The admiration of raw speed is probably the single dominant appeal in our fascination with the thoroughbred.

The 'speed gene' is believed to have entered the graceful breed from a single founder, which was most likely a British mare about 300 years ago.

The sport has come a long way in that time and the Scottsville speed festival enters its 55th year on Saturday.

Ashburton trainer Duncan Howell's sobering success last weekend in the Gr2 Betting World 1900 has levelled the SA Champions Season pitch somewhat, after Summerveld resident Garth Puller predicted some months back that the local conditioners may as well take a holiday while the visitors plunder the silverware.

Racing has a way of sorting the men from the boys and Saturday's four Gr1's over the Scottsville 1200m boast a mix of hometown talent, with out-of-province stars out to impress and confirm their boom reputations. But, homeground experience is a distinct advantage on this tricky track...

While runners from the powerful Joey Ramsden stable dominate the betting for the R1-million Tsogo Sun Sprint, Coenie De Beer travels from the North to defend his title with Talktothestars.

Last year's winning rider Piere Strydom has jumped ship from the De Beer star to ride Brutal Force for Ramsden. That just adds to the needle!

With a carryover-boosted Pick 6 pool expected to top R3 million, punters have plenty to play for.

GR1 SPEED JACKPOT AT SCOTTVILLE

Speed Machine

Gr1 Tsogo Sun Sprint - Scottsville

The R1 million Tsogo Sun Sprint heads the Gr1 speed jackpot at Scotts-ville this Saturday.

Sentiment suggests we go for 2016 winner Talktothestars to pull off a rare double. On the flipside, logic points us in the direction of the Ramsden trio, headed by the progressive 3yo Attenborough.

Being a handicap, this is the widest open of the four Gr1's and with a capacity field lining up, a surprise result could well be on the cards – particularly if the draw bias comes into play.

Big Ask

David versus Goliath is the mind's picture created by small-time trainer Coenie de Beer taking on a powerhouse yard with fifteen horses to every one of his, of the likes of Joey Ramsden and Sean Tarry, who have six runners between them.

De Beer celebrated a personal Gr1 first in this event last year with his barefoot bomber Talktothestars, and a year down the line the gelding may have reached form at just the right time. Fair enough, the barefeet have been replaced by alumites, and with just one modest Flamingo Park success in the ensuing 12 months, the son of Overlord looks to have it all to do. He ran a cracker at his last start, when chasing Rafeef late to run a courageous second in the Gr1 Computaform Sprint.

On the other end of the scale, Ramsden's 3yo Attenborough opened his local account in style with an impressive late burst to win the Listed In Full Flight Handicap. Ridden by Anton Marcus, his racing style suggests he won't be bothered by his widish draw and this R2 million purchase could go on to realise his potential now.

Local course and distance specialist London Call has earned his stripes at this track and trip and he takes on his first Gr1 test as a 6yo.

The son of Kahal is perfectly drawn at 2 and has the gate speed and toe to go all the way.

Vaughan Marshall's at times in-and-out galloper Exelero meets Attenborough on 3kgs better terms for his 1,25 length defeat at the course last time. He is a little unreliable.

The 4yo Search Party is one of five Captain Al progeny in the field.

He meets Attenborough on 3kgs better terms for a 1,50 length defeat in the In Full Flight Handicap at his second KZN start this season.

The son of Captain Al was well weighted to win the Gr2 Cape Merchants late last year and is not far off London Call on recent form.

Barbosa is 4kgs better off with Attenborough for a 4,20 length beating last time. The 7yo's form has been a little uninspiring but he has not been too far off.

Red Rag

The lightly raced Bull Valley is a quality 4yo and ran an eyecatching fourth behind Champagne Haze at his last start in the Gr2 Senor Santa Stakes.

This Gr3 winner has his first start at Scottsville, but may find the 17 draw an unwelcome opening present.

Joey Ramsden's dual Gr3 winner Table Bay gets the blinkers as he comes out of an unplaced effort in the Cape Derby 17 weeks ago.

This free striding son of Redoute's Choice may need this but was rated highly as a late 2yo into his 3yo term – and cannot be written off.

Piere Strydom won this race last year but switches allegiances in 2017 to Brutal Force, one of a trio of Joey Ramsden runners.

This class 5yo (aka 'Fatty')needs to prove he is as effective at Scottsville as he has been at Turffontein and finds himself fit and in good form after his Computaform Sprint running on fourth last time.

Top Rank

Justin Snaith's gutsy multiple stakes winner Sergeant Hardy improved nicely on his CTS Sprint unplaced run on Met day. He was beaten a length by London Call at a prep run in mid April and meets the Dixon star on 2kgs better terms for a 1,75 length beating. He is known to have his issues, but is capable of a big effort.

Tricky

It's a battle of the battle hardened proven brigade versus the emerging new generation racers.

Attenborough could give the Mayfair Speculators silks another victory and he is the marginal first selection to beat Bull Valley, with Talktothestars and Brutal Force picking up the pieces.

Alice And The Princess

Gr1 SA Fillies Sprint - Scottsville

The ten-time winner Carry On Alice has done her bit to put her trainer on the map and she makes her annual return to one of her favourite stomping grounds to set a few records straight.

Sean Tarry's SP top-rated runner, Carry On Alice bids for her fifth Gr1 win and won this event in 2015, beating the De Kock hotshot Alboran Sea

Last year, when a forgettable fifth, she did not settle in behind horses and the gaps didn't open in time for her.

With the full width of the track being used this year and a marginally smaller field than average, Carry On Alice may enjoy the conditions as she has never been a horse who needs cover.

July entry Bela-Bela takes her

first step in her big race prep and while she ranks high on the SP ratings, looks to have it all to do against the fast girls. Her two Gr 1 wins were over 2000m and 1800m, but she has won over shorter in the lower leagues.

Every Chance

Bernard Fayd'herbe will give her every chance, but Bela's Met jockey Anthony Delpech sticks with the proven speed product as Dean Kannemeyer brings last year's victress Real Princess back for her own bid at the double. Her and the Tarry galloper are thus 1 each in this race. The daughter of Trippi hasn't seen the winner's enclosure since that peak day, and she is likely to be making her swansong appearance. A Scottsville specialist, she flies under the powerful Kannemeyer —Delpech flag and could well go out with a bang — despite her scratchy form.

Just The One

Joey Ramsden's Cape Fillies Guineas winner Just Sensual gets the blinkers fitted and will be ridden by Anton Marcus. She has shown sufficient toe to be competitive over the 1200m and her Prix Du Cap victory

Earlier, Live Life had beaten Carry On Alice in the Gr2 Sceptre Stakes by 0,75 lengths on terms 2kg worse than weight for age- and on that occasion she came from last.

The Secret Is Out won last year's Gr1 Allan Robertson at this meeting, and is a Scottsville specialist who found her best form in the Poinsettia Stakes timeously last time.

At her best, she is lethal and capable of winning.

Killer

Bela-Bela stablemate Jo's Bond beat Carry On Alice in the Southern Cross Stakes over 1000m when receiving only 2kg and the latter duly reversed form at level weights in the Gr 1 Cape Flying Championships.

Jo's Bond is seen as a 1000m specialist, but this imposing daughter of Captain Al did turn it on impressively in the Listed Kwazulu-Natal Stakes over the Scottsville 1000m from just off the pace, and if not out of sorts after her recent Joburg raid, can challenge.

Generation Gap

The tussle between the proven Gr1 mares and the younger set should make for an interesting contest.

It may pay to go a touch wider in the exotics, but if things go Alice's way it could be no race.

Some Speed Trivia

How many jockeys have bred and ridden the winner of the Gr1 SA Fillies Sprint?

Only one, according to our records.

That is current Summerveld conditioner Garth Puller, a multiple past SA Champion jockey and one of the men with the best powers of recall in the industry.

Puller bred the very smart nine-time winner Home Streaker, a daughter of Home And Dry (Joy 11), who he rode to victory in the 1983 SA Fillies Sprint, when the race carried a stake of R40 000.

A then much younger Piet Steyn brought the Colin Burroughs-trained flyer up from Cape Town for her only outing in KZN that season.

Home Or Away?

Gr1 Gold Medallion Scottsville

This is a tricky affair with some national form interwoven with hometown course specialists, who don't appear to lack ability. In Saturday Dennis Drier and Vaughan Marshall bump heads again, with the former saddling Twice Over's debut winner, Sand And Sea.

Anton Marcus rides the Scottsville course-and distance winner who started a well supported 5 to 2 favourite in a strong looking winner's race on his debut three weeks ago. Interestingly, it is rare to find a feature race where Mayfair Speculators have only one runner and so Marcus rides this R1 million purchase without having had his usual host of choices. Up in the weights, the Drakenstein bred colt will be competitive if improving a length or two on that.

Vaughan Marshall saddles Woljayrine, the seemingly progressive Jay Peg colt who popped up after a quiet debut (where he was beaten 3,45 lengths by Sniper Shot) to win the Gr3 Godolphin Barb like a horse going places. If he repeats that run he must have a shout – but is 4kgs worse off with Varallo, who was beaten 2,25 lengths into third there.

Top Rated

The SP top-rated is Mike de Kock's Gr1 SA Nursery runner-up Naafer. The son of Lonhro made a respiratory noise when beaten 4 lengths by his boom stablemate, Mustaaqeem. But his maiden win was walk in the park stuff and he certainly looks above average – his breathing issues aside.

Fellow Aussie Sir Frenchie carries the dominant Snaith flag and this son of Choisir is bound to be stronger after his Scottsville baptism when a length

behind Woljayrine in the Godolphin Barb. With a swing of 4kgs in his favour, the two-time Kenilworth winner ticks a good few boxes in our book.

Varallo was just 1,25 lengths behind Sir Frenchie in the Barb and the son of Var could be an interesting prospect with the blinkers fitted first time and Piere Strydom up. A course and distance winner, he won his first two starts like a horse destined for

better – and is another who holds Woljayrine on paper.

Cape visitor Al Mariachi has his second start here after going down a half length to Sand And Sea last time. The Crawford galloper enjoys a turnaround of 3kgs in his favour and comes into the focus on his best home form.

Autumn In Seattle won his first two starts and is a very quick son of Sail From Seattle. He enjoys a 4kg swing with Woljayrine on the Godolphin Barb where he went down 3,60 lengths and meets Arianos Bagofgold on 2kgs better for a half length beating in the Sentinel Stakes.

Sentinel Stakes winner Arianos Bagofgold has won his last two starts and steps up to the 1200m for the first time. The increase in trip should play into his hands and could negate his weight deficit.

Paul Lafferty's Sniper Shot is an interesting runner. The son of Judpot won his maiden on the Greyville poly and then followed up on soft going on the turf. He looks held by Varallo but meets Procal Harum on 3kgs better terms for a half length beating last time.

Howells Again?

Gr1 Allan Robertson Championship Scottsville

History show that it takes a top-class filly to win the Allan Robertson Championship. After his superb feature success on Friday evening at Greyville, Duncan Howells may fancy his chances of grabbing some more silverware.

Howells, who is based ten minutes down the road at South Africa's most underrated training centre, saddles the Highlands bred Antonius Pius filly, Neptune's Rain. A winner of 2 of 3 starts, the SP top-rated pick showed good cruising speed in the Gr3 Strelitzia Stakes over 100m shorter at

Scottsville and then displayed a fine turn of foot to win going away by 1,25 lengths.

Hollywood

The runner up Made In Hollywood had won her maiden by 6,25 lengths over 1200m at Kenilworth and subsequently finished just 1,25 lengths behind the Cape's best 2yo Dutch Phillip, over 1000m.

Third-placed Gold Image, who is one of two Glen Kotzen runners, was beaten 3,25 lengths by Neptune's Rain, and impressed when easily winning her debut over 800m. She then finished an outstanding third in the Kuda Sprint over 1200m on Sun Met day.

Her stablemate Princess Peach looks held by Neptune's Rain on her first start in KZN but Richard Fourie rides and she looks ready to improve

- and the fact that she was running on

over 100m shorter bodes well. Paul Matchett makes a welcome return to Scottsville with the recent clear cut maiden winner, Brave Mary. The daughter of Brave Tin Soldier took four runs to

2,75 length beating over 1100m in the Pretty Polly Stakes and the latter was beaten 5,5 lengths at level weights over 1000m by Call To Account on Met day. On paper that points to Call To Account having the edge, but Green Plains has improved with every run and looks to be a tough filly who will enjoy the Scottsville course and distance.

The Australian-bred Touch Of Magic is an impressive specimen and won her only start by 3,75 lengths on debut over 1000m at Scottsville with a 2,5kg claimer up. The form hasn't worked out well, but she must rate a place chance.

Accountable

Listed Summer Juvenile Stakes winner Call To Account has to be a big runner too as she beat the smart Dutch Philip on Met day, albeit over 1000m. In her only subsequent start against the boys over 1200m at Scottsville she set the fractions, but faded late to be beaten 3,65 lengths by Tsogo Sun Gold Medallion contender Sand And Sea.

Supplemented into this race, the Lezeanne Forbes' trained Light On Her Toes is by Gimmethegreenlight out of Allan Robertson winner On Her Toes and three winners have come out of the race she won over 1200m at Greyville in her second career start.

It looks tough for the rest.

Neptune's Rain has the homeground advantage and shown enough ability to win this.

Draw Is Key

Champion jockey Garth Puller has suggested that punters keep an eye on the Scottsville draw bias, that seems to favour those drawn down the inside.

The 65 year old Puller, who won the 1986 Gr1 Gold Medallion at this track on the champion Bush Telegraph, beating Main Man on an objection, said that the draw bias at Scottsville had been there for as long as he could remember.

"Look, every racecourse has its quirks – even the weather is a factor. Thinking jockeys take these into account and ride their races accordingly. It certainly also helps to have the horse under you," he said.

"Oddly enough at Scottsville last weekend they erected a false rail to preserve the going for the Gr1's this coming Saturday. But surely that only serves to exacerbate and protect the inside, making it more pronounced?" he questioned.

Puller, who rode for close on 35 years, celebrated his final winner at his very last race meeting on 27 December 2005. He also booted home 7 winners at Kenilworth on the afternoon of 27 September 1980.

Bush Telegraph went on to win the July in 1987. How many Gold Medallion winners have achieved that double? The answer will be published next week. KENILWORTH ON SATURDAY

Fill Up On Philip

Gr3 Cape Of Good Hope Nursery Kenilworth

Exciting What A Winter colt Dutch Philip can seal his Cape 2yo championship title when he takes on seven rivals in Saturday's Nursery at Kenilworth. The recent Listed Somerset 1200 winner has won 3 of his 4 starts and the Candice Bass-Robinson trained youngster looks to be the best we have seen in the Cape juvenile ranks.

Good Run

Beaten only once – that when running a decent enough third behind Call To Account in the Listed Summer Juvenile Stakes on Met day – Dutch Philip produced his best at his last start over Saturday's course and distance.

The recent Listed Perfect Promise Sprint winner and SP top-rated Magical Wonderland is unbeaten in two impressive starts and at face value looks a decent bet.

Top Choice

A daughter of What A Winter, Magical Wonderland turned the jets on late to beat Too Phat To Fly, Rose In Bloom and Nanna Anna last time. The unknown factor of the going looks unlikely to play a role with rain forecast for only Friday as we go to press.

Justin Snaith has won this race for the past two years running and he sends out recent course-and-distance runaway winner Oh Susanna. The Australian bred daughter of Street Cry was backed into the red at her second start and beat Capaill by over 5 lengths in a large field.

Blooming Good

Joey Ramsden is a trainer who knows how to get the 2yo's ready and he saddles course and winner, Rose In Bloom. The daughter of Gimmethegreenlight ran third beaten 2,25 lengths in the Perfect Promise after showing pace. Her rider Jannie Bekker will be keen to break the ice after making a comeback to the saddle.

The Bezrin filly Too Phat To Fly has run two decent course-and-distance races. She won her maiden at 75 to 1 and then chased Magical Wonderland home when beaten a length in the Perfect Promise Sprint.

The Sail From Seattle 2yo's have been firing and well supported debut winner Lanark could be anything. With Grant van Niekerk away at Scottsville, Gareth Wright steps in and gets a golden rare chance to ride a feature winner.

Nanna Anna is the most experienced filly in the race but looks held by more than half this field.

PERSONALITY

On The Way Up

Diego de Gouveia hasn't taken the conventional route to becoming a jockey.

Apart from the odd ride on a hack during holidays in the Drakensberg, the Academy was the first time he rode a horse. He grew up in Edenvale in Johannesburg and went to school with Callan Murray. In fact, the two boys applied to the Academy together. "We both applied and never looked back since."

Their paths split after their first year, when Diego decided to leave at the end of 2012. "I was really unhappy, but I was very young and rebellious at the time and didn't enjoy the discipline, so I went back to Joburg. I carried on riding though, because I have an immense passion for horses and racing and was determined to be a jockey. Mr James Maree said he could help get me into the work riders programme. He told me to just keep riding work and do his courses in the meantime. Mr Gary Waterston also helped me a lot in the mornings and gave me lots of pointers. When I rode in work riders' races, him and Mr Maree used to give me advice afterwards. They both played a major role in teaching me the basics and I owe them a lot."

Along with Serino Moodley, Diego arranged to spend a year riding in Zimbabwe, staying with a few other apprentices at the Zim Academy. "It took a few months for my license to be approved, but Zim gave me an opportunity to work with different horses. Although things are difficult up there, it was a lovely experience to ride somewhere different and Borrowdale is one of the most beautiful courses I have ridden on. I was freelancing, which was pretty tough because there are a lot of South African guys coming up and taking most of the top rides, but we were getting full cards, and getting great race riding experience."

Second time lucky

Diego came home in October 2015 and spent the next few months riding work before rejoining the Academy in January 2016. Has it been a smoother ride this time round? "So much better," he enthuses. "Being a bit older than I was and having my mind set on a goal and wanting to make it, all makes it a lot easier. Lots of other things have changed as well and I'm enjoying it a lot more this time."

What does he enjoy about it most? "The early mornings. No really!" he laughs. "My thinking is if you enjoy what you're doing, you never work a day in your life. I love being with the horses. If could be there every day I would. I love going to stables in the morning and I love the build up to races, trying to get the best rides and trying to improve and do better than last time."

Is he quite competitive? "I've got a very competitive personality. I always want to win, which can sometimes be bad. I can't stand losing. If I have to run second, let it be a few lengths, not a heads up, heads down!"

Successful association

Diego has struck up a good relationship with Paul Lafferty, thanks to a chance booking.

"It was an apprentice race. I didn't have a ride and Mr Laff put me on a horse. I rode a dirty 6th or 7th and he was happy with the ride and I thought 'that's alright!"

"I also ride a lot of work for Mr Drier and have had quite a few winners for him. I was lucky that my first few rides for him were winners. It's not often that Mr Drier gives apprentices opportunities, but he's an incredible teacher. You can win a race and he'll ask 'why did you go so early?' He's a lovely man to be associated with and I help were I can. Another person who has helped get me on track is Anthony Delpech. I used to do his kit and I learnt a lot from him. Now that I have more rides, I don't have time to do kit anymore, but he's an exceptional rider and someone I really look up to."

Apprentice Abroad

Along with Colin Ncobo, Diego was selected to attend the British Racing School as well as gaining valuable experience working for the William Haggas yard which he thoroughly enjoyed. "It was a lovely experience. The way they do things there is very different and as a rider you do a lot more of the work yourself. It made me respect our grooms a lot more. In South Africa, we're very fortunate to have the grooms we have. The work they do is incredible."

Mr Haggas' yard is extremely professional and has all the equipment you can think of – treadmills, spas – the horses get the best of everything. Everything is very organised. There's an electronic notice board, so when you get there in the morning, you know whether you're doing 3 or

4 horses, it tells you which horses you are riding and what work to do. If you're riding X, you go to that horse's stable and each stable has a box outside with that horse's kit. Some use French saddles, some use Australian saddles – it's all on the board outside the stable door – the type of girth, everything. While you're ringing in the yard, Mr Haggas will check your instructions with you and then he'll normally let you ring a few more times and send you out."

Two weeks at the Haggas yard was followed by an intensive one week international apprentice course at the British Racing School. "They taught us different ways to use a whip, how to judge pace and how to do times. Then you'd actually go and do a practical. You would take a horse

and they would drive next to you in a car and you'd have to try and

estimate how many furlongs a minute you were doing. We also did a lot of Equiciser work. It was a really nice all round experience."

Back to work

Does he have designs on an apprenticeship title? "I'm currently tied for second with Eric Ngwane. Lyle is out in front by a ridiculous margin, but such is life. We don't get to race ride every day like he does yet. It's difficult to do much travelling at this stage. Lyle helped me get into PE and I rode for Yvette Bremner and rode a winner there. I went a few more times, but the travel is quite expensive and being an apprentice, we don't make as much as the jockeys do, so we end up losing money. It's all about being able to get rides. People might know you, but to get the good rides and make it work is tougher. Lyle has already made a name for himself, we are still getting there."

"I'm quite a people person and am quite outspoken, which sometimes gets me in trouble. I don't find it difficult to ask for rides, but you've got to go about it in the right way. If you get shot down, that's the game. You're not going to get every ride," he says pragmatically. "You try and get on the best horse and then the second best horse and so on until you crack one. Some days it's hard, but then you get those days where you get the good ones and you get 2 or 3 winners on the card, which is good."

Diego already has a few doubles under his belt, but is still chasing his first feature success. He is hoping Tsogo Sun Sprint day might change that.

Lyle Doing Well

It has been close on a fortnight since current South African Apprentice log leader, Lyle Hewitson took a bad fall from the Renate du Plessis-trained Gitano Giant at Fairview.

He underwent surgery for his broken collar-bone in Johannesburg the Sunday after the racemeeting and was discharged the very next day. On medical advice it was suggested he get medical hyperbaric oxygen treatments and was referred to Revitalair by Biobarica at

the Rivonia Therapy and Sports Centre. Hyperbaric Oxygen Treatment (HBOT) is a medical treatment which exposes the patient to pure Oxygen, at greater than normal atmospheric pressure, to create a state of hyperoxia

The minimum recommended course is 10 treatments and Lyle had his first session on Wednesday, 17 May. He says he could be racing in in 5-6 weeks.

Professor Joey

It's unheard of that a horse keeps defying the handicapper winning handicaps!

Joey Ramsden's Encosta De Lago gelding Professor Brian is surely the most improved horse in training.

The 4yo scored his sixth win from 13 starts (he doesn't run places) at Greyville on Wednesday in an MR 101 Handicap.

That means in the space of 5 runs since 21 January he has gone from a 58 to a 64 to a 72 to a 78 to an 85- he won here by 2 lengths which suggests 4lbs.

But he may get 8 in view of the ease of the win and the fact he has won 5 in a row. That's 35lbs in 5 runs.

Duncan Howells' Australian-bred Ten Gun Salute was the big newsmaker in the Vodacom Durban July countdown this past week, after his impressive victory in Friday evening's Gr2 Betting World 1900.

The son of Henrythenavigator won a race considered a 'preferred inclusion' ticket by the July selection and after not being in the big race top 25 published in early May, he is bound to be thereabouts when the next log is published after the Daily News 2000 on 3 June.

The 3yo Tilbury Fort chased Ten Gun Salute home and while he will need to do more, it was a nicely improved effort from the Sean Tarry charge.

The underdone 2016 Cape Derby winner It's My Turn hung on to dead-heat for third with non-entry, Mr Winsome. It's My Turn ran fourth in the July last year and looks the 'dark horse' of the Justin Snaith contingent as he builds fitness.

His stablemate Elusive Silva, ranked 16 on the log before Friday evening, produced little spark late and ran just out of the money. That would not have done the Sledgehammer winner's bid any favours as he hovers in the danger zone.

Another Snaith entrant in the star filly Bela-Bela (9 on the log) runs in this Saturday's Gr1 SA Fillies Sprint. Her connections are keeping their options fluid and there is no certainty that she will make the final field.

Master Sabina, now with the Snaith yard, and winner of the last two runnings of the Sansui Summer Cup for Geoff Woodruff, will run in the Vodacom Durban July for only the second time.

Michael de Broglio's seven-year-old was a 20-1 chance when ninth in last year's race and this time he will be prepared by Justin Snaith who took over the gelding last week.

Jonathan Snaith said: "He may run first in the Rising Sun Gold Challenge on June 10 for a gallop or go straight to the July."

After all the hype surrounding his entry, the Argentinian bred Hat Puntano has been scratched by trainer Mike Azzie. Another scratching is Mike de Kock's SA Classic winner Heavenly Blue.

The Air We Breathe

Oscar Foulkes along with mum Veronica is part owner of Gr1 Tsogo Sun Sprint runner, Sergeant Hardy and the two share a special connection.

Sergeant Hardy was bred by Veronica Foulkes' Normandy Stud and led through the ring of the 2015 CTS Cape Premier Yearling Sale. "My younger brother bought him, then he was found to have a paralysed right vocal chord, which is fairly unusual –it's usually the left one. They don't know for certain what causes the vocal chord paralysis, possibly an IV nicks the nerve that runs in the same place. Then we sent him to a Ready To Run sale. We had him scoped – we didn't want people to find out afterwards that there was a problem – and put a notice on the door. We ended up buying him back at R70k."

Oscar has been battling throat cancer on and off for a number of years. He has his first op in 2006 after steadily losing his voice over the preceding years.

"The cancer that I have. Had," he corrects himself, "is not something that was ever going to kill me. The worst was that I could end up with a hole in my throat." However, the treatments have taken their toll, leaving Oscar with a soft, high-pitched voice. "I don't have an issue with it. I'm quite used to being called 'M'am' on the phone," he says good-naturedly. "For me it's just fantastic to be able to make a phone call. There were long periods over the last ten years when I haven't been able to make phone calls for months on end or when people have rung and I've picked up and they didn't know I had answered. Worse was going to someone's house and ringing the doorbell

the intercom. Having a high pitched voice is the least of my worries."

It has been a long journey, but it is one he is winning. And in celebration and affirmation, Oscar decided to enter for this year's ABSA

Cape Epic mountain bike race. But that was all

and not being able to announce who you are on

the way back in 2015.

ABSA Cape Epic

Why the Epic? "It's something I've always been curious about," he muses. "You see these things and know it's a completely different level of commitment. Something like Wines2Whales you can do if you're relatively fit, but Epic takes 6 months to a year to prepare for. We are running the Val de Vie hospitality and when I found out that the race

finished at Val de Vie this year, I decided it was a sign. When I said I would like an entry back in 2015, I didn't even know what treatment was awaiting me, so I'd already committed before I knew what was coming my way."

"I've had multiple surgeries to remove tumors, but they've kept coming back." Eventually he was forced to have a course of radiation therapy, which finished a little over a year ago. "I didn't eat solid food until last April. I had a diet of soup and morphine — it was the most incredible pain I've ever experienced. My weight dropped to 66kgs. To start from that and then get exercising again was a challenge."

The Cape Epic mountain bike race is aptly named, taking place over – and largely up- 691 km of Western Cape countryside. Their website states the accumulated vertical gain over the eight days is 15,400m. For someone recovering from cancer treatment it seems particularly ambitious, particularly as the repeated surgeries had left him with impaired breathing due to scar tissue that had built up on his vocal chords. "It was great to have a goal like that. I literally could hardly ride around the block – that's how depleted my body was."

Oscar met his riding partner, Piet Viljoen, thanks to a blog post titled 'Will you be my Epic Valentine?' in February 2016. "Friends connected us. Piet is a value investor and it took a big stretch to look at me in my state and say in a year's time we'll be riding Epic together, but his commitment is more on the level of 'I do' than 'yes'. Even though he's a lot stronger, he's been a support for me as well and helped me get through, building my strength. We're an odd combination, but it works."

Hoarse Power

The two competed as team 'Sergeant Hardy', with their racing kit made up in Veronica's racing colours and sporting the moniker 'Hoarse Power' on their cycling shorts.

Competing in the Grand Masters division, they finished the course in 47:00.31,3 placing 27th in their category. "Many people take on big physical endurance challenges –

I'm by no means the first person to do it, or the first person to do it with difficulty. A few years ago a team completed and between them they had 3 arms and 3 legs. I actually spent quite a lot of Epic riding in close proximity to Reuben van Niekerk (the one-legged rider) who has now completed 4 Epics. What I'm overcoming is minimal

compared with that.

It's one of the most magnificent things about the Epic. Apart from some male madness, there's just this dogged determination that

water, nothing is going to stop you finishing what you started out to do."

There is an interesting postscript to Oscar's Epic. His surgeon, Professor Fagan, suggested a procedure to repair the obstruction caused by the scar tissue, but due to the recovery time, Oscar elected to postpone until after the Epic. However, the day after he finished, he rang for an appointment and surgery was scheduled for that Thursday. The before and after photos and the results were arresting. "I'd ridden Epic on something like 50% breathing capacity. It's not the same as breathing through a straw, but you get the picture. Even while lying in the hospital bed, my breathing felt easier."

"In my head, I had lost 10% to 20% breathing capacity. Sometimes it's better not to know – if I'd known that the impediment was more like 50%, perhaps I wouldn't even have started the Epic process."

Last year, in a letter of fatherly guidance, he wrote to his son: 'We have powers of endurance that are far in excess of what we might imagine.' "Little did I know the circumstances under which I would experience that for myself."

"Having experienced what it's like to try and do these things without being able to breathe properly, I am totally in awe of what Sergeant Hardy does. We schlepped along towards the middle / back of the field. He's lost 30% of his breathing capacity and is one of the top-rated sprinters in the country."

And so back to the (horse) racing

"Sergeant Hardy was a November foal, so we ran him as an early 2yo just to see how he would respond," explains Oscar. He won first time out, over 800m at Kenilworth on 27 December 2015. By 4,75 lengths. "We knew it was worth persevering with him and the rest is history," shrugs Oscar.

"There's just something about him," says Oscar. "He is a big, magnificent beast. We were obviously very disappointed about his CTS run, because his form leading up to it had been sensational."

Shared experience

Sharing the experience with his mother has also made it special, particularly as Sergeant Hardy is a Normandy homebred. "I worked out some stats recently that you get roughly one Gr1 winner for every 500 foals. On this basis, if you look at the number of foals my mother breeds every year, she has outperformed the breed average by a factor of 9 or 10. She doesn't breed from expensive bloodstock and most are homebreds, but she has produced the likes of Winter Solstice, Tatler, Bravura and Mother Russia. That's a pretty impressive track record."

"I grew up with it, but then spent 10-15 years more involved with wine than racing. I've had the opportunity of rekindling that over the last 5 years and I've loved it."

"A lot happens at the stud and even though it's her operation, we share a lot of the planning and strategising, so it's great to have the opportunity to race a horse together. With my brother passing away in 2015 and my on-going brushes with cancer, it's been a very emotional time for her and I've just treasured the time and opportunity to share these things with her."

Off The Track

Kenilworth Racing have apologised for a communication breakdown around the switch of tracks at the Southern Suburbs racecourse on Sunday.

Punters and other stakeholders contacted the Sporting Post after the meeting, including two Winter Series features, were run on the summer course.

The official racecard indicated that the meeting was being held on the winter course.

In a press release issued by Phumelela Gaming & Leisure Limited on Monday 22 May 2017, it was stated that Due to the catastrophic drought currently being experienced in the Western Cape, the Winter course was unable to be adequately prepared for the race meeting at Kenilworth on Sunday 21 May 2017, resulting in the Summer course being utilised.

The Operators and National Horseracing Authority were apprised of developments, as were the National Racing Bureau who duly advertised same, certain sectors of the general public were regrettably uninformed due to an unacceptable breakdown in communication.

Kenilworth Racing advised that they deeply regretted and profusely apologised for this unfortunate oversight and advises that disciplinary action will be taken against those responsible.

The Winter Course will be used this Saturday, 27 May.

Seeing Stars!

Maine Chance Farms proprietor Andreas Jacobs is behind the move to stand the first son of champion Sea The Stars to be based in this country.

Klipdrif Stud are set to stand Quasillo, a half-brother to Maine Chance Farms' top-class Querari (Oasis Dream) and a group winning son of sensational sire Sea The Stars.

Despite injuring his hip as a foal he won by 2 lengths on debut and then won the Derby Trial to become favourite for Germany's best classic.

Thoroughbred Daily News reported:

Made a clear favourite on the basis of his untapped potential in this Gr1 Deutsches Derby trial, Quasillo delivered with a deal of authority to place himself center stage as the run-up to the July 5 Hamburg Classic continues. Detached with one behind early as Eduardo Pedroza allowed the duel for the lead to take place up ahead, the homebred who had created a stir on his winning debut over 11 furlongs at Munich Apr. 19 made smooth progress on the outside turning for home. Ending up near the stand's rail, the chestnut swamped Ajalo with a furlong remaining and bounded clear for an emphatic score. "He did that really easily today, but he is still quite green," Andreas Wohler commented. "We have seen his potential for the Derby today".

John Freeman reports that it is our good fortune that his unfortunate injury has led him to South Africa.

Gestut Fährhof have successfully test-bred him in Germany to prepare him for a stud career – he is virile and fertile and is presently in the process of shipment to South Africa.

Already fully syndicated, he will stand at a fee of R12000.

Humor's Funny Cide

Leading US sire, Distorted Humor, continues to make his mark in the world's greatest races.

He is broodmare sire of the world's current top rated runner Arrogate (Unbridled's Song), and his son, Maclean's Music, produced a first crop classic winner when Cloud Computing scored a in Saturday's Gr1 Preakness Stakes, the second leg of the US Triple Crown.

Cloud Computing, is bred on a similar cross to Gr1 Haskell Invitational winner, Any Given Saturday. While Cloud Computing is by a son of Distorted Humor out of a mare by A P Indy, Any Given Saturday is by Distorted Humor out of an A P Indy daughter.

Distorted Humor has long enjoyed success with Seattle Slew line mares, with other notable performers sired by him carrying the 1977 Triple Crown winner in their pedigrees including champion, Funny Cide, and Gr1 winners Drosselmeyer, Joking and millionaire, Alternation.

Maclean's Music is bred on the reverse cross to Arrogate, being by Distorted Humor out of a mare by Unbridled's Song.

He got off to a smart start last year with his first 2yos including 20 winners (from 40 starters) and ended 2016 as North America's eighth leading first crop sire by prize money. To date he has been represented by five individual stakes winners, with Cloud Computing his first graded stakes winner.

The Hill 'N Dale based sire, who won his only racetrack appearance and stood his first season at stud for \$6,500, is the second son of Distorted Humor to have sired a Preakness Stakes winner, with Wilgerbosdrift based, Flower Alley (Distorted Humor) having sired 2012 Preakness victor I'll Have Another.

Two Here

Distorted Humor is represented in South Africa by two Gr1 winning sons, the aforementioned Flower Alley as well as former National Stakes winner and Irish champion, Pathfork. It's worth noting that both Pathfork and Flower Alley have Sadler's Wells in their pedigrees.

A consistently top class sire, (he headed North America's sires list in 2011), Distorted Humor has 136 stakes winners to his credit, with 18 of his stakes winners having scored at Gr1 level.

Distorted Humor got off to a flying start at stud, with his first 2yos boasting five stakes winners, including G1 Spinaway Stakes winner Awesome Humor, and he was Leading First Crop Sire of 2002. Distorted Humor's first crop included champion and dual classic winner, Funny Cide, and graded winners, Go Rockin' Robin and Sensibly Chic.

Mr P

Cloud Computing's win confirmed the stranglehold that the Mr Prospector male line has maintained on the Preakness Stakes. The 2017 winner is one of no fewer than 16 Preakness winners descended from Mr P to date.

While his male line has indeed exerted a remarkable influence over North America's championship races, it is also worth noting that Cloud Computing traces back in female line to one of the truly great tap root mares in Alcibiades (Supremus).

Other notables descended from Alcibiades include Kentucky Oaks runner up, Pillow Talk (Mr Trouble), Gr1 winning 2yo, Secret Hello (Private Account), and former South African sire, Raise A Man (Raise A Native).

United They Stand!

County Kildare is a world away from the rustic rural setting of Piketberg but Bennie van der Merwe and his Moutonshoek team will have their eyes firmly focussed on the Curragh on Sunday where a full sister to their new sire is set to line up in the Gr1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas.

The United States, one of more than 60 Gr1 winners sired by Galileo, will stand his first season at Moutonshoek this year.

His full sister Hydrangea, is one of 13 potential runners for the Gr1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas.

One of the better 2yo's of last year, when second in both the Gr1 Moyglare Stud Stakes and Gr1 Dubai Fillies' Mile, Hydrangea defeated QIPCO 1000 Guineas winner Winter when successful in the Gr3 Ballylinch 1000 Guineas Trial two starts back.

Hydrangea has won or placed in six of her nine outings to date, and has already amassed more than £220 000 in prize money.

Her sire, responsible for both the English 2000 and 1000 Guineas winners this year, could be represented by four runners in Sunday's classic, with Galileo's likely starters including the abovementioned Winter.

The United States, was a top class racehorse, who banked more than £1 million in stakes. His victories included the Gr1 Ranvet Stakes, Gr2 Crystal Mile and Gr3 KPMG Enterprise Stakes, with The United States also having won first time out, over 1400m, as a 2yo.

The United States and Hydrangea are out of G3 Prix d'Arenberg winner Beauty Is Truth, a daughter of outstanding sire and broodmare sire Pivotal. Beauty Is Truth is also the dam of Gr3 Anglesey Stakes winner Fire Lily who ran second to multiple Gr1 winner Elusive Kate in the 2011 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac.

Ready To Be My Valentine?

South African-bred Gr1 winner Happy Valentine will be on offer from Team Valor International as part of Arrowfield Stud's consignment to the Magic Millions Gold Coast National Broodmare Sale on June 1 in Queensland, Australia.

The 6-year-old daughter of Silvano should garner considerable international interest and of special interest to South African breeders will be that she has been covered by More Than Ready- the sire of young stallion Gimmethegreenlight, the Gr1 Queen's Plate winner.

He won the 2000 Guineas, the Irish 2,000 Guineas, the St. James's Palace Stakes and the Sussex Stakes in 2008. He was retired to Ashford Stud in Kentucky after the 2008 Breeders' Cup Classic, where he ran second to Raven's Pass — with the favourite Curlin, considered the world's best dirt horse, well beaten.

In the 2010 season, Henrythenavigator shuttled between Ashford Stud and Coolmore's Australian farm, and was later shuttled between Coolmore's Ireland and Australia farms. He sired three Gr1 winners in total.

An A\$10 000 buy at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale in January 2014, Ten Gun Salute (a half-brother to 10 winners) was sold for R1,150 million at the Lanzerac Ready To Run Sale later that year.

Ashburton-based trainer Duncan Howells attributed Ten Gun Salute's dismal effort in the Drill Hall Stakes at his previous outing to a back muscle issue and paid generous tribute to physio Beth Shaw and his own team.

Originally bought – some would argue stolen- at the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale in January 2014 by Heritage Bloodstock for A\$10 000, Ten Gun Salute was offered at the Lanzerac Ready To Run Sale in October 2014.

David Allan of Allan Bloodlines outlayed R1 150 000 there for the half-brother to ten winners.

The winner is by former Coolmore shuttler Henrythenavigator (USA) out of Ladybird Blue (Bluebird), who was placed in the Gr1 South Australia Oaks and is a dual Stakes winner who traces in female line to Noble Lassie, the dam of Vaguely Noble.

Ten Gun Salute, whose previous biggest score was in the Listed Michael Roberts Handicap in January 2016, has now won 4 races with 5 places from 16 starts for stakes of R702 400.

In yet another confident feature show, underrated rider Chase Maujean got the Woodruff runner up to win by a short head in a time of 97,35 secs.

The 2016 Gr2 Gauteng Fillies Guineas winner Heaps Of Fun, under replacement rider Deon Sampson, had looked dangerous down the inside rail, and ran an improved race to get third.

The Varsfontein white and scarlet is synonymous with top fillies and like many before her, the winner is by the champion farm's stalwart stallion Caesour, who died in 2013.

A son of Nureyev, Caesour made history when his daughters Perfect Promise and Dane Julia became the first South African bred horses to win Gr1 races in Australia and New Zealand respectively.

Alexa is a sixth stakes performer for the Irish bred Darshaan mare Alexandra Bi, a two-time winner in Italy. Alexandra Bi was acquired by the Kalmanson family at Newmarket and has produced a host of outstanding performers.

On the same afternoon, the five-time winner Hostwin Galaxy (Redoute's Choice) a son of Alexandra Bi's Gr1 winning daughter Alexandra Rose, ran a cracking third behind Huka Eagle in the 1200m Gr1 Chairman's Challenge Cup in Macau.

Varsfontein offered two lots (#275 and #276) from this family on the BSA National Yearling Sale earlier this month.

A daughter of Captain Al out of a full-sister to Saturday's winner was withdrawn. A Judpot colt out of Albizia (Fort Wood-Alexandra Bi) was snapped up for R400 000 by Tawny Syndicate.






