The KZN Breeders Series Log for 2yo's is dominated by the combination of Piemonte Stud and Alan Greeff who lead - with top Oratorio filly, Carlita, and the Crusade colt Alfeo, respectively. 212 juveniles vie for just 28 places on the race day. There are two races – 1 each for colts and fillies respectively for stakes of R200 000 each over 1200m. The KZN Breeders Race Day takes place on 30 June at Greyville racecourse, and is exclusively for KZN-bred horses registered with the KZN Breeders Premium Scheme.

Over The Hill?

One of former champion SA owner Markus Jooste's business initiatives — the renaming of the famous Epsom Hill as Poundland Hill at the Investec Derby Festival - has been scuppered by Britain's The Jockey Club, which has stepped in to cancel the deal. In a statement, Epsom GM Simon Durrant said: "Due to the widely reported issues concerning Steinhoff International, we have mutually agreed that Poundland, one of its brands, will not be involved with The Hill at the Investec Derby Festival in June. In future the famous Hill will carry the name Horseplay On The Hill." Some irony there.

Will She, Won't She?

There has been some speculation as to whether Takingthepeace will stay the 2450m of the SA Oaks in her bid for SA Triple Tiara glory on 5 May. While her sire Visionaire has so far produced predominantly sprintermilers, the filly's damline is where the key lies. Her dam won up to 1450m but was also Gr3-placed over 1800m. Damsire Rambo Dancer won a Gr1 over 2400m and his full-sister won the English Oaks. While he produced many top stayers, including Pick 6, Bianconi, Coastal Waltz and Major Hero, Rambo Dancer as a broodmare sire significantly produced the Gr1 Derby and Gr2 Gold Vase

winner Seal, who stayed all day.

van Niekerk booted home 4 winners at Kenilworth on Saturday to take his season tally to 82 with a win strike-rate of 20%. He is tenth on the national log.

He struck in just the third ride of his debut meeting for Rameshwar Gujadhur's yard in the 5th race, as he rode Independence to his first win in 16 months, JP produced the double when clinching the feature, the Noble Salute - Evaco 17th Anniversary Cup (Gr3), courtesy of Nottinghamshire. The five-year old ran a cracker to score his 4th win in Mauritius.



Richard Fourie gave a superbly judged front-running display to win the fourth at Kenilworth on Saturday on the Tiger Dance filly Kamaishi. Trained by Mike Robinson, the win was a special moment for his wife Luella as it was her first success in her own silks. To add to the sentimentality of the occasion, the silks design was created by their young daughter Caitlin.
