Night Sky's powerful finishing burst in the Winter Guineas and came up 1,25 lengths short.

On paper, his 1kg swing at the weights will certainly level the playing field slightly – but Aldo Domeyer is unlikely to be fit to take the ride.

Elevated has failed to build on his excellent Cape Guineas fourth and has not yet recovered from his possibly ill-conceived tilt at the Investec Cape Derby.

He was reported not striding out when a modest fifth and 4,35 lengths behind African Night Sky and is surely better than that effort.

Power Combo

Andre Nel's Loadshedder has won twice in eight starts and steps up in ground.

The son of Gimmethegreenlight stayed on well for a 3 length third in the Winter Guineas and his 1kg pull will certainly bring him closer to African Night Sky.

This R900 000 sale graduate is yet

to run a bad race in 8 starts and is worth including.

Ollivander has lost form since his nice third behind Horizon in the Gr3 Politician Stakes on L'Ormarins Queen's Plate day.

Well back in his last three starts, he was 9,40 lengths behind African Night Sky in the Guineas and even with a 1kg pull cannot be fancied to reverse the standings.

The Var gelding Verdier never showed in the Winter Guineas when running 5,60 lengths behind African Night Sky.

Being out of a good mare who won up to 2850m, it is possible that he will enjoy the step up in trip but will need to improve many lengths to feature.

It looks to be African Night Sky's race to lose.

Our Mate Art could challenge with the weight advantage and if he enjoys the step-up to the 1800m.

It looks tough for the rest.

Artie Who?

Our Mate Art looks to be the only likely threat to African Night Sky in Sunday's Gr3 Winter Classic.

He is by Artie Schiller, the only Breeders' Cup Champion by sire-of-sires El Prado.

Artie Schiller has already sired Gr1 horses on every surface, along with contenders in four different Breeders' Cup races, and the Kentucky Derby.

A turf specialist himself, Artie Schiller was purchased and raced by William Entenmann of Timber Bay Farm and his daughter Denise Walsh. He was trained by Jimmy Jerkens.

At 2 the colt won two of his five starts and at 3 won five of eight outings, including the Jamaica Handicap in which he set a new Belmont Park course record for 1800m.

At Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, he was sent off as the favourite for the 2004 Breeders' Cup Mile but finished twelfth in the fourteen-horse field.

Artie Schiller had his best earnings year at 4 and his most important career win. After winning the 2005 Maker's Mark Mile Stakes and the Bernard Baruch Handicap, he travelled to Belmont Park where under jockey Garrett Gomez he won the Breeders' Cup Mile.

Artie Schiller was retired from racing in August 2006 and entered stud for the 2007 season at Hurricane Hall in Lexington, Kentucky.

He has produced 34 black-type winners, 63 black-type horses and 14 Graded stakes winners, who have earned \$36 million in the Northern and Southern Hemisphere combined.

He currently stands at WinStar Farm in Versaille, KY, for a fee of \$15 000.

SA Features Downgraded

While breeders use it as their benchmark of excellence, does race grading really make a difference to owners, trainers and punters?

It is understandable that sponsors may aspire to be associated with Gr1 status. By their nature they attract more hype, adspend and attention from the operators, media and uninformed general public.

Who really cares if the Vodacom Durban July is a Gr2 and why should the Sansui Summer Cup,

in essence a well-heeled local handicap, be a Gr1 race? The downgrading of certain South African feature races has followed a recommendation from the National Horseracing Authority's Graded Races Commit-

tee.

The Graded Races Committee received a letter in late 2015 from the Asian Pattern Committee expressing concern that the number of Grade 1 races in South Africa was excessive compared to other countries.

The Asian Pattern Committee suggested that ideally South Africa should have no more than 25 Gr1 races and it was against this background that the Graded Races Committee agreed to aggressively review all of South Africa's Gr1 races over the next few years.

In 2011 South Africa agreed to comply with the Ground Rules of the Asian Pattern Committee. In terms of the Ground Rules all races must justify their grading by the quality of its runners. The quality of the field is assessed primarily by the annual race ratings of the first four placed horses over a three year period.

The following races were downgraded to Gr3 status this season:

The Debutante, Gold Bowl, Gold Cup, Umkhomazi Stakes and the Victory Moon Stakes.

The following races were downgraded to Listed status this season:

Algoa Cup, Champion Juvenile Cup, Christmas Handicap, Eastern Cape Derby, Jacaranda Handicap, Kenilworth Fillies Nursery, The Langerman, Racing Association Handicap and the Acacia Handicap.

For the record, the present Graded Races Committee under the Chairmanship of Ken Truter, comprises Lyndon Barends, Arnold Hyde, Roger Smith, Vidrik Thurling, Clyde Basel, Jay Harrielall, Graeme Hawkins, Raf Sheik, Larry Wainstein and Kevin Sommerville.

Robin Scott At 82

Old School Scholar

After a half century in the game, one of the icons and great stalwarts of South African horseracing and breeding turns 82 on Saturday.

Champion breeder Robin Scott told the Sporting Post earlier this week that he had 'nothing much planned' for the day.

Asked what his secret to a long and good life was, he said that 'smoking was bad' but that 'if you don't drink you will never get there!'


"I still work and keeping the brain and mind active is very important I believe. I have had my time of celebrating – the 30's,40's, 50's,60's and 70's. Now we just enjoy reaching the next one," he laughed.

In 1967, the dairy farm across from Ivanhoe Stud came up for sale and Robin, along with his brothers Des and Neville established Highdown Stud.

After having boxed at the highest level for 50 long years, he once suggested that breeding racehorses was 'like a pendulum'.

"You do well for a bit and then you don't and then of course, the thing swings back".

The Scott Bros are from Irish stock, with their father hailing from Belfast and their mother also from Northern Ireland.

Sands Of Time

Their story has its roots in the sands of Isipingo beach, where Robin and boyhood friend George Rowles galloped George's father's racehorses across the beach and took part at the local gymkhanas.

At the age of 22, with some financial assistance from his mother, Robin opened the first Scotts Shoe Store at the bottom of Berea Road in Durban.

Brother Des joined in running the retail business which flourished into a national chain comprising 120 shoe and clothing stores, four shoe factories and three clothing factories. Brother Neville was a farmer, who worked for the Oppenheimer's dairy in White River.

Robin and Des had a number of horses in training and the distinctive Scott livery of black, white maltese cross, red sleeves and white cap became a firm fixture in winner's enclosures across the country.

"Devon Air was my favourite horse to race," remembers Robin. "We bought her in the UK, brought her over here and she won three Grade 1 races – the Greyville 1900, the July and the Gold Cup – in three months. The best horses I raced were Jungle Class and Bold West; both were multiple Grade 1 winners trained by Herman Brown."

Another to carry their silks with distinction was Spanish Pool and they had a particularly close and successful association with Terrance Millard, to whom they entrusted the likes of Sunera, Prontisimo and July winning, Devon Air and Ilustrador.

Quality First

The first stallions to stand at Highdown were Kimberly Kid and the imported Ambiopoise.

With a policy of only breeding from high quality mares, the original broodmare band consisted of 30 mares, most of which are still active in the stud book and include the likes of Lenore, purchased from Archie Dell. She produced Leta (grandam of Steiger) and several generations on, The Apache.

Politics

While there have been numerous breeding highlights over the years, Politician was an early and obvious standout who came along after only 6 years in business.

Politician may have put the Scott Bros on the map, but with the help of champions sires Jungle Cove and Foveros among others, there have been many subsequent successes. They were also responsible for breeding Arctic Cove and Jungle Rock and more recent stars Eton Square, Orbison, Meadow Magic, The Apache and recent Gold Cup winner, Wild One.

The initial approach from the Hong Kong Jockey Club to Murray was made just a week ago.

Murray's absence will be felt, particularly after it was reported that his good friend and colleague Lyle Hewitson will be out of action for an extended period after breaking a collar bone in a horror fall at Fairview last Saturday.

Another top man in former Champion Jockey Gavin Lerena flew out for a stint in the UK last Friday and had his first ride at Bath on Wednesday.

Season Ends For Hewitson

The Ugly Side Of Racing

A shocking fatal fall by a 2yo first-timer ended the season for our champion apprentice in-waiting and cast a dark cloud on East Cape Derby day on Saturday.

The Renate du Plessis-trained Gitano Giant was making his debut under Lyle Hewitson in the Fairview third race.

According to the Stipes Report, Gitano Giant broke down, fell and dislodged Hewitson at the 450m marker.

A Stipendiary Steward, the Course Veterinary Surgeon and the Course Manager inspected the surrounding area where Gitano Giant broke down on the racecourse and nothing untoward was observed.

The 2yo was euthanized after apparently having broken both forelegs.

Hewitson caught an early flight to Johannesburg on Sunday morning and had a plate and screws inserted into his fractured left collarbone the same day.

He was discharged on Monday and was expected to commence physiotherapy in about six weeks time.

With only about ten weeks left of the current season, Hewitson is unlikely to see further action but has the championship title in the bag as he is on 103 winners and a country mile ahead of his nearest rival.

He also occupies a top ten position on the senior log, but is likely to tumble down that ladder.

In an ironic twist, Hewitson fell when Samish Bay stumbled badly near the 200m on the same track on 28 April.

That incident ended on a happier note for horse and rider.

Lerena Settles In

SA log leading jockey Gavin Lerena came through his opening ride in the UK in gloomy conditions at Bath Racecourse on Wednesday.

The scenic track is situated on Lansdown Hill, northeast of Bath, Somerset.

The 31 year old Lerena was aboard Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum's Mudajaj for the Charlie Hills string in the 2300m Class 4 British Stallion Studs EBF Maiden Stakes.

Mudajaj had opened his career over 1800m at Leicester on 29 April and finished 4th. While he was expected to improve over the extra ground with the experience under his belt, he failed to quicken and finished back of midfield.

Lerena, who left for the UK last weekend, is being sponsored by Chelsea Thoroughbreds and is based with trainer Charlie Hills at Faringdon Place Stables in Lambourn.

A one-time SA Champion jockey, this was not Lerena's first ride in the UK as he was a member of the victorious Rest Of The World Team at last year's Shergar Cup.

Hills' training complex at Faringdon Place centres around three large American Barns which house 150 horses between them.

He has saddled 12 winners so far in the UK flat season, that runs from April to November.

Gavin is also carded to ride Chelsea Thoroughbreds' Dr Goodhead, also for the Hills stable, at Newmarket today.

Lerena, who sacrificed a possible second SA Jockey title to take up the contract, indicated on his departure from South Africa that he would be keen to break the ice early.

It is believed that his family will be joining him once he has settled in.

A Million Reminders!

South Africa's leading owners Mayfair Speculators lead their nearest rivals by over R19 million on the official stakes earning logs published by the National Horseracing Authority and the Markus Jooste world conquering machine kicked into another gear with a smart debut winner in Australia on Tuesday.

Fastnet Rock's daughter Sia, an \$AUS1.1-million purchase off the 2016 Inglis Easter Sale was saddled by David and Ben Hayes, and Tom Dabernig, to a promising win at Geelong over 1100m.

Jooste's Nordic Racing and Breeding race the filly in partnership.

In the last fortnight Jooste has enjoyed partnership winners under the Mayfair Speculators banner in Ireland (Douglas Macar-

thur), England (Soulful) and France (Straight Shooter)

Jooste, who also owns SA Horse Of The Year Legal Eagle, is set for a major Investec Derby Festival in the first week of June at Epsom, and bids for a double with the Australian – bred The Conglomerate in the Vodacom Durban July four weeks later.

Dream Team Set For Preakness

The Kentucky Derby winner, Always Dreaming, will break from the 4 gate in the ten horse field for Saturday's \$1 500 000 Gr1 Preakness Stakes at Pimlico Racecourse in Baltimore.

Thirteen winners have started from that post, most recently Curlin in 2007.

Classic Empire, the early second choice at 3-1 to win the second leg of the Triple Crown, will be next to Always Dreaming in post No. 5. Lookin at Lee, the Derby runner-up and the 10-1 third choice, drew the No. 9 post.

Always Dreaming, who has won four races in a row, including the Florida Derby and the Kentucky Derby, is an early 4-5 favourite for the Preakness.

He has been winning impressively, but conditions will be different in Baltimore on Saturday. The field will be smaller, the weather warmer and the track drier.

He will also be racing on only two weeks' rest, having typically gotten a month between races.

I think it's fun," Classic Empire's trainer, Mark Casse, said at Wednesday's post-position draw. "I think if they both break running, they may go at each other from the beginning. ... We're going at it, so we're not going to sit back and wait."

But the Derby champion's trainer, Todd Pletcher, cautioned that the Preakness will not be a two-horse match race. "It's never that easy," he said. "It's a 10-horse race."

Secretariat's 1973 record of 1:53s still stands in the \$1.5 million Gr1 Preakness Stakes, which will be run at Pimlico for the 142nd time this Saturday. The race has produced 20 Horses Of The Year and Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming powered through his training on Monday as he continues his preparation for the next step to Triple Crown glory.



The HTBA Scone Yearling Sale ended on Monday capping a remarkable year of Inglis Select Yearling Sales and confirming 2017 as the strongest in the company's 150-year history. Inglis sold a total of 1877 yearlings in 2017 at a clearance rate of 88%, average of \$116,000, and gross of \$219,410,250. The gross figure sees Inglis beat its own record from 2008 (\$212,290,086) for an Australasian Yearling Sale season. The Scone Yearling Sale ended with a year-on-year growth of 30.3%, becoming the sixth Inglis Select Yearling Sale to achieve a growth in 2017.

Snitzel Sizzling

Four stakes winners over the past weekend have boosted Australia's leading sire Snitzel's prize money to a new Australian premiership record total of \$13.8 million, surpassing the previous record of \$12.9 million set last season by Street Cry. He now boasts 62 Group & Listed stakes winners (27 this season), 11 Gr1 winners (5 this season) and 27 2yo stakes winners (9 this season).



Small fields remain a vexing issue in the Cape. Despite an extension to the closing date for entries for the Cape Of Good Hope Nursery

and the Kenilworth Fillies Nursery to be run on May 27, only 19 entries were received. Supplementary entries close Friday 19 May.



Deluxe Model

The former Charles Laird-trained Newhaven Park-based first season stallion Delago Deluxe (Encosta De Lago) sired his second winner courtesy of Massagi's (2 f ex Stubborn by Lonhro) victory over 1400 metres at Ascot last Wednesday. The Gr1-winning champion two year-old sprinter raced in the Mayfair Speculators silks. They paid a hefty Aus \$550 000 to acquire the colt at the 2010 Magic Millions Gold Coast Sale. Delago Deluxe will stand for a fee of \$11 000 this season.

Sporting

East Cape Derby winning substitute jockey Craig Zackey showed a rare glimpse of sportsmanship in this tough game at Fairview on Saturday. He handed the trophy to his injured colleague Lyle Hewitson who was carded to ride Dorset Noble — after Aldo Domeyer cried off with back pain.



Brandon Bailey only turns 24 this month and the trainee racecaller has come on leaps and bounds since his tentative first live race in February at Turffontein. Listening to him calling Mauritius from the Rivonia studio on Saturday afternoon was a pleasure. It proves again that commentating is not a Varsity

No Nonsense

The Australian authorities take no nonsense. Grafton-based trainer Daniel Want has been disqualified for 15 months by Racing NSW stewards for presenting a horse in his care to race with cobalt in its system.

Big Five

Grant Van Niekerk

Grant van Niekerk has earned his way to the top of our rider rankings with a well-deserved reputation for always doing his very best on every ride. With a new stable and a new sponsor, he celebrated Mother's Day with 5 wins on the Kenilworth card.

The Capetonian joined the SA Jockey Academy in January 2007, alongside Gareth Wright, JP Van Der Merwe, Tshwaro Appie, Athandiwe Mgudlwa and Aldo Domeyer. His first ride came aboard the Glen Kotzen-trained Combat Leader at Clairwood on 11 June 2008 where he finished second. Two meetings later, he got the ride again and rode his first winner at Clairwood Park on 25 June 2008. It was his fourth ride under rules.

After his initial training, Grant was placed at the Cape Town academy, a move which suited him down to the ground, being his home town. However, Cape Town is also very competitive and it can be difficult for young riders to make an impression. The senior rank and file of our training ranks have seen more jockeys come and go than most of us have had hot dinners and are generally fairly good judges when the new drafts roll into town, so it was interesting that the late Alan Higgins singled Grant out as a future star, right from day one. For someone who mentored the

likes of Spike Lerena, Glen Hatt, Mark Khan and Greg Cheyne, that is high praise indeed. When I ask why, the answer is simple, 'Honest A Little Luck While being good certainly helps, as the old expression goes, sometimes it's better to be lucky than good and in Grant's case, luck smiled down on him during the 2011 Jockey 'International'. Randall Simons was stood down from his ride on Smanjemanje in the Victory Moon Stakes and Grant stepped into the breach, bringing him home an easy 3.75 length winner for trainer Tyrone Zackey. Mr Zackey kept Grant on the horse and, newly out of his time, he was the youngest rider in the 2012 J&B Met and the two were the narrowest of losers in the 2012 Vodacom Durban July, going down a short head to Pomodoro.

"My first job was with Mr van Reenen. I worked for him for a few months and then Glen Kotzen offered me a job. I was really over the moon. I did very well for Mr Kotzen and then Mr Bass approached me. Obviously it's a stable you can't pass by, so I took the opportunity and I have to say, Mr Bass put me on the map." That was in July 2013 and brought with it a sponsorship from Kuda Insurance. The appointment, which raised eyebrows in some quarters, was a winning one and on 7 December 2013, Grant rode a career best 5 winners on the Kenilworth card, of which 4 were for the Bass yard. He also brought home 6 winners on the Kenilworth card on 12 July 2014, which included two for the Bass team. "I rode a lot of good horses for them," he reflects.

Big horses

Inara gave Grant his first career Gr1 win in the Maine Chance Farms Paddock Stakes on 10 January 2015 and followed up with a second Gr1 in the 31 January Klawervlei Majorca Stakes. "I won five Gr1's on her and she won in Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town. For a filly to do that is phenomenal and she's a horse that is really close to my heart."

Grant also partnered Marinaresco, who gave him a second heart-stopping July second, as well as a very emotional Gr1 Mike & Carol Bass Champions Cup on Mike's last official day in the office on 31 July 2016. "Marinaresco is special. I know how good he is, but obviously things didn't pan out in the Queen's Plate and Met for me. I would have loved to keep the ride, but I am grateful to the Basses for everything they taught me and all the opportunities that came my way."

New association

Grant and the Bass yard parted company in February 2017, with both parties choosing to freelance. In March 2017, Grant was snapped up by the Plattner yard, while Aldo Domeyer stepped into the vacant stable jockey position for Candice Bass-Robinson. Grant also picked up a new sponsor in Drakenstein Stud Farm.

"Working for the Plattner yard is great. Andre Nel is really easy to ride for and he's very very good with his horses. I get along with him and Mrs Plattner very well. It's a great team to work for, there's no unnecessary pressure on you, they're very understanding when a horse gets beaten and I am really loving riding for them. We're doing very well together and I hope it continues. Andre is a great guy and a great trainer and I think he'll go straight to the top."

Big Five

On Sunday, 14 May 2017, from 9 carded rides at Kenilworth, Grant brought home 5 winners, two seconds and a fifth and his 9th ride was scratched. He brought home two winners for the Plattner yard, two for the Woodruff string and one for Candice Bass-Robinson. "I've had six on a day before and it's always nice to have multiple winners on a day. If you get past the 4th winner, it's a great feeling. I thought I was a little unlucky not to have 6

today," he says, referring to the first race in which he lodged an objection. "But it was still a great day."

"I haven't had the best of seasons. I was off for six weeks, so I'm grateful to have five wins again — I am feeling very good about today." Asked whether he was expecting a good day at the office, he says, "It just kind of happened. Sometimes you can have good rides and think you're going to have a good day and end up with none. The first one came and I thought 'thank God!', then the next one and the next. Once you've had a winner or two, it pushes your confidence up and you may end up winning even on horses that may not be favourite."

Ups and Downs

"The best part of being a jockey is riding winners – that's what makes it sweet, you know? I love being around horses. I love riding. For me the best part of the job is being around horses and riding winners. That makes everything worthwhile."

What does he find challenging? "Pressure when it comes to betting and critics afterwards. Like any sportsman, one can go through a bad patch and there are always people who will talk. If that gets in your way, that can affect you when you're riding. I try and block it out and carry on with life. I think as long as you know you've done your best, no-one's opinion really matters."

Champions Season

Does he have any designs on the Durban season? "The Plattner yard are my first priority and we are working hard for that Graded win. But, they don't have that many horses, so I am available for quite a few races. Andre is very understanding and if I am offered a good ride, he is happy for me to take it — he is very good like that."

Is there perhaps a July prospect on the horizon? "Nothing has been confirmed yet, but I feel I've been unlucky on two occasions now. I really want to win the July and feel like my time has come to win it." His other big race goals are the Queen's Plate for his sponsor and the Met.

Asked if there has been a special mentor or support from anyone in particular during his career, Grant answers, "There are a few people, but mainly my family. They have been supportive right throughout. So I'd have to say my family and my little daughter. They are the reason I carry on and always try and do my best."

A Bright Light

The Armitage family's faithful Mr Prospector stallion Goldkeeper has died at the age of 27 at Sandown Stud.

Beset by fertility issues throughout his career, he started out in Zimbabwe in 1994 and was transferred to Wilfred Koster at Cheveley Stud in 2001.

He moved back to James Armitage at Sandown in 2006 and produced his last foal, Shine Bright, a 4yo currently in training with Sean Tarry.

Shine Bright, who has won two races to date, was bred by Sandown, and is out of the three time winning Lizard Island mare Bright Thing.

Goldkeeper only sired 380 foals for an extraordinary lifetime winning strike rate of 80% winners to foals.

While he developed into a decent broodmare sire, producing the likes of multiple Gr1 winner All Is Secret, and the stakes winners Stay Alert and Reflective Image, he had a decent list of versatile Gr1 winners, including Gold Tax, Battle Maiden, Tiza, Kushka and Disco Queen.

A Hat For The July?

A bit of racing whimsy

Supplementary entries for the 2017 Vodacom Durban July closed on Tuesday, 9 May 2017, but not before the entry of a 'mystery' horse from the Michael Azzie yard, a big, black 3yo Argentinian colt named Hat Puntana.

It is shades of my favourite film, Francis Ford Coppola's The Black Stallion and given that the July is something of a crazy race in which anything can, and usually does happen, it feels strangely appropriate.

Hat In The Ring

Unlike The Black Stallion, our 'mystery horse' doesn't come out of nowhere and he does have a documented history. Quite an exciting one as it happens.

Hat Puntano (Arg) is a dual Gr1 winner in Argentina. Bred by Haras La Biznaga, he is by Hat Trick out of the Bernstein mare, Stormy Pursuer. Hat Puntana has had four career starts to date, racing in the interests of Las Monjitas. He was trained by Carlos D Etchechoury for his first two starts and then transferred to Juan J Etchechoury for the last two of his starts in Argentina.

Robin Bruss of Northfields Bloodstock was responsible for brokering the purchase and furnished the details of the colt's career. Hat Puntano broke his maiden by 16 lengths on debut, beating a 13 horse field over 7 furlongs on the San Isidro turf on 30 April 2016. His second start was in the Gran Premio Gran Criterium, a G1 contest for 3yo colts and geldings over a mile, where he exhibited an impressive turn of foot to come from last to win by 2 lengths in a time of 1 min 34.66. After changing stables to Juan Etchechoury, he ran in the Gran Premio Estrellas, a mile G1 contest on dirt at Palermo on 25 June 2016. Unfortunately he didn't seem to act on the surface, and finished 6th. His final start in Argentina was on 30 July 2016, in the G1 Gran Premio Clasico Dos Mil Guineas (Argentine 2000 Guineas) on turf in which he disposed of the 8 horse field by 5 lengths. It was an impressive performance and good enough to prompt his purchase as a possible 2017 Triple Crown candidate.

Robin commented, "His style of racing is very exciting. His sire, Hat Trick, is a champion miler by the legendary Sunday Silence and a horse I happen to know very well. Hat Trick is a dual G1 winner and broke the track record for a mile when he won the 2005 G1 Kyoto Mile Championship of Japan in a time of 1:32.10. The record still stands."

Asked whether there was any significance to the name, Robin explains that Hat Trick shuttles between Gainesway and Argentina and the Argentinians have a naming convention whereby the Hat Trick colts are named 'Hat-something' and the fillies are called 'something-Trick', "so there are an army of Hats and an army of Tricks," he laughs.

July ghosts

The coal black colt is in the care of Randjesfontein trainer

Michael Azzie, who has had a year which could best be described as 'challenging'.
But Mike is also one of our most colourful turf characters and again, it feel somewhat appropriate that the colt should be trained by him. Clearly quietly excited about his charge, Mr Azzie said, "He has a real stallion's pedigree and the idea is for him to hopefully do well here and then go to stud." The horse was imported last November and has been registered to Drakenstein Stud (Nom. Mrs G. Rupert) and Mr Jaime and Mrs Mariza Vilela.

The colt has not raced since leaving Argentina, which has added an additional air of intrigue to the July entry. There is also debate about the assigned MR of 113 which, in echoes of the furore over Abashiri in 2016, means Azzie's 3yo faces the prospect of being lumped with a massive weight. Mr Azzie has expressed doubts as to whether they will go through to final acceptances with that rating or choose discretion over valour and opt for the Gold Challenge and Champions Cup before a tilt at the Cape Summer Season.

"As far as the July is concerned, we are chasing the eight ball as he hasn't raced since last July. The handicappers have whacked him a bit, so we're in a similar position to last year where Abashiri was giving away weight to the rest of the field, so we'll have to have a serious think." Azzie has indicated that Hat Puntano would be aimed at a Progress Plate on the Highveld at the end of May.

Shared ownership

There is an old joke that a racehorse is the strongest horse in the world because it can take so many people for a ride at the same time and that is probably true. However, it doesn't only extend to people with a betting ticket on its nose. Anyone who has ever worked with a horse or in some way helped or contributed to it's career or well-being automatically starts to feel a little proprietorial over it, with everyone from the feed merchant to the farrier claiming a little of the reflected glory when it does well. We've all been there. I was drafted in as an emergency driver to chauffeur Heavenly Blue and a buddy back from a beach outing last year and when he won the SA Classic, you can rest assured there was a tiny bit of me that felt just a little responsible for the entire thing. Because one doesn't have to own a horse to feel as though you do.

Simply becoming a fan will get you a long way there. And when they canter down to the start, they take a little piece of you with them. We've all heard punters referring to the horses they've bet on as 'my horse'. It's the same thing. I read a lovely piece on this recently that says, "For many, many people, the racehorse does for us what we cannot do for ourselves. He flies when our bodies are broken; he defies his own odds; he rises above class and politics; sometimes, he achieves fame by sheer force of will. And you

don't forget a horse that gives you wings."

Of course those wings do come at a price. They require that you lay your emotions on the line and genuinely invest in a horse, which means taking the downs with the ups and sticking with it regardless. However, when that investment pays off, well, as Jane Smiley once said, it feels as though Heaven has reached down and touched us personally.

At the end of the day, we're all gamblers. Whether we're breeding, buying or standing at the betting window. And it's perhaps what makes racing folk such a special breed.

July dreams

The 12 scratchings leave a total of 47 horses still in contention and the second declaration stage closes at 11:00 on Monday, 29 May.

There is a lovely quote that reads, "Fishing is worth any amount of effort and any amount of expense to people who love it, because in the end you get such a large number of dreams per fish". Maybe he'll run, maybe he won't. But in the meantime, it's nice to dream. What price a 'Hat' for the July?

New Sire Off The Mark: Marchfield

Poetry In Motion

Moutonshoek's proven former Canadian-based sire Marchfield sired his first SA-bred winner when the Lucky Houdalakis-trained Spring Poetry shed her maiden at her third start over the Vaal 1400m straight last Thursday.

"They take time and they are classic horses. We are thrilled that the pattern shown by the Marchfield progeny in Canada looks to repeat itself here," said an elated Dr Bennie van der Merwe after the news of their smashing son of A.P. Indy's first local

winner had filtered through.

"He enjoyed a virtual explosion of winners six weeks before the end of the Canadian season and missed becoming Champion Freshman sire by a matter of \$2000. He sired 73% winners from his first crop, with 8% stakes horses from runners and then went on to became Champion Second Season sire there," he added.

The knowledgeable stud master said that the Marchfield progeny took time to mature and looked to be horses who would stay on. He was particular pleased with the manner in which his partner's filly had asserted herself.

Spring Poetry was appropriately bred by Moutonshoek and races in the familiar blue and yellow of one of leading owner, Chris Gerber.

Having her third run after two decent placed efforts – she had

run an excellent third to recent Gr2 SA Fillies Nursery fourthplaced Desert Rhythm- she won easily by 1,50 lengths in a time of 84,68 secs.

She was passed unsold at a top bid of R75k out of the ring at the 2106 Val De Vie Yearling Sale but was then sold for R180 000 at the National 2yo Sale.

Marchfield is by AP Indy, the emperor of sires in North America, and is out of Red Ransom's well-performed daughter, Pico Teneriffe, a triple Gr3 winner and 2009 Canadian Broodmare of the Year.

Racing sound until the age of 7, Marchfield was a Classic winner at 3, a graded stakes winner on turf and polytrack and Canada's Champion Older Horse at 4 and 5, winning races such as the 2008 Gr2 Autumn Stakes and the 2009 Gr2 Sky Classic Stakes, as well as the Gr3 Dominion Day Handicap.

Marchfield attained a top price of R180 000 from his 6 lots sold at the recent BSA National Yearling Sale.

He stood for a fee of R25 000 in 2016.

New Sire Off The Mark: Byword

Doing The Talking

Mauritzfontein's well performed young sire Byword, whose half-brother Finche made a stunning, winning debut at Deauville on Sunday, broke the ice at Flamingo Park on Monday when his first crop son Talk Wrench won over 1000m.

Bred by Rob and Michele Pickering, Talk Wrench became his sire's first winner and has now won or placed in four of his six outings.

The colt was a R220 000 purchase from last year's National Yearling Sale.



Byword

He is from the first crop of outstanding racehorse Byword, who was France's Champion Older Horse in 2010.

Byword's seven wins included the Gr1 Prince Of Wales's Stakes (where he beat seven individual Gr1 winners), Gr2 Prix du Muguet and Gr2 Prix du Dollar (where Byword accounted for seven time Gr1 winner Cirrus Des Aigles). The chestnut also ran second to triple Gr1 Breeders' Cup Mile winner Goldikova in the 2010 Gr1 Prix d'Ispahan.

He is one of 12 G1 winners sired by French champion Peintre Celebre (by Nureyev), and is out of former Broodmare Of The Year Binche, dam also of four time Gr1 winner Proviso.

This is the same family as 2015 LONGINES Hong Kong Sprint winner Peniaphobia and US champion racemare Wandesta among others.

Byword, whose yearlings have made up to R2 000 000, is the covering sire of several lots on Thursday's Cape Mare Sale.

He stood for a fee of R30 000 in 2016.

Rocking All Over The World

Fastnet Rock was represented by stakes winners on three different continents this past weekend.

His daughter, Zhukova, became her sire's 28th Gr1 winner when victorious in the Man O'War Stakes in the US, daughters, Turret Rocks and Laganore ran 1-2 in Ireland's Gr3 Blue Wind Stakes, and yet another Fastnet Rock filly, Miss Debutante, captured the Listed Denise's Joy Stakes in Australia.

World Over

Few sires have enjoyed more cross hemisphere success and Fastnet Rock is emulating his sire, Danehill, whose stock found favour the world over. Danehill left behind 89 Gr1 winners in at least 11 different countries and was a champion sire in both hemispheres.

A perennial leader on the Australian Sires List, Fastnet Rock is enjoying another fine year in 2017. He has already been represented by 15 stakes winners this year. His 2017 black type winners have scored in all of Australia, France, Ireland, Japan and South Africa.

This weekend, Zhukova, the first female since Waya in 1978 to capture the Man O'War Stakes, is also the first Fastnet Rock to win at the highest level in North America.

She is also the fifth Gr1 winner for her sire produced by a daughter of Galileo, with that cross also producing Gr1 Investec Oaks winner, Qualify.

Classics

Fastnet Rock is likely to be represented in this year's major European classics by the likes of Rivet and Intricately, both of

whom won Gr 1 races as two-year-olds last year. A dual Champion Sire in Australia (he headed the list in both 2011-2012 and 2014-2015), Fastnet Rock has 115 stakes winners to his credit and his offspring have earned more than AUS\$118 million.

In terms of Gr1 winners, Fastnet Rock has sired more individual top flight Gr1 winners than other major Danehill sire sons.

Early

His stock have often shown precocity and he has been represented by four stakes winning 2yos this year (his 2yo daughters Shoals and Formality recently ran 1-2 in a GR2 contest at Randwick).

Fastnet Rock has also sired his share of horses who stay a mile and a half plus. This category includes the above mentioned Qualify, French Gr2 winner, One Foot In Heaven, Gr3 Vintage Crop Stakes (over2800m) winner, Torecedor, as well as Ilitshe, winner of the Gr3 Caradoc Gold Cup over 2850m. Fastnet Rock looks to have inherited his remarkable versatility as a sire from Danehill, with the latter having sired Gr1 winners from 1000 to 4000 metres.

He is also enjoying increasing success as a sire of sires. For the past two seasons, a son of Fastnet Rock (Hinchinbrook and Smart Missile) has been Champion First Crop Sire in Australia. Currently, Fastnet Rock's G1 winning son, Your Song, is Australia's second Leading First Crop Sire by prize money. His sons, Hinchinbrook, Foxwedge and Stryker have all sired G1 winners, and Foxwedge and Smart Missile are Australia's second and third leading second crop sires respectively.

Foxwedge is also sire of smart local runner, Quick Brown Fox, who won her first two outings before taking on Gr1 company in the Cape Fillies Guineas.

Broodmares

The ever growing influence of Fastnet Rock is also felt through his broodmare daughters.

He is damsire of Gr1 Schweppes All Aged Stakes winner, Tivaci, while daughter, Head Over Heels, is responsible for South African millionaire and Gr2 Charity Mile winner, New Predator.

It is notable that both Tivaci and New Predator are by Sadler's Wells line stallions (High Chaparral and New Approach). Fastnet Rock, like many others from this sire line, has enjoyed phenomenal success when mated to Sadler's Wells line mares, with no fewer than six of his Gr1 winners to date out of mares from the Sadler's Wells line.


