

Old associations, sentimental connections and fond memories of twenty years ago gather dust on the shelves of time but will enjoy the light of day again with the running of the East Cape Derby on Saturday.

The outstanding Trigger Finger filly Annie won this race two decades ago. It's tough for a lady- no matter the vintage of the year.

Men typically are faster than women. Apparently because they have a significantly greater maximum aerobic capacity- or the rate at which oxygen can be used to produce energy.

The same applies to horses and that is where much of the fascination lies in the East Cape Derby.

Phumelela East Cape Racing General Manager Luciano Passerini told the Sporting Post that they were expecting a great turnout for a race that is always a spectacle.

"The Derby was moved to Fairview on the clo-

sure of Arlington in 2013. Interestingly, the last filly to win it was Annie in 1998," he added.

Twenty years on, the fairer sex probably have their best shout in years with Alan Greeff's Queen Forever and Yvette Bremner's Widow's Lamp taking on twelve males.

And in one of those lovely typically horseracing twists of irony to their no-holds barred clash on Saturday, Yvette Bremner was working for Alan Greeff in the Annie era of the late 90's. The daughter of Trigger Finger was raced by Veronica Foulkes and ended up winning nine races from 800m to 2400m.

"I recall the day like yesterday when Annie did her tendon. We ran down to see her. I was bawling my eyes out," says Yvette, who added that Annie was a

superstar and hated being beaten.

Yvette's boss of the time, Alan Greeff, said he couldn't believe how the time had flown.

"It can't be twenty years! Good grief, I'm getting old," reflected the champion trainer as he remembered the sad moment.

"It was a small field. She was red hot odds-on. Piere Strydom was aboard. The old-timers were so sharp- my late Dad took just one look and said she won't race again. He was right."

On comparisons with Queen Forever and Annie, Alan would not be drawn and said that they were two very different horses. He said Annie was absolutely brilliant – albeit nothing much to look at.

"Greg Cheyne had the choice of rides between Queen Forever and Kimberley Star for Saturday. It was much of a muchness. A toss of the coin really. There is little to choose between my two. But Queen Forever is a runner — that's obviously dependant on if she stays!" said the man who knows what it takes to win the Derby.

Yvette, now a successful trainer in her own right, said that Widow's Lamp showed nothing in her work.

"Just as Annie took on the boys and never wanted to be beaten in her work, so Widow's Lamp is unfazed. She keeps her energy for race day. But she is so naughty at the moment — a sign she is in the pink of health and wellbeing. Lyle had the choice of rides. He was on Belonje originally — until Widow's Lamp won the Oaks! Then he felt she would have a serious shout here."

Yvette said that Belonje was a runner but that he was a serious stayer in the making and would likely go 3200m as a 4yo.

"He is a so well-bred. But was small at the sale and we got him for R150 000. He is now 16,3 ha and growing! He is very immature and playful. He is one for the notebook though!"

The inevitable twists and turns of the Annie story has further irony woven in.

Sally Bruss of Lammerskraal bred Widow's Lamp and had the privilege of hosting the champion broodmare Annie in the Lammerskraal ranks for years.

"Mr Mike Rattray made a business decision in the 90's to breed for quality. He decided to limit the broodmare band to 50 and buy in well-performed, well-bred athletes with proven race performance. Welsh Woman, dam of champion Celtic Grove, was the first and Annie was also acquired from Veronica Foulkes after she retired from racing," recalls Sally, who proudly adds that her former boss was a forerunner of a policy that has proven a winner internationally.

Annie produced Equus Champion Ice Cube and multiple stakes winner and Durban July placed Jagged Ice, amongst a host of winners. She was euthanized four years ago — that old injury incurred in the East Cape Fillies Guineas two decades earlier proving to be her undoing.

Pressed on whether she felt Widow's Lamp would stay the 2400m, Sally said that the Go Deputy stamina influence could count in her favour.

"There is plenty of speed dominance in her damline. But she looks like a stayer and she settles nicely. We have her full-brother in training with Geoff Woodruff and he says he looks a staying sort. We sold her half-sister by Master Of My Fate at Nationals. But she came up late and they got her for R300 000. Thankfully we have a gorgeous Visionaire colt weanling right here with us. We will be rooting for Widow's Lamp!"

It has been twenty years since the Trigger Finger filly Annie won the then MTN Dion Gr3 East Cape Derby run at Arlington. On Saturday the fairer sex have two standout local ladies in the 57th running of a race not won by a hometown galloper since 2009.

The Listed East Cape Derby moved to Fairview in 2013 following the closure of Arlington and despite the reduced status has still managed to attract a quartet of visitors – no doubt the R218 000 first cheque being a major incentive to travel the 750km up the Garden Route.

Yvette Bremner's East Cape Oaks

winner Widow's Lamp has continued to show a game and consistent run of form, culminating in her first stakes score when tried over the 2000m for the first time at her last start. There is everything reason to believe she will relish the trip here and, while she is yet to take on the boys, she is a very talented girl and should be right there.

The other fairer sex contender is Queen Forever, who had no luck when chasing Widow's Lamp home in the Oaks. This daughter of Gimmethegreenlight was a well beaten 2,25 lengths, but has a massive chance if she stays the 2400m.

Justin Snaith saddles a coupling of the Listed East Cape Guineas winner Sabbatical and recent Durbanville maiden winner Streetfighting Man.

Sabbatical was bumped last time when going down a half length to Kimberley Star and meets the Greeff runner on 2kgs worse terms on Saturday. The son of Silvano has drawn wide but enjoys running at them late and should be storming home

in the final 200m.

Saturday's impressive Gr1 winner Coral Fever is at number 2 – but his participation is still in the balance as he may not suit Greyville.



## **Jooste And I Are Friends'**

## - Rian du Plessis

For the first time since the Steinhoff scandal erupted in early December, a friend of Markus Jooste has answered questions about his relationship with the former Steinhoff CEO, who resigned under a cloud.

Rian du Plessis, CEO of Phumelela, explained to Netwerk 24 why he was appointed as a representative of Jooste's family trust.

On Tuesday Netwerk24 reported on the application made to the Cape High Court by the Mayfair Investment companies to have the arrangements with their creditors formalised and made orders of the court.

In court papers, Mayfair Speculators was described as a company involved in throughbred breeding and racing, with direct and part ownership of approximately 400 horses. The company also has an interest in the French based Mayfair Speculators STET, which owns 100 horses.

The schedule for the creditors meeting held at the end of March, which were handed in as addendums to the court papers, show that Du Plessis represented various interests

The Silver Oaks Trust, who has a subordinate claim of R108,7 million against Mayfair Holdings;

Pavilion Capital Investments Limited, who has a subordinate claim of R420million against Mayfair Holdings and

Formal Holdings, who has a subordinate claim of R867,5 million against Mayfair Speculators

Du Plessis, who is overseas, replied by email:

"Markus Jooste and I met in January 1979 as students at the University Of Stellenbosch. Our families have become close and personal friends."

According to Du Plessis, Jooste had asked him to become a trustee of the Silver Oaks Trust.

Du Plessis said the trust had been established as a vehicle for the benefit of the Jooste family.

He was appointed as a trustee in February 2018.

He explained that the trust is the sole shareholder in Mayfair Holdings, who in turn was sole shareholder in Mayfair Speculators.

Du Plessis said that the Mayfair companies had proposed a scheme of arrangement in terms of section 155 of the Compnies Act to their creditors in order to allow them sufficient time to dispose of their assets — including horses in training — in an orderly manner, so as to ensure that all creditors are paid in full.

"In my opinion, and in particular regard to the orderly disposal of the horses, this is the best outcome for all stakeholders in the South African racing industry, as well as for the animals themselves."

Phumelela Gaming & Leisure is a listed company licenced to conduct racing and betting in seven of our nine provinces.

Jooste was a director from December 2005 to December 2017. After he resigned from Steinhoff, he also resigned as a director of other entities, including the Mayfair companies.

From 2006, Jooste held 1,8% or 1,3 million shares in Phumelela and increased his interest to 4,6% or 4,7 million shares, which he held indirectly, apparently through Kalamojo Trading & Investments. Read more here

## **Seoul Hosts ARC**

## **Attenborough Leads CTC Charge**

With twelve Graded races run over the past weekend, there are 26 individual point scoring horses as the 2018 Charity Turf Challenge got under way. The exciting competition commenced in the fourth race at Greyville on Friday evening.

Top equine honours went to Attenborough from the stable of Joey Ramsden who won the Gr1 Computaform Sprint in dominant fashion. Having paid over R15 on the Tote, the four year old son of Western Winter picked up the long shot bonus of 5 points to take his total to 25 points and leads the competition by 5 points from the well supported Coral Fever who got the better of Abashiri after a long duel in the Gr.1 Premier's Champions Challenge.

Perhaps the biggest surprise on the weekend was the competition's most heavily supported entry, Snowdance, who had to settle for second place in the Gr2 Daisy Guineas at Greyville behind the Duncan Howells' Captain Al filly, Fiorella.

## **Legal Eagle - What Went Wrong?**

Draw a line through the run. That's what champion trainer Sean Tarry said on Monday morning after Equus Horse Of The Year Legal Eagle turned in the most disappointing showing of his career in Saturday's Gr1 R4-million Champions Challenge over 2000m at Turffontein.

The six-year-old multi-millionaire was beaten eight lengths into eighth spot, his biggest losing margin since his debut run over 1160m back in October 2014 when he was inexperienced and obviously needed more ground.

Legal Eagle set the pace under replacement jockey S'Manga Khumalo, led the field into the straight and was as well in contention as ever racing through the

400m mark, but there was nothing to come from him this time; he faded out steadily in an uncharacteristically weak finish.

"Legal Eagle pulled up well, he is sound and happy and this is not a question of wear and tear or that he's lost his zest for racing. The way the Champions Challenge was run simply didn't suit him and was the reason for his disappointing performance.

"We were quite upbeat about giving Legal Eagle a chance, letting him come from off the pace. It didn't work out that way. He was slow off by half a length, rushed up and then found himself in front, in full stride and setting a hot pace. Things just didn't play out the way we wanted. Restraining him from that position was not possible; would have made things worse."

Tarry said that Legal Eagle would be enjoying his customary long winter holiday on the farm and that he'd be prepared for the Cape summer season in the way he's done it over the last several years, with a preprun in Gauteng in November leading to the big Cape features in January.

"We won't be taking Legal Eagle to KwaZulu-Natal. If he'd run a smart race on Saturday that would've been a consideration but we're not desperate to prove anything, we will stay with the pattern he is accustomed to. If he is to race in Durban it will have to be next year."

## **Snaith's July Powerhouse**

SA trainer championship log leader Justin Snaith has eight entries in the July in his bid to win Africa's greatest horseracing event for the third time. The Cape-based family operation won the race when the outstanding grey filly Dancer's Daughter dead-heated with Pocket Power in 2008.

They also trained Legislate to victory in an action-packed and dramatic 2014 renewal. Snaith, who has enjoyed a terrific season so far, which included a watershed first win in the Gr1 Sun Met, holds the power hand with the top three in the betting. His champion 3yo Oh Susanna was withdrawn with a bruised heel from her engagement last Friday.

"Gaynor Rupert joined us at Summerveld on Saturday to visit her star filly. The withdrawal was a precautionary move and Oh Susanna literally missed one day of work. She is jumping out of her skin and well on track for the Gr1 Woolavington on 2 June. She will take some beating there," reflected Jono Snaith in a chat with the Sporting Post on Tuesday.

The R4,25 million 2200m Vodacom Durban July will be run at Greyville on Saturday 7 July and always attracts plenty of interest and public debate.

Trainer Sean Tarry, who had a relatively quiet Champions Day by his own high standards, still has seven entries in the Vodacom Durban July running after scratching all of French Navy, Safe Harbour, Silver God and Throng. The quartet were withdrawn on Monday at 11h32, with no reasons given.

Former SA Champion jockey Anton Marcus commenced rehabilitation on Monday after undergoing surgery on Saturday.

Marcus was thrown from the rather wayward White River in the pre-race parade for the Daisy Guineas at Greyville on Friday evening, a half hour after winniing the Daisy Fillies Guineas on Fiorella.

Ironically Marcus was wheeled in to have a plate and screws inserted into his wrist in the middle of the Champions Day meeting at Turffontein on Saturday where he was carded to ride the fancied Legal Eagle and boom 3yo Majestic Mambo. Neither ran a place.

The KZN-based rider expects to be out for at least four weeks and his absence will be a major blow at a crucial time for Ashburton trainer Duncan Howells, with whom he has formed a winning partnership.

Marcus joins the injured list which includes fellow top jockeys, Anthony Delpech and Gavin Lerena.

## **History & Shocks**

Saxon Warrior stormed home in the Newmarket sunshine on Saturday to provide Aidan O'Brien with a ninth QIPCO Gr1 2000 Guineas victory.

Sent off a 3/1 shot under the trainer's son Donnacha O'Brien- the jockey following his brother Joseph's footsteps in claiming a Classic success as a teenager- last year's Racing Post Trophy winner burst through with a couple of furlongs to go and stayed on to score by a length and a half.

Tip Two Win ran a massive race in second at 50/1, while the well-backed 5/2 favourite Masar could not build on the promise of his wide-margin Craven win and had to settle for third under William Buick.

It was a 300th Gr1 success for Aidan O'Brien, who was not on hand to see his son win the Guineas, with the trainer overseeing Mendelssohn's run in the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, which was a less happy experience!

On Sunday Billesdon Brook stunned her connections and most punters by winning the Gr 1,000 Guineas at 66-1, the longest-priced runner to land this Classic in its 210 years.

She became the biggest success in the career of her 30-year-old jockey, Sean Levey, and is the second Classic winner trained by Richard Hannon.

Levey is being hailed by some as the first black jockey to win a British Classic race, though he describes himself as "international", born in Swaziland to an Irish father, a former jockey, and a Swazi mother.

## Justified!

Trainer Bob Baffert smashed a jinx that stood for 136 years when the unbeaten Justify splashed through the slop to win the Gr1 Kentucky Derby by 2½ lengths on Saturday.

Not since Apollo in 1882 had a colt won the roses without racing as a 2-year-old. Now, Baffert is in position to make another run at the Triple Crown. Three years ago, he trained American Pharoah to the sport's first sweep of the Derby, Preakness and Belmont in 37 years and just the 12th ever.

The Derby record for most wins by a trainer is within Baffert's grasp, too. With his fifth victory, the 65-year-old snapped a tie for second and trails only Ben Jones with six.

Justify is just as impressive. The imposing chestnut colt with the blaze running from his eyes to the tip of his nose improved to 4-0 — winning his races by a combined 21½ lengths. The favourite won for the sixth year in a row, the longest such run since the 1970s.

Mike Smith earned his second Derby victory, becoming at 52 the second-oldest winning jockey. Bill Shoemaker was 54 when he won with Ferdinand in 1986.

Smith crossed the finish line at Churchill Downs with only a few specks of mud on his white and green silks in the rainiest Derby in the race's 144-year history. Nearly 3 inches fell on the crowd of 157,813 throughout the day.

A \$500 000 buy Justify is out of Johannesburg stallion Scat Daddy out of the Ghostzapper mare, Stage Magic. Owned by WinStar Farm, LLC, China Horse Club, LLC and SF Racing, LLC.

## **Zim Win For Cape-Bred**

Roman Discent, the biggest outsider in the field at 66-1, won the \$50,000 Gr1 Castle Tankard at Borrowdale Park on Saturday and, to quote the winning trainer Bridget Stidolph, "surprised everyone on Borrowdale Racecourse".

It was almost a clean sweep for the Stidolph yard as she also saddled second-placed Simona and fourth-placed Mathematician. Kilrain from the Mike de Kock yard, who finished third, went off favourite at 13-10.

Matthew Thackeray rode a brilliant race on the son of Dynasty, coming from behind and to fight out a tight finish with Simona and winning by the proverbial whisker. Kilrain, ridden by MJ Byleveld, also ran on well and was only a neck behind the second horse at the line.

Roman Discent was bred by Avontuur Thoroughbred Farm and is owned by Ryan Sherwood, Scott Buchan, Neil Evans, Gary Carter, Merlyn Chant and Paula Lewis.

## **8000 Up For Asmussen**

Steve Asmussen reached a notable landmark when he became only the second trainer in American racing history to record 8000 victories when Lookin At Lee took the third race at Churchill Downs on Saturday.

The www.racingpost.com reports that according to Equibase statistics, only the late Dale Baird, the winningmost trainer of all time with 9,445 wins, leads Asmussen in career victories in North America.

Speaking to the Blood-Horse, Asmussen reflected on his achievement, saying: "It's an incredible accomplishment and I'm extremely proud of the all the help we have, they put so much hard work and passion into this, and how fortunate we've been to have such great horses."


Hall of Fame trainer Asmussen, 52, also trained Curlin to win two races in Dubai in 2008, including the World Cup. Leading trainer by races won nine times in the States, he holds the world record for single-year victories with 650 in 2009 and has twice won the Eclipse Award as outstanding trainer.

He has trained the Horse of the Year on four occasions with Curlin (2007, 2008), Rachel Alexandra (2009) and Gun Runner (2017).

Asmussen's landmark success came in a \$76,000 allowance race in which Lookin At Lee was winning for the first time since coming second to Always Dreaming 12 months previously in the Kentucky Derby.

As a comparison, our own master trainer Mike de Kock landed his 3000th career winner when Janoobi snatched victory in the Betting World Gauteng Guineas at Turffontein in March 2017.

## No Question - SHE'S THE BOSS

Life in the constant shadow of a giant is no walk in the park. But shadows can't exist without light and our brand new lady trainer Ashley Fortune loves the dynamics of her new role. She labels her and her semi-retired champion jockey husband Andrew, the Yin and Yang of South African racing.

**Ashley Fortune** 

South Africa's newest and most upwardly mobile lady trainer made history at Turffontein on Champi-

ons Day by saddling her first winner – in a Grade 3 race – and ridden by her stepson, Aldo Domeyer.

It doesn't get much better than that for a famous South African racing family – certainly judging by the pleased as punch, Candyman, and the enthusiastic reaction from the Turffontein crowd after a long and tough day.

"Nobody planned it like that! We really made history? Wow, I will take that

with both hands but now life goes on and we have to saddle our next winner," says the obviously pragmatic Ashley, who balances her new occupation with the demands of motherhood – and 'another big baby' in their Walkerville household in the form of husband Andrew.

The obvious question arises – who is the boss?

"Horses are my life and this is all I have ever wanted to do since my school days," says Ashley, who recalls that when other kids were aspiring to be doctors, dentists and civil engineers, all she ever wanted was a job — any job- with horses.

And now she has got a real job in racing — and she is the boss! "Andrew loves to let the whole world know he is around. When he arrives on course, everybody is aware of it. I am exactly the opposite. If I had his personality, we wouldn't have lasted five minutes," she laughs.

## Inspiration

As to her inspiration, she says her husband is top of the tree. But Ashley has read the autobiography of Australian trainer Gai Waterhouse, widely regarded as the most successful female trainer in the world.

"There are a lot of parallels that I can identify with Mrs Waterhouse. And lady trainers have a great record in this country. I have read



Ashley was born in Harare on 20 July 1981. She lived with her parents and a younger sister on a farm near a small town called Ruwa. Her Dad was a transport contractor and the facility allowed space to store the vehicles – but more importantly, horses too!

"We were horse crazy from an early age. I spent my life doing polocrosse. It gave me a great foundation for what I do today."

She recalls that she was an 'okay' student at Chisipite High School but couldn't wait to spend more time with horses.

She lost her sister thirteen years ago and her folks are 'just down the road' in Parys. She tries to see them often as she can.

## Lifechanger

It was while working for champion trainer Noelene Peech in Zim that Ashley met the charming South African jockey who was to change her life forever.

"We clicked from day one. He talked a lot. Nothing has changed! Funny enough, he is also a good listener and is a very intelligent guy with great life experience. Nothing seems to scare him."

The charismatic jockey only returned to ride in the last meeting of that season but by then numbers had been exchanged and they were coupled on the tote. A move followed to Cape Town

just before the Met of 2009.

"So 'Winnie Wallflower' joined forces with 'Mr Love The Limelight' and we have been together ever since!" she laughs, adding that they have a beautiful son together. Andrew's two oldest children also live with them.

"Sean Peter Fortune is five years old. We initially named him after Andrew's late great friend, Kimberley trainer Peter Miller. But I

was pregnant when Peter's son Sean died tragically. So we chose to call our new son Sean."

Ashley explained that they have horses on their Walkerville property and Sean is already an accomplished rider. "I have to stop him from pulling a horse out at the Vaal to work in the mornings! It's quite scary. No question — this apple hasn't fallen far from the tree!"

When it comes to the business side of things, Ashley says they are keen to build up their string and give their owners a fair deal and a happy experience.

"We have 30 horses in training and have received support from so many people. Hassen Adams, as an example, is a seasoned major owner and to know that he has the confidence to give us horses is a major boon. We have a great growing band of owners and cherish and value them all. Andrew doesn't believe in cheesy emails – he speaks to people. It is something he does very well."

As to the guidance and direction in terms of stable management, Ashley says that Andrew is the first man at work every day and has a great all-round stable management knowledge. "I have given him one morning off a week, as I don't want him to burn himself out," she says with a smile.

"I have also picked the brains of the likes of Alan Greeff, Shane Humby, Darryl Hodgson, Clinton Binda, the Alexanders and my neighbour Gokhan Terzi. They are so willing to give advice and help. There are plenty of good people in what can be a very cut throat game at times," she says.

## Coaching

Ashley does a lot of the rehab and physio work on her horses herself and Wayne Agrella has been a staunch supporter in terms of riding work. She adds that Andrew also comes in handy with coaching of their work-riders.

"He tweaks their seat and shows them how to look better on a horse. That has built their confidence."

She went on to say that she was incredibly fortunate to have commenced with horses in training.

"It is not easy with me being largely an unknown. Having Andrew around gives our owners the confidence that things will be okay. I joke a lot and dig a lot. We laugh a lot. But I really couldn't have done it without him."

## Andrew Fortune had the last word

## - but what's new?

"I realise Ashley is starting in tough times. Guys are leaving the game and here we are opening our doors! I read somewhere that some of the world's greatest businesses have started during a downturn or recession. So we are under no false illusions and are ready to go out there and roll up our sleeves and get our hands dirty. More winners will come — in the meanwhile let's bring the fun back into racing again! Good grief, some of the miserable faces at the racecourse tells me not everybody is enjoying it," he said with a broad smile.

The 2018 Somerset 1200 winner is one of five first crop winners, thus far, to represent Gr2 Premier Trophy and Gr2 Peninsula Handicap hero Master Of My

Others representing the Varsfontein Stud resident include feature race contender Goliath Heron, debut winner Master Keys, and Kuda Sprint contender Lucky Dancer.

Master Of My Fate, whose half-sister My Guiding Star is dam of unbeaten Gr3 Flamboyant Stakes winner Hashtagyolo, enjoyed notable success at the recent Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale.

His yearlings made up to R900 000, with two other Master Of My Fate sired lots making R600 000 apiece.

# Justification!



Justify | Benoit

Justify, the unbeaten winner of Saturday's 144th Gr1 Kentucky Derby, is yet another feather in the cap of the short-lived sire, Scat Daddy.

The 2018 Gr1 Santa Anita Derby winner was one of four starters in the Kentucky Derby for Scat Daddy, whose other runners, Flameaway, Combatant and Mendelssohn, fared poorly, finishing 13th, 18th and last respectively. This quartet hail from their sire's penultimate crop.

Scat Daddy, the first sire since 1923 to be represented by as many as four runners in the Derby, is enjoying another fine year, with Justify, 18 length UAE Derby winner, Mendelssohn (also victorious in last year's Gr1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf), and Blue Grass Stakes second, Flameaway. By far and away the best son of his sire Johannesburg, Scat Daddy has over 20 Gr1 winners to his credit and he looks to have the potential to leave a lasting mark on the stud book, despite dying young, at the age of 11.

### **Royal Ascot**

Despite being a multiple Gr1 winner on the dirt, Scat Daddy truly made his mark as a top international stallion with a remarkable strike rate at the Royal Ascot meeting. His group winning Ascot offspring include all of No Nay Never (Norfolk Stakes), Acapulco (Queen Mary Stakes), Lady Aurelia (King's Stand Stakes, Queen Mary Stakes), Caravaggio (Commonwealth Cup, Coventry Stakes), and Sioux Nation (Norfolk Stakes). Scat Daddy's high class son, No Nay Never, one of two Gr1 Prix Morny winners sired by him, was recently represented by his first winner when daughter, Mae Never No, won at Belmont Park last week. Another son of Scat Daddy, millionaire Handsome Mike, is currently North America's sixth Leading First Crop Sire by earnings.

Scat Daddy's grandsire, Hennessy, made his mark on both this year's Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks —not only is the son of Storm Cat the great grandsire of Justify, but his multiple Gr1 winning son, Henny Hughes, is broodmare sire of Oaks winner, Monomoy Girl.

Justify is the first Kentucky Derby winner since 2008 hero, Big Brown, descended in male line from the mighty Northern Dancer (himself winner of the Kentucky Derby in 1964).

Other Kentucky Derby winners descended from "The Dancer" include Ferdinand, Sea Hero, and Charismatic, with the Kentucky Derby having been by and large dominated by Mr Prospector and his legion of descendants. Remarkably, considered he is thought of by many as the most influential stallion of all time, Northern Dancer was represented by just a single starter in the Kentucky Derby, with his son Giboulee finishing seventh in 1977.

#### Storm Bird

Northern Dancer's son, Storm Bird (male line ancestor of Scat Daddy), however, made his mark in the 1999 Kentucky Derby, when the first three home, Charismatic (Summer Squall), Menifee (Harlan), and Cat Thief (Storm Cat), all traced back to that former champion and Dewhurst Stakes winner. Not only is Justify a son of a truly exceptional stallion in Scat Daddy, however, he is from a female line with a history of producing high class performers over the years.

The chestnut is directly descended in female line from the Colin mare, Noontide, whose other numerous top class performers include the remarkably durable champion, Stymie (Equestrian). The latter, whose 35 wins ensured Stymie retired as the then all-time leading money earner in the USA, was Champion Handicap Male back in 1945. Out of the Gr3 placed Stage Magic (Ghostzapper), Justify is a half-brother to G2 Californian Stakes third The Lieutenant (Street Sense).

His second dam is Gr1 CCA Oaks third, Magical Illusion, with the 2018 Kentucky Derby's first three dams all black type performers.

Justify's second dam is a daughter of Blue Grass Stakes winner, Pulpit (best known as the sire of Tapit –grandsire of Monomoy Girl), who is a close relative of Johannesburg.

Thus Justify is inbred to the important mare, Narrate (Honest Pleasure), the latter being a descendant of the mare, Feola (Friar Marcus), also ancestress of Japanese champion and outstanding sire, Deep Impact (Sunday Silence), whose son Saxon Warrior won Saturday's Gr1 Qipco 2000 Guineas.

#### Hawaii

Interestingly enough, Justify is also inbred to South African, and US Turf, Champion Hawaii (Utrillo). Hawaii, whose name can also be found in the pedigree of Friday's Kentucky Oaks winner, Monomoy Girl (Tapizar), notably appears twice in the pedigree of Justify.

The former Claiborne Farm based resident is found in the pedigree of Justify's sire, Scat Daddy, whose grandsire Hennessy is out of the Hawaii mare Island, Kitty, and dam, Stage Magic. The latter is a daughter of brilliant racehorse and sire Ghostzapper, whose granddam, Thirty Zip, is out of the Hawaii mare Sailaway. Justify is the first US classic winner produced by a Ghostzapper mare, but, given the quality of daughter that Ghostzapper has sired, he is unlikely to be the last.

Justin Snaith's Cape Summer Season dual Gr1 winner Snowdance found one too good for her on an action-packed Friday evening at Greyville when Ashburton-based Fiorella got her head in front in the final stride to win the R500 000 Gr2 Daisy Fillies Guineas.

Deceased champion Captain Al produced the top two home in the opening classic of the SA Champions Season — but in the wrong order for many, with the local lady Fiorella capitalising on the suspect fitness of the thirteen-week rested Cape star. Starting at short odds-on, Bernard Fayd'herbe rode a confident race on Snowdance as the long-striding Cheveley Stud bred galloper carted her field along and looked a winner right up to the 200m marker.

Even when Anton Marcus gathered Fiorella late in his customary style, Snowdance dwarfed her and looked to have things under control.

But Bernard Fayd'herbe hit the panic button late as Snowdance changed legs but had to put up the white flag as the gutsy 11-1 shot Fiorella pulled off a massive win to score by a short head in a time of 96,73secs.

The top two were 1,25 lengths ahead of Elusive Heart, with Roy's Riviera a fair fourth.

Owner Dave Maclean was on hand to collect the winner's trophy and it is good to see him competing actively this season in the black-type league. He also owns, amongst others, the smart 3yo Neptune's Rain, who featured prominently in last Sunday's Poinsettia finish and has been labelled a Gr1 filly by Howells.

A R700 000 National Yearling Sale purchase, the Varsfontein-bred Fiorella has now won 4 races with 4 places from 9 starts and stakes of R606 625.

A daughter of late champion sire Captain Al (Al Mufti), she is out of Caesour's SA Oaks winner Arcola —a half sister to fellow Oaks winners Ash Cloud and Princess Of Light . She is bred on the same cross as ill-fated Paddock Stakes winner Emerald Cove.

## **Snaith Does It Again**

Just as things looked to be turning pearshaped, Justin Snaith pulled the SA Champions Season launch on Friday evening out of the fire with an exciting win by his Twice Over gelding Do It Again in the R600 000 Gr2 Daisy Guineas.

The withdrawal of stable star Oh Susanna with a bruised heel from the Guineas early on Friday morning, was followed by an uncomfortable showing by Copper Force (not enjoying the conditions) in the Drill Hall Stakes, then a heartstopping narrow defeat for their dual Gr1 winner Snowdance in the Daisy Fillies Guineas. But the Daisy Guineas victory for the handsome son of Twice Over righted the ship and set the foundation for a big season. After Wonderwall had shown the way and local hope Sniper Shot had slipped into the lead at the 300m, Do It Again was seen making massive strides and he hit the front at the 200m to win going away.by 1,25 lengths in a time of 96,03 secs. Do It Again has won 3 races with 2 places from 5 starts for stakes of R707 500. He was knocked down to John Freeman for R1,1 million at the 2016 National Yearling Sale Bred by Northfields, Do It Again is a son of Twice Over (Observatory) out of the sixtime winning Sweet Virginia (Casey Tibbs). Described as the best horse he trained by Phillipi trainer Riaan Van Reenen, the slightly built Sweet Virginia is out of the Royal Prerogative Millie Bovana. She was victorious in the 2005 Gr3 Final Fling Stakes, and walloped the boys in the Gr3 Winter Classic and Winter Derby.

## On The Mark

Comeback Kid Mark Khan defied fitness doubts and the generous betting odds to grab his fourth SA Derby winner when steering longshot Hero's Honour home for Gary Alexander in the R2 million Gr1 SA Derby at Turffontein on Saturday. A maiden winner, Hero's Honour was trying the 2450m for the first time on Saturday and taking on some big guns. But he produced the goods to give Gary Alexander his third SA Derby success and the jockey-trainer combination a second after Timber Trader won the race in 2002. Khan had Hero's Honour relaxed in fifth as Walter Smoothie and Gambado showed the way all the way around. At the 400m, Aldo Domeyer produced Ashley Fortune's Cash Time down the centre with what looked to be a winning surge. But Hero's Honour slipped down the rail and took command as Surcharge and Noble Secret took off late.

At the line, the multiple champion jockey had judged it to perfection and the 55-1 shot Hero's Honour registered an impressive win by 1,50 lengths in a time of 155,09.

Surcharge rounded off a perfect SA Triple Crown consolation – banking a second cheque in all three legs, with the De Kock runner Noble Secret a further quarter length back in third.

Hero's Honour was a first Gr1 winner for Lawrence and Jarryd Wernars, whose familiar white, red and black silks are seen across the country.

A R300 000 2016 CTS Johannesburg Ready To Run Sale graduate, Hero's Honour has won 2 races with 2 places from 6 starts for stakes of R1 354 600.

Bred by Summerhill, the winner is by Await The Dawn —a son of Giant's Causeway who stood for less than two years at Summerhill Stud before he died of a heart attack in October 2014,

Hero's Honour is out of the versatile fourtime winner Grail Maiden (Galileo), who won from 1200m to 2400m, and no doubt imparted her staying genes to her son.

Despite a 50% win strike-rate for visitors over the past 8 years, Joey Ramsden and Justin Snaith were the only away trainers prepared to take their chances in the prestigious Gr1 sprint and Snaith looked to be the more likely to get lucky, with the fancied Sergeant Hardy a popular choice. But on a tough day for punters and the form book, that was not to be as Richard Fourie settled Attenborough four lengths off the rush led by Down To Zero, Pinnacle Peak and Wrecking Ball.

In a race won by top horses over the years, Attenborough made it look so easy as he took off under a left-handed ride and charged up the outside to score a deserved win by a length in a nice time of 56,32 secs. The former PE-based Man O'War Sprint winner Pinnacle Peak showed plenty of pace and hung on for second, ahead of the winner's stablemate Speedpoint, who also showed the benefit of a second run in Gauteng.

While it was a first Computaform Sprint winner for Joey Ramsden, one of his former charges in the soldier Copper Parade won it for Yvette Bremner in 2014.

This was the top-class Richard Fourie's Gr1 sprint success. That seems quite extraordinary given his long association with the Snaith yard.

Top sprinters Sergeant Hardy and Trip To Heaven both finished well downfield. A R2 million purchase by Mayfair Speculators

off the Cape Premier Yearling Sale, Attenborough has now won 5 races with 9 places from 21 starts and stakes of R2 025 025. Attenborough was purchased out of the Mayfair Speculators unbundling and was having his second run for his new owners on Saturday.
