

But the puzzling no show of the Yvette Bremner-trained National Park from the nominee list of the Champion 2yo male category for the regional East Cape Racing Awards published by the Racing Association late last week had the owners of the son of Gimmethegreenlight sitting up and asking questions – how and why?

There is little doubt that the first nominee Alfeo would be a deserved winner of the category. The MR 94-rated galloper has won 3 of his 6 starts, in-

cluding a stakes feature. He finished some 15 lengths back in the Champion Juvenile Cup.

The next nominee Say No More was 18,6 lengths back in the same feature. He has an 83 rating and has a record of 1 win in 7 starts.

The third nominee Born A Bully won his first start – the first local 2yo event over 800m. That was his sole win in eight starts. He was 16,6 lengths back in the Champion Juvenile Cup. He is rated 78.

The question is – how and why no place for the

narrow runner-up in the Champion Juvenile Cup and the highest rated (96) of the crop, National Park, can be justified?

A winner of 2 of his 5 starts, National Park won the Champion Juvenile Cup beating likely champion 2yo filly of last term, Madame Speaker. He lost the race in the Stipes Boardroom after a successful objection by the runner-up.

So a two-time winning MR 96 rated narrow loser of the Champion Juvenile Cup, doesn't even get a nomination nod ahead of two one-time winners (rated 78 & 83), who finished a collective 35 lengths behind him in the Listed Champion Juvenile Cup — a race often used as a benchmark of the 2yo crop over the years.

The judging panel is comprised of Thulani Khanyile (Convenor), Dr Ashley Parker, Trevor Reid, Mathew Lips and Henk Steenkamp

The owners and breeders of National Park are outraged.

Not about the fact that Alfeo would be a deserving winner. They are tired of the fact that the sport they are so passionate about and have invested many millions of rands in over decades is run by people, many of whom have been in it for five minutes, who have no interest in the well-being of the game and the preservation of the tradition, ethics and ethos.

"This is a matter of principle for us. Four of the panel members are knowledgeable and experienced people. Our horse is clearly a candidate for a nomination. Yet two, with respect, inferior horses get nominated. We suggest that the Convenor of the panel has exceeded his authority and used the occasion of an important event for the industry to wage a personal vendetta. We suggest that his competency to convene this panel is in serious doubt. We cannot let this action pass unnoticed as it is an indictment of the broader level of personal egotism at play in the industry in certain quarters," said owners Rob Knuppe, Hedley McGrath and Mark Wright in a joint statement.

"The Racing Association, and by implication their awards committee, are allowing any goodwill left in the industry to be destroyed through glossing over this matter. It was brought to the RA's CEO attention and he 'relented' and agreed to include National Park. We are not seeking a favour, hollow victory or concession- or even a sympathy ticket. We are simply looking for the truth as to what happened and would like the individual members of the committee to stand up and be counted."

The Sporting Post emailed Larry Wainstein and Thulani Khanyile and gave them an opportunity to respond to the owners concerns and our own questions. No reply was forthcoming.

A simple logic of damage control suggests there was a better way to deal with whatever happened here. It starts with humility and didn't end with playing hardball with longstanding owners and breeders - or shunning the media enquiries.

This blip on our everyday radar may appear trivial to some. But add the logic applied to the selection of the nominees with the collective years of involvement and investment by the owners of National Park, and think again.

"This situation is unacceptable and must be urgently addressed before there is a mass exodus of owners and breeders from the Thoroughbred Industry. Any tin-pot dictators, given free reign will simply encourage the speed of the exodus," said the aggrieved connections in closing.

Jockey Club Stakes (L) Fairview

Two East Cape Racing Awards nominees could fight out the finish of the R150 000 Listed Jockey Club Stakes at Fairview on Friday. The super consistent topweight Beataboutthebush steps up in ground again and she must be the horse to beat.

The race is named in recognition of the fact that the Jockey Club- now the National Horseracing Authority- was founded in Port Elizabeth almost 130 years ago.

The superbly talented 5yo Gimmethegreenlight mare Beataboutthebush has been a model of consistency, earning at 15 of her 19 starts and, in many cases,

encountering traffic issues with her late dash racing style, that has cost her dearly. She failed to flatter in this race last year, but with a conservative ride from Cape Champion jockey Aldo Domeyer, she looks close to a good thing. She is fit and her fluent victory in the Paddock Stakes last time sets her up for a big effort over the extra 400m.

The former Joburg-based 7yo Patchit Up Baby has not won in ages but looks much better suited to the extra here. The game daughter of Ideal World should negate the superiority of the Paddock Stakes result with Beataboutthebush. She is widely drawn and was reported not striding out last time – a concern.

The Joey Ramsden yard has been through a torrid time (*read more in Short Heads on page 10*) and they plan a raid with the very smart Fresnaye. If the daughter of Western Winter has escaped the post-inoculation blues then she must be a massive runner on current Cape winter stakes form.

Yvette Bremner's top-class Widow's Lamp was outgunned in the Gr1 Woolavington 2000 at Greyville and then found the mile of the Paddock Stakes on the short side last time. The daughter of Go

Deputy is very effective over the 2000m and could recapture her earlier best – the wide draw should not be of too much concern with her preferred racing style.

Her stablemate Peach Delight is a course and distance winner and very gutsy on her day. She strikes us as a likely pacemaker and could threaten the back end of quartets.

best of the Snaith attack may be Konkola who jumps from the pole position draw with Richard Fourie in the irons. Fit and well, the daughter of Silvano could spoil the Alan Greeff party.

Esteemal is poorly drawn and stayed on well to finish fourth in the Winter Oaks at home after doing herself no favours when failing to settle.

Queen Forever is stablemate to the topweight and enjoys this trip. She ran a fair race in the East ape Derby at her penultimate start and may have needed her last run when a well beaten 8 lengths in the Paddock Stakes.

It looks very tough for the rest and unless Ryan Munger (Widow's Lamp) or Richard Fourie (Konkola) can produce some genius, Beataboutthebush looks likely to win this.

Challenge Final Leg

The Listed Jockey Club Stakes is the 3rd Leg of the Eastern Cape Fillies and Mares Challenge

Weights are framed with 5 year-olds and older allotted 56 kgs, 4 year-olds 55 kgs and 3 year-olds 50 kgs.

Penalties accrue for stakes wins- winners of Gr1 races getting 4kg for each such win, Grade 2 winners get 3kg, Grade 3 race wins attract a 2kg penalty and Listed races 1kg.

R700 000 was set aside by Phumelela for the East Cape Filies & Mares Challenge, a series of three races. Besides the total stake monies of R450 000 on offer, a Challenge bonus of R250 000 was offered to the horse who could win all three races.

The now retired Star Burst Galaxy won the first leg, the East Cape Breeders Stakes run over 1200m on Friday 29 June.

A likely favourite to win on Friday, Beataboutthebush won the second leg, the R150 000 East Cape Paddock Stakes run over a mile on Friday 20 July. That was her second consecutive victory in the race.

Poly Saves The Day

The polytrack saved the Fairview meeting for the second week in a row when last Friday's eight-race turf programme was switched at the last moment to the all-weather.

Phumelela advised at 12h00 that following an inspection of the course by the Stipes, Vet, Course Manager and Jockeys it was decided to move the race meeting to the Polytrack following the rain that had continued to fall through Friday morning, due to unsafe underfoot conditions on the Turf.

Phumelela Eastern Cape GM Luciano Passerini told the SP Digest that the penetrometer reading was 25 on Thursday.

"That's soft at Fairview. The rain was intermittent on Friday morning. We had 4 mm's of rain in the morning. We tried our best to stay on the turf. But our decision to switch to poly was vindicated as 13mm's had fallen by the time we ran the last. The best interest of safety for horse and rider are paramount."

He pointed out that a switch before the first race was preferred as most punters had not yet placed their exotic bets by that time.



Well-Bred Filly Cracks It On Debut

Only eighteen days into his new contract as retained jockey to the powerful Highlands-Ridgemont team, Anton Marcus was quickly into his stride for his new connections with an impressive icebreaker debutante in the second at Kenilworth on Saturday.

The Highlands-bred Dynasty filly Front And Centre, a half-sister to Highlands' Singspiel stallion Potala Palace, races in the interests of Craig & Ross Kieswetter and Ridgemont Highlands, and made an impressive first impression when she bounded clear in the Maiden Plate for fillies and mares over the 1200m.

The R300 000 Cape Premier Yearling Sale graduate — easy to back at 11 to 1 — won in a time of 74.07 secs to beat the strongly fancied and highly vaunted Snaith runner Juniper Spring, who had two runs under the belt and started at 5-4. Given the positivity surrounding the ability of the runner-up, this was a seriously encouraging debut by Front And Centre.

A daughter of Dynasty (Fort Wood), the Brett Crawford-trained winner is out of the dual UK Gr3 placed mare Alignmet (Alzao).

It has been a good week for the Highlands-Ridgemont team.

Their Sandown-based stallion Pathfork (Distorted Humor) produced the Highlands-bred sales-topper, a well related filly out of Scented Samantha, who sold for R1,2 million at the National 2yo Sale.

On Day 2 of the sale, a son of their premier stallion Dynasty topped the price list. Highlands ranked third on the vendor list with their 13 lots selling for an aggregate of R2 010 000 – an average of R154 615.

Puller's Sunday Hat-Trick

Former Champion Jockey turned Summerveld trainer Garth Puller celebrated his second Scottsville Sunday hat-trick in a fortnight and kept his yard ticking over with an early season win strike-rate of 26 %.

The modest veteran horseman, who is sponsored by Winning Form, said that he was pleased with the second August treble by his team. His debutante La Bella was ridden to a good win by Anton Marcus in the second race.

"She's a progressive daughter of Crusade and we felt she could win first up. She is a big filly and her knees are still a bit open, so we need to give her some

time. Anton thought there was a challenge looming so he pulled the stick. I think she could have won without it,"said Puller.

The up and coming 4kg claimer Khanya Sakayi, who rode his maiden career treble at the same venue a fortnight earlier, was aboard the next two Puller winners – Los Barbados and Rio De La Plata.

"Every win with these older horses is a bonus and they are not punting propositions. And it's much weaker now too after the big guns have gone. So I'd like to believe we should be winning our races. We also had 20mm of rain in two days prior to the meeting. The two 6yo's relished the cut in the ground and Khanya Sakayi rode both perfectly according to instructions. They both take a hard ride and he let them roll at the top of the straight. Let's face it, the weight claim helps the cause when the youngster is talented . We saw that with Ferraris and Mbhele on Saturday."

Barrier Trials & Tribulations

Time To Step Up?

Thanks to the efforts of Gold Circle, and Paul Lafferty in particular, Barrier Trials were reintroduced to South Africa – well, in Gold Circle country at least - late last year and the first trial was held on the Greyville poly on Sunday, 12 November 2017.

Rules

While the initiative has its fans and its detractors, I'm fascinated by it for rather a different reason – the simple matter of where it fits into the Rules.

In theory, barrier trials are run under the Rules and Constitution of the National Horseracing Authority ("NHA"). In case you think the Operators fall outside those rules, allow me to disabuse you of that notion. For the sake of expediency, I'm selecting the highlights reel, but my theory is easily proven with The Operators Rules (yes, they do exist), under section 44 of the NHA's Rule Book, which reads as follows:-

44.1 - A RACING OPERATOR shall be bound by, and shall hold its RACE MEETINGS under the RULES (all of them). That basically says it all as far as I'm concerned, but if you remain unconvinced, there are a few more to support my theory.

44.6 - A RACING OPERATOR shall observe, abide by and enforce the CONSTITUTION and the RULES.

46 states, that "All meetings at which RACES take place shall be run in terms of the RULES."

Section 49, which pertains to entries and Subsection 49.1 clearly states "All entries, however made, are subject to the Rules, the Conditions and the Race Requirements. In the event that there is a conflict between the Rules, the Conditions and/or the Race Requirements, the Rules shall prevail."

And so on, and so forth. You get the picture.

So it is clear that Gold Circle is bound by the Rules of the NHA. But of course the exception proves the rule and it seems that when it comes to Barrier Trials, they do not.

Oue?

There are no official NHA rules to govern Barrier Trials and therefore, as matters stand, Barrier Trials are conducted in some kind of limbo where some rules count, but some do not. Sounds like business as usual, really! However, jokes aside, it's hard enough to enforce existing rules- grey areas are tantamount to an engraved invitation for trouble. Read more here

Kenilworth Development To Go Ahead

The Cape Town City council has dismissed appeals to halt the controversial development of a hotel, high-rise residential units and retail developments on the Kenilworth Racecourse property.

Independent Online reports that the proposed 6.8ha development has been slammed by activists, who fear the impact on the nearby conservation area, its endangered species and irreplaceable biodiversity.

They charged that the city council approved the rezoning application for the development without an environmental impact assessment (EIA) being completed, and a poor public consultation process to keep the development under wraps.

The city council, however, found all environmental authorisation and protocols were abided by.

While the appeals were dismissed in February, and a final decision letter would be issued next month, some objectors were only notified their appeal was dismissed this month, when they queried progress on the case themselves.

They now have 180 days to place this mayoral decision on review.

The Kenilworth Racecourse Conservation Area (KRCA) is situated in the centre of the course and is regarded as one of the last and best examples of Cape Sand Fynbos remaining on the Cape Peninsula.

More than 300 indigenous plant species have been identified, of which 34 are listed as Red Data species. Thirteen different amphibian species occur in the conservation area, of which two are critically endangered and the third is listed as vulnerable.

In the development, land between the grandstand and Rosmead Avenue has been earmarked for a hotel which would link directly to the grandstand.

The Jockey Room will be converted to a restaurant linked to the hotel. The development will include provision for parking and hospitality facilities.

The original stables, along with the parade ring, are to be refurbished and newer stables, and high-density, high-rise residential units built.

In April last year, the Municipal Planning Tribunal approved an application by Nadeson Projects on behalf of the property owner Kenilworth Racing to subdivide the property, and rezone portions of the land for development.

Weight Allowance Is Gold

A natural ability and a weight concession are gold in the hands of the right apprentice jockey. Two new generation talents stole the limelight on Saturday, winning over 30% of the local programme between Kenilworth and Turffontein.

Luke Ferraris and Sandile Mbhele, who was crowned Outstanding Apprentice at the Cape Racing Awards a fortnight ago, rode a hattrick apiece at Turffontein and Kenilworth, respectively.

Sandile, who survived a Snaith-Fourie objection in the Kenilworth third race, to launch the first of a treble of Kenilworth winners for Vaughan Marshall, received glowing praise from Ronnie Sheehan Assistant trainer Peter Wrensch, whose runner Troop The Colour, a 16-10 favourite, finished last of five runners in the seventh race, a 2400m MR 66 Handicap – won by Mbhele on Vaughan Marshall's The Silva Fox.

"No excuses. Troop The Colour pulled up one hundred percent sound. He was beaten by a superb text-book ride and by the pedestrian pace," added Wrensch, who had his boss Ronnie Sheehan on course, after a spell of ill health.

"Aldo Domeyer and I spoke about the pace before the race. We were concerned and our fears came back to haunt us. Once Sandile took charge in front, slowed it up, and then pinched those three lengths at the 700m, we were on a hiding to nothing. Troop The Colour needs a decent gallop and he stays well and finishes his race off when relaxed off a fast pace. I am disappointed as Ronnie hasn't been racing in quite a while. He has been undergoing chemotherapy, but looks so much better and it would have been nice to have a winner. Thankfully he is getting better. And Troop The Colour is none the worse for wear."

Wrensch, a top-class Cape Hunt rider of yesteryear, said that Mbhele was full value for his 2,5kg claim, and added that he made his weight advantage count.

"As a rider, I appreciate watching a guy who thinks about what he is doing. Any jockey can go to the front. But Anton Marcus and Piere Strydom are different league. Look at Piere's ride on The Lawyer in the Turffontein first on Saturday. He got to the front and outrode them. And the horse wasn't spluttering and swerving at the end. Sandile also proved when winning on Symphony in the last that he is no one-dimensional apprentice with a weight discount ticket. He switched the filly off and then judged his ride to perfection from off them. He will get plenty of opportunity now that trainers see how nicely he sits and thinks his game through. He has the world at his feet, I feel — if he keeps his head down,"

At Turffontein, with his Dad David celebrating his 55th birthday and Grandfather Ormond in bed with bronchitis, Luke Ferraris, another 2,5kg claimer on the express route up, rode a treble – including a double for his Grandfather and a winner for Sean Tarry.

Ferraris has now ridden 33 winners from 273 rides. A slower beginner, Mbhele has ridden 26 winners from 318 rides.

As Peter Wrensch suggests, they both look like young men to watch

The Win X-Factor!

Australian superstar Winx broke Back Caviar's record for consecutive victories in great style at Randwick on Saturday when she stormed in to win the A\$500 000 Gr1 Winx Stakes.

Having her first run as a 7yo, the daughter of Street Cry's 26th victory in a row, and her 19th Gr1 win, came amid cheers and applause from an adoring crowd as regular pilot Hugh Bowman rode a confident race.

Families turned up with kids on parent's shoulders watching what could be a once-in-a-lifetime experience for many.

The victory was Winx's 30th from 36 starts, with her prizemoney earned in excess of A\$19 million.

Glyn Schofield rode Godolphin's smart four-year-old Kementari who was seen as being a genuine challenger for the great mare – but Winx was never threatened.

Schofield said: "He had his chance, he loomed up with the mare and couldn't quite sprint with her, he ran okay I suppose."

In media reports, winning trainer Chris Waller told www.racing.com that he was watching keenly.

"Just looking for signs of her losing that dominance," the trainer admitted. "Haven't seen one ounce of it. If anything I've seen improvement.

"It's quite staggering. It shouldn't be about me, it's about that amazing animal. What she is doing for sport in Australia – we should all take a bow and say well done.

"She's the same as the last 25 starts. She never looks like she's dominant. You are always just hoping to see her do it.

A 7yo daughter of Street Cry, Winx has won the equivalent of over R201 million.

She was sold for A\$230 000 at the 2013 Magic Millions Gold Coast sale. She was part of a draft of horses from Coolmore Stud and was purchased by a partnership of Magic Bloodstock Racing, owned by Peter Tighe and his wife Patty, Richard Treweeke and Debbie Kepitis.

Her dam is Vegas Showgirl and Winx is named after a Las Vegas burlesque show.

A Sea Of Class!

The four day York Ebor Festival got under way yesterday with the impressive Roaring Lion a runaway winner of the Gr1 Juddmonte International.

Ridden by Oisin Murphy for trainer John Gosden, the three-year-old was clear entering the final furlong and went on to win by three and a quarter lengths. The 3-1 shot took one of the biggest prizes of the season on the Knavesmire by beating 8-5 favourite Poet's Word.

"He's a mile-and-a-quarter horse through and through and I'd have been very disappointed if he hadn't run like that," Gosden told the BBC.

The muscular grey had too much brawn for a Juddmonte International field that did not lack for quality.

With all but one of the eight-strong field having already conquered racing's highest rank, this had all the makings of a vintage Group 1 and, while it did not disappoint, it was hard to predict Roaring Lion's superiority, travelling effortlessly to the lead under Oisin Murphy before gunning to a three-and-a-quarter-length victory over the second-highest-rated horse on the planet, Poet's Word.

With Arc-winning stablemate Enable on the sidelines and the Knavesmire anything but the mire Cracksman adores, Roaring Lion has emerged from two towering shadows at John Gosden's star-studded Newmarket yard and, after following up success in the Coral-Eclipse at Sandown, is Flat racing's new middle-distance pin-up.


Having compromised his chances of victory in last season's Racing Post Trophy with his wayward antics, Roaring Lion started the season moderately in the Craven but, with a little help from an Indian summer, has blossomed.

While the winner was always in clear water, Poet's Word had to be driven early in the straight and switched to his left to escape an uncomfortable pocket but, while that was far from ideal, it would be far-fetched to call him an unlucky loser with Roaring Lion last off the bridle and dominant at the finish.

The Champion Stakes in both Ireland and Britain are on the radar next but Gosden was looking even further into the future, believing he can conquer even greater heights if he remains in training at four and beyond.

And today Ladies' Day places the fillies in the limelight, with an eight-strong line-up for the Gr1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks run at 16h35, our time.

With Forever Together, winner of the Oaks at Epsom in June, a surprise absentee, Sea Of Class is set to start a short-priced favourite.



Mark Johnston has equalled the all-time record number of British winners for a racehorse trainer. Dr Richard Kimble won at Ripon on the weekend to give the Scot his 4193rd victory. The 58-year-old has reached the mark set by the retired Richard Hannon Sr, and it is only a matter of time before he breaks the record. Johnston, who is based in the Yorkshire village of Middleham, trained his first winner in 1987 and his victories have earned £53m in prize money.

Fire Away

A Syndicate of stud farms has purchased Fire Away (USA), to stand at Wilgerbosdrift Stud next season. The syndicate includes major studs like Wilgerbosdrift, Drakenstein, Moutonshoek, Mauritzfontein, Avontuur, Ascot, Wicklow, Cheveley, Ndoro, Piemonte and Boland Stud. Fire Away was purchased in the USA last month and arrived at Abington Place last Saturday to join the Mike de Kock team for a race campaign in Dubai in 2019.

Cup Goal

With an eye on the Melbourne Cup, Australian Bloodstock has purchase of one of Europe's leading stayers in Irish-bred Fastnet Rock 7yo, Torcedor. A dual Gr3 winner, the gelded Torcedor has also been Gr1 placed behind star stayer Stradivarius at his past two outings, including a last-start second in the Goodwood Cup (3218m). That form had the horse high up on the wish-list of Australian Bloodstock, with the syndicator eventually securing a deal with Te Akau Racing for an undisclosed seven-figure sum.

The Sporting Post's Personality Profile of last week, Trainer Ricardo Le Grange, rounded off three winners on the Kranji weekend double-header when he enjoyed a Sunday double, including a feature winner for staunch owner, Fred Crabbia.

An honest sprinter, Rafaello sprang out of the pack to give yet another reminder of his genuineness in the SGD \$125,000 Kranji Stakes A race over 1100m on the Polytrack.

Though more prolific on turf- seven wins versus one on Polytrack – Michael Lee reports that the Oratorio six-year-old was all heart – or "guts and glory" as his jockey Barend Vorster said – as he came pegging Special King (Azhar Ismail) back inside the last furlong.

For a few fleeting seconds, Rafaello looked to be paddling away on the one spot after journeying three wide among the leading bunch, but once Vorster had him rebalanced and thrusted for a final push, he was chasing shadows no more. As he started to lengthen up, he went bearing down on Special King before putting some breathing space in between.

Favourite Distinctive Darci (Vlad Duric) sailed home on the outside, but a bungled start took its toll on him late as he could only knuckle down to within a length off Rafaello. Special King, who was rising in class, exceeded expectations by hanging on for third place. The winning time was 1min 5.29secs for the 1100m on the Polytrack.

With a handy record of nine wins and nine placings from 33 starts, Rafaello has now amassed around \$740,000 in prizemoney for Crabbia.

Canford Cliffs' Son Crosses The Channel

Sunday sees Deauville round off its summer season with the Gr2 Grand Prix de Deauville-Lucien Barriere, which is set to see Sylvester Kirk continue his search for a big win with Canford Cliffs son Salouen.

The four-year-old has only two ordinary victories as a juvenile to his name, but he has been a regular Pattern-race performer throughout his career.

He has been placed at the top level several times, coming closest to glory when only beaten a head by Cracksman in the Gr1 Coronation Cup at Epsom in June.

Grı Firsts At Deauville

Urban Fox was denied a second Gr1 success when collared close home by Nonza in the Darley Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville on Sunday.

Winner of the Pretty Polly Stakes at the Curragh, the William Haggas-trained four-year-old made another strong bid for honours but was just run out of it in the final strides.

She hit the front in the straight under James Doyle, after Jessica Harington's I'm So Fancy had set the pace, but Nonza, trained by Henri-Francois Devin, was produced by Alexis Badel to land the spoils by a narrow margin.

It was a first Gr1 score for jockey Alexis Badel and trainer Henri-Francois Devin and sparked emotional scenes in the winner's enclosure.

A homebred product of the Devin family's Haras du Mesnil, the daughter of Zanzibari looks progressive.

Sandile Mbhele Absolutely Anything's POSSIBLE

Twenty year old Sandile Mbhele is the 'anything's possible' poster boy of the jockey ranks. He is the tangible living evidence of genuine hope in a system that often comes under fire for sometimes ungainly pretension and perceived window-dressing.

The son of a hardworking Airports Company Cargo Loader and a Domestic Worker, the one-time Ganges Senior Secondary School pupil openly concedes that he flunked every test and exam he ever sat for in a shockingly fragile schooling system – but readily admits that things started changing the day he first set eyes on Summerveld.

Listening to Sandile chat frankly about his troubled High School days a stone's throw from Clairwood Racecourse is an eye-opener for those of us wearing those ever so fashionable rose-tinted spectacles – the type that keep us feeling better and shuts the world out.

"After I had been subsidised by my Mom's very generous Boss through a private primary school education, life from my Grade 8 year was a nightmare rude awakening. There was no discipline at my school. No facilities for sport or anything else. No control. Open flaunting of drugs. We never did homework. Results were a joke. It was cool to get 24% for maths. We bunked and would then hide away from the police and the army, who would try and take us back to class. Most of us were headed nowhere very fast and education and career weren't words in our dictionaries. In fact, we had no dictionar-

But then all that changed when an SA Jockey Academy recruitment team visited the school.

ies- very few text books at all!"

"They had a talk to us about a career as a jockey. They weighed us. And then handed out a pamphlet. That little piece of paper was to prove to be my passport to escape my disastrous high school experience. Before I knew it, I was on an SAJA orientation camp and with the support of my parents — who I wouldn't have blamed for giving up — I had discovered a new dimension on life. An exciting vibrant new world where discipline was key. Where people were hard. But actually seemed to care."

Sandile started his career adventure at SAJA with his current resident duo of Burke and Tarentaal, as well as Denis Schwarz, Dylan Lerena, Calvin Habib, Ashton Arries and Kabelo Matsunyane.

"I hope I haven't left an-

fun and hard work at the SA Jockey Academy. But I could focus on my school work suddenly and, hey, I got my matric – which would not have happened had I stayed where I was. And I grew to love these wonderful animals called horses. Something I hadn't taken too much notice of until then."

He says the greatest part of life at the academy was the camaraderie and friendships that he formed. He laughed at the rush to get out of bed in the morning for stable work.

"There were limited spades and brooms to clean stables and muck out with. So if you missed out you had to use your hands. Some of the guys would try and write their names on the sacks. Some of us got up at 4am just to get a broom. It certainly motivated us to resist the temptation to have put the snooze button on!"

'Sanzi', an affectionate label bestowed on him by his fellow Cape Town Jockey Academy residents Louis Burke and Liam Tarentaal, has been on a high since booting home a career first treble for the Vaughan Marshall yard at Kenilworth last Saturday.

"Did you really come all the way here to talk to me?" he asked apologetically as we underwent the formalities of the introductions with our photographer in tow at the gate of the tightly-run ship that is the Milnerton academy, with the glorious views of a cloud bedecked Table Mountain.

Former jockey and local SAJA riding master Terrance Welch says that his three current students are 'a good bunch'.

"We haven't got any problems here. The guys work hard and pull their weight. They all have talent and bright futures ahead of them," adds Welch.

Sandile had his first race ride on the gutsy mare Kingsview at Scottsville for Therese Mitchley.

The date was 28 August 2016. The polite former Durbanite admits he doesn't remember much about the 70 secs the daughter of King's Chapel took to run just 4 lengths off the winner in sixth place. But she was going to prove a gem in the young jockey's career – giving him his first winning ride at the same venue just four months later.

"I will always remember 21 December 2016. The win was an early unplanned Christmas present – the best ever- and I was thrilled as the trainer Ms

Mitchley had given me so much opportunity and encouragement. Again I don't remember much about the race. I drifted from the outside to the inside and had to survive an objection to keep the race."

The records show that the late Alec Forbes, rider of the runner-up, lodged an objection on the grounds of inter-

ference in the latter stages. To Sandile's relief the result stood but he signed an admission of guilt for a contravention of Rule 62.2.7 as he had failed to ensure that he did not cause interference to the placed horses.

"The Riding Master was on leave and Mr Stuart Ferrie kindly helped me through the hearing and guided me. I was totally confused. I got a week's suspension for it. It was quite a hectic way to start my professional career!,"he recalls.

But things didn't exactly take off for Sandile thereafter.

"I really battled to get rides in KZN. I ran from string to string. Worked in some stables. I tried hard and did all the right things — so I thought anyway. It was depressing having to sit out weeks without a ride. Then having to explain to the Academy management during assessments that I was really trying my best. I even had a trainer suggest that as I was a clean-cut sort of guy who spoke fairly well, I could try my hand at getting a job somewhere else outside of racing."

He admits being totally deflated. But friends like Serino Moodley encouraged him to plug on. He says that, on reflection, he is very glad he didn't take the tempting step and throw in the towel.

Liam Tarentaal, who is sitting listening to the interview with one eye on the Comedy Central channel, adds his input at this point.

"I don't think people know how tough life is at the Academy and then trying to break through as a jockey. The competition is tough and it looks glamorous in the winner's enclosure. But I think the training at Summerveld is really meant to be a tough baptism into the system and to groom and prepare us to face the hard knocks later on," says the youngster who has ridden two winners — both for Eric Sands- in his first three weeks in Cape Town.

"I know what Liam is saying. My self-esteem was under serious pressure. Then one day I had a short chat to trainer Justin Snaith at Summerveld. He suggested I try my luck in Cape Town. Well that suggestion was to be a turning point for me," concedes Sandile as he reflects on his first six months in the Mother City.

He has received most of his support at the yards of Vaughan Marshall, Eric Sands, Greg Ennion and Candice Bass-Robinson.

"Just as I found KZN a brick wall, the Cape has been a springboard for my career and my confidence has been restored. I work hard and get the rides. Not necessarily all the best ones. But I appreciate each and every opportunity and make the most of it."

He says that his Saturday three-timer was a real highlight. We suggested that he had ridden a pearler on The Silva Fox.

"I knew I had to take it easy in front with my weight concession. I read in the Sporting Post that I had been really clever to pinch a few lengths at the 700m. The real reason I moved ahead then was that MJ Byleveld on Giant Flag had tried to challenge me and I made the move then to keep him out. But it worked out well. There isn't even a meter between the first and the second box, but it makes a million miles difference, depending which one you are unsaddling in,"he laughs for the first time.

Sandile is keen to absorb advice and guidance from all angles.

"I do Aldo Domeyer's kit and he talks to me a lot and encourages me. He is my mentor and one of the strongest jockeys that I have ridden against. He is always telling me to keep my head up and smile. And he was one of the first people to congratulate me after Saturday's treble."

Vaughan Marshall was the trainer of all three of Sandile's Saturday winners.

"When I phone around for rides, I first check to see what Mr Marshall has put me on. He has been a major supporter and is a good man who commands much respect. I owe him a lot."

Sandile hasn't seen his Mom, Dad and 13 year old sister since he left Durban in January.

"I do miss them. I went up for an apprentice race a few months back but it was a quick trip and I didn't get the chance to say hello to them. Maybe I can take some time in December, but I need to establish myself as a priority and that is the busy season."

His immediate goal is to get his first feature win on the board. "I managed a third on Goodtime Gal in the Champagne Stakes.

But I need to do better than that."

And an overseas posting?

"I have never left the borders of SA, so that would be a great adventure. And the ultimate for any jockey would be to ride internationally, I imagine. But I have been in racing for two minutes only. My time will come. I know it will."

All-Star Jockeys

SA-born Chad Schofield will represent Hong Kong at the World All-Star Jockeys competition at Sapporo Racecourse in Japan this weekend with a view to joining three Hong Kong greats on the honour roll.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club reports that Douglas Whyte (2004), Zac Purton (2012) and Joao Moreira (2015) have between them won the past 18 champion jockey titles in Hong Kong, with Whyte winning 13 on end before the latter pair advanced to the fore. The talented Schofield's long-range ambitions – if not his short-term expectations – would be to join that elite bracket, and, with that in mind, he is aiming to make the most of his participation in the four-race, two-day competition.

"It's a big honour to represent Hong Kong, I'm pretty chuffed that I've been invited and I'm really looking forward to it," he said, admitting that his call-up was not expected.

"I was surprised, to be honest. It's a big opportunity for me, I've never ridden in Japan and I'm looking forward to what I'm sure will be a good experience for me."

Almost five years after the then-teenager sealed a major atop Shamus Award in the 2013 Cox Plate, Schofield, now 24, heads into the World All-Star Jockeys with three good seasons in Hong Kong under his belt. Last term, he sealed big-race success thanks to Singapore Sling in the Hong Kong Classic Cup on his way to finishing fifth in the premiership with 38 wins.

"This is now my fourth season in Hong Kong and each season I've raised the bar gradually – I feel like I'm still young, still improving and I have a great deal to learn, so no doubt this upcoming experience in Japan will only help me going into the season in Hong Kong," Schofield said.

"Missing the Pre-season Carnival barrier trials isn't ideal but I couldn't really turn down something like this," he said. "I have an agent acting on my behalf over in Japan so I'm hoping I can pick up one or two rides outside of the competition. And it would be good to come into the Hong Kong season with a bit of form and also have my eye in a little bit."

The World All-Star Jockeys is a points-based contest with jockeys competing in two designated races on Saturday, 25 August and two more on Sunday, 26 August. The competition's 14 invited riders compete for the individual crown as well as for the team title. Schofield will be one of six overseas jockeys joining one of Japan's NAR jockeys against a team of seven JRA jockeys.

BREEDING

One of the relatively unheralded stars of 2017-2018 was former Highlands stallion Jallad. The son of Blushing Groom, who passed away at the ripe old age of 29 in 2017, has built up an increasingly impressive record as a broodmare sire -and this was reflected at the recently held **Equus Awards.**

Jallad achieved a remarkable, if not unique, feat when broodmare sire of both the Equus

Champion Sprinter (Will Pays) and Champion Stayer (It's My Turn) - further testimony to his great versatility as a stallion, and a feat deserving of more attention.

To top it all off, the Jallad mare Strawberry Lane was named Equus Broodmare Of The Year for 2017-2018. The Lammerskraal Stud owned Strawberry Lane had earlier been named the Cape's Broodmare Of The Year and is down to visit Visionaire (Grand Slam) this season.

By far the best horse sired by disappointing Indian Ridge stallion Imperial Stride, Will Pays became the ninth Gr1 winner produced by a daughter of Jallad when he downed high class performers Attenborough (Western Winter), Trip To Heaven (Trippi), Pinnacle Peak (Querari) and Dutch Philip (What A Winter) to win the 2018 Gr1 Mercury Sprint.

Coincidentally, Will Pays is also the best horse thrown by his dam Rattlebag- a talented racemare who won six times, including the Azalea Stakes, and who was promoted to second place in the Gr1 SA Fillies Guineas. One of those beaten by Rattlebag in the SA Fillies Guineas included subsequent Oaks winner Taineberry (Centaine)- the dam of Strawberry Lane!

To date, Will Pays has won 11 of 33 races and banked more than R1.8 million in stakes.

Turn For The Best

Champion Stayer It's My Turn, whose exclusion from the 2018 Vodacom Durban July continues to look more and more bizarre, is one of a growing number of top class performers sired by Dynasty out of a daughter of Jallad.

It's My Turn, whose four graded victories include the 2016 Gr1 Investec Cape Derby, joins last season's Gr1 winners Liege (Summer Cup) and Eyes Wide Open (Cape Derby) as other top level winners sired by Dynasty out of Jallad mares. Other notable performers bred on this cross include July runner up Run For It, unbeaten filly Hashtagyolo, and Gr2 Betting World 1900 winner Solid Speed.

Jallad's winning daughter Strawberry Lane was responsible for her second Gr1 winner when daughter Redberry Lane (Western Winter) downed Snowdance (Captain Al) to claim the 2018 Gr1 Jonsson Workwear Garden Province Stakes. In the process, the re-

gally bred Redberry Lane stamped herself as a hugely exciting future broodmare prospect- and an intriguing prospect for the 2018-2019 season.

A full-sister to dual Guineas winner Solo Traveller and to Fillies Guineas second Strawberry Ice (dam of Gold Bracelet winner Flying Ice), Redberry Lane, who also won the Syringa handicap last season, is one of seven winners produced by her dam-who, in

turn, is an own sister to Gr3 Pretty Polly winner Jalbery (dam of Golden Horseshoe winner Purple Diamond and last season's Off To Stud winner Love To Boogie).

Strawberry Lane was not the only Jallad mare to confirm herself an outstanding producer last season, however. Former Garden Province Stakes winner Lyrical Linda was responsible for Summer Cup hero Liege (Dynasty), with the latter (a first Gr1 winner for his dam) one of 3 stakes winners for his dam, whose son Lance (Jet Master) is now standing at stud.

The Jallad sired Equus Champion Russian Sage also made his presence felt in 2017-2018, with his son Perovskia- his sire's best son by far- winning the Gr2 Drill Hall and Jet Master Stakes.

Champion

The most successful son of Blushing Groom ever to stand at stud in South Africa, Jallad was South Africa's Champion Sire in 2001, with his 16 individual Gr1 winners including such champions as the above mentioned Russian Sage, Rabiya, Succesful Bidder, Icy Air and Horse Of The Year Free My Heart.

Jallad left quite a mark on the Cape Derby, siring the winners Rabiya, Russian Sage, and Grande Jete, and is damsire of Derby heroes It's My Turn and Eyes Wide Open.

His versatility as a stallion can be highlighted by the fact that Jallad runners won Gr1 races from 1160 to 3200m.

Jallad ended 2017-2018 as South Africa's third leading Broodmare Sire by stakes won (according to NHA statistics), with his daughters progeny winning 130 races and banking more than R16.4 million in prize money. Jallad daughters were responsible for 13 individual stakes winners last season, who won 19 black type features. Other notable black type performers out of Jallad mares last season included Oaks Trial winner Chariot Of Gold (Silvano), Off To Stud Stakes winner Love To Boogie (Trippi), Sweet Chestnut Stakes victress Too Phat To Fly (Bezrin), and Michael Roberts Handicap hero Wild Wicket (another by Dynasty).

Previous star performers produced by daughters of Jallad include star sprinter Shea Shea (National Emblem), Gr1 Met hero Martial Eagle (Silvano), Gr1 Allan Robertson Fillies Championship winner Give Me Five (Goldkeeper) and the above mentioned Solo Traveller. BREEDING

Drakenstein Stud's Cartier Champion Duke Of Marmalade enjoyed a good weekend, with the son of Danehill enjoying both local success and featuring as a broodmare sire of a pricey Argana Yearling Sale buy.

Duke Of Spin became the sixth winner to have emerged from his sire's first South African bred crop when he romped home, while making all the running, to score a facile 3.75 length maiden win on just his second official start at Scottsville on Sunday.

Trained by Duncan Howells, the Varsfontein Stud bred colt relished the mile and he looks to have a bright future ahead of him.

Out of the Fort Wood mare Justthewayyouare. Duke Of Spin was a R1.4 million buy from last year's National Yearling Sale.

Other smart sorts to have emerged from Duke Of Marmalade's exciting first local crop include Cape champion Temple Grafin and the talented Santa Clara – second in both the Kenilworth Fillies Nursery and Irridescence Stakes last season.

Duke Of Marmalade is also broodmare sire of a Camelot colt (Lot 62) who made €400 000 at the recent Argana Yearling Sale. Positive Trends!

The total aggregate for all Bloodstock South Africa yearling sales in 2018 grew by an impressive 20%. The standout sale as far as the aggregate increase is concerned, would have to be the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sales where a 25% increase was achieved.

The KZN Yearling Sale and the Emperors Palace National Two Year Old Sale also posted significant increases in their aggregates achieved, both posting double digit growth. As a result, BSA grew their percentage of the market share by 38%. The average price achieved over all yearling sales run by BSA improved by a healthy 20%.

This year also marked the introduction of a new initiative at the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale of a two-tiered sale. Horses sold on session 1 had an increased minimum bid of R100 000 whilst session 2 remained at R50 000. It is worth noting that only 17% of the horses over the entire sale failed to reach the R100 000 minimum bid for session 1 (8% in session 1 and 9% in session 2). The results speak for themselves: average price achieved on session 1 was R582 000 whilst session 2 achieved R188 000. It is interesting to note that at the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale the number of horses sold between the R500 000 to R1 000 000 and R300 000 to R500 000 grew by 42% and 34% respectively.

When reviewing statistics the two figures that are often overlooked are the sales median and clearance rate. Bloodstock South Africa has proudly noted that the median price achieved increased at every sale held in 2018 and the clearance rate was 82%.

The most positive effect on the South African Thoroughbred Industry in 2018 has been the very active international market for both yearlings and proven race horses. International participation at the 2018 Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale was significant. From purchasing 29 horses and spending what equated to 16% of the Bloodstock South Africa's turnover in 2017, international buying increased to 54 horses this year, and their participation saw the overseas spend equate to no less than 34% of BSA's turnover at the 2018 sale.
