The long and winding road to the dream of glory in Africa's greatest horseracing event began in earnest today when Gold Circle announced the names of the 69 first entries for the R4,25 million Vodacom Durban July to be run on Saturday 7 July 2018.

Horseracing loves the cliche's but this really is the one race that every owner, trainer, breeder and jockey wants to win. And the cyclical nature of fortune is reflected in the reality that 2017 history-making winning trainer Candice Bass-Robinson and 2016 champion Joey Ramsden are not amongst the 27 proud conditioners who have taken their first baby steps to stardom.

Dean Kannemeyer, who won the race in 2015 with Silvano gelding Power King, is the most recent title-holder and he has a quartet entered, headed by exciting and lightly raced 3yo Silva's Bullet –

coincidentally also a Silvano.

"It's early days but I want to keep my options open. I rate Silva's Bullet highly and if he wins his next start I will be looking at the Daily News. Then we are suddenly serious candidates for the July! It's My Turn is a Cape Derby winner, while Mambo Mime is a Gr3 winner and very capable – he is thriving here in KZN. The Slade is a tough sort and is capable of going on with it this season," added Kannemeyer.

One of the most interesting entries is past winner Legislate, who recently returned from a stint as a stallion in the Drakenstein paddocks, to come back into

training with Justin Snaith. The Cape champion trainer has eight entries and what a fairytale that would be were he to return to win the race four years later with the son of Dynasty!

Snaith has also entered Sun Met winner Oh Susanna, an exciting 3yo who will be out to write her own chapter of history.

Even the small trainer has a hope. Milnerton-based Harold Crawford has entered Listed Jet Master Stakes winner Perovskia, whose sire Russian Sage twice ran unplaced in the July – in 2008 behind Pocket Power and 2010 behind Bold Silvano.

Perovskia was Crawford's first feature winner in three decades this season and another fairytale lies waiting to be written.

Give Her A Nother

Gr1 Empress Club Stakes Turffontein

It's the Tarry and De Kock show at Turffontein on Saturday. The two power yards boast nine of the thirteen runners between them in the R1 million Gr1 Empress Club Stakes. But the Cape raiders Silvan Star and Gimme Six will keep the locals on their toes.

The gallant chestnut mare Nother Russia ran a superb race earlier this month when pacing it all the way up the long Turffontein straight with champion miler Legal Eagle, before going down a quarter length to the superstar in the Gr1 Horse Chestnut Stakes.

If that massive effort hasn't taken the edge off her, she must be a worthy favourite to land the double in this prestigious contest — and , with all respect, there is no Legal Eagle lurking amongst her twelve opponents.

Glen Kotzen must rate his chances from a 3 draw and with the services of the top-class Richard Fourie, who partners the Silvano mare, Silvan Star. The Ascot Stud-bred galloper enjoyed her first outing here when storming home to beat Gimme Six and Nother Russia over 1450m at the Vaal on 24 March. While she may have been flattered by a less than razor sharp Nother Russia there, the top three all came off runs on Met day.

Gimme Six enjoys the services again of Piere Strydom. The Daisy Fillies Guineas winner ran a smart fifth behind Snowdance in the Majorca prior to showing her wellbeing with that top effort ahead of Nother Russia in her Vaal prep. The daughter of Gimmethegreenlight has drawn wide, but is likely to be dropped out for a challenge and will be cutting them back late.

Orchid Island ran no kind of race behind Legal Eagle last out and has a mountain to climb to beat her stablemate – and on top of that has the widest draw to temper her aspirations further.

The Sean Tarry duo of Tahini and Heaps Of Fun are both solid mares but may lack a few lengths with Nother Russia under these conditions.

Mike de Kock's Cascapedia returns from a 14 week break fol-

Safe Harbour has her second run since returning from a quiet Cape campaign. At best, she is capable of challenging for the places.

Folk Dance ran on steadily in the SA Fillies Classic and was under two lengths off exciting winner, Takingthepeace. She has previously proven effective over Saturday's course-and-distance but will need more zip in the finish here.

Fish River gets the blinkers fitted after a quiet trip to KZN when she stayed on without threatening in the Umzimkhulu. Well beaten here in the Gauteng Fillies Guineas, she has a mountain to climb.

The Acacia Handicap winner Simply Royal runs for Ray Danielson and loves the course-and-distance. She asked a lot to take on Nother Russia at level weights but has won 4 from 7 starts and is a progressive and smart 4yo.

Al Danza has hit smart form, winning the Listed Jacaranda Handicap on Classic Day in a thriller. The conditions of this race make Saturday's test a very different ball-game and she will be hard pressed to find a hat-trick.

Nother Russia is a confident choice to make it a double. The Cape raiders have come a long way and can't be underestimated - as they have shown already. Simply Royal could be Tarry's dark horse.

Gold Soars!

Saturday's Gr1 Turffontein feature is named in honour of one of the greatest fillies to grace the turf in this country.

A daughter of Farnesio out of the El Gran Capitan mare, Elysee, Empress Club was dubbed the 'Galloping Goldmine' by racing commentators and her legion of fans and was renowned for taking on the best of the boys – and beating them!

Legendary trainer Terrance Millard sent out the Argentinian import to make an easy winning debut for the late Laurie Jaffee at the Vaal on 23 March 1991.

She was to go on and win 14 of her next 19 starts, including eight Gr1's, and was a five-time SA champion in the process. Her successes included the J&B Met and Queens Plate. Her 2 year old victories included the Gr2 SA Nursery, the Gr1 Gold Medallion and the Gr2 Gosforth Park Juvenile Fillies.

She won both the Gr1 SA Guineas and the Gr1 SA Fillies Guineas, when the two races were a few weeks apart.

Often talked about was her appearance at Durbanville to contest the Southeaster Sprint on 15 December 1992. She took on and beat crack speedsters Marie Galante and Taban to set a new 1000m track record of 56.5 secs. Durbanville has never seen a bigger event since!

Following her export to the USA, she won the 1994 Gr3 Hillsborough Handicap on the turf at Bay Meadows.

Empress Club retired to Gainesway, then operated by Graham Beck' with a record of 16 wins from 26 starts and earnings of \$1,155,235. Her first foal was a Lyphard colt. Named Azouz Pasha, he was an English stakes winner. Empress Club's other two winners also were Northern Hemisphere winners. Empress Club produced six named foals.


The Empress died at Gainesway farm on 19 December 2004. She was in foal to resident stallion Orientate at the time.

Go With The Queen

East Cape Oaks (L) Fairview

Trainer Alan Greeff is bang in form after saddling four winners at Fairview last week and he goes into Friday's R150 000 Listed East Cape Oaks with a five-pronged attack, headed by the 2yo stakes winner Queen Forever

The 2017 Listed Lady's Slipper winner, Queen Forever is the officially highest-rated galloper in the field and looks set to relish the stamina test at her first time beyond the mile. She was a bit unlucky when encountering traffic and finishing within a length of Sabbatical in the East Cape Guineas.

Widow's Lamp is the epitome of consistency and is another who looks well suited to the 2000m. She was eased late in running when second in the Oaks Trial and will be a serious challenger.

Esteemal is the first of the Snaith pair. The daughter of Captain Al scored a long overdue second win last time and must be a major factor at her first run here.

Woodstock Fairy is another Cape raider. She stays well but has plenty to do at the weights.

Gitango Tonight has lost form recently.

Searching shed her maiden certificate at her penultimate start on the polytrack. The well bred galloper was staying on well over shorter last time and will enjoy the extra.

The R1 million sale graduate Summer Moon is way out of the reckoning on her official rating but is lightly tried and looks very capable of improving out of sight in this company. She stayed on for fourth in the Oaks Plate last time.

Giovanna has poor recent form and both her career victories have been on the polytrack – so she looks unlikely.

Three Times A Lady has pulled the best of the draw but took a while to win her maiden, which she did at her penultimate start on the polytrack. She is bred to go this trip and could improve into the places.

Piera is the fifth of the Greeff quintet and has been battling since winning her maiden on the polytrack here in November.

Data Link took eleven runs to win her maiden and followed that with a modest fourth in a low-key handicap. This could be too much for her at this stage.

Corne Spies one-time winner Joking Dice looks hard-pressed to assert

'Where's The Discretion?' - Trainer

Ashburton trainer Duncan Howells had his feature victory celebrations dampened at Greyville on Wednesday when the Stipes withdrew sensational Listed KZN Stakes winner Neptune's Rain's starting stall certificate.

Howells expressed his disappointment with what he felt was a lack of discretion and flexibility shown, given the special circumstances of the double delay of the feature.

"These are sprinting fillies. The race was delayed ten days. They are naturally going to be slightly above themselves. I could see on the way to the start that Neptune's Rain was above herself. The fillies were dripping with sweat at the start. We have also not been able to get much work into them. There was a delay with a shoe issue at the start and a troublesome filly drawn near the rail. Neptune's Rain was forced to stand for a while. She did rear in her gate but loaded like a lamb with the hood. She has ten runs under the belt and has had no issues at the start. I feel that no discretion is being shown," he said following the withdrawal of the stalls certificate. **Read more**

Red Light - Spells Danger!

Given the recent public focus and attention around on-course ambulance and medical services, the apparent failure of the ambulance to track the runners in the eighth race at Greyville on Wednesday is puzzling.

The Sporting Post has learnt from reliable sources that a handler was kicked at the start of this race.

The video footage of the start clearly shows the runners jumping under starter's orders and the lead vehicle pulling away as the ambulance driver and his passenger alight from their vehicle, which appears to remain at the start. The handler was attended to and the race proceeded without incident – and without the ambulance.

The official Stipes report makes no reference to the handler being kicked or the ambulance being obliged to remain at the start.

Surely the handler's injury was grounds for a false start, given the limited medical resources on course?

And why should we trust Stipes reports with selective information being furnished?

Tiger On A Roll

Davy Russell, the oldest jockey in the race, capped a magnificent riding career when he rode Tiger Roll, one of the most accomplished little horses of the last few years, to a dramatic last- gasp victory in the 171st Randox Health Grand National at Aintree on Saturday.

In a race watched by over 600 million television viewers worldwide, Tiger Roll stayed out of trouble – and there was plenty of it, with many of us wondering if we really needed to be watching.

Tiger Roll was a second National winner in three years for Michael O'Leary, Ryanair's chief executive, and a second for trainer Gordon Elliott who won it with Silver Birch in 2007 before he had ever saddled a winner in Ireland.

The race was shown live on Tellytrack but there were complaints from various punters that Saftote was not functioning properly. We have not been able to ascertain what the nature of the problems were.

There were also a few negative comments about the race on our Facebook page and thankfully all the 38 starters were safely in their stables on Saturday night, although 26 did not finish.

The Stars Are Set To Shine

Gold Circle's 2018 SA Champions Season launches at Greyville Race Course on Friday 4 May with the running of three Gr2 features.

Entries for the R500 000 IOS Drill Hall Stakes over 1400 metres, as well as the R600 000 Daisy Guineas and R500 000 Daisy Fillies Guineas, both over 1600 metres, were received on Monday.

SA Champions Season, often referred to as the National Championship of horseracing in South Africa, showcases the very best the sport of horse racing has to offer from the beginning of May to the end of July each year, and attracts contestants from all over the country.

Comprising 25 Race Meetings and 217 races, Champions Season boasts more than R46-million in prize money including 13 Grade 1 races; 9 Grade 2 races; 9 Grade 3 races and 7 Listed races.

The R4,25-million Vodacom Durban July, run annually on the first Saturday of July, is the jewel in Gold Circle's crown and once again approximately 55 000 racegoers will descend on Greyville Race Course to enjoy the 12-race VDJ extravaganza.

The Golden Horse Casino Sprint Race Day at Scottsville on 28 May; the Daily News 2000 at Greyville on Saturday 2 June; the Rising Sun Gold Challenge at Greyville on Saturday 10 June and the eLan Gold Cup at Greyville on 28 July are the other major Grade 1 race days on the calendar.

25 For Wonder Winx!

Champion Winx matched Black Caviar's record of 25 wins in a row after her second consecutive win in the A\$4 million Gr1 Queen Elizabeth Stakes at Royal Randwick on the weekend.



Winx has stormed deeper into racing history, ridiculing fears her pursuit of a 25th consecutive victory would end in defeat- or retirement.

The wonder mare proved she is better than ever with resounding victory in the 2000m contest, laying the plat-

form for an historic tilt an unprecedented fourth Cox Plate at Moonee Valley in October.

Restrained in last place until the 600m mark, Winx eased to the outside of the 10-horse field before overhauling Darren Weir's Gailo Chop with a trademark withering sprint.

Her signature surge catapulted her almost four lengths past Gailo Chop and to a world record 18th Group 1.

And she matched Black Caviar's feat of stringing together 25 wins in a row, an achievement which left trainer Chris Waller sobbing inconsolably.

Randwick was packed as Winx took her earnings to almost \$19 million – more than \$5million more than previous record-holder Makybe Diva, the triple Melbourne Cup winner.

Jockey Hugh Bowman beamed with relief and joy as he returned Winx to scale before a rapturous crowd.

"I'm so proud of her, so proud to be apart of it." he said

Winx is now likely to be spelled immediately in preparation for her bid to become the first horse to win four Cox Plates.

Won by Alec Laird's London News in 1997, and Mike de Kock with Irridescence in 2006 and Archipenko in 2008, the HK\$24 million Gr1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup to be run at Sha Tin on Sunday 29 April is likely to host an internationally representative 2018 renewal.

Overseas raiders have captured

the APQEII Cup 12 times since it was first opened to outside competition in 1995, with Maine Chance Farms Silvano winning it in 2001.

A classic winner from Japan, the best of Hong Kong's talented 10-furlong cohort and a top contender from Aidan O'Brien's powerful team are among eleven horses selected for a world class edition of the race, one of three Gr1 features on Champions Day.

Also on the bill are the HK\$18 million Champions Mile (1600m) and the HK\$16 million Chairman's Sprint Prize (1200m). This year marks the first time that all three races will be staged on one day.

The HK\$16 million Chairman's Sprint Prize (1200m) is in its third year as a Gr1 contest and last year ranked 34th in World's Best 100 Group 1 Races, making it Hong Kong's highest-rated race.

A field of 12 top-class sprinters is slated to go to post, including the best from Hong Kong and Japan, and leading speedsters from Europe.

The 12 selections for the HK\$18 million Champions Mile feature our own Philanthropist son Singapore Sling from the Tony Millard stable, who ran such an outstanding race in the Hong Kong Derby, as well as the rest of Hong Kong's best milers and Ireland's Lancaster Bomber from the O'Brien stable.

Lancaster Bomber has placed second five times at Gr1 level, including when behind World Approval in last season's Breeders' Cup Mile at Del Mar.

The line-up also includes the current Hong Kong season's two in-form Gr1 milers: the John Moore-trained Beauty Generation secured the Hong Kong Mile in December and followed up with an elite win in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (1400m); Seasons Bloom snared the Stewards' Cup for the Danny Shum stable in January under Joao Moreira.

Enough Is Enough Candice Delpech Speaks Out

On Saturday, 7 April 2018, during the running of the Gr1 SA Classic at Turffontein, Majestic Mambo stumbled, dislodging SA Champion Jockey, Anthony Delpech. While the rest of the field – including the on-course ambulance – continued across the finish line, Anthony was left lying at the 350m mark. While time stands still in situations like that and everything feels exaggerated, it would be not be unfair to say that too much time elapsed before Anthony was attended to.

From the track, the first responders transferred him into the on course ambulance, which drove him to the track's first aid facility. There, Anthony was seen by the Chief Medical Officer and despite complaining of pain in his hands and feet, was deemed to have concussion. He was transferred into another ambulance and transported by road to Milpark Hospital's casualty department.

His wife Candice, who unusually was watching from home in Durban, immediately left home and was making her way to the airport to catch a flight to Joburg. While driving to the airport, she was having to field calls, trying to relay Anthony's Medical Aid details in order to get him admitted as somehow, these did not travel with him.

Sequence of events

By the time Candice arrived at the hospital at 8pm on Saturday evening, the hospital was ready to discharge Anthony and send him home after a CT scan came back clear. Tex Lerena was pres-

ent and insisted that Anthony stay overnight admission for observation. Luckily they listened and at 10pm Anthony was re-admitted into a general ward, with Candice in a chair by his side.

Anthony was next seen by a doctor at 6am on Sunday morning and an MRI scheduled for lunchtime. Still complaining of pain in his hands and feet as well as having increasing difficulty breathing, it was not until 9pm on Sunday night that Anthony finally had his vital signs checked, at which point it was discovered that his oxygen saturation levels were at 52 – dangerously below normal levels of of 95-100.

On Monday, a neurosurgeon advised that the MRI results revealed a herniated disc in his neck which was exerting pressure on his spinal cord. Surgery was scheduled for the following day. The

surgical team talked Anthony and Candice through the proposed operation on Tuesday morning, explaining that it entailed the removal of the herniated disc material to be replaced by a bone graft, followed by a cervical fusion to stabilise the joint. When Anthony nodded his understanding, the doctor exclaimed, "Don't move your head, you can sever your spinal cord." "I was horrified," says Candice.

Speaking out

Although the operation was successfully performed on Tuesday, 10 April 2018, as with any injury and major surgery, it is going to be a long road to recovery. Candice has courageously agreed to talk to me about the accident. Given the extremely private nature of the Delpech family, it's a responsibility I take seriously. And I think everyone else should too.


While these are difficult details for the family to share, Candice says enough is enough. "In my 26 years with Anthony, I've never once raised my voice or stated any opinion about racing or how Anthony has been treated, but I know if we don't stand up together now, nothing is going to be done."

"Anthony has devoted his life to racing. He understands the risks and accepts there are injuries associated with the job, but it's his passion and if there are falls, the support should be there."

First response

"Anthony was on the ground for far too long before the first responders reached him. He was incorrectly diagnosed on course as having a concussion and was transferred to hospital by road with his serious spinal injury. If that ambulance had jammed on its breaks or hit a bump, he could have severed his spine. Lastly, he was incorrectly admitted to the casualty department, which delayed him getting the correct care he so badly needed."

"It comes down to the quality of the first response and the chain of communication. Had there been a properly experienced trauma medic onsite who could have correctly assessed the seriousness of the situation, Anthony would have been airlifted to hospital. The handover to casualty would have been strong and Anthony would have been admitted to the ICU immediately.

The Hard Truth

In response to the statement issued by Phumelela regarding race day safety measures, Candice says, "We have experienced the total opposite of this response. This is not the first time this has happened and it's not isolated to a single centre. In December 2015, Anthony suffered a bad fall when his horse flipped over in the starting stalls at Kenilworth. The on course medic pronounced him fit to go home. Pippa Mickleburgh drove him to his hotel, where he was in so much pain, he hardly slept. The next morning Larry Wainstein helped him get a set of crutches. It was 22 December so he couldn't get a direct flight home, and had to fly from Cape Town to Johannesburg and then to Durban. Three airports, three wheelchairs and 24 hours later, he drove himself to Hillcrest hospital for an X-ray to find out he had a broken leg."

"In December 2016, Anthony fell at Turffontein and again, was discharged by the on course doctor. He drove to the airport, caught a plane back to Durban and then drove himself to the hospital where he was diagnosed with a broken collar bone that had to have a plate put in two days later. In 2017, he fell at Greyville. The medic put the stethoscope over the body protector and wondered why he couldn't hear anything. And then he was sent home with a concussion," continues Candice.

During the international meeting a few years ago, S'manga Khumalo was similarly left on the track for far too long before being attended to. Then there was the debacle over the Jarred Samuel incident at Greyville. We've just seen Gavin Lerena seriously injured in a fall at Turffontein and while that was handled effectively, mainly thanks to the intervention of Gavin's family, it is clear that Anthony's case was not.

Candice says, "I am angry, disappointed and feel let down by our racing authorities at how our jockeys are treated. If we can produce world class riders that hold their own all over the world, surely they deserve world class support?"

Time of the essence

While nothing can undo the events of 7 April, it is entirely possible to improve things going forward.

It is accepted that the time it takes an injured person to receive appropriate action after an accident has a direct influence on not only their immediate survival, but also on their recovery time. The first three minutes are critical and the first hour post trauma is commonly referred to as the 'golden hour' as it is a vital treatment window that can dictate whether a patient lives or dies—and if they do live, what that their quality of life will be.

While we cannot control accidents, we can control how they are dealt with. There should be clear, accepted and above all, standardised emergency protocols.

The first response should be immediate. There is no point

in having an ambulance follow riders and having support staff on-site if they cannot get to a stricken jockey fast enough. Every moment wasted is a potential life-saving opportunity lost.

On-site support needs to be of the highest standard and the chain of communication has to be effective to ensure appropriate treatment at the hospital.

Emergency details should be on hand at all times. A severely injured or unconscious jockey may not be able to communicate their emergency contacts or details. There should be a line of communication to next of kin and emergency contacts, as well as relevant media to relieve strain on family members.

Nice to Haves

Candice recalls Anthony being injured during his stint in Hong Kong where the HKJC sent a car to drive her to the hospital and back every day and had a member of staff stationed outside Anthony's hospital room until he was discharged, to ensure he was well taken care of.

While it will be argued that we are not Hong Kong, there is plenty that can be done to make a difficult process easier both for our jockeys as well as for their families.

Candice had to secure her own transfer from Durban to Joburg, she has had to hire a car, book into a hotel, buy meals and spend a fortune on airtime communicating with all Anthony's family, friends and well wishers. While these are necessary consequences, not everyone has the same resources. Would it not make life a lot easier and less stressful having a specific point of contact and some kind of budget / contingency planning available for incidents like these?

While there have been a number of people who have been an invaluable support, Candice says it's been the little things such as the Lerena family bringing her a curry for dinner one night, or a kind nurse who drove her to a local Pick n Pay to buy toiletries and essentials that have meant a lot. "They're small things, which aren't really small things, you know?" she says quietly. I blink hard and nod silently over the lump in my throat.

When you know better, do better

Candice confirms that Anthony is getting stronger and better every day and thanks everyone for their on-going love and support. But now that he is out of immediate danger, she is focussing on the bigger picture. "This is not just about us, but now that it has happened, it's our responsibility to see that something gets done. We are lucky that Anthony is a senior jockey and we have the resources and infrastructure to cope with something like this, but what about the rest? If this is how Anthony, our National Champion Jockey, is treated, what chance does anyone else have? We have to realise, we are playing with people's lives here. Things have to be sorted out."

Being proactive in improving the status quo could quite literally save lives. It cannot wait. Horse racing is an extraordinary sport with extraordinary risks. We cannot have ordinary support services.

The KZN Breeders Series Log for 2yo's is dominated by the combination of Piemonte Stud and Alan Greeff who lead — with top Oratorio filly, Carlita, and the Crusade colt Alfeo, respectively. 212 juveniles vie for just 28 places on the race day. There are two races – 1 each for colts and fillies respectively for stakes of R200 000 each over 1200m. The KZN Breeders Race Day takes place on 30 June at Grevville racecourse. and is exclusively for KZNbred horses registered with the KZN Breeders Premium Scheme.

Over The Hill?

One of former champion SA owner Markus Jooste's business initiatives — the renaming of the famous Epsom Hill as Poundland Hill at the Investec Derby Festival — has been scuppered by Britain's The Jockey Club, which has stepped in to cancel the deal. In a statement, Epsom GM Simon Durrant said: "Due to the widely reported issues concerning Steinhoff International, we have mutually agreed that Poundland, one of its brands, will not be involved with The Hill at the Investec Derby Festival in June. In future the famous Hill will carry the name Horseplay On The Hill." Some irony there.

Will She, Won't She? There has been some

speculation as to whether Takingthepeace will stay the 2450m of the SA Oaks in her bid for SA Triple Tiara glory on 5 May. While her sire Visionaire has so far produced predominantly sprinter-milers, the filly's damline is where the key lies. Her dam won up to 1450m but was also Gr3-placed over 1800m. Damsire Rambo Dancer won a Gr1 over 2400m and his full-sister won the English Oaks. While he produced many top stayers, including Pick 6, Bianconi, Coastal Waltz and Major Hero, Rambo Dancer as a broodmare sire significantly produced the Gr1 Derby and Gr2 Gold Vase winner Seal,

PERSONALITY

Optimistic

Gary Grant

In response to market factors, the TBA / BSA has undergone some fairly radical changes over the past few years. We caught up with Gary Grant ahead of this year's National Yearling Sales.

The Team

In order to draw a clear distinction between the responsibility of breed affairs and their sales arm. June 2016 saw the TBA setting up a Bloodstock South Africa sales board made up of Council members Rennie Price (Chairman), Lee Scribante and Mark Greene and a management team comprising Gary Grant, Chris Haynes and Michael Holmes to take over the running of the sales arm.

"Chris and I are both Chartered Accountants and have been in business together for nearly 25 years, mostly through Equine Group. Michael has a BCom in marketing, he runs Michael Holmes Bloodstock and prior to that, he was with Chris Smith Bloodstock. It's a good fit in terms of a management team and between the three of us we have nearly 80 years' experience in the industry," he says with satisfaction.

"Chris assumes responsibility for marketing and liaison with vendors and buyers. Mike stages the event, Chris directs the communications with vendors and buyers and I look after the financial side of the business, so that's pretty much how we operate."

Operations

With a dramatic rationalisation, the team has pulled the business sharply back into focus and swing the balance sheet from a R6 million loss in the 2016 financial year to a R2 million profit for 2017. "It's imperative that Bloodstock SA makes a profit because that's where the TBA's funding comes from and that in turn allows them to make contributions to the industry."

In addition to turning BSA around and making a profit, we are also putting money back in breeders pockets with reduced levies and commissions and reduced entries and acceptance fees.

"It's important to us to look after our

vendors- without them we don't have a business," he says pointedly. "We're trying hard to help them in terms of where they place horses but more importantly, get them paid on time."

He confirms that the days of waiting for ever are over. "80% is being paid at 30 days and by 60 days, we're up to 90-95%." Significantly, they haven't had one write-off so far and have collected every cent.

The strategy is paying dividends. "The number of of horses we sold last year was more than the year before. Nationals was oversubscribed, the KZN sale is oversubscribed and we've got 260 entries for the mare sale which is about a quarter more than last year. If we're getting support from vendors, I believe we must be doing something right."

"We're not by any means the finished article, but we're making strides and believe we're improving with each sale."

Custodians


While that covers vendors, they have not forgotten about buyers. "I think our sales complex compares favourably with many complexes around the world – certainly the ones I've been to - and I think our sales ground is of equal, if not better standards

– but we've done some refurbishment and revamping. We are going for a fresher, more modern appearance and have received a lot of compliments on how it's looking." "We've opened up the arena to give it more of a

flow and we now have tables where buyers can sit at a table and relax and don't have to feel like you're sitting in a movie theatre in a row of chairs. From a buyer's perspective, the yard too, should offer a good viewing experience."

"We've changed the caterers and built a deck, o you can escape the sale and have a bite and glass

> of wine. There's a good coffee station and we've upgraded the restaurants, including the Enchanted Garden which was popular last year, and it's perfect to escape to if you are in the mood for something simple but tasty after a couple of hours of looking."

Better together

"In the last few years, we've had a divided industry and I think the sales haven't been as much fun as they used to be. It's our intention to try and get everybody back under one roof and enjoy the camaraderie that goes with the sales. We want to focus on getting people to reconnect and talk and enjoy themselves and enjoy the sale. It's not just business — racing is many people's pleasure and leisure and we shouldn't lose sight of that."

They have also revived the relationship with Emperor's Palace as a title sponsor and Gary says, "It's a good fit and one that we're very pleased to be able to re-establish."

Logistics

The sale offers 526 lots spread over three sessions from Tuesday, 24 – Thursday, 26 April and the gavel will be wielded by the capable hands of Steve Davis, Andrew Miller and Graeme Hawkins, supported by a new-look bid spotting team.

"With the long weekend coming up, we've tried to finish a little earlier on Thursday and not sell on the weekend so that people can be at home with their families. At the end of the day, it is business and we try to operate during business hours, which is consistent with how the rest of the world does things."

In a break with tradition, the sale no longer pairs with Champions Day. "Last year we followed, believing the sale and race day were related, but actually they're not. As soon as you go into early May, you start clashing with the international fixtures and it curtails certain internationals attending our sale, so we've gone back to the April slot. The timing is good for attendance by international and local buyers."

"There are a few people coming from Hong Kong and a few agents from the UK, so we're pretty pleased with the international interest so far. There are a couple of bigger agents and a few faces we've not seen before, so we're looking forward to having them. We've had very good interest in terms of credit applications, more so than previous years, which we take as a good sign."

What's On Offer

"The National Yearling Sale is our best sale of the year and I think the catalogue speaks for itself. The depth in stallions is good and we've got a wonderful range of 59 vendors."

One of the big changes is splitting the catalogue into two sections. "For want of a better expression, we have a session 1 comprising lots 1-231," explains Gary. "These were selected by panel based on a combination of pedigree and conformation, so they're really high quality individuals and as far as their page is concerned and in theory you should be able to buy blind as a lot of the homework has been done for you."

He acknowledges there has been a certain amount of resistance to the fact that the minimum bid is R100k for this portion. "It's not

radical and is a trend that's consistent with sales around the world. The median for this sale last year was R175k and more than half the horses sold for more. These are the best on offer and I don't think a vendor would be willing to part company with them for less than R100k."

"The session 2 portion also has quality individuals, although their pedigree pages might be a little lighter. Overall, I think we've got a great selection and think there are yearlings for the full buying bench. No matter what your budget, there should be something for everyone."

Value Adds

BSA offer bonuses for selected Gr1's and Gr2's and have implemented a series of maiden juvenile bonuses. "We offered a maiden juvenile bonus of R40k for 2017 sales graduates which we are bumping up to R50k for 2018 and they have been very well received. It's quite a nice injection for those owners and nice for them to get cash back early. If you look at the price range of horses that qualified, many have more than paid back their purchase price already, so I think it's working well. I think we're seeing bigger juvenile fields and hopefully the stakes bonus is part of the reason for that. If we can help new buyers have quick return, they may look at buying a classic horse a little further down the line."

There are no sales races. "The only sale that has a sales race attached is the KZN sale and that's because it's a KZN Breeders initiative," he confirms.

Predictions


"I think the top end will be strong. Last year we had more money than horses at the top end of the market and I think breeders took note of that, which has helped form a strong catalogue."

"It's going to be difficult to compare because of the split catalogue, but if you asked for my dream result, it would be an increase in the median and clearance rate. I'd like to get the median up because that's a barometer for the breeders as a whole - if you could get a median of R200k, you're starting to have a chance of making some money."

Secondly, the clearance rate is one of the key factors – we want to sell the horses. If we could achieve a 90% clearance rate I'd be happy. It's a brittle market, so it's probably a bit unrealistic, but if I'm shooting high, that's where I'd be aiming. Things often start off poorly, but a lot of business gets done after the sale. I think our breeders are pretty beleagured, so for us, we'd really like to get the horses sold."

"Sentiment is a lot more positive, so hopefully people are not so intent on sitting on their hands with a wait and see approach. I think a lot of people kept their powder dry for Nationals because there is such a range and because it is a selected sale. I'd say we're cautiously optimistic."

Turffontein Medical Services

Phumelela Gaming has moved to allay concerns about the provision of medical services at Turffontein. This follows certain matters being brought to the attention of Phumelela Gaming's racing management after the unfortunate injuries recently suffered by jockeys Anthony Delpech and Gavin Lerena. Phumelela Gaming said it would like to dispel misconceptions among the public.

The company said it was committed to the health and safety of participants in horseracing events at all its facilities, and released the following statement:

"Our Chief Medical Officer (CMO) is responsible for overseeing medical operating procedures and has close to 30 years direct experience as a Medical Doctor in the sport. The CMO is supported by a track-based medical team consisting of a Race Medical Doctor, Advanced Life Support (ALS) paramedics, Registered Nurses, and an event ambulance crew staffed up to Intermediate Life Support (ILS) level.

In addition, all horse racing events are externally supported by Netcare 911 emergency medical services to provide transportation from the arena medical centre to pre-determined trauma facilities, including Netcare Milpark Hospital which is Level 1 accredited trauma centre.

Contrary to what has been reported in certain media publications, Phumelela Gaming continuously maintains and updates its medical operating procedures specifically according to the different racing events held around the country.

In general, these operating procedures provide for an ALS First

Responder, a marked ILS event ambulance and a veterinarian vehicle to follow the pack. In the event of a rider coming off a horse, it is required that the event ambulance continues to follow the field while the First Responder, who as previously stated is well equipped, attends to the injured jockey. This allows for preliminary treatment to be initiated while the event ambulance returns to the site of the fall. The event ambulance is then utilised to remove the injured jockey to the track-based medical facility where the patient can be fully examined by the designated Race Medical Doctor.

In the event that an injured jockey needs to be transferred to a hospital, an external emergency medical service provider is utilised with preference being given to Netcare 911. The medical operating procedures further provide for airlifting of critical injury cases by helicopter directly from the track.

Phumelela Gaming would like to reassure race participants, their families and spectators that the necessary measures are absolutely in place to provide for the medical treatment and care of injured jockeys.

Races are further monitored by CCTV in order to ensure the soonest possible detection of an incident, which is then reported to the medical teams via radio.

In the hope of advancing these assurances subsequent to the recent injury of Gavin Lerena and Anthony Delpech, additional steps have now been introduced to ensure the proper identification of all medical resources active on the track, including First Responders.

We wish the recently injured riders well in their recovery and thank those involved for raising their concerns with Phumelela Gaming." Read more about Anthony Delpech on page 11



Beyond the champion miler , past alumni of this outstanding sale include recently exported Equus Champion Marinaresco, the Gr1 winner Captain America, another past Horse Of The Year and outstanding sire Dynasty, as well as his champion sons Futura and Legislate.

Horse Of The Year National Colour and Equus Champion, and smart young sire, Elusive Fort are two other prominent names on the achievement list.

Fine Selection

Our leading sires are all on show, with promising younger

producers Elusive Fort, Gimmethegreenlight, Querari, Twice Over and What A Winter balancing the needs equation.

Stallions represented by first SA yearlings at the sale include Capetown Noir, Captain Of All, Flower Alley, Kingsbarns, Linngari, Soft Falling Rain, Time Thief, Vercingetorix and Wylie Hall.

The exciting Galileo sire Nathaniel, whose very first crop produced European Horse Of The Year and five time Gr1 winner Enable, is also represented.


The damlines are strong, with 13 Gr1 winners respresented, including two of our finest racemares of recent years, in Triple Tiara winner Cherry On The Top and top-class Met winner River Jetez.

Housekeeping

For the first time in recent years, the sale will be divided into two sessions,.The first session, which runs up to lot 231, continues into the second day. Each day of trading will commence at 11h30, with the first day ending on lot 170. Silvano Colt Tops April Sale

Combining the 2017 CTS March and April Select Sale into one sale for 2018 made for a 323-lot catalogue, split in three parts.

A Select session of 117 lots, with a minimum bid of R50k, and a second session of 205 lots with a R20k minimum bid, both qualifying for the CTS Millions races. A third session of 21 lots without Million tickets, where the minimum bid was R15k, rounded things off.

Buyers responded as expected, with eighteen of the twenty highest prices coming from the Select session. Vaughan Marshall secured the R700k top lot, a Silvano colt from Klawervlei. The yearling's dam is a stakes winner by Captain Al out of Gr1 winner Roxanne. This is the female line of Legislate.

Second top price of R525k was for a Captain Al filly from Klawervlei, on a bid from Jacques Chowles on behalf of Itlaaq (Pty) Ltd. The filly is the first foal of a Trippi half sister to three stakes performers by Captain Al.

The Select portion of the sale had 81 yearlings sold, with a median of R110k. The top price in the non-Select second session was shared by two colts, a What A Winter from Drakenstein and Silvano from Klipdrif, both going for a highly respectable R260k. This session saw 118 yearlings sold, with a median of R45k. **The sale price list is here**

The CTS View

We're in a true buyers' market," said CTS CEO Wéhann Smith after the Select Session of the April Yearling Sale at Durbanville turned over R13,22-million on Thursday – admittedly disappointing for some of the vendors, but with any number of bonuses to smaller investors.

"The going was tough, but one has to look at both sides of the spectrum. Traditionally this is a sale that produces excellent thoroughbreds and for once the smaller buyers had many opportunities to secure beautifully-bred yearlings at very decent prices.

"We saw the top of the market hold strong, with 12 lots fetching R300,000 or more and four getting above the R500,000 mark with a highest price of R700,00. There were several bargain buys in the middle and lower market between R50,000 and R200,000 and the traditionally smaller buyers were active and smiling. They'll be cashing in on their investments, in the near future."

The CTS April Yearling Sale reached an aggregate of R20,335-million after two days of bidding. In total, 208 of 288 lots offered were sold at a combined average for the three sessions of R97,764 and a median of R60,000.

Klawervlei Stud topped the vendor's list with 37 yearlings sold at an average of R204,324.

Chris van Niekerk's Rainbow Beach Trading was the leading buyer, securing nine yearlings at an average R178,888 per purchase,.

What A Winter, Master Of My Fate and Vercingetorix were the leading three sires.

Light At The End Of The Tunnel!

In the aftermath of the CTS April Yearling Sale there is little question that the South African thoroughbred sales industry is going through a phase of major correction and adjustment on all fronts.

But we all knew that! Innovation and experimentation is the name of the game in tough times and the trial of Cape Thoroughbred Sales having combined the CTS March and Emperors Palace Select Sale into what was effectively another regional sale, just ten days prior to Nationals, was a calculated move that may well need a review before the sales calendar programming is rostered for 2019.

"I'm waiting for Joburg" was the phrase often uttered ahead of "I'll have another" at the admittedly well attended sale at the country course on Thursday and Friday, which was characterised by typical CTS five-star hospitality, but a serious lack of cash and genuine buyers. And, as acknowledged by some breeders, an overall absence of genuine depth in the broad catalogue.

While we are clearly feeling the knock-on effects of the vacuum left by Markus Jooste, and to a lesser extent the competitive edge provided by the late Adriaan van Vuuren, the real impact on breeders across the board that were possibly never even supported by either of those big buyers in the very recent 'good old days', is the minor 'flooding' of the market over the past four months of the Mayfair Speculators horses.

Large numbers of unraced 2yo's and a host of raced — and in many cases proven horses — have been put together by the former Mayfair trainers as they battled to balance the books in the aftermath of the fallout from the Steinhoff saga.

This has surely drained the cash reserves – not every-body's got unlimited buckets of the green stuff – and has meant a possible reallocation of spend for many prospective buyers.

Add to this the notable absence of some other major players, possibly still stung and reeling from South African horseracing's darkest December in memory, and there has probably never been a more appropriate time for a joining of hands and renewed flexibility in terms of providing much-needed relief for hard-pressed breeders, as that group reflect and possibly reconsider the numbers and the way they run their own businesses.

But it's not all doom and gloom!

The Avontuur policy of patience and giving them time is paying massive dividends for the progeny of their internationally proven stakes winner producing sire Oratorio.

His daughter Carlita showed her class in the Listed Eastern Cape Fillies Nursery and recently it was the turn of the beautiful grey, Mardi Gras out of Sarabande, who won in fine style.

There are high hopes for the Oratorio yearlings, who make up the bulk of the Avontuur Natioonal class of 2018.

First up is Lot 58, Cassimbo out of Torra Bay (AUS) who is a powerful, very attractive colt from an internationally successful female line. 

One of the standout lots in the draft is a Silvano filly out of Gr1 Thekwini Stakes winner Royal Fantasy (Lot 16) – which makes her a sister to the talented filly Simply Royal and talented feature race contender 3yo Royal Crusade. Wilgerbosdrift's two sires Flower Alley and Soft Falling Rain both have smart looking yearlings in the draft. The latter is a half-sister to no fewer than seven stakes horses, including Equus Champions In The Fast Lane and Let's Rock 'N Roll and top Dubai performer Light The Lights. Jet Master — A Lasting Legacy

There can be little doubt that the late Jet Master was one of the finest thoroughbred stallions ever bred in South Africa.

The strapping bay was Champion Sire in South Africa on seven occasions and was also Champion 2YO Sire in 2004-2005.

Jet Master, whose offspring won the Gr1 J&B Met five years running, from 2007 to 2011, left behind more than 70 stakes winners and over 130 stakes horses. He sired 22 Gr1 winners, who were produced by daughters of 16 different stallions.





Like many top stallions in the past, Jet Master's very first crop proved his best.

From a foal crop of 77 registered foals, the champion produced 16 stakes winners, including four Gr1 winners. This crop was headed by arguably Jet Master's finest son, triple Horse Of The Year, Pocket Power. Remarkably, Jet Master would go on to produce at least one Gr1 winner in each crop barring his final crop - which still managed to produce 10 black type performers.

While it has taken some time, there are now signs that South Africa's Joint Horse Of The Year of 1999 may continue to exert his influence on the South African stud book, through his sons and daughters at stud.

Jet Master is sire of the top two sires on the First Crop Sires List for 2017-2018 at the time of writing and is also enjoying increasing success as a broodmare sire. His sons, Pomodoro and Master Of My Fate, are busy fighting to head the First Crop Sires List, with both bays having winners over the past weekend.

Former July winner, Pomodoro, was represented by a really eye catching winner at Turffontein, when daughter, Return Flight, broke her maiden by 11.25 lengths, while his paternal half-brother, Master Of My Fate, is sire of Twist Of Fate. The latter made it win number two from just four outings when scoring over 1200m (beating fellow Master Of My Fate son, Lucky Dancer) at Kenilworth on Saturday and he looks a smart sort.

Improvement Likely

What is so encouraging about both Master Of My Fate and Pomodoro is that neither raced at two, and one can but think the offspring of both stallions should only improve with time and distance.

To date, there is little separating the two sires' in terms of prize money, although Master Of My Fate has had five winners, as

opposed to Pomodoro's two. Pomodoro, on the other hand, has already produced a pair of smart stakes horses (Cirillo and Royal Italian), as well as Saturday's hugely impressive winner, Return Flight.

Interestingly, both Pomodoro and Master Of My Fate are closely inbred to Northern Dancer, with Pomodoro's dam, Golden Apple, being sired by Northern Guest (Northern Dancer), and Master Of My Fate's dam by the Lyphard (Northern Dancer) sire, Elliodor. With both Master

Of My Fate and Pomodoro represented by a number of well related juveniles yet to face the starter, the future surely looks bright for both stallions.

Another young son of Jet Master now standing at stud is the talented Divine Jet, a half-brother to short-lived Gr1 SA Classic winner, Divine Jury, and bred on the same Jet Master/Al Mufti cross as champion Yorker and Gr1 Empress Club Stakes winner Little Miss Magic. A striking individual, Divine Jet was one of the most promising 3yos of his generation, when the bay won the first three starts of his career.

Daughters

On the broodmare front, Jet Master's daughters made a considerable splash when responsible for a pair of Equus Champions last season. The bay son of Rakeen was damsire of both Lady In Black (Champion 2YO Filly) and the exported Edict Of Nantes (Champion 3YO Colt/Gelding), with the former having gone on to win the recent G3 Umzimkhulu Stakes this season. Lady In Black, who was also second to Met winner, Oh Susanna (Street Cry), in the 2018 G1 Cartier Paddock Stakes, is out of the Jet Master mare, Mystery Dame, while Edict Of Nantes was produced by the sire's daughter, Pagan Dance. This season, Jet Master daughters are once again making their mark. Among the notable winners representing Jet Master as a broodmare sire in 2017-2018 are Lanzerac Ready To Run Stakes winner, and millionaire, Miss Katalin, Listed Jacaranda Handicap winner Al Danza (Captain Al), and G3 Chairman's Cup hero, Our Emperor (Dynasty). (Oaks Trial second, Our Shining Star, is another smart performer, whose dam is a daughter of Jet Master, as is CTS 1600 second Captain And Master). Jet Master is also broodmare sire of this season's talented three-year-olds, Cot Campbell and The Sun Also Rises, both of whom by champion sire Trippi, along with Miss Katalin.

Other notable winners out of Jet Master mares include the graded stakes winners Rivarine (Var), Eventual Angel (Right Approach), Exit Here (Jay Peg), Here Comes Billy (Muhtafal) and Silvano's Jet (Silvano).

At the time of writing, Jet Master is currently South Africa's fifth leading Broodmare Sire (by earnings), with his daughters having produced the winners of over R9.2 million this season alone.

The Winter Is Here!

Highlands part of Ridgemont, who enjoyed a champagne start to their Cape Winter Series sponsorship in 2017 when African Night Sky became the first horse since the mighty Pocket Power to win the Cape Triple Crown, are once again the big brand name behind the series this year.

The R1-million Winter Series for 3-year-olds comprises three testing legs from a mile to 2400m.

The Cape winter conditions make it a testing spectacle of ability and endurance and it takes a top horse to wear the crown.

Rocket Countdown, who sprang a 36-1 shock in the Selangor Cup in November, heads the 16 first entries for the Highlands Stud Winter Guineas over 1600m at Kenilworth on Saturday, 28 April.

The R250 000 Grade 3 race will be run on the summer course with its longer run-in.

Rocket Countdown went on to finish seventh in the R1-million Cape Guineas, beaten little more than four lengths.

He is one of four entries trained by Candice Bass-Robinson whose father, Mike, won the Winter Guineas eight times since 1997, most recently with subsequent Vodacom Durban July winner Marinaresco in 2016.

Rocket Countdown has the worst of the draw at No 16 and has to shoulder a 2kg penalty as a Grade 2 winner.

Doublemint is the only other penalised entrant and he will carry 1kg extra for his success in the Gr3 BMW Politician Stakes on the day of the L'Ormarins Queen's Plate.

He is trained by Justin Snaith who scored with Readytogorightnow (2013) and African Night Sky 12 months ago. Other notable winners include subsequent July hero Power King (2014), Variety Club (2012) and Act Of War three years later.

The last two were both trained by Joey Ramsden who has the only filly in the race, Made In Hollywood. She is second only to Rocket Countdown on merit ratings and has also been entered for the Listed Sweet Chestnut Stakes on the same card.

The Winter Guineas is a good race for favourites who have been successful in five of the last seven runnings.

The supplementary entry stage is on Friday 20 April with declarations on Monday 23 April.

The second leg is the R250 000 Gr3 Winter Classic run over 1800m on the Kenilworth Winter Course on Saturday 26 May.

The series reaches a climax with the running of the R250 000 Gr3 Winter Derby run over 2400m on the Kenilworth Winter Course on Saturday 30 June.

A bonus of R250 000 will be paid to owner/s of the horse that wins all three legs. <u>View the entries here</u>

Top Colt May Go To Stud

Equus 2017 Champion two-year-old colt Mustaaqeem may suffer a premature end to his racing career.

Mustaaqeem (14-10 favourite), faded steadily over the final 300m of the Gr3 Man O'War Sprint on Classic Day, finishing near eight lengths off the surprise winner Pinnacle Peak. He was found to have bled, which explains his surprise weakening in the race.

A disappointed Mike de Kock,said: "This was like a bolt of lightning to us, Mustaaqeem has never before shown signs of bleeding. He's had knee problems, chips were removed, but he's recovered and barring some stiffness after his comeback run he was doing well in work at home."

De Kock said that Angus Gold, Racing Manager to Sheikh Hamdan of Dubai, will be discussing Mustaaqeem's future with the Sheikh. They could well decide that Mustaaqeem be sent to stud without going to the racetrack again.

"Mustaaqeem is a very good and valuable horse and as we know his full-brother Rafeef has been well accepted at stud in South Africa. His blood will be good for the South African breeding industry. I don't foresee a problem with full-brothers at stud in the same country. They are different horses and will produce different types of progeny.

"Nothing has been finalised yet, however. It is up to Sheikh Hamdan to make the call. We'll be hoping Mustaaqeem stays in South Africa."

Mustaaqeem, by Redoute's Choice from National Colour, has won two from four, including the Gr1 SA Nursery by four lengths.
