

The oldest racecourse in the Southern Hemisphere will become the new stage for 200 South African racehorses when the Champ de Mars hosts the first of 37 meetings on 24 March, headlined by the Duchess Of York Cup.

Mauritius has been the only genuine second-hand market for decades for South African owners looking to offload or take a profit, and the influence of our horses every season can be gauged when the import numbers are viewed against the Indian Ocean Island's total racing active equine population of just 425 horses.

Weichong Marwing and Derreck David have been confirmed as the SA jockey contingent, with an unnamed third pending.

Horseracing is all of 106 years old in the popular

holiday destination and going strong. But an insider tells us that it is not without the problems faced by many racing jurisdictions worldwide.

"We have a passionate culture of gambling on the horses, but the Government is not a great friend of the sport and there is little collaboration before issuing directives. Like the example of field sizes having been set at a minimum of 6 horses. No explanation or rationale has been tendered," said the source, who preferred to remain anonymous.

He said that the authority granted to the PMU- Pari

Mutuel Urbain- the French state-controlled betting system, to broadcast international racing in Mauritius, a country historically satisfied with a once weekly dose of passion, has served to further drain the engine-driving betting turnover on local racing.

"Despite the glut of offshore racing, the locals still prefer the real live product and the hometown heroes," he adds.

The Mauritius Turf Club had planned to hold 40 racemeetings this season but have only been allowed 37, with three Sunday meets dropped. The popular International Jockeys' Challenge, to be held on 1 and 2 December, will thus be the only weekend of racing all season.

There is some real quality in the SA draft. Recent Gr2 Merchants winner The Thinker and multiple Gr1 star Seventh Plain are amongst the list of new season imports. Interestingly, the Mauritius Turf Club freely publishes the names of the new gallopers, and are willing to talk about them.

The same transparent public spirited approach does not apply to our own National Horseracing Authority, who despite the fact that this is by far our biggest export market, do not publish any names of Mauritius exports in their weekly calendar.

On enquiry as to why this glaring gap on the NHA calendar, we were informed that it would be 'given due attention'. And as if to show that they are the almighty power over all information related to the sport in this country, they refused to disclose any further details.

"Due to a court case pending, we are unable to disclose any information regarding Mayfair Speculators/Mr M Jooste's exported horses," says the response, which adds that we may want to 'contact Mr D Brugman'. The Racing Manager has not returned messages - certainly not to us- since the Jooste storm broke in early December.

The only reference we could track to the NHA's reference of a 'court case pending' is Absa's legal action against Mayfair Speculators, which was postponed earlier this month to 30 April in order to give the parties an opportunity to reach agreement out of court. How does that have a bearing on withholding information from the public? No financial figures are ever published and we weren't asking for them.

The policing body of our sport referring the media to the owner representative on a matter of process that should be published for all stakeholders' information purposes leaves a bad taste. The puzzle deepens when pondering why the NHA published the registrations of change of ownerships for the Mayfair Speculators horses that remained racing locally.

Export certificates are required by most receiving countries on export as a means of maintaining their individual stud book records. Our research has shown that Mauritius and Hong Kong, as 'non-breeding' destinations, do not require this.

An official of the South African Reserve Bank assures us that in terms of exchange control regulations, all proceeds of horses sold for export are repatriated back to South Africa. This is monitored through the recipient's bankers.

We await the National Horseracing Authority getting their house in order and maintain our protest of their policy to selectively protect information.

She ran on smartly at her last start to beat a small field over Saturday's course and distance and can challenge for serious money here.

Final Judgement was outgunned in the Majorca Stakes last time out and prior to that travelled to PE where she was beaten out of the money in the Listed Lady's Bracelet. The choice of Richard Fourie to ride course and distance winner Elusive Heart, suggests the latter is the stable elect.

Elusive Heart failed to feature in the Sophomore Sprint last time but should prove more competitive against her own sex. The daughter of Elusive Fort boasts a rare victory over the trip (on the old course) over Snowdance and is worth including in bigger perms.

Seattle Gold failed to find her feet in the summer features but is a

Dean Kannemeyer has two in the field, headed by the supremely consistent Summer Sky.



The 4yo son of Trippi ran on steadily over the course and distance last time and with a 2kg swing at the weights looks set to reverse his 0,75 length defeat by Perovskia. A winner of 4 of his 16 starts, Morne Winnaar, who won on him three runs back , looks to have plenty in his favour from a 1 draw with a handy galloping weight.

Joey Ramsden's chestnut flyer Macduff is a versatile son of Street Flyer, who has never quite found his correct trip. He stumbled in running when finishing just under 5 lengths behind Bishop's Bounty in the Diadem Stakes.

Our Mate Art started his 4yo season like a horse going places, winning two on the trot, including the Matchem Stakes. While racing in strong company, he failed to impress in either the Green Point Stakes or the Peninsula Handicap and is a difficult sort to catch right. On best form he would have an undeniable shout.

The bang in-form Richard Fourie pilots Piet Steyn's consistent Waiting For Rain. The son of Black Minnaloushe never runs a bad race and won a cracker at his last start when beating Benjan in a tight finish. Off his 51kg mark, he may well be good enough to grab what would be a deserved first stakes success.

Mambo Mime was a class 3yo but he has been dogged by bad luck on the health front . He beat Milton at his penultimate start and then looked dangerous briefly in the straight before fading to 6 lengths behind Eyes Wide Open in the Peninsula Handicap. He is an above average sort and worth including in quartets.

Harold Crawford's Perovskia is one of the best produce of Russian Sage and steps up in class after two hard fought wins in handicap company. He may battle to hold Summer Sky at the 2kg weight turnaround but should be in the shake up.

Catkin enjoys a 5kg turnaround in the weights with Fifty Cents for a 2,55 length beating last time and comes in fresh off an 11 week break. The son of Horse Chestnut is very game and can run well fresh.

Fifty Cents survived an objection by the then promising 3yo Horizon to win this race in 2016 and the 5yo is currently in prime form – having won 3 of his last 4 starts. He was a particularly facile winner at Fairview last time and if over the exertions of the travel, he must go into selections.

Summer Sky ticks all the boxes. He is a horse who can be ridden from off the pace and can also go up and make them gallop. He is the pick to beat Waiting For Rain and Our Mate Art.

The Justin Snaith pair of Twinkle Toes and Angel's Trumpet will enjoy plenty of support, with the latter the better on her outstanding fourth after being hampered in the Gr2 Sceptre Stakes.

The Glen Kotzen yard have a serious strike rate when raiding from their Paarl home-base and send out a decent pair of Anneline and Gr2 The Debutante winner, Princess Peach. The latter has not found a winning strike in four starts as a 3yo, but has had her excuses and could be a value bet if things go her way. The daughter of Captain Al ran on well late for third behind star Magical Wonderland in the Gr2 Sceptre Stakes at her last start.

Candice Bass – Robinson also brings a pair of runners up from the Cape. Aldo Domeyer rides Felicity Flyer, who appears to be the stable elect. The daughter of Noordhoek Flyer is a game sort but choked up in the Sceptre Stakes, where she ran well downfield. On her best form she must have a chance of place money.

With no banker in sight, it may pay to go wide. Star Burst Galaxy and Easy Street are two class acts, with the likes of Princess

This race is the first leg of the SA Triple Crown and the unbeaten son of Mambo In Seattle has to be among the runners capable of winning all three legs. He has won all three of his races over 1800m and the Guineas could be his toughest task as there could well be better milers in the race.

The final fields for the Gauteng Guineas and Gauteng Fillies Guineas will be published later today.

An interesting entry is Majestic Mambo for the Paul Peter yard as the unbeaten three-year-old also looks a strong candidate for SA Triple Crown honours. This entry gives Peter the option of running him in this event or the SA Derby which is run on the same day.

Bold July Bid

Pivotal son Wings Of Desire's connections are to consider running him in the Vodacom Durban July Handicap at Greyville before he takes up stud duties at Heversham Park Farm later this year.

The Racing Post reports that the 5yo was trained by John Gosden in Britain for owner-breeder Lady Bamford to win the Gr2 Dante Stakes at York on only his third start in 2016, Wings Of Desire was purchased by Heversham Park in December, in a deal brokered by bloodstock agent Richard Venn.

The five-year-old son of Pivotal was also fourth in Harzand's Derby and subsequently earned a career-high Racing Post Rating of 119 for his valiant second to the year-older Highland Reel in the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes.

Wings Of Desire boasts a true Classic pedigree as a brother to the Royal Ascot scorer Eagle Top and Oaks third The Lark, out of Gull Wing, a Listed-winning half-sister to Pivotal's dual Oaks heroine Sariska. He came out of quarantine last week and is likely to go into training with Ormond Ferraris.

The feature is run on 7 July.

Brett's Baron Opens Innings

Phillipi trainer Brett Crawford reaches a new career milestone with his first Dubai runner at Meydan this evening as Sun Met winner Whisky Baron steps out in the Gr2 Zabeel Mile.

The eighth meeting of the 2018 Dubai World Cup Carnival is a high-quality one including three turf feature races, highlighted by the Zabeel Mile Sponsored by District One Legacy.

The race was won last year by Championship (Silvestre De Sousa) who is back to defend his crown.

Colm O'Donoghue will partner Whisky Baron who returns from a break and is thought to likely need the outing.

Mike de Kock who has both Janoobi (Jim Crowley) and Noah From Goa (Christophe Soumillon) in the Zabeel Mile, is an old adversary of Championship among the ten declared.

Crowley's mount was a very game second in this year's Al Fahidi Fort, whereas Noah From Goa was an even fifth in that race. The latter also chased Championship home in the Zabeel Mile last year, having finished third to him in the Al Fahidi Fort.

Trained by Ahmad bin Harmash for Sheikh Mansoor bin Mohd Al Maktoum, Championship was one of the stars of the early part of the 2017 carnival, winning the 1400m Group 2 Al Fahidi Fort before landing the Zabeel Mile. Sadly, a setback ruled him out for the rest of the season and he only returned to racecourse action in this year's Al Fahidi Fort three weeks ago, when he beat just one of his eight rivals.

Bin Harmash also saddles Treasury Notes (Connor Beasly) for Sheikh Rashid bin Dalmook Al Maktoum. The 6-year-old was an excellent second in a 1400m turf handicap last Thursday on what was just his second UAE outing and first since March last year.

"We were very pleased with Treasury Notes last week on his first run after a break. He has a nice low draw in two, whereas Championship has the outside gate". Bin Harmash said: "That is not a problem though, as he likes to race prominently and should be able to from there. With a bit of luck in running hopefully both should run well in an open race."

Riverton Celebrates A Century Duncan Barry

On 11 February 2018, the Barry family celebrated a very special milestone – a century at Riverton. As that is pretty special in anyone's book, we caught up with Robertson's gentleman farmer.

Duncan always greets you warmly, usually accompanied by quip or two and never fails to find the positive – even when things are looking less than rosy. Being asked after his wife at a sale one day, Duncan shot back, "She's not here." Then, alluding to the fact he'd sustained a few bruises in the auction ring, "She doesn't like seeing me suffer," before flashing a smile to show there were no hard feelings.

But the smile and the enthusiasm never wanes and year on year, Riverton produces honest soldiers that serve their owners well. Everything off the farm is 100% handcrafted, with Barry growing the feed the horses are raised on and taking such a hands on approach to watching them grow that even years after leaving the farm, Riverton horses still respond to his whistle. That sort of care and attention to detail is rare these days, but Riverton is a place where grace is said before meals, where one starts early in the morning and works until the job is done and where business is still conducted with a handshake.

Heritage

The family are descendants of the Honourable Joseph Barry and his nephews who traded by ship and established stores, churches, schools and counting houses across the Overberg in the 1800s. Barry & Nephews significantly opened up trade opportunities for Overberg farmers as the overland route was a hazardous, long and expensive journey that discouraged trade with Cape Town. By the late 1850s Barry & Nephews were loading a million pounds of wool direct for London at Port Beaufort and their custom built SS Kadie steamship was navigating 35km from Port Beaufort up the Breede River to Malgas.

The land that Riverton stands on was purchased for Duncan's grandfather, Duncan van Reenen Barry, in 1918 while he was away fighting World War 1. "The Algerian oak trees that stand watch over the old homestead (now a gracious guest house) came with him from France as acorns in his tog bag and they're still going today," says Duncan proudly.

Duncan van Reenen Barry, known for his great sense of humour and love of life and his fellow man, married Hubertha Deneys van Velden. The pair had a long and devoted marriage, so much so that Hubertha died from a broken heart two and a half months after her husband passed away in 1962. The pair had two sons, George and Alfred as well as three daughters, Noelle, Helen and Jean.

Much like his father, George Barry was known for his sense of humour and great kindness. Like his father, he also went to war, and was injured in the battle of El Alamein when his tank was blown up by a mine. When he returned to South Africa, he worked briefly as an accountant, but returned to the farm full time when his father became ill. George married kindergarten teacher, Philippa Jeffery and like the generation before, had a long and happy marriage and were blessed with three children, Janet, Patricia and Duncan who now runs Riverton with his wife Natasha and their three children.

Celebration

Duncan says, "It's a privilege, more than anything else, to have grown up here. The celebration was organised for 11 February because one of my aunts would have turned 90 that day, so we thought we would make it on the 11th and get everyone to celebrate her birthday at the same time, but unfortunately she passed away at the end of last year. But we were very blessed to have my dad's last remaining sister with us. She is 93 now and still very together and helped raise the new flag we've had made."

As befits a celebration of this magnitude, friends and family flew in from far and wide and congregated in Robertson for a full weekend's celebration. "It was just great to get everyone together. We had my dad's side of the family as well as my mom's side. Obviously not everyone was able to make it but we had over 100 people and some close neighbours also involved. It was great and well organised as usual by my wife."

Horses

The farm has historically focussed on wine and fruit, but in 1967, George started breeding Thoroughbreds with Dr Tommy Foulkes and the imported French sire Jamaico first put Riverton on the map. "They were very successful," says Duncan. "They topped the sales average one year and we've got lucky and had some nice horses and some Gr1 winners." As per the old horseman's motto that it's good luck to keep a grey horse in your barn, fortune has favoured Riverton in the form of grey stallions ever since, including Russian Fox and the current inmate, Blue Tiger. Duncan is the reason there are still horses at Riverton today.

> After the initial success, the horses started to become less profitable and by the mid-80's, George was considering giving up. He rang Duncan, working and travelling in Ireland at the time, to discuss his thoughts and received the reply, "It's your call Dad, but don't expect me back if there are no horses on the farm!"

The horses are Duncan's passion as well as his pride and joy. Although the numbers are relatively small, over the years he has been rewarded by some high profile runners, including the likes of Cardinal Fury (the first Gr1 winner produced under Duncan's care), Domino Man, Potent Power and new sire Captain Of All, but prides himself on their high winners ""Shave VENDER...

BSA Cape Yearling Sale

Riverton offers four colts on BSA's forthcoming Cape Yearling Sale at Mistico and Duncan talked us through his draft.

Lot 3 is called Marco Polo and is by Pathfork out of Remarkable. "This is a lovely big, scopey colt. I actually don't know why it's taken me so long to go back to a Mr Prospector horse. Awesome Power was the last one and he wasn't too bad!" he quips. "Since then haven't been back to a Mr Prospector horse, but eventually I've done it. He's from an old Odessa family and this is a very, very nice horse."

Lot 24 is named Asterix and is by Vercingetorix (who was famously pinhooked and produced by Riverton's Groom's Consortium) out of the Grooms' Consortium mare, Victory Dance. "This is a very nice colt with a lot of scope and is probably one of the nicer yearlings she's had. It's a strong female line that one would expect to produce a decent sort and I think this is the best chance so far."

Lot 62 is a thoroughly Riverton product, being from the family of Domino Man by Blue Tiger out of a mare named Kadie. "Dad imported the third dam, Seavah, from the UK and bred all those good horses out of her. Kadie was the little Barry ship that sailed from Cape Town to the Breede River mouth and up to Malgas. The mare has perhaps been a little disappointing, but her 2005 colt, Captain James (named after Captain James Fowler who captained the Kadie) looked like a decent horse, but was killed in a float accident with What A Winter's brother, What A Question." Knowing how much time, effort and planning goes into Duncan's matings, why Blue Tiger for Kadie this time round? "Honestly? She's an old mare that didn't want to travel. Blue Tiger hasn't done it yet, but he hasn't had the chances. This one's called Unleashed Power and he's a nice colt," he says firmly.

Rounding off the draft is Lot 84, by talking horse Master Of My Fate from the same family as Kadie. And his dam has produced two 4-time winners to date. "This is a colt with a lot of scope. He's going to be a big horse," says Duncan. He has been named Master Mount. "I must have named that!" he quips.

Highlight

Asked to name the highlights of his breeding career, Duncan doesn't hesitate long. "It was probably having three Gold Medallion winners in 4 years. Two were bred for Riverton (Potent Power and Captain Of All) and Link Man was bred for the Tawny Syndicate. For a small stud to have dominated a race like that three times out of 4 years was quite special. Hopefully we'll produce something again this year !"

Captain Of All holds a special place in his heart and Duncan has repaid him with loyal support in his breeding career. "I've got a yearling going to Joburg and one to Durban and I've got 4 foals on the ground and 4 or 5 in foal to him." Duncan speaks highly of the physical types he is producing, "They are very nice. They are more leggy than he is. If he passes on any of his speed, which he will, we should have some early speedsters and being horses that have scope, go on to run a mile. Captain Of All's pedigree is Captain Al out of a Fard mare, which goes back to Forty Winks and Drum Beat, so it's all speed, but he got mares that got a mile, and I think we'll have some milers on what I've seen. He's very exciting. He's got a big syndicate and has been well supported with over 100 mares every year. There are a lot of shareholders and they've all used him, so he's had a wide variety of mares and I think we're going to have some fun."

Fond Farewells To A Great Man

A memorial service was held in Durban on Monday afternoon following the passing last week of one of KZN racing's senior statesmen and long established supporters in Ben Jonsson.

A Chairman of the SA Jockey Academy, Mr Jonsson – known to many as Benji – served as a local executive of the Jockey Club, now known as the National Horseracing Authority (NHA), and also as a head executive of the Jockey Club.

"He was like a father to the apprentices, he was held in such high regard," his great friend of decades standing, Bill Lambert, told Gold Circle's David Thiselton.

Mr Jonsson's love of horseracing included riding in amateur races in the 1940s. He rode at such venues as Lions River Karkloof, Hilton Road, Greytown, Isipingo, Mooi River and Maritzburg.He won a few races and extracted much enjoyment from this pastime.

He also never missed a professional racemeeting as a spectator and loved to have a flutter. In the 1940s he kept a carefully compiled register of every bet he ever took and also recorded the gate fee in the accounts record.

One of a set of triplets, his elder sibling, the late Hugh, was the breeder of Jet Master, one of the greatest South African stallions of all time.

The late Mr Jonsson's connection to Mick Goss and his family started when, as a young man recently out of school, Ben made his first investment in a racehorse, acquiring a colt from Mick Goss's grandfather, Pat Goss Snr, in the mid 1940's for the princely sum of £50.

Legend has it that Ben had only £35 from his savings to spend, and had to borrow the remaining £15 from his employer, which he redeemed at £2 a month. Unable to afford the training fees, Ben leased the colt to the grandfather of David Pianel, famous for his association with the studs of the Rowles family (Ivanhoe) and Sydney Press' Coromandel Stud.

Ben's colt was no champion. He won two heats on the same day at the Lions River gymkhana. But he went on to own many good horses – the likes of the Qui Danzig galloper, What A Question, amongst them.

In his latter years he would still attend virtually every KZN meeting. He was by this time quite a prolific owner together with his son NIck.

Mr Jonsson founded the successful company Jonsson Workwear, which is now owned by Nick. Jonsson Workwear have also become loyal supporters of South African racing and among the races they sponsor is the prestigious Gr1 Garden Province Stakes, which is run on Vodacom Durban July day. A saddened Bill Lambert summed it up, "He was a wonderful, wonderful man ... this is just too much."

"I've had close on 12 years with Sean and I think that's enough. It's just the right time," he said.

Steyn was active at the Shongweni Sale last Tuesday. "I have 10 nice horses to start with. I am serving out

my notice and will slowly move to the Vaal. All my family are up there – I'm just not looking forward to the cold weather."

Tarry Geared For Big Season

Trainer Sean Tarry has confirmed that his horses are fit and well and that he is looking for some big performances from his charges during the forthcoming Highveld Autumn and KZN Champions Seasons.



According to reports, Tarry has earned over R10 million in each of the last three Highveld Autumn seasons and he is expected to cut back the current lead of close on R7 million held by the rampant Justin Snaith on the SA Champion trainer table.

In an exclusive chat to the Sporting Post, the multiple SA champion

announced that former Charles Laird Assistant trainer Lorenzo Karriem has taken the reins of his KZN Sattelite yard from Deshone Steyn, who left last week.

"I want to wish Deshone everything of the best in his new venture. He has been with me since Succesful Bidder's win in the 2007 Drill Hall Stakes and he has played a prominent role in the yard's success. A change is as good as a holiday and I hope things work out well for him."

Sean said that former jockey Lorenzo Karriem would be taking over the day-to-day running of the KZN yard.

"He has had a good grounding of experience with top trainers like Joey Ramsden and Charles Laird and we have a vibrant team ethic and a solid base of top horses and good owners. I want to welcome Lorenzo and wish him success."

As for the recent Randjesfontein Sale of horses out of his yard, Sean said that he was fortunate to have some young horses coming in to replace the older horses.

"That's the nature and cycle of the game. We lose a few and we gain a few. I am looking forward to being very competitive in the forthcoming feature seasons. We have the established structure in place and now we just need a bit of luck to go our way on the track," he said.

Laird Calls Time

Longstanding trainer Charles Laird has called it a day.

The multiple Gr1 winning conditioner told Tabnews: "I haven't officially handed in my licence yet, but sold my last 15 at the Shongweni sale last Tuesday, and am not training anymore. About 90% of my stable was owned by Markus Jooste and since December they have been selling off anything worth racing, so it was time to call it a day."

Part of one of South Africa's great racing dynasties, Laird took out his licence in September 1995, taking over from his father Russell after five years with the yard. Things got off to a great start when National Emblem won the John Skeaping at his very first meeting, and Charles still rates the great racehorse and stallion as "the best I have trained".

Prior to that, he had worked as a handicapper at Turffontein, for the TBA and at a stud farm – so he has experienced racing from many different sides.

After going to stud, National Emblem also provided Laird with a couple of latter day superstars in Nhlavini and Rebel King, and he also mentions Our Giant, Warm White Night, Seventh Rock and July hero Hunting Tower as others that stand out from a long career.

Asked about his future plans, Laird said he was "busy consolidating and winding up the CC and business. After that I will think about what to do next."

Owning The World

There aren't too many jockeys that buy their own racehorses, nevermind taking their place among the little people in racing's cheap seats.

"I've done pretty much everything in racing from handling to riding work and now I've got the opportunity to be a jockey. Having my own horse just seemed a normal thing to do," says Aldo Domeyer. Aldo purchased the 4yo Philanthropist gelding Wish To Land as a package deal along with a Black Minnaloushe gelding Mini Loushe from Plattner Racing, transferring them both to Alan Greeff in PE. "I used to work for Plattner and this horse showed quite a bit if you look at his early form. He's a big horse and I've always maintained that big horses come to hand a bit later than the smaller, more compact ones. The initial idea was to get a few friends involved, but I was quite fond of him so then I thought I'd rather keep him myself." <u>Read more here</u>

Growing up as a horsey kid in Cape Town – well, the Western Cape (I think one needed a visa to travel in and out of Malmesbury in those days), there were not too many options in terms of riding fashion. Lairds was about it (although you did have a choice between the Milnerton or the Wynberg branch). I still recall Andy McPherson personally assisting my mom in helping get me kitted out on my very first visit and I was traumatised when they closed their doors a few years ago.

In those days, there wasn't a great deal to choose from in terms of riding gear- the height of excitement was a pair of plaited (rather than plain) reins and pretty much everything in my (and my horse's) riding wardrobe came with a Lairds label as standard. Breeches were white or cream, jackets were black (unless you were a hunt master) and leather was available in any colour as long as it was brown (yes I am THAT old).

Forward on about a million years and you now have tack shops open most days of the week (and their websites active when they are not), you can purchase anything you like any time of the day or night, from just about anywhere in the world at the click of a button and not only can you get just about anything you want in just about any colour you want, you can even get it with sparkleswith a price tag to match your poor life choice.

Interestingly, while equestrian leisure (and leather) wear has moved on, it has taken a bit longer for things to change on the race track, but one person determined to change all that, is Roxy Joubert, CEO of Jock Performance Race Wear.

Who is Roxy?

Roxy will be familiar to racing fans as the rider of one of Kenilworth's lead horses and more recently as top class SA jockey Bernard Fayd'herbe's gorgeous other half. However, there is far more to Roxy than just being a racing WAG. Combining her flair for style and design with her lifestyle as Bernard's number one supporter, she has designed and created a proudly South African range of racing wear named 'Jock', which has recently launched to great acclaim. As it's always fun to support our racing family, I caught up with Roxy on just how it all started.

Roxy grew up around horses and

rode from the age of 5. So far so run of the mill. However, her foray into fashion came via a rather unconventional route. A serious motocross accident in 2008, resulted in serious medical and surgical intervention which rendered Roxy unable to walk for two years.

However, the shy smile and elegant attire that we know from race days hides a deceptively tough and determined streak. Roxy got back on her feet and eventually back on a horse. A grey, off the track Thoroughbred, as it happens, named Ringing Bells, who inadvertently started her on the path to where she is today.

Small Beginnings

With her good looking new mount, Roxy took up showing and had a particular idea in mind for what she wanted to wear in the show ring. "I wanted something very specific for my jacket and there was just nothing around. Australia and New Zealand seem to lead the way as far as showing goes, so I looked at everything they had available and then designed and tailored my own. When I wore it in the ring, everyone loved it and wanted to know where I'd got it from. It got such an amazing response that my mother said why don't I start making them for other people, so since 2010 I've been designing my own line of show wear under the RJ Equestrian Attire label."

Opportunity Knocks

When she became Bernard's partner, Roxy's life and focus underwent a natural shift. Watching Bernard train and ride both at home and abroad, she realised that while the equestrian wear market was broad, there was a definite gap as far as race wear was concerned. "I noticed that there are few really good brands on the market and very few using technical fabrics, so I saw an opportunity for making something more modern with more technical designs, fabrics and colours."

> With Bernard as her product tester as well as her primary client, it took about a year going back and forth, designing, testing and finishing before she hit on the right recipe, but finally, Jock Performance Race Wear was born.

Logo

First, the name. "I couldn't use 'Jockey', but I wanted something relating to racing, so I looked at a

few options. Jono Snaith helped a lot and in the end I settled on Jock. It's beautiful, clean and simple which helps a lot for branding purposes as the more detailed you get, the more limited you are in terms of what you can do. I'm really happy with it and so many people – in and out of racing – have complimented me on the logo."

In addition to Bernard, Roxy gathered as much help and advice as she could in designing her range. "Greg Cheyne is a supplier for jockey wear as a side business and when I started, I approached him and he offered a lot of advice."

Range

Depending on your chosen discipline, equestrian riders (and suppliers) have cottoned on to the fact that riders come in all shapes and sizes and that there are advantages and challenges to each. Most of us have our inches a little more unevenly distributed that we might like and jockeys are no exception, so the Jock breeches come in a range of options in terms of waist size and leg length and of course, standard and light weight.

The product she is most proud of to date is her performance race vest, available in either short or long sleeves as well as a choice of colours. "The European market would probably use this as a base layer. Here, under their silks, jockeys usually wear either a lycra or mesh top, depending on weight. If they are riding light, obviously they try and wear less." The vest, which can be ordered either with the Jock logo on the collar or unbranded for those who would like to add their own sponsorship details, has been designed with comfort and performance in mind. It is made from a high performance fabric that is hard wearing, breathable and specifically cut and tailored for racing. "One of the biggest factors for jockeys is getting things on and off between races, so stitching plays a big role. We also use compression technology to help prevent muscle fatigue. And everything is 50% UV proof," she adds proudly.

Roxy personally checks each item and even does some of the packaging herself, adding a personal touch.

It's a lifestyle

In addition to her technical range, she has launched a lifestyle range including her popular Supa Fit peak cap and wardrobe staples of cotton t-shirts in black or white, in both mens and womens sizes. "How that came about was that there are a number of big equestrian brands that are so good you can wear them as leisure wear. You get show shirts that are so beautiful you can style them with jeans. I often get comments and people don't even realise I'm wearing sports wear. With the Jock logo and design, I thought it would make a good lifestyle brand."

As with the technical range, the designs are clean and ascetic with the emphasis on comfort and shipping is available both locally and internationally.

Roxy is also fine-turning a range of track wear that will be launched in the near future.

Launch

Roxy did a huge amount of homework as well as legwork before going live, setting up her website and social media platforms as well as having her range professionally photographed – with the help of a few friends. The lifestyle shoot was done at Snaith Racing and they had a studio shoot for the technical wear, featuring Bernard, Callan Murray and Martin Seidl (who will be the Jock flagbearer in Germany).

"It has been hard work, but it's been a lot of fun and everyone has been so supportive. All the guys have given me feedback and helped me fine tune things and I've learnt and taken a little from everyone, so every garment has a story to tell. But Bernard has been my biggest inspiration, sounding board and support. Whenever I got discouraged and said I didn't think it would work, he'd be there to say no, keep going, so we've really done it together."

Big hit

All the hard work has paid off and the range launched to huge demand. "I didn't expect it to take off so fast – it's gone viral! People are really enjoying the logo and the pricing, which is attractive to the international market. I've had orders from Australia and Hong Kong and just did a big order for Karis Teetan. When we posted the photo shoot pics on Facebook, Martin had about 30 orders straightaway. Then Christophe Soumillon shared some photos on Twitter and the phone hasn't stopped ringing!" So much so that she sold out her race wear range within a week of going live and is working flat out to produce new stock.

Christopher won in his new Jock kit in Dubai over the weekend and with three European stores to stock the brand from 1 April, it seems the sky's the limit.

Short Heads



After the news that veteran Weichong Marwing will be riding in Mauritius for the Gilbert Rousset yard, the latest is that Mauritius Hall Of Famer Derreck David could be set for a return to the island where he has achieved great heights in past years. The South African-born David became one of only 14 jockeys to be inducted to the Mauritius Hall Of Fame in 2015. He will be engaged by the Alain Perdrau yard. SA jockeys found themselves under fire in the middle of the last Mauritius season and very few locals were expected to be brave enough to take up contracts in the new term, which starts next month.

BIPOT BLISS

Top class Richard Fourie is now on 65 winners for the season with a 17% win strike-rate after he rode a hat-trick at Kenilworth on Saturday, including the Bipot. The exotic has been in existence for just under 5 years and there is no history of any other jockey having achieved this feat.

Fatty At Fairview

Former Joey Ramsden trained & Mayfair Speculators-owned Gr2 Joburg Merchants winner Brutal Force has his first run for his new owner partnership of Michael Brown, Hedley McGrath & Braam van Huyssteen at Fairview on Friday. The one-time sales record-breaker, affectionately known as 'Fatty', ran a good fourth in the Gr1 Cape Flying Championship on Met day. He is now trained by Yvette Bremner.

VINTAGE VAR

Avontuur's top class producer, and last season's SA Champion 2yo sire, Var is maturing like those excellent reds on his home turf and he produced an outstanding 2yo treble last Saturday. This was highlighted by a pair of very impressive debut winners in the form of the Robbie Sagetrained William The Silent and Vaughan Marshall's Zinedine, respectively. Joey Ramsden's Carioca completed the Var twoyear-old treble when she won at her fourth start. Can Var defend his title this term?

(Mystery

Mike de Kock has reported that two of of his runners bled at Meyday last Thursday evening. Suyoof and Icy Trail, both unplaced in a handicap over 1600m on turf, bled during the race. "Bleeding has been a problem for us this season, more so than in previous years, and we can't offer an explanation why. We can't put our finger on it," said De Kock.

Amateurs

Commentator Alistair Cohen asked if a secrecy bill had been passed at Flamingo Park on Monday. Firstly, the reasons for the delay at the start of the second race was not communicated- and then no word

was forthcoming on a late withdrawal in the same race. It is frustrating amateurism and unacceptable as this is basic process as we race 364 days a year. Obviously the NHA and Tellytrack are not talking to each other.



Stalling Again

While veteran retired trainer lan Jayes simply blames schooling, the old starting stalls bugbear

raised its ugly head at Turffontein on Saturday, where the trainer of the first race winner, William The Silent, called the goings on 'wrong and offside'. Robbie Sage enjoyed a race of mixed emotions after two horses – including his own Dewali – were withdrawn at the start. " Dewali is probably even better than the winner, but ended up standing in the stalls for five minutes. That's wrong. It's offside." The Stipes made a tacit acknowledgement that the fault lay with the poor behaviour of the Candice Dawson-trained Vardo, by not punishing Dewali. But the damage to betting turnover and owner costs had already been done.

More Farce Than Class

The Karaka New Zealand Sale first session ended with a female streaker in the ring. Bookmaker Rob Waterhouse tweeted his assessment of the uncatalogued lot: "An unusual and appealing lot going through the ring : an athletic, precocious type, good stride- plenty of bounce, if a shade frisky. My grandmother might dismiss as 'lacking breeding' and, no doubt, might be expensive to keep in work."

Identity Crisis Trainer Speaks

Yet another case of mistaken identity has had punters and racing enthusiasts hot under the collar.

With the NHA's procedures having run their course, we chatted to Clinton Binda to find out what happened.

How matters unfolded

At the Vaal meeting on Tuesday, 6 February 2018, Clinton Binda brought three horses to the course – Whorly Whorly and Trouble Maker carded to run in race 3 and Night Shadow, carded to run in race 5.

Whorly Whorly is a long-standing Binda inmate, while Trouble Maker (Captain Al – Badger's Cove) and Night Shadow (Silvano – Saratoga Shadow) were relatively new. The two horses had arrived at the yard in late 2017 as part of a consignment of 8 horses from PE. Both horses were to race in the interests of the Hollywood Syndicate & Dreamstar Racing and were both making their debut for the yard on Tuesday, 6 February.

Clinton saddled his two runners for the third race, a 1000m MR86 Handicap, which saw Whorly Whorly finishing 1.4 lengths off the winner in 5th place and Trouble Maker finishing 9.2 lengths last in the field of 10.

Where the problem surfaced

Ahead of race 5, it was discovered that the horse presented as Night Shadow was not, in fact, a 6yo Silvano gelding, but was instead found to be the 6yo Captain Al gelding named Trouble Maker that had been carded to run in the third race. Clinton's runner for the 5th race was immediately scratched.

Objection

An objection was lodged by a member of the Central Provinces Stipendiary Board in terms of Rule 68.3.4 (that the HORSE ran in a RACE for which it was not entered), which was heard at the NHA offices at Turffontein on Friday, 9 February 2018. The Board reached the unanimous opinion that the horse named NIGHT SHADOW ran in the 3rd Race on 6 February 2018 at the Vaal Racecourse under the name TROU-BLE MAKER and accordingly upheld the objection.

In terms of Rule 69.6 the horse that ran as TROUBLE MAKER was disqualified from the 3rd Race on 6 February 2018 at the Vaal Racecourse and all records pertaining to TROUBLE MAKER in relation to Race 3 on this particular day are to be expunged from the official records.

Following the objection, an inquiry into the incident was held at the NHA offices at Turffontein on Wednesday, 14 February 2018 where Clinton Binda was charged with a contravention of Rule 72.1.45 (no PERSON shall present a HORSE to race where the HORSE in question is not the HORSE identified in the passport and/or is not the HORSE carded for the RACE in guestion). The Inquiry Board entered a plea of not guilty on his behalf, then found him guilty of the charge. They imposed a penalty of a fine of R20 000.00, of which R10 000.00 is wholly suspended for a period of 1 (one) year, provided that during this period he is not convicted of a contravention of the same rule.

Miss Tanya Pilgrim, the NHA Horse Identifier on duty at the Vaal Racecourse on Tuesday, 6 February, 2018, was suspended pending a disciplinary hearing.

From the horse's mouth

Now that the matter has been settled by the NHA and all the parties dealt with, Clinton Binda has chosen to share his version of events.

"There has been a lot of discussion about it and I wanted to explain from my side how it happened," he explains. "First and foremost, I understand that it was a serious mistake, but I'd like to stress that it was a genuine mistake that required a 'perfect storm' of build up mistakes for the wrong horse to run on race day. Unfortunately that's what happened. Night Shadow and Trouble Maker arrived in my yard as part of a group of 8 horses. Obviously when they arrived, we ID'd the horses, but we don't have a scanner, so we did it off the passport ID page. The two horses look very similar and somewhere, somewhere along the line, someone got confused. There are a lot of scenarios that could have happened - it's possible that the wrong horse arrived with the wrong sticker - but who knows. The two horses have very similar markings and we got it wrong, it's as simple as that."

Apart from a difference in height, both horses are plain bays with a tiny white star and since their arrival, each horse has been trained as the other, with noone ever suspecting they'd got them the wrong way round.

Global Storm Warning

The influence of former US champion sire, Storm Cat, continues to be felt across the globe. The multiple US champion remains a factor in racing the world over, through a legion of sons, grandsons and great-grandsons, and also continues to be a very important broodmare sire.

Storm Cat, ninth on the 2018 Broodmare Sires List, who ended 2017 as the third leading Broodmare Sire in North America, enjoyed another memorable stint as a damsire last year. The son of fellow important broodmare sire, Storm Bird, was represented by an impressive 23 stakes winners as damsire, headed by the Gr1 winners, Churchill, Clemmie, Decorated Knight, Happily and Satono Aladdin. Interestingly, all but Satono Aladdin were sired by Galileo.

To date, Storm Cat is broodmare sire of over 240 stakes winners, including important and or promising stallions Speightstown (Gone West), Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha), Sky Mesa (Pulpit) and Dialed In (Mineshaft). Now, however, it is Storm Cat's own sons who are making their mark as broodmare sires.

Giant's Causeway

The 2018 List of Leading Sires Of Broodmares is headed by Storm Cat's best sire son, Giant's Causeway, whose maternal grandson, Gun Runner (Candy Ride), won the recent Gr1 Pegasus World Cup Invitational.

Giant's Causeway, who is also damsire of local champion and Wilgerbosdrift based sire, Soft Falling Rain (National Assembly), is still a relatively young broodmare sire, but he has already made his mark in this sphere, with the triple US champion sire already featuring as broodmare sire of 59 stakes winners. Giant's Causeway mares have proved effective when mated to a range of stallions, from varying sire lines. To date, Giant's Causeway is broodmare sire of Gr1 winners sired by all of Gun Runner, National Assembly, More Than Ready, Casino Prince, Malibu Moon, Deep Impact, Kitten's Joy, Fastnet Rock, Lemon Drop Kid, Union Rags, General Nediym, Danehill Dancer, and Northern Afleet.

Barring US Horse Of The Year, Gun Runner, and SA champion, Soft Falling Rain, top performers produced by daughters of Giant's Causeway include Verrazano (Haskell Invitational, Wood Memorial), Eden's Moon (Las Virgenes), Beauty Parlour (French 1000 Guineas), Evening Jewel (Del Mar Oaks), Hawkbill (Coral-Eclipse) and Free Drop Billy (Breeders Futurity).

Giant's Causeway's best sire son, Shamardal, remarkably, is also fast becoming a high class broodmare sire, with the former champion already damsire of Irish 2000 Guineas winning sire, Awtaad (Cape Cross).

Forest Wildcat

Now deceased, Forest Wildcat, whose son, Var, enjoyed such a memorable Saturday this past weekend with his 2yo's, is currently 15th on the Leading Broodmare Sires List. Forest Wildcat is damsire of recent Gr2 Al Fahdi Fort winner Jungle Cat (Iffraaj) and Saturday's Gr3 Fair Grounds Handicap hero, Synchrony (Tapit), and has a total of 61 black type winners to his name as a broodmare sire.

He is also damsire of Gr1 winners Callback (Street Sense), Evita Argentina (Candy Ride), Paradise Woods (Union Rags), Lady Aurelia (Scat Daddy), Sean Avery (Cherokee Run) and promising young Australian sire, Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock). The latter is already sire of G1 winners, Foxplay and Volpe Veloce.



Storm Cat

Forestry

While not in the same class as Giant's Causeway and Stormy Atlantic as a Storm Cat sired sire, Forestry is fast becoming a top class broodmare sire. His tally of more than 30 stakes winners as a broodmare sire includes a Kentucky Derby winner and champion (Nyquist), and three Breeders' Cup winners (Bobby's Kitten, Nyquist and Rushing Fall). Retired millionaire, Green Mask (Mizzen Mast) is another high class galloper produced by a daughter of Forestry.

The former Gr1 King's Bishop Stakes winner, who is from the same family as Mr Prospector and Seattle Slew, is also leading sire of promising US 3yo, Instilled Regard (Arch), the winner of the 2018 Lecomte Stakes.

Hennessy & Johannesburg

Storm Cat's Gr1 winning son, Hennessy, was a champion sire of 2yos, whose offspring won major races all over the world. The deceased chestnut was also a successful broodmare sire, with more than 50 stakes winners, headed by G1 winners Irish Lights, Mi Sueno, Sassy Image and Careless Jewel. He is damsire of G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner, Hootenanny (Quality Road), who is now standing at stud in Kentucky.

Hennessy's most famous son, Johannesburg, best known as the sire of the great stallion, Scat Daddy, is also fast becoming a top class broodmare sire.

Currently 23rd on the US Broodmare Sires list, Johannesburg is already damsire of Gr1 winners Seventh Heaven (Irish and Yorkshire Oaks), Jet Setting (Irish 1000 Guineas), Collected (Pacific Classic) and KZN sire, Crusade (Middle Park Stakes).

Tale Of The Cat

Closely related to Johannesburg, Tale Of The Cat is one of Storm Cat's most successful sons in terms of numbers. The sire of over 100 stakes winners himself, Tale Of The Cat is also broodmare sire of more than 50 stakes winners, headed by Gr1 winners Amazing Maria (Falmouth Stakes), Dortmund (Santa Anita Derby), Sailor's Valentine (Ashland Stakes), Declassify (Triple Bend Hcp) and It's Tricky (CCA Oaks). Tale Of The Cat is damsire of recent South African Gr3 winner, Doublemint (Twice Over).

Other sons of Storm Cat with at least one Gr1 winner include Bernstein, Stormy Atlantic, Tabasco Cat and Tiger Ridge. Inevitably, inbreeding to Storm Cat is becoming a factor in pedigrees. That pattern has already resulted in such Gr1 winners as Harmonize (Del Mar Oaks) and Lady Aurelia (Prix Morny, King's Stand Stakes), as well as Saturday's Gr2 Barbara Fritchie Stakes winner, Locust Point.

Singapore Sling returned at 9/1 in a Hong Kong Classic Cup market dominated by Nothingilikemore, the only horse ahead of the South African import in last month's Hong Kong Classic Mile. But the 1.8 jolly failed to sparkle this time, running home a disappointing fourth behind the Tony Millard-trained bay. There was nothing sub-par about Singapore Sling. Millard's latest stable star looked a picture pre-race and delivered a performance to match.

"It really surprised me, the kick The Golden Age gave – he kicked strongly and maintained the momentum he'd built up. My bloke ran a really strong race though. He felt better today than he did at the mile; he was as strong at the line as he was at any other point in the race," Schofield said after his mount had clocked 1m 46.99s. That ranks as the second fastest Classic Cup at the current distance, just one hundredth of a second off Rapper Dragon's 2017 time. Exultant chased determinedly under Zac Purton to put down his own Derby marker but had to settle for second, a length and a half behind the winner.

Bred by Drakenstein Stud, Singapore Sling, a R225 000 Cape Premier Yearling Sale Book 1 graduate, is by Philanthropist out of the three-time winning Western Winter mare, Sing Dixie Sing. It was a second Hong Kong Classic Cup success for Millard. The handler took the prize in 2011 with Ambitious Dragon, a horse that went on to win the Derby and subsequently proved his merit as one of Hong Kong's all-time greats.

"Ambitious Dragon was a true champion and this horse is still building up to be talked of in the same voice – he has to still do it. There was nothing wrong with his win today, though," Millard said. "After the mile, Beverly (Millard) was of the opinion that he'd got a little bit of spring in his stride and he has come on from that. We just need to keep him like this all the way through. It was a hard fought win and I'm certainly happy that he finished off strongly." Schofield has no concerns about another step up in distance in the final leg of the three-race Four-Year-Old Classic Series on 18 March, the BMW Hong Kong Derby.

"The 2000 metres in the Derby will be no problem," Schofield said. "He's just on the right path, he's getting better all the time, he's relaxing, and mentally and physically I'm very happy with him. He's a lovely horse to have heading into the Derby." Schofield's four-timer also included the Richard Gibson-trained

Wishful Thinker in race 10 and the Millard-trained debutant Silver Fig in race four.


