# Old Man River

The Klawervlei Stud bred Captain Lars registered his 23rd victory at Lingfield on Saturday – and his 11th this year. He made his debut on 1 May 2012 at Scottsville for Mike de Kock. By Captain Al out of the Gr1 placed Polar Falcon mare Polar Charge, who won twice in Italy, Captain Lars cost R1,4 million on the Cape Premier Yearling Sale.



The National Yearling Sale R5 million recordbreaker Ghaalla became Var's 43rd stakes winner when flashing up late to win the Gr3 Fillies Mile on Saturday. The Varfsontein bred flyer is expected in the Cape for the Fillies Guineas on 15 December. Var is currently South Africa's Leading Active Sire by money earned this season, with his runners having already banked over R3,6 million in 2018-2019.

One of South Africa's greatest jockeys of all time has been officially medically boarded due to knee issues. Trainer Tony Millard was pleased with the performance of dual Gr1 winner Edict Of Nantes (now Northern Superstar), who hadn't raced since December 2017 when finishing out of the money in the Class 1 Chevalier Cup on Sunday at Sha Tin in Hong Kong. The Count Dubois galloper, who was trained here by Brett Crawford for Mayfair Speculators, ran on steadily for sixth. He goes for the Gr1 Hong Kong Cup on 9 December.
