Mike de Kock watched Saturday's Gr2 Gauteng Fillies Guineas win by Takingthepeace from an hotel room in Australia, where he is attending the Inglis Sale. SNITZEL'S RECORD

After thirty one weeks of the 2017-18 racing season, Arrowfield Stud's incumbent Champion Australian Sire Snitzel has surged to another all-time record for Australian progeny earnings of over A\$18 million. Occupying second position is Coolmore's ill-fated High Chaparral, who made a major move up the leader board after the wins of Rekindling in the Melbourne Cup and Ace High in the Victoria Derby in the spring, with A\$10 million, while Yarraman Park's high-profile sire I Am Invincible rounds out the top three. Lonhro moved back into the top 10 after the weekend's racing.

Sheikh's Trainer Guilty

Salem Bin Ghadayer, who trains for Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum, the son of Dubai's ruler Sheikh Mohammed Al Maktoum, has been found guilty of administering ketamine to a horse in his care. His one-year ban has been suspended pending an appeal. Ketamine is a banned substance and powerful anaesthetic which is used to prevent humans and animals from feeling pain. Ghadayer saddled Mailshot to win a 1600m turf handicap at Meydan on Saturday.

Buyers will have an opportunity at both yearling sales next month to bid on the progeny of Wilgerbosdrift's stallion Flower Alley (Distorted Humor), who enjoyed a pair of US winners this past weekend and also had some notable success as a broodmare sire.

Liza Jane broke her maiden at Turfway Park, while stakes placed Ms Wakaya picked up her third career victory at Santa Anita. Flower Alley son Nessy, a full brother to Gr1 Pattison Canadian International winner Bullards Alley, ran third in the Gr2 Mac Diarmida Stakes at Gulfstream Park .
