Behind the scenes of the glamour and pomp 'n sparkle of Sun Met day, the racing gods were keeping an eagle eye on the all important component of betting turnover. Does it work having three local racemeetings on a day that one would think the average punter was surely only interested in what was happening at Kenilworth?

With the sun having set on the Cape's flagship raceday, the post-mortems have centred around the highlights of a superb performance by a 3yo filly, the historic stamp of approval from the Hong Kong Jockey Club, and the ever lingering cloud of local betting turnovers under pressure.

The exploits of Street Cry's daughter Oh Susanna and the winning Snaith team have been extensively covered in the ensuing pages. Beyond the champion performances on the day, it is remarkable that the event actually stood up bravely to one of its most testing build-ups in recent memory.

"Tough economic conditions, with junk status the newest buzz-word, and the devastating drought that is crippling the Western Cape formed an ominous backdrop to the 2018 Sun Met. We expected it to be tough and it was thus a tremendous boost and privilege to have the Hong Kong involvement," Phumelela Sports Betting Executive, Vee Moodley, told the Sporting Post.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club simulcast only the major meetings from around the world and the announcement that the betting-crazy racing jurisdiction were to

take six races from Kenilworth was a coup for Saftote- even though local punters don't benefit directly.

There is no question that the Mayfair Speculators implosion in early December was an albatross around the neck of the Met build-up. Two of the fancied runners in the race carried the silks of South Africa's champion owners and the uncertainty around their participation, coupled with the mass political outcry, only abated 24 hours before the off. And even then, there was no certainty as to what Saturday would bring.

While attendance figures have not been published, the general consensus is that Oh Susanna's great victory was witnessed by one of the smallest crowds in living memory. And that is taking cognisance of the fact that most of the spectators these days are housed under cover.

The betting turnovers didn't emerge unscathed. Down about 10% year-on-year, the Hong Kong simulcast was to become an unlikely game saver.

Unlike commingling, where the overseas players gamble into our local pools, simulcasting entails the sale of the television picture and the payment of royalties. While no sums have been published, we are aware that the Mauritius agreement with SA racing involves a 3% royalty. There is talk that we could get commingling from Hong Kong on the 2019 Met. Their Met win pool was R4 million on Saturday. So that is an exciting proposition!

The Hong Kong players ploughed R176 million into their menu of six races, while our punters could only find R64 odd million for 30 local races. Turffontein is traditionally our strongest Saturday drawcard for punters, but why run three local meetings?

"It worked last year but we will revisit our programming for 2019," Gold Circle Racing Executive Raf Sheik told the Sporting Post. The Greyville Saturday meeting bore the brunt of the Sun Met shadow, with 'embarrassing pools' – trying as it was, in terms of its later scheduling, to compete into the teeth of the quartet of Gr1's at Kenilworth..

"Next season, I believe we will only race on Friday evening and Sunday afternoon," adds Raf Sheik, who says that 'what works one year, doesn't necessarily apply the next year'.

Who knows what the future holds?

Now For The July

With the sun having set on the 2018 Met, South Africa's leading bookmakers Hollywood have come out ahead of the field again and published the maiden ante-post market for the 2018 Gr1 Vodacom Durban July.

The R4,25 million 2200m contest will be run at Greyville on Saturday 7 July 2018.

We are months away from first entry date but the debate will be hot with the astute player looking to take a position for some serious value. Classic Hands Up

Gr3 Tony Ruffel Stakes Turffontein

After a Cape summer season of mixed fortunes, Mike de Kock is back home and goes for a hat-trick of wins in the R250 000 Gr3 Tony Ruffel Stakes at Turffontein on Saturday. The champion saddles a decent trio of runners.



The weights in this 3yo feature are structured with two-time winners and less carrying 53 kg, with an additional 2kg penalty for every win thereafter with a maximum of 57kg. Winners of Gr1 races (there are none in the field) get 3kg, Gr2 winners get 2kg and Gr2 winners just 1kg.

Top of the ratings is the Bush Hill

Stud bred Curved Ball gelding Seerite, who grabbed the attention when chasing Monks Hood home in a thrilling finish to the Dingaans. He won on debut and ran a cracking fourth behind Zen Arcade in the Graham Beck Stakes at only his second start. This fellow has done little wrong!

Piere Strydom partners Stuart Pettigrew's promising Gimmethegreenlight gelding Surcharge, who won the Listed Secretariat Stakes over the course and distance last time out. A winner of 4 of his 6 starts, this good-looking galloper is likely to prefer 1800m in time to come and looks a genuine class act.

Anthony Delpech partners what appears to be the De Kock elect in the Teofilo colt, Yakeen. The promising Australian-bred has won two of his 3 starts by an aggregate of six lengths and impressed when beaten Soldier On going away last time. He has drawn on the paint.

After his Dingaans no-show, his stablemate Pietro Mascagni got his confidence back with a smart Vaal 1500m Handicap win last time. He was earmarked early on.

Sir David Baird was an emphatic winner of the KZN Guineas Trial at his penultimate start before fading out after leading in the Cape Guineas. He was scratched coughing from his last scheduled start and looks much better than his Guineas perfromance.

Tatts Jooste Dispersal

Markus Jooste was prevented from having runners at the Sun Met meeting last weekend amid the fallout from the Steinhoff accounting scandal, and some of the thoroughbreds in which he is involved in Europe are likely to provide a boost to the bottom line of the Tattersalls February Sale, which begins its two-day run today, reports Emma Berry on www.thoroughbreddailynews.com

The mixed auction has been on the up in recent years, not just in numbers catalogued, which saw it stretched to two sessions in 2017 from its more regular stand-alone day.

Twelve months ago also featured a new high mark when Easton Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}) was sold for 500,000gns to Mick Flanagan. That record price has to be under threat with the inclusion in the sale of the regally-bred Willie John (GB) (Dansili {GB}), catalogued as lot 379, to be sold from William Haggas's Somerville Lodge on behalf of Jooste and the China Horse Club. It's rare to see a Classic prospect change hands at this time in his career but the unusual circumstances of the colt's current ownership means that he will return to the ring where he fetched 325,000gns as a yearling. Since then, the son of Meon Valley Stud's dual Group 1 winner Izzi Top (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) has won his sole start-a seven-furlong novice race at Yarmouth-in eye-catching fashion, and he holds entries for the Derby and the Irish Derby. With only five runners on the track, **Rathmor Stud stallion Noble Tune got off** the mark at Scottsville on Wednesday when the Kumaran Naidoo trained Awesomely Tuned won at her third start.

The good looking filly was bred by S Bunwarie and is out of the three-time winning Cataloochee mare, Awesome Beauty. She had improved steadily from

4th on her polytrack debut to 3rd at her last start, before bounding home to register a good win over the turf 1200m in a time of 70,36 seecs.

The first son of Undbridled's Song to stand here, Noble Tune a half-brother to dual Gr1 winner Honor Code, stood his first season in 2014 and his first crop are now 2yo's.

Bred on the scross of Fappiano x Storm Cat that produced 2015 Triple Crown winner, American Pharoah, Noble Tune's sire-line is unique to the South African studbook as Fappiano is now considered a new branch of the Mr Prospector sire-line

Noble Tune placed second in the Gr1 Breeders Cup Juvenile on turf, and won a Gr2 and Gr3 amongst his outstanding efforts.

He stands at Rathmor for a fee of R25 000.

Michael and Tanya McHardy are the owners of the family business, Rathmor Stud, previously Kingswood Stud. The farm was bought from Dr Allan King in June 1998. They stand Noble Tune and Strategic News. Rathmor hit the news when breeding a rare white medicine hat colt by Kahal named Gran Blanco. Gran Blanco sold at the 2013 Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale for R220 000. Situated near Nottingham Road in the KZN Midlands, Rathmor Stud is 200ha in extent and has about 30 hectares under irrigation as well as 20 hectares of eragrostis that is kept solely for their own consumption.

Al Sahem Dubai Debut

Vodacom Durban July runner-up Al Sahem makes his debut at Meydan this evening for Mike de Kock's yard in the Gr2 Al Rashidiya over 1800m on turf, alongside stablemate Light The Lights, who won just recently.

Al Sahem hasn't raced since he was touched off in the famous Durban race and Mike de Kock, quoted on his website, said: "He'll need it first up, but he's doing well, we're expecting a nice run from him. I've spoken to Sean Tarry about him, he's not a horse that shows all that much at home, so the race will show us where we stand with him.

"I've left Christophe Soumillon on Light The Lights because he is in a good space, in form. We've got Pat Cosgrave on Al Sahem, we thought he got lost in the Deep Blue Sea but he's showing his face in our stable again. "I'd like to see good runs from both of them here."

Janoobi (Jim Crowley) and Noah From Goa (Soumillon) will be lining up in the Gr2 Al Fahidi Fort, a race Mike has won many times in the last 15 years.

"Janoobi needed his first run here, he faded out but he's improved and he's well drawn. He can run strongly from the front so the race may suit him. If he gets away he may be hard to peg back.

"Noah From Goa impressed with his first run after a rest last time, he's improved more and we'll be looking for a forward run from him."

Cosgrave rides the returning grey Liquid Mercury in a handicap over 2410m on turf – this one hasn't raced for a year, he's recovered from a pelvis operation and his action has changed because of that, he strides differently. "He'll come on with the run."

Alareef, who was well beaten last week but stayed on steadily for second, should run another decent race in a handicap over 1200m on dirt, Saturday. He's won over the course and distance twice in the last three seasons and has a chance again. "He's a soldier and he'll improve on last week," Mike said.

Smart Strike colt Pertinacious was fancied to win a 1400m Maiden on turf recently, but he ran no kind of race and Mike said: "He had us scratching our heads, we had no explanation for his poor run but he's back on dirt, we're hoping he comes back to his best here so we can put that last run down to the surface. He shows us ability."

Syncopation has not been at his best this season, but Mike's expecting a better run from him in a dirt handicap over 1600m.

Baroot closes off weekend racing for Blue Stables, he's in a handicap on turf over 1800m and is one that can finish in the money.

Baroot moved up before fading last week and he wasn't hard ridden – he would have come on from that run and Mike said: "He has that come on look, he needed his run last week and should be in the shake-up."

When Justin Snaith won a record breaking 8 races on Met day 2016, in his podium speech after Baritone's win in the last of the afternoon he stated he'd gladly swap the eight wins for a victory in the Met, resolving to apply himself even harder. It took him two years, but on 27 January 2018, he did it, not only winning the Sun Met with Oh Susanna, but saddling five winners on the day, including three Gr1's. With Justin taking a well-deserved break, his brother Jono gave us a bird's eye view of 'Snaith day'.

Phenomenal effort

First and foremost, the win came thanks to an enormous amount of dedication and self-sacrifice from Justin. "Justin has put a lot of effort in – more so than I've ever seen," says Jono. "He does everything himself, even driving the horses to the beach. He's had to sacrifice a lot with his family – and his young daughter in particular- to have the day we wanted. I'm just glad it paid off."

New Approach

In December last year, Justin announced a new strategy for this season – and it's one that's paying dividends. Jono explains, "It wasn't anything specific, Justin just changed his approach for the Cape season. In the last two years we went flat out from the first bell and although it was successful, by Met day the horses were tired, so this year we decided to take it easier. We were a lot more forgiving at home, we didn't run the horses often and when we did run them, it was to bring them along. It was purely a less is more approach. And the results are here," he smiles happily.

This year's Met card showed evidence of a more disciplined approach, with notably only a single runner in the Summer Juvenile Stakes – usually one of their major targets- and rather than the volume of runners of years past, they noticeably opted for quality over quantity. "Because Justin is so competitive, he always wanted our 2yo's to win first time out, which required a lot more hard work into those early races and attention from the handicapper. We haven't run many 2yo's this season, which we think will be a positive later on."

WAYNE MARKS

"On L'Ormarins Queen's Plate day, we ran more horses than we might have wanted to, but we got a call from the NRB asking to help fill races and we try and help Kenilworth where we can."

WFA

Jono was a proponent of changing the Met to Weight-For-Age, campaigning via the Industry Liaison Committee for the switch. "Pure WFA encourages the best horse to win and we want the best horses to win our best races. It took a hard 6 months' slog, but we got it through. Funny enough, at the time, Justin said, 'do you realise, you've just cost me the Met?' I said I still believed it was the right decision for racing in the long term, but as it happened, we supplemented Oh Susanna late and the pure WFA suited her, but I think even with an extra 2kgs she would have won," he states confidently.

"If you look back at the results, Legal Eagle is the best miler and he won the Queen's Plate and we think Oh Susanna will be a superstar in time to come and I think in both cases, the best horse won on the day. It's a good result for racing."

Smooth Prep

"Justin's strategy paid off. We've had such a good vibe in the yard this season and he was so happy with the horses and the team, the day couldn't come soon enough. We've never brought such a robust group of horses to the course and I've never seen Justin that confident."

How the day unfolded

After saddling first two past the post in the day's opener, Sergeant Hardy opened the throttle in the Cape Flying Championship, bringing home the trophy for Veronica Foulkes and her son, Oscar. "It couldn't happen to nicer people," says Jono. "Sergeant Hardy cost R70k and look what he's done. He's all heart. It shows you don't have to spend millions to have some fun. It's a lovely story for them and for all the small breeders. In fact, you have to give Vaughan Koster a mention here too for Snowdance – what he does off a small base is phenomenal – Legislate, Bela-Bela, Snowdance – for us, he's been frighteningly good. Well done to him as well."

Confident

"When Snowdance won the Majorca, we were walking off the podium and Justin turned to me and said, "I'm telling you, the way she won, this year we're winning the Met. And he was right. He was so confident in his team of horses – he knew one would do it

> for him, he just didn't know which one. They were so hard to separate and they all had a winning plan."

The Met

The Met is a race everyone dreams of winning. "But you can only win with one horse," reflects Jono. "We would love each and every one of our runners to have won, but it was Oh Susanna's day." It's been a long slog. How

does it feel to finally have that trophy in their stable? "Even though we got hit by champagne from Grant, no-one felt a thing!"

he jokes. "We're just glad to be part of history, but

SNAITH RACING

Justin is the real star. He's dedicated himself totally to the horses. Everyone knew how important this day was. I'm glad it paid off."

It was particularly special to bring home a Gr1 double for Drakenstein, with the Majorca Stakes as well as the Met. "What Drakenstein puts in, is what they get out. Gaynor does an incredible service for Kenilworth and South African racing in marketing our brand internationally, as well as running the L'Ormarins Queen's Plate. We are so lucky to have her and it's nice as an industry to give her something in return with the big wins. I think Saturday will be one of the most memorable days of her life and something she'll treasure for a long time. What is even more special is that her children flew in specially for the Met and her whole family were there, including Johann, who picked Oh Susanna as something special after the Fillies Guineas. He wasn't focussed on Snowdance, but on the horse that flew up from last to run second. He said, 'That's the one.' I thought he was nuts, but how right he was. A month later she won the Paddock Stakes and then the Met."

Noting that Justin has a knack with fillies, Jono quips, "Even at school! Look at his record: Dancer's Daughter, Captain's Lover, Ebony Flyer, Bela-Bela and now these two. I think the handicapper will have their hands full trying to rate these two this week. I'm not sure they'll meet again – they're each specialists over their distance – but if they ever did, it would be a helluva race."

Grant

"He's amazing and is riding with so much confidence. With Justin and my dad both being competitive riders, good hands are very important to them and Grant has beautiful hands and is very forgiving with horses. He gives them their heads, drops them in and settles them and that's really important for us."

Team Effort

"We've got a fantastic team back home and on race day we've got my mother in the stables out the back, checking on all the horses and managing our lead pony, Royal Bounty, who is worth is weight in gold" (for those who missed it, Sue painted a silver lightning bolt onto the hard-working Royal Bounty's hindquarters in homage to Usain Bolt). "You'll see my dad on him every morning at the track. If any horse has an issue, my dad just trots up on Bounty and sorts it out. He's also one of the soldiers in the yard."

Last, but not least, he pays tribute to their fantastic team of grooms. "Our guys really are world class. I've been to the best farms in the world and I think people underestimate how good our grooms are. The likes of Patrick and Jabu who come to the course with us – each one of them could be trainers in their own right. It's a team effort the whole way through."

Wholesale support

The regular punters love Justin because he is always so open about his runners – "and they clearly made a lot of money on Saturday', quips Jono. But he's quick to mention that it was support closer to home that really made the day. "We have an amazing group of owners in the yard, who are the most important part of our team. They are the reason for our success and we could not do what we do without the support from every one of them. Although we had multiple clients with horses in the Met, they were the first to come and congratulate us and that made it extra special."

Organisation

"Brandhouse did an amazing job for 39 years and it's not easy stepping into J&B's boots, but I think Mumm and Sun International have done a sterling job and should be proud of themselves." "People also don't know how much time and effort Ken Truter and Lyndon Barends put into making the day happen and I must say thanks to them for the way they dealt with everything to ensure the day ran smoothly."

Would it be possible to compare 2016 to 2018? "If you had to ask how the two compare, although one is a world record and will always be close to Justin's heart, I'd say this year would be a hard day to top. I think this was just extra special and will probably be the best day of his career."

Never ones to think small, they are already focussing on the future. "When the export protocols are sorted out, our goal is to win a Gr1 race at Ascot with a South African horse, South African jockey and South African owner. That's our dream. And hopefully one day we can make it a reality for South African racing."

Snaith's Gr1 Dominance

Justin Snaith crowned his best racing day in over 15 years at Kenilworth on Saturday and looks set to chase the R19,4 million gross stakes achieved when he was crowned SA Champion trainer in the 2013/14 season.

With the halfway mark of the season upon us, the Snaith team are currently on R14,7 million and over R6 million ahead of their nearest rival Sean Tarry on the SA Champion trainer table.

The compact Cape Summer Season lasts just under two months and hosts 8 Gr1 races. Snaith won 5 of those.

He got the ball rolling early in December when the Cheveley Stud bred daughter of Captain Al Snowdance powered home under Bernard Fayd'herbe to beat stablemate – and subsequent Paddock Stakes and Met winner- Oh Susanna, in the Gr1 Cape Fillies Guineas

The Drakenstein Stud owned and bred Oh Susanna, a daughter of Street Cry, then won the Gr1 Paddock Stakes on day one of the L'Ormarins Queen's Plate Festival of Racing in early January.

Three weeks later she took on the boys and duly won the Gr1 Sun Met in style – the first 3yo filly to achieve the feat in over a century.

Not to be outdone, Snowdance came out on the same afternoon and paralysed her field to add the Gr1 Majorca Stakes title to her fast growing list of titles.

The Snaiths third Gr1 success of Met day came courtesy of yet another progeny of Captain Al in Sergeant Hardy, who went almost gun to tape to win the Gr1 Cape Flying Championship. With well documented breathing issues, the Normandy Stud – bred gelding runs mainly on a massive heart and has jet engines behind him.

All that was left to Snaith's colleagues was the Gr1 Cape Guineas, won in style by Captain Al's son Tap O'Noth, who failed to deliver in the Cape Derby on Saturday. He still looks a very decent prospect up to a mile.

The Gr1 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate was won for the third year running by the Avontuur-bred superstar Legal Eagle, a son of Greys Inn, who ran fourth in Saturday's Sun Met.

The Gr1 Cape Derby was won by Glen Kotzen's Highlands Stud-bred Eyes Wide Open, a son of Dynasty.

The season ends on 24 February with the running of the Gr3 Prix Du Cape and the non black-type Cape Mile.

These days, a thirteen race card fills me with dread, rather than anticipation. Particularly with a new outfit for the 'style ahead of the field' Afro chic theme and a brand new pair of shoes that I hadn't had time to break in yet.

It is something of a mixed blessing that it is noticeably easier to get to Kenilworth on Met day these days. With possibly less traffic than one would encounter on a mid-week afternoon, we turned into Rosmead, parked our trusty vehicle and immersed ourselves in Met Day 2018.

Look And Feel

When Sun International first announced their sponsorship, I was a little nervous after attending the launch function. However, Sun have been restrained and subtle in their approach and it is paying off handsomely.

They have taken their lead from the tried and tested Queen's Plate template and simply added their own dressing to make the day their own. There were flashes of glitz, but the flourishes served to accent and highlight, rather than dominate and the racing remained reassuringly centre stage. The crowd was small, but elegant and purposeful. It was also very cosmopolitan and perhaps thanks to the corporate support, felt smart and grownup (gone my teenage days of jostling for space on the front apron and sitting cross legged on the grass sharing vodka spiked watermelons with fellow racegoers).

Theme

The course was dressed with flowers and the odd flourish here and there – such as the new winner's enclosure which I thought worked well, as well as a smart new podium.

The bright, but not garish colour scheme is gentle and inviting, the Afro chic theme worked well and from a layout point of view, like the L'Ormarins Queen's Plate, they had set out a corporate lounge area across the chute in the picnic area of old. The dress theme worked well and while there were many first timers, people were interested in the racing and the punters mingled well with the lookers, the onlookers and party folk.

The layout created an atmosphere, while ensuring you never felt you were in danger of getting crushed. The separate entrance and exit lanes across the chute were also a winner to help get people efficiently where they needed to be.

The Racing

The Snaith yard gave warning of things to come, kicking off the card by bringing home the first two past the post in the South African Hall Of Fame FM 84 Handicap powered by Samsung (otherwise known as the first race).

Brett Crawford added another strike for Philippi with Traces in the Summer Juvenile Stakes – outgunning the somewhat infamous PE visitor, Carlita, by 2.5 lengths.

Grant van Niekerk swung into action in the CTS 1200, to bank \$500,000 for the Basses on the classy Dutch Philip. There was perhaps a bit of karma in the victory of Undercover Agent, as his nursery has felt the freeze from certain quarters in days gone by, but with changes afoot, victory was sweet indeed.

The Wrath Of The Gods

While our sales race gladiators got name panels on their number cloths, the Gr1 Cape Flying runners did not and perhaps it was tempting the wrath of the racing gods that put a spanner in the works of the Met day sprint. Two horses failed to pull up after the false start and another bolted the course shortly afterwards, reducing the field to 14. However, it's quality rather than

> quantity that counts and the dependable Sergeant Hardy ran his little bay heart out for a well-deserved first Gr1 victory and the first of the day's three Gr1 scalps for the Snaiths.

> > There is always a quality turn out for the Cape Derby and this year was no exception. However, Glen Kotzen trained Eyes Wide Open was too good for them on the day, winning by 1.75 lengths for an ecstatic Richard Fourie.

Snowdance, Snowdance, Snowdance There was a wonderful class of fillies for the Gr1 Majorca Stakes, but there was only ever going to be one winner and Snowdance blew them all away Grant van Niekerk, posting his third win of the afternoon.

We were still dispensing with the post race preliminaries when a sleek black helicopter landed in the middle of the track, dropping off Chief Entertainment Officer, Usain Bolt. I was curious to see what he was like in the flesh and can confirm that he is as charming as he is gracious. After briefly addressing the crowds

from the podium, his entourage accompanied him up the track, through the chute to the parade ring, shaking hands and signing autographs as he went.

He proved a gracious host during the Met jockey introductions, gamely signing, amongst others, Corne Orffer's skull cap cover. Nicely done.

The Race

A big race, well any race really, is a nerve-wracking event. You want everyone to win, but that's not the way life works. The best one can hope for is a noble and true run race and pray that everyone gets home safe.

The gates crashed open to a quiet reception – the roar from the crowd seems to be a thing of the past. Krambambuli kept them honest in the lead, Captain America loomed dangerously over his inside shoulder and Legal Eagle took his usual position just off the vanguard, poised to strike. It was anybody's race coming into the straight. Captain America stole a march down the inside, Anton posed the question and Legal Eagle took flight and our hearts with him. Marinaresco gave chase, African Night Sky challenged. And then, unbelievably, Oh Susanna found wings of her own. And just when we couldn't stand it anymore, from the clouds Last Winter bolted from the blue. The race offered everything and the filly took it all and raised it.

Heroics, heartbreak and euphoria – and, ultimately, a new hero – or in this case, heroine. You'd have to go far to find all of that crammed into two minutes.

Huge congratulations to the Snaiths, to Grant and to the Drakenstein team on their first Met trophy. It's hard to put into words the time, the effort, the blood, sweat, tears and above all the horses and the hard-earned lessons that got them to the podium on Saturday – congratulations to you all and thank you for an unforgettable spectacle that will have us all talking for generations to come.

If you don't like where you are, Move! You are not a Tree! We seldom take the time to heap praise when we have the opportunity, so now seems as good a time as any to express my admiration for Justin. Despite years of trying – over two generations – the Met had eluded their grasp. His relentless determination to succeed saw him adjust and finesse and above all make the changes necessary – not always an easy or comfortable process – to achieve his goal. He is an example to all of us.

Best of the rest

Richard Fourie (who also had a blinding afternoon, posting two additional wins to go with his Derby victory) fought out the Cape Stayers' finish with Bernard Fayd'herbe and delivered a first Met day victory for Dan Katz. Justin grabbed a 5th winner for the day with Hotel Cipriani and Glen Kotzen and the Woodhill team mopped up the last two of the afternoon.

As the sun disappeared behind the mountain, people started making their way home, massing for the after party, or gathering in knots to reflect on the day's events. As always, there were hidden gems of friends and family – new and old – to be discovered and chats that lingered long into the night. Best of all, my new shoes held up – result !

Disaster management

The threatened strike action was diffused and the solidarity march was conducted in a peaceful and orderly fashion as promised. While congratulations are to be offered all round for the – fortunately successful- 11th hour scrambling that saw an unseemly and entirely unsubtle number of horses changing hands in the last week, including Brutal Force who registered new ownership on the very eve of the race as well as three scratchings as late as Saturday morning, one hopes that some questions will be asked and some planning done for the future. Racing's remit is racing – it's not for us to wade into the treacherous territory of the interests of the greater good. At least, it never was until now, which again begs some interesting questions.

Thanks to the unbending mean-spiritedness of a single individual, we got through Saturday by the skin of our teeth and probably aged 10 years in the process. While it would be nice to pretend this sort of thing won't happen again in a hurry, the events of last year, which included no less than 3 major train wrecks for racing, seem to predict otherwise. Nature abhors a vacuum, so you can rest assured, a new challenge will emerge to take its place soon enough.

Don't Lose The Lesson

The ins and outs of the current stew are for wiser and more considered heads to unravel, but I'm a fan of the mantra that if you lose, you shouldn't lose the lesson. Last week's debacle showed in stark relief that we do not have sufficiently robust processes, wit or the lateral thinking required to deal adequately with a situation of this nature. While that is regrettable, it does offer an opportunities to improve. If we are smart, our decisions makers will take a long, hard look at exactly how and why we got into the situation in the first place and hopefully look at putting measures in place to ensure the next time it happens – because it won't be long – we have some tools to help ourselves.

Maya Angelou said 'Do the best you can until you know better. Then when you know better, do better'. The last few months – if not years- have handed us an extraordinary learning opportunity. Now that we know better, here's hoping we will do better.



When I caught up with the latest member of the 'Jockeys That Have Won The

Met' club, Grant van Niekerk's broad grin was audible down the phone.

When I commented that I could hear the smile on his face, he shot back "I think it will be there for quite a while!"

The 26 year old is so sincere and entirely without guile or artifice, that one immediately warms to him.

Sun Met Star

He has a stellar 2018 Met day in the bag. From 12 carded rides, he posted 4 wins (including the Gr1 Majorca and Gr1 Sun Met) and 2 places. How did the day pan out for him? "It was a great day. Obviously things went according to plan for me. It was just one of those days where you wake up in the morning, feeling confident that everything will go smoothly. From the first race to the last, it was just clear sailing for me.

Justin really turned his horses out amazingly. I would not be able to have a day like that if it was not for him. Getting to chat to Lester Piggott and seeing Usain Bolt was the cherry on the top. And meeting Miss Universe!" he grins cheekily.

How The Day Took Shape

"My day started very well. I won the first on the card and that gave me a lot of confidence going into the next race. Then along came the 4th race (the CTS 1200) where I rode Dutch Philip. I've always rated Dutch Philip. I always worked him at the Basses as a baby - I worked him and Magical Wonderland and would not be able to separate them." Commenting that it must have been a tough choice for Aldo, knowing how fond he is of the colt, Grant agrees. "Coming into this race, Magical Wonderland had the better form. It was a tough decision for him. The filly won well last time. Dutch Philip disappointed in his last start, but he had excuses. I think that's why Aldo went for Magical Wonderland. I just rode with a lot of confidence and knew that if he was back to his old self, he would be the one to beat and when I asked, he guickened like a good horse."

The Eclipse Award is an American thoroughbred horse racing award named after the 18th century British racehorse and sire, Eclipse. The Eclipse Awards were created by three independent bodies in 1971 to honour the champions of the sport.

HUGH **CAN DO**

The last time champion racemare Winx raced without Hugh Bowman was in September 2015 when James McDonald rode her to victory in the Theo Marks Stakes. The star – who won all of her 9 starts in 2017- may miss her regular pilot again on her return to action in the Apollo Stakes at Randwick on 17 February. Bowman is currently under suspension until 22 February but has indicated that he may lodge an appeal.

Best Of The Lot

Arrogate made it a double in the 2017 Longines World's best racehorse awards in London last Tuesday with a rating of 134, ahead of Australian champion Winx - third in 2016 – on a rating of 132. Cracksman and Gun Runner, who won his last outing in the Pegasus World Cup on Saturday, were joint third on 130. Winx' regular pilot Hugh Bowman was crowned world's leading jockey. The Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe was named the world's best race.

Barry Irwin Reflects

The 2018 CTS Cape Premier Yearling Sale proved an interesting event – both in terms of the prices as well as the buying bench, with an overall average at a shade over R500k and median prices of R300k for both colts and fillies.

Notable among the top buyers were the Hong Kong Jockey Club, Amanda Skiffington, Angus Gold and Team Valor's Barry Irwin, who made a welcome return to the CTS buying bench.

Barry is renowned for cherry picking horses according to his 'Colonel Sanders' secret recipe selection process from an eclectic mix of international auctions and pedigrees. He has been notably absent from CTS for some time – what prompted his attendance this year? "I haven't come for several years because I wasn't comfortable with the CTS sales culture. When I heard there had been some significant changes and the promise of more to come, I figured things were moving in the right direction and wanted to show my support. I thought there would be some good bargains, which there were, and I believe in the South African bloodstock industry and wanted a hand in helping shape it going forward."

Selections

Barry purchased seven lots for a total of R3,2-million. His Day 1 purchases numbered lot 12 (Gimmethegreenlight – Fragrant AI), lot 26 Duke's Daughter (Duke Of Marmalade – Heart's Content) and lot 58 (Captain AI – Linda My Love).

He elaborates, "By and large the pedigrees in South Africa, because they're isolated, lack international commercial value and are just not fashionable. Because of that, when a bloodline shows up that is fashionable, people go crazy and whether the individual warrants the bidding or not, people go bananas. But I guess they're looking at something I'm not. Pedigree to me is nice, but it's not why I buy horses."

Buying An Athlete

Asked to talk us through his selection process, Barry explains, "I buy individuals, not pedigrees. What I do is, my wife carries the catalogue and we go and look at all the horses. After we've looked them over, I may ask what a particular horse is by, but when we go back to our room and go over the selections, that's when I find out what the pedigrees are. I would obviously like a nice pedigree, but for me, that's a secondary consideration."

"What I'm trying to do is buy an athlete. At a sale like this, they're well raised and in most instances, well presented. There's no-where else on earth I can go and get horses of this quality for US \$25,000-50,000. In the USA, horses like this would cost five times that amount. There are some terrific looking horses here."

What Caught His Eye

"When I first looked around, there were three I really liked and about half a dozen I would have been glad to race. On the first day, I just bought the three I liked." He continues, "I've bought plenty of Captain Al's over the years and hip 58 fit the mould. Of all the sires I've seen since I've been coming here, Captain Al gets the most American-like horse. I always gravitate towards them because that's what I'm used to. I like Gimmethegreenlight a lot too." "The horses I bought from this sale are all pretty much the same – not too big, not too small. They're medium-sized, well-balanced horses that are well proportioned and walk well. There was only one larger horse, hip 12, a Gimmethegreenlight out of Fragrant Al. She's going to be a big girl, but I thought she looked really good. She was a buy back that I bought out the back and Hassen Adams is keeping a leg of that one."

Barry was particularly pleased with his second purchase. "Lot 26 is a Duke Of Marmalade filly that I thought I got an incredible deal on. The guy that bred and sold her is a friend of Jono Snaith's and asked if he could stay in for a part share. I said I don't really want to sell any of her right now, it was just such a great deal and I want to think about it for a while, but in the end I let Anthony Peter stay in for half."

On Sunday, he bought lots 173 (Querari – West Coast Mama), lot 205 (Visionaire – Bint Susu), Lot 206 (Visionaire – Black Current) and lot 228 (Gimmethegreenlight – Country Girl). "Glen Kotzen asked me to look at a Visionaire colt he liked, and I found a filly I liked, which turned out to be by Visionaire as well. I was happy to buy them both because I own half the stallion and want to try and support him and I thought I got some really good representatives, especially the colt. While I was there, I wound up buying two more lots – a Gimmethegreenlight and a Queraribecause they were going so cheaply."

Value for Money

Barry is highly enthused about the value on offer on the local market. "I get so excited here. There's no place else I can get quality like this at these prices. People here get down on horses too quickly. Take Var for example. He had some beautiful individuals that were just being given away - I don't get it. I know Jooste was one of his biggest supporters, and I suppose him not being there hurt their average, but there were some terrific ones selling for peanuts."

Barry's purchases will all stay and race in South Africa, with the majority earmarked for Snaith Racing and the Visionaire filly and colt going to Mike Robinson and Glen Kotzen repectively.

Overview

There has understandably been a lot of apprehension and tension about Markus Jooste's dramatic exit – how did he gauge the overall mood? "I think it was a perfect storm type situation in that Hong Kong had a very good reason to come here, based on what's going on with their relationship with Australia, so the timing couldn't have been better and helped the upper market."

"From my perspective, the mood at the sale was buouyant. Everyone was talking about the elephant in the room of course, but people were happy to be there, and overall the mood seemed to be positive and optimistic for the future."

"With some of the big players gone, there was an expectation that it would hurt the aggregate, but not the median. I predicted that if there was an accurate way to adjust the numbers of the past two years to take out the Jooste impact and then compare it with what happened this year, I think the figures would look pretty accurate."

"I think there were other people like me, who had been sitting on the sidelines who have been encouraged to come back now that the playing field is a little more straightforward and I think that's a really hopeful sign."

BREEDING

Local Is Lekker On Met Day



Captain Al

Despite the 2018 Sun Met going the way of Australian bred Oh Susanna (Street Cry), South African bred and raced stallions shone on Saturday with seven of the nine feature races going to progeny of locally bred sires.

The Met day truly belonged, however, to the late champion sire, Captain Al-one of the finest advertisements for South African bred stallions in recent times. The eight times champion sire of 2yo's, and South African champion sire in 2014-2015 was responsible for Gr1 Majorca Stakes winner, Snowdance, Gr1 Cape Flying Championship hero, Sergeant Hardy, and Undercover Agent, winner of the CTS 1600.

The CTS 1600- won last year by Captain Al's son, William Longsword – was once again a tribute race for Captain Al, who was also responsible for runner up, Captain And Master. Sergeant Hardy was a second consecutive Cape Flying Championship winner for Captain Al, whose daughter, Carry On Alice, won the 2017 running. Another son of Captain Al, Kasimir, finished runner up in the CTS 1200.

Captain Al is no stranger to making a splash on Met day. The son of Al Mufti- himself sire of 2005 Met winner Alastor- was sire of 2014 Met winner, Hill Fifty Four, as well as such big race winners on Met days as the above mentioned William Longsword and Carry On Alice, while he is also responsible for three Listed Summer Juvenile Stakes winners in the form of Sergeant Hardy, Only Emily and Call To Account.

Our Captain

Captain Al, two of whose sons, Captain Of All and William Longsword, now stand at Klawervlei, is from the Roberto (sire of Al Mufti) male line which is enjoying something of a resurgence.

Dynaformer's (Roberto) son, Point Of Entry, who ended 2017 as the seventh leading first crop sire in North America, made a very encouraging start with his first two-year-olds last season, including the brilliant and unbeaten G3 winner, Analyze It. Other sires responsible for a major winner last year included Duporth (Hey Doc), Domesday (Ruthven) and Dynaformer. The latter is also responsible for previous Gr1 sires in Temple City and Purim and is broodmare sire of Gr2 winner, Sharp Susan, the dam of record breaking 2018 Sun Met winner, Oh Susanna. Philanthropist, sire of recent Hong Kong Classic Mile runner up Singapore Sling, is another from the Roberto male line.

Dynasty

Dynasty, once again, was prominent on one of the country's biggest race days.

The former Horse Of The Year, and four times Equus Outstanding Stallion was represented by his fourth Gr1 Cape Derby winner when Eyes Wide Open downed a star studded field in Saturday's R1 000 000 contest. Dynasty's previous Cape Derby winners include the sires, Jackson and Legislate, as well as It's My Turn. Eyes Wide Open could well join the ranks of the South African stallion band in the not too distant future.

Eyes Wide Open- bred on the same mating as this season's Gr1 Summer Cup winner, Liege- is from the same Dynasty/Jallad cross as 2016 Derby winner, It's My Turn, and he was one of two graded winners on the day for his sire. Dynasty's second Met day feature race winner came in the form of Gr2 Cape Stayers race winner, Let It Rain, a half-brother to another locally bred sire in the form of Soft Falling Rain.

Last season's Champion First Crop Sire, What A Winter, was yet another locally bred stallion to come good on Sun Met day. The triple Equus Champion enjoyed a notable sales race feature double with sons, Agent Of Fortune and Dutch Philip, winning the Kuda Sprint and CTS 1200. The CTS 1200 proved a bonanza for progeny of What A Winter with the sire's daughter, Magical Wonderland, finishing third.

Home Grown

The first three home in the CTS 1200 were all sired by homegrown stallions.Seven times champion sire, Jet Master, one of the greatest sires bred in this country, is broodmare sire of Saturday's Kuda Sprint winner, Agent Of Fortune, while Jet Master's son, Pomodoro, is sire of Kuda Sprint runner up, Cirillo.

Pomodoro had just two runners on Sun Met day, with another son, Royal Italian, finishing third in the Listed Tattersalls Summer Juvenile Stakes. Jet Master, also responsible for another promising young sire in Master Of My Fate and damsire of recent Gr1 Paddock Stakes runner up, Lady In Black, is also sire of Saturday's Gr2 Cape Stayers runner up, Master's Eye.

Fans of South African bred sires can also take solace from the fact that currently the first two sires on the First Crop Sires List – Pomodoro & Master Of My Fate- are both locally bred stallions, and both are by Jet Master.

Could a locally bred and raced stallion head the First Crop Sires list for a second year running?

Winter Winners

Last season's Champion First Season Sire What A Winter enjoyed a feature double on Sun Met day.

The four time Gr1 winner had a pair of big race winners, in the form of Agent Of Fortune and Dutch Philip, who won the Kuda Sprint and The CTS 1200 respectively.

The CTS 1200 proved a particular triumph for What A Winter, whose daughter Magical

Wonderland ran third to Dutch Philip in the \$500 000 feature. Last season's brilliant two-year-old Dutch Philip picked up his fifth career win, from just ten starts, when he beat the progressive Kasimir.

Trained by Vaughan Marshall, Agent Of Fortune made an impressive winning debut when he stayed on smartly to land the R350 000 Kuda Sprint over 1000m, under the urgings of rider MJ Byleveld.

What A Winter enjoyed more success at Scottsville on Sunday, when his son Winter Blues made it three wins on the bounce when victorious over 1000 metres. Bred by Dr Ian Heyns, the 3yo Winter Blues has now won all three starts since relocating to KZN.

How To Buy A Derby Winner

Dynasty, winner of the 2003 Cape Derby, was represented by his fourth Gr1 Investec Cape Derby winner in seven years when his son Eyes Wide Open captured the 2018 Cape Derby at Kenilworth on Saturday.

Bred by Highlands, the handsome Eyes Wide Open follows in the footsteps of Dynasty sons Jackson, Legislate and It's My Turn. Both Jackson (Highlands) and Legislate (Drakenstein) went to stud

Dynasty is also responsible for fellow Derby winners Irish Flame (SA Derby, Gold Circle Derby) and Winter Derby winners African Night Sky and Dynastic Power. Another son of the sire, Sage Throne, was demoted from first place in the 2011 G22 Gold Circle Derby, while Dynasty son Dynamic was second in the 2013 Investec Cape Derby, while Dynasty sired Cape Guineas winner Act Of War was runner up in the 2015 Cape Derby.

The evergreen Dynasty is enjoying another superb season, including Summer Cup winner Liege, unbeaten Gr3 Flamboyant Stakes winner Hashtagyolo, Gr2 Southern Cross Stakes victress Just Sensual and Our Emperor.

A Gr1 Breeders Cup Juvenile winner, Uncle Mo won 5 of 8 starts and earned \$1,606,000. He recorded the highest Beyer figures of his generation at both 2 (108) and 3 (118). He was trained by Todd Pletcher and ridden in all his races by John Velazquez.

Love The Chase, dam of two-time US Horse of the Year California Chrome, will visit Uncle Mo this year.

A first Snaith Met win, the first 3yo filly to win the Cape flagship in over a century for Justin's top owners Drakenstein Stud – and a chance to meet one of the globe's sporting icons in the process. It doesn't get too much better than that!

Met day dominance has become a regular activity on the Snaith marketing calendar, and they pulled off their biggest coup to date with a smashing daughter of Street Cry. With the race being run at weight-for-age for the first time in history, the treble L'Ormarins Queen's Plate champion Legal Eagle was widely expected to get third time lucky. But it was not to be in a race that saw plenty of tactical jockeying for positions early on. Stablemate to the winner, Krambambuli led Legal Eagle at a fair gallop, with Oh

Due to the absence of clear distance markers and extreme variations in camera work, taking split times presented challenges. We are happy with the accuracy of the times, but the 400m times may be less reliable due to various positions on the course at that point. Due to poor camera angles we had to take some liberties with the stayers race.

- **Sun Met** Visibly it looked as if nobody really wanted it early on, but despite that they still set off at a fair clip. The gallop appeared reasonable throughout, until it slowed in the home straight (going not much faster than the stayers). The overall time on the day was a decent one.
- **Cape Derby** the leaders slowed it up on the bend, where the field became very tightly bunched, before the predictable sprint home up the straight clearly a false run race, where the final result may not stand the test of time.
- **CTS Mile** there was a lot of pulling going into the bend, and horses in the front rank were being held back (Captain And Master & Undercover Agent); very slowly run early, predictably resulting in a sprint up the straight; the first three entering the home straight were the first three home- clearly a false run race, where the final result may not stand the test of time
- **Majorca S** Pace setter Final Judgement didn't break particularly well, but did then work very hard early to get the lead; she opened up around the turn and went clear; as a result of this the final 700m appears to be relatively slow, with Snowdance (who'd raced in 2nd) taking over at the 400m, but comparatively this was the fastest race around the turn.

Susanna tucked up in sixth, about five lengths off the leaders.

In the rush for home, Anton Marcus sent Legal Eagle down the middle as Captain America slipped through the inside path. At the 200m marker Legal Eagle was being hailed a popular winner and had them at full stretch as Oh Susanna and Marinaresco chased hard.

The race changed complexion at 75m as Oh Susanna hit the front, with Legal Eagle on the skids with the needle in the red. As Grant van Niekerk commenced his victory celebration four strides from the line, Piere Strydom swooped as he launched Last Winter from a hopeless looking position 10 lengths back at the 200m, to get within a half length of the winner. The winner's time was 123,50 secs in a race run off a muddling pace – but it wasn't total slow motion.

The times over the past five years confirm that – Hill Fifty Four (123,93 secs), Futura (125,38 secs), Smart Call (123,17 secs), with Whisky Baron the quickest at 122,71 secs. The winner was bred by Drakenstein Stud and is by Street Cry out of the valuable USA six-time winner Sharp Susan (Touch Gold), who was purchased for A\$1 million in foal to Street Cry in 2012. The good news is that Sharp Susan is in foal to Galileo and will foal down in late February. Oh Susanna has won 3 races: 2 Gr1's with 3 places from 8 starts for stakes of R3 773 375.

Snaith Officer Salutes

A Gr1 false start on a major raceday with Hong Kong betting on our racing was not the ideal tonic for our racing authorities at Kenilworth on Saturday. But things ended well with the eventual tote favourite winning and saving a few punters.

After the enthusiastic 8yo Tevez had jumped the gun, the 17 horse field for the Gr1 Cape Flying Championship was reduced on restart through the late withdrawal of Search Party, Olympian and Mike de Kock star Naafer, who Anthony Delpech was unable to pull up.

After pacing it down the inside with Bold Respect and Percival, it was apparent that Sergeant Hardy was in a galloping mood and despite some looming threats from the likes of Trip To Heaven and Brutal Force, Bernard Fayd'herbe kept him focussed to win easily by 1,25 lengths in a time of 58,74 secs and give Justin Snaith the first leg of a glorious Gr1 treble. Trip To Heaven, who only jumped marginally slowly, came on strongly to grab his second consecutive runner-up cheque in this race.

Despite his breathing issues, Sergeant Hardy continues to more than pay his way for the Foulkes family. This was his 8th win – his first Gr1 – with 5 places from 17 starts for stakes of R1 823 375. The now 4yo was knocked down to Glen Kotzen at the 2015 Cape Premier Yearling Sale for R450 000, but subsequently failed the post-sale scope which resulted in the sale being cancelled. At the Ready to Run Sale his right vocal chord remained paralysed, and a veterinary certificate to this effect was posted on his stable door. It was at this sale that he was bought back for R70 000 – an extraordinary price for a horse with an advertised defect! Bred by Normandy Stud, he is by deceased champion sire Captain Al (Al Mufti) - who sired the winner of the earlier \$500 000 CTS 1600 - out of the four-time winner Hard Lady (by Hard Up), who also raced in Veronica's vieux rose and white silks.

Gr1 Cape Flying Championship 1000m Winner Sergeant Hardy (best handicapped) set the pace; ran on strongly final 400m Runner-up Trip To Heaven raced 4th about a length behind the winner; chased hard but no imprssion

Third finisher Live Life had a shoe replaced at the start; raced in the rear 5 lengths off the pace; didn't find the clearest of passages; appeared to attempt to savage Brutal Force at the 200m marker; ran on strongly late

Gr1 Cape Derby R1 000,000 Eyes On July

The decision to give the Sun Met a miss and focus on the R1 million Investec Gr1 Cape Derby paid dividends for Chrigor Stud and the Woodhill Racing Team when Dynasty's star son Eyes Wide Open charged to victory in the prestigious classic.

A winner of the Gr2 Peninsula Handicap at his previous start against older horses, Eyes Wide Open dug deep to reel in the free-striding Steel Rose, who grabbed a dangerous looking lead in the home straight.

While not detracting from the win, the race was run at a dawdle courtesy of Greg Cheyne and PE raider Kimberley Star, who brought them into the straight in slow time. Comeback kid Piet Botha seized the moment on Steel Rose and took up the 500m sprint challenge in the rush for home.

The Glen Puller longshot continued to roll into the 200m with an upset on the cards. But that's where Eyes Wide Open showed his ability and heart, as he moved up and went past the Gitano Hernando gelding to win going away by 1,75 lengths in a time of 125,62 secs.

Do It Again came out the pack to grab second, ahead of another Kotzen-Chrigor

runner in Pack Leader. Steel Rose enjoyed his moment of Gr1 glory, hanging on doggedly for fourth.

Richard Fourie was full of praise for the winner: "His star is on the rise – this is the closest you will get to Dynasty. He has everything – big race temperament, heart and ability. What a horse!"

The Highlands bred Eyes Wide Open is a son of Dynasty (Fort Wood) out of the one time winning Live Your Dreams (Jallad). An R850 000 BSA KZN Sibaya Yearling Sale graduate, Eyes Wide Open is a dual Gr1 winner now with 4 wins and 1 place from his 8 starts for stakes of R1 408 375.

Bolts Of Blue

With Met ambassador Usain Bolt's helicopter landing during the R1 million Gr1 Majorca Stakes post-race interview, Grant van Niekerk's chirp of 'this one's for you Usain, my man' typified the confidence of a young jockey at the top of his game. Even a slight error of judgement, when overconfidently probably hitting the front a few seconds early on the keen-to-run and highly vaunted Cape Fillies Guineas winner Snowdance, didn't matter. Van Niekerk's bravado and confidence, and the top-class ability of a filly that annihilated subsequent Sun Met winner in the Cape classic in early December, saved the day.

Simply, Snowdance didn't start a banker of the day and at 1-8 for nothing, and she really was too good for a field that included a year older Cape Fillies Guineas winner, a KZN Fillies Guineas winner and some other very decent - older - stakes performers. Always stalking the leaders, the good-looking Snowdance drew off in the straight and briefly hit a flat spot before drawing away to flatter her opposition with a 1,50 length winning margin – in a time of 98,2 secs. The Victress Stakes winner Star Express finally drew well and she stayed on gamely, ahead of a fast finishing Rose In Bloom under German visitor Martin Seidl. Silvan Star staved on for well for fourth and 2,10 lengths off the winner. She was the fastest finisher and ran a cracker from a wide draw.

Bred by Cheveley Stud, Snowdance, who races for Jack Mitchell and Drakenstein Stud, is yet another top-class filly sired by the late champion sire Captain Al (Al Mufti).

She is a full-sister to the Listed Laisserfaire Stakes and Lady's Pendant winner Victorian Secret.

Snowdance is out of Gr3 Kenilworth Fillies Nursery winner Spring Lilac (Joshua Dancer) - a half-sister to Equus Champions Bela-Bela and Rabiya.

She has won 4 races with 1 place from 5 races for stakes of R1 566 000.

In his first season as trainer to Hassen Adams, the vastly experienced Dan Katz had plenty of reason to celebrate at Kenilworth on Sun Met day with his first Gr2 success, courtesy of the courageous stayer, Let It Rain.

R400,000

The Highlands-bred son of Dynasty gave a lion-hearted display in the 2800m R400 000 Gr2 Cape Stayers under the guidance of the astute Richard Fourie – who made all the difference.

Formerly with Weiho Marwing, Let It Rain is a strong galloping front-runner who stays all day. But when Savage Wind was sent to lead to make the pace for his stablemate Fortissima, it provided Fourie and Let It Rain the perfect small cover to lope along in second.

At the 400m, Savage Wind had cried enough and Let It Rain was there to pick up the pieces. He was joined by Ollivander on the inside and the threatening Master's Eye who swooped up the outside. With Master's Eye looking a likely winner, Fourie got Let It Rain to lift and he came back with a big effort.

The son of Dynasty rallied powerfully to beat the luckless Master's Eye by a head in a time of 180,22 secs, with Ollivander still just a one-time winner a further two lengths back in third.

A R1,3 million Cape Premier Yearling Sale purchase, the winner is by Dynasty (Fort Wood) out of the one-time winning Gardener's Delight (Giant's Causeway). That makes him a half-brother to 4 winners, including Equus Champion, Gr2 Godolphin Mile winner and present day Wilgerbosdrift sire, Soft Falling Rain. Let It Rain was registering his second stakes success and took his tally to 6 wins with 11 places from 28 starts for stakes of R917 888. He now returns to the Weiho Marwing yard in Johannesburg.

Last Traces Of Summer

Improving smartly on a fair debut, the one-eyed Australian-bred Traces got the Sun Met day feature programme off to a great start when he bounded home to shed his maiden ticket in the R150 000 Listed Summer Juvenile Stakes. As one-eyed horses are not allowed to race in Australia, his breeders Arrowfield race the smart looking bay here in partnership with Ridgemont Racing, and having learnt from his experience first time up when all of his opponents were down his blind side, Greg Cheyne rode a cracker and produced him at the right moment. After speedy Glen Kotzen-trained debutante Princess Elsa led the charge, Traces took command at the 200m, and went on to hold the promising PE debut winning filly Carlita, who grabbed a pleasing second cheque for trainer Alan Greeff. Traces recorded 59,39 secs for the 1000m in the South Easter and won by 2,25 lengths.

The winner is by Arrowfield Stud's record-breaking sire Snitzel, a son of Redoute's Choice, who equalled Danehill's seasonal record of 26 Australian stakes winners in 2016/17, as well as setting a new high mark for earnings and twoyear-old winners, with A\$16.2 million in prize-money banked, with 35 juvenile winners.

Trace's dam Traceability is an Australian-bred daughter of Charge Forward and a half-sister to 2002 Gr1 winner Premier's Champion Stakes winner, Suntagonal. He has now won once from 2 starts for stakes of R93 750.

With a first cheque of R3 734 375, it was a great race for larger-than-life Cape owner Marsh Shirtliff, who also has shares in the third placed Magical Wonderland and fourth-placed finisher, Sand And Sea. He and Bryn Ressell also own Undercover Agent who won the Kuda Sprint earlier. Grant Van Niekerk had Dutch Philip relaxed early and he produced the gutsy speedster at the 300m with a sweeping run up the outside. Bernard Fayd'herbe looked to be moving through ominously on the Snaith's Kasimir down the inside, but they had no answer to Dutch Philip who went on to win by a half length in a time of 72,51 secs. Dutch Philip is a R460 000 CTS March Yearling Sale graduate and was bred by Rex Stud. He is out of the versatile five-time winning Dominion Royale mare, Uppity Ann. He now heads for the Cape Classic at Kenilworth on 28 October.

A dual stakes winner with a bright future, Dutch Philip has now banked R4 140 850 from his 5 wins with 3 places from 10 starts.

A triple Equus Champion and four time Gr1 winner, Agent Of Fortune's sire What A Winter ended his first season last term with his 10 juvenile winners having earned R1 472 750 – which placed him narrowly atop the first crop sires list, ahead of European stars Oratorio and Twice Over. Agent Of Fortune is his fourth stakes winner and originally sold for R240 000 on the 2017 CTS March Yearling Sale. He banked R218 750 on Saturday for owners Bryn Ressell and Marsh Shirtliff.

Numerous samples from around the track has been taken for analysis and as it is now in the 3-5 year period the track could be due for a 'top-up'. With the heavy rainfalls, 'leaching' could have taken place and a lot of the binding material of the track could now be sitting on the base pad.

It has been agreed that the track be turned 'on its head' i.e. lift all the material off the asphalt base and bring it to the top and re-mix with the power harrow. The lower pad has not been touched since the track was laid. Simultaneously the track will be re-levelled.

"In order to facilitate the maintenance programme of the Polytrack, the racemeeting scheduled for Greyville on 14 February 2018, has been switched to Scottsville" said Raf Sheik, Gold Circle Racing Executive.
