At Tokyo racecourse in Japan on Sunday, 4YO US-bred entire Mozu Ascot (Frankel-India, by Hennessy) claimed his first graded stakes success charging home to snatch victory in the final strides in the 68th running of the Gr1 Yasuda Kinen over 1600m, defeating Aerolithe & Suave Richard. The Kentucky-bred Mozu Ascot, who earned an automatic entry into the Gr1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs in November, advanced his record to 5 wins and 1 placing from 11 starts for ¥221,135,000 in earnings.

GIMME SOME

Varsfontein stallion Gimmethegreenlight enjoyed a Super Saturday on 2 June. Surcharge won the Gr1 Daily News 2000 and is one of an impressive 11 stakes horses produced in Gimmethegreenlight's second crop, with this crop having also produced Gr2 Camellia Stakes winner Green Plains, Gr1 filly Rose In Bloom and Gr1 SA Fillies Classic second Green Top. On the same day, Gimmethegreenlight daughter Simona picked up one of Zimbabwe's biggest races when the 4yo triumphed in the Gr2 OK Grand Challenge at Borrowdale.
