The 7yo Ryalex won by 24 lengths at Carlisle Racecourse on Monday - but that wasn't the only reason he captured attention. The gelding has just one ear. While his appearance is uncommon, it doesn't seem to impact his racing, which he showed when giving his rivals a hiding in the handicap chase. The Lucinda Russell-trained gelding usually races in a hood, which means the missing ear doesn't often get noticed. He lost it in an accident in Ireland.

Muzi Yeni is 9 wins ahead of Ryan Munger at the top of the SA national log after his double at Flamingo Park on Monday. The jockeys with the best strike rate are Anton Marcus (30%), Gavin Lerena (27%) and Richard Fourie (25%). Sean Tarry (39 winners) has edged R200 000 ahead of reigning champion Justin Snaith (50 winners) on the national trainers log.

### The Eagle Hovers

Past dual SA Horse Of The Year Legal Eagle makes his seasonal debut in the eighth race at Thursday's Turffontein night meeting, following a sixmonth layoff. The 7yo, who boasts 13 wins from 24 starts for Sean Tarry, will contest a Pinnacle Stakes over 1160m. He is expected to bid for a 4th L'Ormarins Queen's Plate win in 2019 - but has a few rainbow bridges to cross, as it were, after we watched the Cape Mile on Sunday!



#### Noble Stuff

Rathmor stallion Noble Tune's Curlin half-sister sold for \$600 000 at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale earlier this month. The half-sister to Gr1 winner Honor Code, Gr1 Breeders Cup placed Noble Tune, the handsome Declarationofpeace and Stakes horse Lady Serena, dam Serena's Cat has been an outstanding broodmare and saw her Curlin filly achieve the third-highest price for a weanling during the Book 1 session. She was bred in Kentucky by Dell Ridge Farm and Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings. The weanling filly sold to Meadow Oaks Racing Stables.
