Brett Crawford's win in the Post Merchants on Friday night at Greyville took his SA Champions Season tally to seven wins and he has earned more than any other trainer during this year's festival of racing. Crawford's total earnings in KZN from the Champions Season's opening night on May 7 until the end of Friday Night's Post Merchant's meeting was R3,171,575. Another statistic where Crawford is top, according to Gold Circle's David Thiselton, is the betting profit per runner. A R1 stake on all 27 of his runners would have returned a profit of R41.



Champion mare Winx has returned to the Sydney stable of trainer Chris Waller. Winx, who was recently inducted into the Australian Racing Hall of Fame, is preparing for an historic spring campaign in which she will attempt to join the legendary Kingston Town as the only horse to win three Cox Plates. Currently the second highest rated horse in the world behind champion US galloper Arrogate, she posted her 17th consecutive victory and her 12th at Gr1 level when winning the Queen Elizabeth Stakes in April to advance her incredible record to 21 wins from 27 starts.
