RAISING THE BAR

The principle of ever having a non-racing man at the helm of our racing regulator seems ludicrous and almost reckless against the background the great strides made in just a matter of six weeks by the new NHA CEO.

The National Horseracing Authority has transcended from years of darkness into a lighter brighter space in a matter of weeks in 2019.

And much on a par with the current Eskom 'what were we thinking' ideology, it is difficult to rationalise what the Board of our regulator were trying to achieve when they employed the 'inspirational leader and change agent with a wealth of experience gained in various operational strategic positions held in various industries' back in March 2016.

Just as Lyndon Barends was always a sitting duck during his 30 months in the hot seat, his new age replacement Vee Moodley is a man who carries a loaded gun, talks turkey and gets things done.

One of Vee's immediate goals in his new role was to introduce a high-performance culture and ensure that the NHA lived up to its mission statement of maintaining the integrity of the sport of horseracing. "Strengthening the Executive and Management teams was high on my agenda, as is ensuring that the transformation goals of the organisation are accomplished within a reasonable time-frame," he said, while unpacking his bag on his first day at office.

Speaking to the Sporting Post on a snap Valentine's Day catch-up six weeks later, Vee said that one of his first goals had been an attempt to shift in-house attitudes from a 'less is more' attitude to one of 'more is still not enough'.

“With every respect to those that went before me, my focus is on transparency and information. We are the racing public’s and stakeholder’s servants. The industry pays our salaries. When we are asked questions we must give answers. It’s an open door policy. Full stop.”

He said that besides Racing Control and Handicapping, the Stud Book department was a top priority. He committed the South African Stud Book to maintaining its status of ‘Approved Thoroughbred Stud Book’ to requirements mandated by the EASBC in an audit and to be achieved by 31 July .

Even the Stipes Reports are already reflecting more information and the recently introduced handicapper’s reports on the Gr1 races analysis is a step to inform and educate.

“A lack of information and education can only build barriers between ourselves and the industry. Previously handicapping decisions were made and that was it. Now everybody can see our thinking and rationale and we are answerable – as we should be,” he said.

Vee says there is great progress on the aspect of bringing the Grooms onto the books of the NHA. He pointed out the NHA rules sub sections 11.2.9, 12. 1 and 12.2, covering Trainers, Grooms and adherence to the Basic Conditions of Employment Act.

“We have had discussions and once we have confirmation of the majority representative body for Grooms in South Africa, we will be making further announcements.”

The upgrading of the results and merit ratings information on the NHA website has been further enhanced by the publication of the line horse.

“This is a good example where an informed member of the public made the suggestion via the Sporting Post comments platform. That’s where the attitude has changed - we are prepared to listen and to act – and we have had a host of suggestions that have been really constructive from a variety of sources.”

The calling in of jockeys by the Stipes after recent features and the consequent tweeting of the information had also been designed to show transparency and proactivity.

“The Stipes now also have all the betting websites streaming live in the boardroom during the raceday. We need to learn to follow this information and use it. Joe Public is attached to the sport and very informed. And whereas he punts or owns horses, NHA officials are not permitted to do either and thus, unsurprisingly, tend to be detached. We need to change that and become part of the heart of the game from a regulatory viewpoint.”

He added that the NHA had been accused at times of being too lenient.

“We need to work on upgrading our performance to best world practice and close the gap. We have some top class experienced personnel and it will just take time.”

He cited the example of the decisive action on the part of the NHA in relation to the 15 January eligibility question of Sugoi’s Assessment Plate win. After the race a trainer had pointed out that in terms of Local conditions pertaining to assessment races on the Highveld, he was of the opinion that the winner had not met its obligation of participating in two assessment plates before being allowed to run in a handicap on the Highveld. The NHA had ruled that should a winner of a maiden race within its first five starts compete in any race for which it is eligible in another province, that race will count as one of the said horse’s mandatory assessment runs.

Vee realises that his job doesn’t come with a popularity badge.

“We are independent and cannot take sides in any instance. From day one we have played open cards with the public, our stakeholders and the media. And that, believe it or not, makes the job a lot easier!”

When Racing Is A Rush!**Gr3 Tommy Hotspur Handicap Turffontein**

The Gr3 Tommy Hotspur Handicap headlines the Turffontein standside track programme on Saturday and provides a tricky 1000m handicap puzzle where a hesitant start or a split second decision could mean the difference between a cheque and a hard-luck story.

Formerly with trainer Brett Crawford out at Philippi, the speedy Var colt Valbonne has his first run for Roy Wagner and looks quite nicely in off the 52kg marker. While he was well beaten by subsequent Cape Flying Championship star Kasimir in the Cape Merchants at his penultimate start, Valbonne showed more enthusiasm when showing pace and beaten into fourth behind Speedpoint in the South Easter Sprint last time. He should strip fit and ready for a big effort with a change of scenery set to recharge his batteries.

Dennis Bosch brings the superfast Chantymen up from KZN and makes use of in-form rider Warren Kennedy. The 4yo son of Oratorio has a throat issue that makes him brilliant over 1000m – but he doesn’t go an inch further. This is his first big test and as a fit and in-form raider he ranks a serious chance.

Clinton Binda’s Premier Show races fresh off a 23 week break when chasing Chimichuri Run home in the Spring Spree Stakes. With only 52kgs to shoulder, the son of Mog-ok could have a say in the outcome at best.

Mike Azzie’s Golden Loom Stakes winner Rivarine gets the blinkers fitted and ran a nice third behind Rebel’s Champ in the Lebelo Sprint last time out. The son of Var meets the Paul Peter topweight on 2kgs better terms for a 1,90 length defeat and should be right in the mix.

It looks quite tough for the rest.

Alec Laird’s Pure Blonde has not shown any form signs recently and would be a surprise winner.

Much the same applies to Candice Dawson’s Rocky Valley who returns from the Cape empty handed after the Cape Flying Championship on Met day and is formless for some time.

Much the same references apply to the likes of Isphan, Tandava, Cathedral County and Down To Zero.

Robbie Hill tries his luck with the smart Red Chesnut Road who travels from Summerveld after an 11 week break. He drops down to the 1000m in an interesting move.

Sean Tarry’s good mare Exquisite Touch is a class sprinter on her day. She has stayed on well at both her starts this term and could surprise with improved fitness.

Grant Maroun has a top record in this race having won it twice in three runnings with Viking Hero (2016) and the filly Wrecking Ball (2017). He saddles Donny G and the newly blinkered Great Shaka – both quick customers. Great Shaka’s headgear should see him tearing away up front and the preference is for him.

Course and distance specialist Rebel’s Champ has to lumber 62kgs and has his first start since an unsuccessful tilt at the

A Ferrari On Four

Saturday's Turffontein feature is named in honour of the four-legged Ferrari, Tommy Hotspur. At the age of 27, and enjoying a pampered retirement on Shearwood Farm in Johannesburg, his proud owner Ashleigh Hughes told the Sporting Post earlier this week that her favourite son was doing well.

"He is in great health and happy in retirement. He is still so handsome, even with all the silver streaks throughout his gold shimmer coat," she added.

Trained for the larger part of his career by Gary Alexander, and then by David Ferraris, he won his first 8 starts in a row, and 10 races in total, including the Gr1 Computaform Sprint. The flashy chestnut colt, by Harry Hotspur out of the Brer Rabbit mare, Tabitha Twitchet, was born on 1 November 1991. "Pure speed on speed," comments Ashleigh. He didn't have good front legs, and was rejected by the National Yearling and National 2yo Sale selection committee and relegated to the farm. The following year, Gary Alexander went to view yearlings at Mr Beck's farms and noticed the skinny 2yo in a paddock. He was immediately drawn to the colt, but Mr Beck tried to talk him out of the little chestnut, due to those poorly conformed legs. However, Gary was determined and eventually a deal was struck and Tommy headed up to Turffontein to race in the interests of Len Salzman, Greg Sadie and Brian Melnick.

It was one of those rare partnerships that simply worked. Despite requiring skilful management, Tommy had 12 starts for Gary, winning his first 8 races in a row. He followed up with 2 close seconds and then posted another 2 wins, including the 1997 Gr1 Computaform Stakes, which saw him break the track record, covering the Gosforth Park 1000 metres in 56,37 seconds.

Tommy transferred to David Ferraris for his next 4 starts, but never matched his earlier form and was retired in March 1998 with 10 wins and 4 places from his total of 16 lifetime starts.

Quality Diadem Closes The Summer

Anton Marcus to ride Chimichuri Run

The recent Gr1 Cape Flying Championship winner Kasimir is the officially highest rated runner in the R400 000 Gr2 Khaya Stables Diadem Stakes to be run at Kenilworth on Saturday 23 February.

KR Property Committee Gets New Look

The Board of Kenilworth Racing (“KR”) has advised that it has appointed a new Property Sub-Committee (“PSC”) under the chairmanship of Robert Bloomberg.

Current KR Directors Greg Bortz and Jonathan Snaith, former KR Director Vidrik Thurling, Phumelela CEO John Stuart and Mrs Gaynor Rupert, who has graciously agreed to lend her expertise, form the balance of the committee.

The PSC is presently fully exploring all avenues pertaining to the KR properties and flowing therefrom investigating the best utilisation of KR’s assets and the creation of annuity income for the Company.

At this juncture, there has been no Board approval in respect of pursuing any developments on any of their properties.

KR is currently in discussions with their legal advisors and will be consulting with planners and environmentalists in due course prior to any formal decisions being made by the Board .

Announcements will follow in due course when they are able to definitively report thereon.

Operator Opens Doors To Punters

An informal but very constructive and lively meeting hosted by new Kenilworth Racing Co-Chairman Robert Bloomberg and WPRRA Chairman Jono Snaith with a small group of longstanding Cape punters was held in the Kenilworth Racing Private Suite after Saturday’s racemeeting.

Kenilworth Racing’s Chief Operating Officer Faeza Heuwel also attended, as did a representative of the Sporting Post.

The meeting arose out of a commitment issued in December from both the KR Board and the WPRRA board to open lines of communication with the media and the public.

A letter written by Michael Jacobs and published in the Argus and the Sporting Post after the Sun Met last month caught the attention of Messrs Bloomberg and Snaith and also initiated a groundswell of support amongst our readers.

‘The Met has lost quite a lot of its fun and energy since it changed to the SunMet, but truth be told it has been on a downward spiral for a good few years. The event has become over commercialised and exclusive, and the huge crowds of yesteryear are staying away,’ wrote Mr Jacobs, a man who started out life as a barman at Kenilworth and Milnerton, and who today works for one of South Africa’s largest retailers. He attends every racemeeting, work permitting.

He said that the owner and punter are the two most important stakeholders in racing. “Without owners there is no horse-racing, without punters there is no betting and punting which funds the industry. Trainers, jockeys, grooms, racing operator staff (and management) are merely workers in the industry, dependant on us and owners to provide their livelihoods!”

As regards the major days, Jacobs said that in his opinion the SunMet and Queen’s Plate have become elitist, exclusionary and exclusive and said it appears as if there is an attempt to sideline the ordinary punter/racegoer. This thought has been echoed by many.

Seasoned racegoer and former politician Danny de La Cruz also attended Saturday’s meeting with his wife. He was very vocal about the cost of the dining facilities on Queen’s Plate day and the fact that he had to go through numerous checks at a venue he has been attending for the past sixty years.

“Nobody from Kenilworth Racing was there to welcome me. The food was sub standard. The way I feel now, I won’t come again. And I should point out that the Betting World Tote on the racetrack no longer has a liquor licence. We punters love to have a drink you know. But now they are offering me toffee apples and bananas,” he laughed.

Neil van Vuuren was another lifetime punter who attended racing as often as he could. He pointed out the sub standard facilities from dirty chairs to poor service in the bar and at the tote counters, outdated tote machines and litter lying around from previous meetings.

He, however, liked the crowd boosting idea mooted by Jono Snaith that tickets could, for example, be donated to the Universities, which could be sold at a discount to students and the proceeds used for fundraising by the various institutions.

Big In Japan

Nanako Fujita is set to make history in Sunday's February Stakes in Tokyo, where she will become the first female Japan Racing Association jockey to compete in a Group 1 race.

The 21-year-old is the only female rider in the JRA ranks, and is already the most successful female jockey in JRA history, eclipsing the previous record of 34 held by Yukiko Masuzawa.

Last weekend Fujita rode her 50th JRA winner. In total she has 70 victories, with 20 coming on the rival National Association of Racing circuit.

She got acquainted with her February Stakes ride, Copano Kicking, last Friday when partnering the four-year-old for the first time at trainer Akira Murayama's yard and on the track at Ritto training centre.

Fujita said: "He was very easy to ride. When I received this offer, I didn't believe it, but was delighted. I want to say thank you to the owner and the trainer."

Owner Sachiaki Kobayashi, who won the February Stakes with Copano Rickey in 2014, said he would ask Fujita to ride Copano Kicking following his latest victory in the Grade 3 Negishi Stakes last month. That success was achieved with the assistance of Irishman Oisin Murphy in the saddle.

Kobayashi said: "I think she is a good jockey. I wanted to ask her to ride a strong horse in a Grade 1. I believe that racing should make dreams for not only the fans but also the connections." - www.racingpost.com

What A Payne!

At Wednesday's Highway meeting at Warwick Farm, former SA-based Sydney trainer David Payne inflicted a A\$156 running double on punters in the opening two events and, job done, packed up and went home.

While the winner of the first race was A\$26 rank outsider Costello in a field of five, the second of Payne's twin-pronged attack was a horse who should never have been allowed to start at A\$6.00.

Beaten only 2.6-lengths behind short-priced Golden Slipper aspirant McLaren recently in the Gr3 Canonbury Stakes, Deep Chill had finished just out of the placings on debut behind Castelvechio who followed up with victory in the \$2 million Inglis 2YO Millennium.

Asked after Deep Chill's maiden win if he might head to the Slipper, Payne suggested the 1200m would be too sharp, and that the beautifully-bred son of Wandjina and Gr1 winner Eskimo Queen is far more of an Inglis Sires and Champagne style of horse.

Trainer of 107 Gr1 Winners, David Payne moved to Australia from South Africa in 2002, without any horses, wanting to make a new start. Since then he has become one of the most respected trainers in the tough Sydney market and has in the past held a position in the top 5 metropolitan trainers.

Grand National - Weights Published

Multiple Gr1 winner Bristol De Mai heads the weights on 11st 10lb, with a lowered rating of 168, for the 2019 Randox Health Grand National.

With a prize fund of £1 million, the world's greatest chase is the most valuable Jump race globally and takes place over four miles, two furlongs and 74 yards and 30 fences at Aintree at 5.15pm on Saturday, April 6, day three of the Randox Health Grand National Festival. This year sees the 172nd running of the great Aintree chase.

Bristol De Mai, one of nine entries for dual Randox Health Grand National-winning trainer Nigel Twiston-Davies, gained his second G1 Betfair Chase at Haydock Park in November, when he defeated Cheltenham Gold Cup hero Native River by four lengths.

Twiston-Davies, whose Aintree successes came courtesy of Earth Summit (1998) and Bindaree (2002), also has impressive Sky Bet Chase victor Go Conquer (10st 13lb) and 2017 Becher Handicap Chase winner Blaklion (10st 12lb) among his nine entries.

The 2018 Randox Health Grand National hero Tiger Roll (Gordon Elliott IRE) has been given 11st 1lb, as he bids to become the first dual winner of the race since the legendary Red Rum.

Cheltenham Betting Opens

South Africa's leading bookmakers Hollywood have opened their ante-post market on next month's show-piece Cheltenham Festival.

The four-day Cheltenham Festival, the fourth most attended sporting event in the United Kingdom which attracts over 320 000 visitors, is due to start on March 12.

"We are in contact with the British Horseracing Authority (BHA), who are handling the logistics of the equine flu on behalf of British Racing and providing regular updates," a spokesman for the Cheltenham racecourse told abc.net.au.

"The festival isn't for five weeks and we hope that the BHA's early actions to resume racing on Wednesday will have resolved this matter quickly."

The British racing industry is worth 3.45 billion pounds sterling (\$6.28 billion) a year and horse racing is the second most attended sport in the country with about 5.7 million people going to meetings each year.

Cheltenham is also worth about 100 million pounds to the local Gloucestershire economy.

features the owners are yet to win, as he bids to go one better than when chasing home the late Ertijaal in the 1000m turf dash 12 months ago.

In fact, trainer Charlie Appleby has finished second in the last five Meydan Sprint renewals with Jungle Cat (2017, 2016) and Ahtoug (2015, 2014) rounding out the quintet of close calls.

A 5-year-old gelded son of Shamardal, Blue Point went to post as the market favourite in the subsequent 1200m turf Al Quoz Sprint sponsored by Azizi Developments (Gr1) on Dubai World Cup day, but that was as far as he got, as a trickle of nostril blood necessitated withdrawal at the gate on veterinary advice. Then well beaten in Hong Kong after an eventful shipping, he returned to Europe and his very best form to win the 1000m Group 1 King's Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot before disappointing in the 1200m July Cup. His most recent outing was a third in the Nunthorpe Stakes (Gr1) at York in August.

"The plan has always been to go to the Al Quoz Sprint via just this race," Appleby said. "He ran very well in this last year and seems in similar form at home as he was 12 months ago, so hopefully he will run well, but will certainly improve for the run."

The aforementioned dual Meydan Sprint winner Ertijaal carried the colours of His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, as did 2016 winner Fityaan, with the owner seeking a fourth consecutive victory in the race. Among the select field of seven he has two representatives, both trained internationally. Following a similar path to Ertijaal, who won the 1000m Turf handicap on opening night three times, Faatinah will bid to post his third Carnival win at the hands of the Australian Hayes' stable.

The owner's second chance, Mujaafy, is in the capable hands of Mike de Kock, seeking a third win in this race, having landed it with Shea Shea in both 2013 and 2014.

De Kock also saddles Janoobi (3rd race) and Astronomer (7th race).

Extended Career In Korea

Fransie Herholdt's stint in South Korea has worked out very well, with the result that the Korean Racing Association have extended his contract for another six months up until August.

Taking the opportunity of the Chinese New Year break to pop over to Joburg for a week to see his family, he opened up on his impressions of racing in the Asian republic.

"It's going very well, and I've ridden seven winners so far – including two for Bart Rice, who played a big role in smoothing the way for me to come here.

"It's a very different set up. Like for riding work you are given a schedule by the translator, and generally whatever you work you will be riding on the Saturday. So you don't ride as much work as here, but it's a lot fairer."

Luckily Fransie is based in the southern city of Busan, as the winter weather came as a bit of a shock.

"It gets unbelievably cold here. Busan is about 10 degrees warmer than Seoul fortunately, as when I was riding there recently it was -14C.

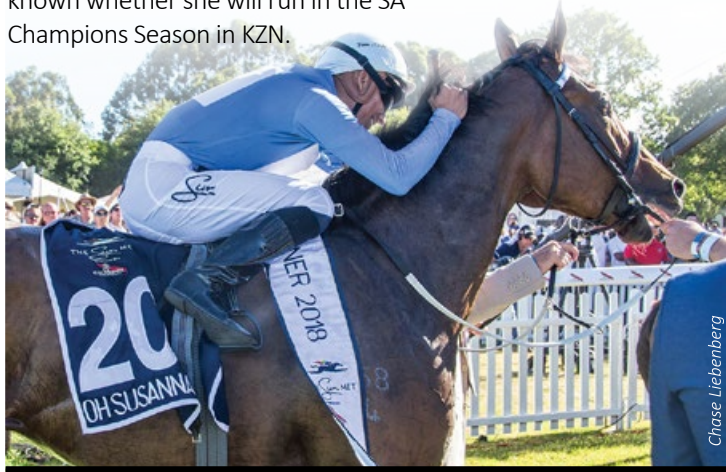
"They use a dirt track, but have to add lots of coarse salt to prevent it freezing over in the extreme temperatures.

"We have fantastic courses here, and I'm looking forward to racing in summer, where it's much more a jump and go style, which suits me."

Trainer Justin Snaith has subsequently reported that the reigning SA Horse Of The Year returned cut into on the right hind and was lame 3/5. It is not known whether she will run in the SA Champions Season in KZN.



Bad News

Another week, another potential PR nightmare for Australian horseracing, it seems. Racing Victoria stewards are expected to interview multiple Gr1 winning jockey Craig Newitt in relation to a betting investigation. A Racing Victoria spokesperson confirmed that they were busy with a wide-ranging investigation but are unable to confirm who is involved at this stage. Newitt has ridden 33 Gr1 winners on Australian soil, most successfully with Miss Andretti (5x Gr1) and Lankan Rupee (4x Gr1).



Sun Sets

The sun sets on the Cape Summer Season at Kenilworth next Saturday 23 February when the R400 000 Khaya Stables Gr2 Diadem Stakes takes pride of place in a new slot on the programme. Longstanding Gr1 winning international owners, Khaya Stables are once again the sponsor of the race which will be run over the Kenilworth 1200m straight track. A Seafood Village and Summer Market will be hosted on course. Now to monitor the loadshedding schedule!

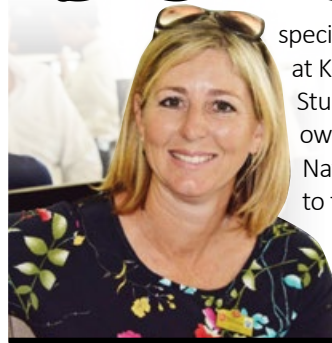
Bridge Of Size

Let's Give The Jockeys A Break!

Leonie Ermacora

The recent public criticism of race riding has evoked an emotional response from the wife of a hardworking middle of the road jockey who died tragically in an accident in 2007. She says that she wishes that horseracing would lift its fragile golden veil of glitz and glamour and play more human open cards in the real world. Life has gone on for Leonie Ermacora since her world was turned upside down two days after her 46th birthday on 17 August 2007.

That was the horrific day her then 43 year old jockey husband Peter Dillon was tragically killed when his motorbike mysteriously wobbled and fell in front of a vehicle driven by a 79 year old lady.

"He was five minutes from home. My Dad walked into the shop where I worked and I just knew it was bad. I said, 'please dad tell me he's alive!' He shook his head and my world was broken in pieces..."

As a mark of just how highly her husband was regarded in the industry, Leonie recalls that over 500 people attended the Memorial Service.

Peter Dillon, who joined the SA Jockey Academy in 1979, would often proudly recount how he had pipped Muis Roberts in a driving finish when he steered his first winner home. He was a leading apprentice but never quite got the support when he came out of his time.

He tried his luck in Mauritius and had ridden in Singapore the year before he died. He also rode in Mauritius and his daughter Catherine is a Mauritian citizen as Leonie was eight months pregnant when they left Durban for Port Louis.

He rode 17 winners from 64 rides in the Middle East, among them two Listed races in Dubai, including the Emirates Sky Cargo Trophy on Baldaquin. His 50% win strike rate in Kuwait, 11 wins out of 22 rides was an outstanding achievement.

A regular Sporting Post reader and poster, Leonie has remarried and lives in Ballito on the KZN North Coast with her husband Edi Ermacora. She stays in close touch with the sport through friends and social media and has strong opinions as to where horseracing fails itself in terms of public image.

"We need to stop fooling everybody. This is a wicked and a tough, tough game- and while some jockeys are driving snazzy cars and living in posh estates, and generally styling, a large proportion of them are eking out an existence. There is a fine line between great, good and plain average

– and that normally comes about through a lucky break or two along the way. I know they say you make your own luck in life- but have a heart. And let's stop jumping on the jockeys every time a favourite gets beaten and we are looking to roast somebody!"

The recent high-profile spotlights on Do It Again and Hawwaam had Leonie suggesting that the trainers become the starting point of explanations to the public rather than the jockey in isolation.

"I know it's a cliché, but how many professions have an ambulance following the men at work? Sportsmen – cricketers, footballers, Springboks – all have off days and make poor judgements. Nowhere else is it highlighted and placed on the individual's head like a jockey gets it- and random people seem to say what the hell they like on social media," she says, adding that what racing needs is the explanation straight from the trainers mouth to the public of why a favourite got beaten.

"Good or bad! Just say it how it is! But racing has always had a problem of public transparency somehow. There is often the story – and then the truth beyond that."

Her personal feeling is that the game has lost its zest and appeal and that there are too many people who think that they are bigger and better than the sport.

"We all came in to the world the same way and we will mostly all go out the same way.

"So let's stop admiring and idolising the money and the power brokers. Events of the past two years in this industry should prove that money doesn't make one man any bloody better than the next!"

She suggests that while it is nothing new, there are 'too many fingers in too many pies'.

"Too many back-seat drivers too. Racing needs transparency – and it should commence with the small things that taint the image to outsiders – like the eradication of the fact that so many couch potato punters slate jockeys. The industry can do its bit and help and educate and inform. Accusing the jockeys of riding for the bookies – or riding a shocker – is conspiracy theorist uninformed hogwash!"

Leonie changes tack as she points out bluntly – from experience- that being married to a jockey is either 'very easy or very difficult.'

"If you are successful, life is always easier financially. Peter struggled his whole life to be the best he could. He rode work every single day, except Sundays. He was

always running from ring to ring – and never ever without a smile. He rode many amazing horses and was one of the hardest working human beings.”

She asked us never to label her late husband ‘underrated’.

“I really dislike it when people say x, y or z is one of the most underrated jockeys. To any jockey that probably means he is worth his weight in gold. He is a great jock – but he just won't get rides. How is it that those same underrated jockeys will ride five winners in Zimbabwe and yet never get rides here? Then you have those jocks that just make it. Many times on the back of a huge win, a great horse and from there you they are well away. I'm not discounting basic natural talent. Some guys just have the knack. But personality and a lot of luck counts too. I'm just very proud of Peter's achievements. He was a real soldier.”

Leonie recalls how unpopular she was when she stood up for her late husband with her ‘big mouth’.

“I fought for him for 20 years. We were a team. I loved and I would have died for him.

He was my soulmate- my best friend and I adored him. Many felt I fought his battles. Yes, I did! And would do it all again. He was too soft. Too kind. Always smiling- even if things went wrong. I watched him suffer. He would often come home deflated and cry. The public doesn't see that side of life in the saddle. That's why when I read ‘experts’ talking rubbish on social media, I get so mad.”

Peter rode his last winner on 1 August. He died on 17 August.

“That just shows how tough things can be. We battled and often sold crockery to Cash Converters to feed our kids when things were bad and we had no food. But his love and devotion to his family and his job was incredible. I forgave many people and found peace after his death.”

Leonie lived in Johannesburg and at age 12 moved to Hillcrest. She was hooked on racing at age 8 when listening to a commentary on Radio Port Natal. At the age of 16 she put R10 on Lightning Shot to win the July and duly pocketed R240. She became a young Mom to her daughter Gaylene and was working for a company in Pinetown at age 21 when she and the Foreman won a R9000 jackpot.

“We banked a horse called Red Bikini. It was some time before I met Peter and clicked that ironically he rode that winner. I bought my first car with that cash!”

Peter was 21 when Leonie met him at a braai with friends.

“He was a soft, kind guy. He accepted Gaylene as his own – that at the tender age of 22 when we got married. I recall he was riding for Doug Campbell and David Payne. We had two wonderful children- Catherine and Kyle- he absolutely adored all three. Today my children are all happily married and successful in life. I have two gorgeous grandchildren and little Daniel looks just like his Oupa Peter.”

She and Edi have been married ten years now and her children call him Dad.

“I'm blessed but the road of life is often bumpy as it twists and turns. Edi has bone marrow cancer but he will be fine. I've never been afraid of a fight and he is blessed to have been granted the prognosis of a long life still.”

She closes by saying that she often thinks about writing a book one day.

“It's called Jockey's Wives. It will make Footballer's Wives look silly! Racing is a sexy fast-paced tough and wicked game that sells itself all wrong. I have been there and got the t-shirt and actually miss it a lot. There were highs and lows. But I'm just so fortunate and honoured to have been a part of Peter's life for 22 years. He lived by the credo – ‘I'm not afraid of tomorrow as I have seen yesterday and I love today’. And I use that today in my life still.”

Durban Demon's Dazzling Send-Off



Douglas Whyte waved farewell to the most successful race-riding career in Hong Kong history on Sunday evening at Sha Tin Racecourse, bowing out after saluting his fans long after the last race had weighed-in.

The 13-time champion jockey's final ride did not produce the fairy tale victory that he and the Sha Tin faithful desired, but the day delivered heart-warming displays of respect and appreciation for a sportsman whose achievements have lifted him high into the pantheon of racing's legends.

Whyte retires with a Hong Kong career total of 1,813 wins – 894 more than current champion Zac Purton – total stakes money of HK\$1,587,210,086.67, multiple Group 1 scores and, of course, his defining 13 consecutive premierships (2001-2013). His win strike rate over more than 22 years riding at Happy Valley and Sha Tin stands forever at 14.78%.

The man they call the Durban Demon was “overwhelmed” in particular at the send-off he received from his jockeys' room colleagues, for so long his unwavering rivals.

“Behind the gates (before the last race) it was quite emotional because the starter, Tony (Speechley), said a few words and all the jocks gave me a hip-hip-hooray, so it was a really nice send-off. You get a bit of a lump in your throat but I still had a race to ride,” Whyte said.

Whyte's blank on his final day was not for the want of trying but did owe something to a stroke of misfortune. Two seconds were his closest placings – Mr Croissant in race two and Seven Heavens in the eighth – but the near-miss came when he rallied the impeded Storm Signal close home in the seventh contest, only to take third.

“I would have won the race,” he said. “That's the only bitter-sweet ending to the day. I'd have loved to have had a winner but I'm happy with the way every horse ran and the way I rode every horse. [Read more here](#)

Halfway To Broodmare Of The Year Title?

While there is still plenty of racing left in the 2018-2019 South African racing season, thoughts will soon start focusing on potential Equus Awards contenders. One category which often proves tricky, and occasionally controversial, is the title of Broodmare Of The Year.

In 2019 there are already a few mares whose progeny have ensured that they enter the mix for this much sought after title. Halfway To Heaven does look a likely winner, given that her sons, Rainbow Bridge (Gr1 Sun Met) and Hawwaam (Gr2 Dingaans, Gr3 Tony Ruffel Stakes), have both won graded races this season, and both look likely to add further to her Broodmare Of The Year claims.

Among the South African based mares who have notably enhanced their credentials this season, a few stand out, such as:

Halfway To Heaven (Jet Master - Pas De Basque)

By deceased seven times champion sire, and increasingly successful broodmare sire, Jet Master, the Gr3 Prix Du Cap winning Halfway To Heaven earned nearly R500 000 on the track but has proved an even more effective producer than she was a racemare.

This mare has been represented by only two runners, namely the Met winning Rainbow Bridge and the hugely talented 3yo, Hawwaam, who looks a Gr1 winner in the making. Between the two, Rainbow Bridge (Ideal World) and Hawwaam (Silvano) have already earned over R4.3 million and there should be more to come. Another tribute to Halfway To Heaven is that her two star sons are sired not only by different stallions, but by sires who hail from different sire lines altogether.

Alignment (Alzao - Scots Lass)

Alignment, who never won a race but did run a close second in the Gr3 Prestige Stakes as a two-year-old in so doing producing a level of form higher than many mares currently at stud in this country, joined an elite list of mares to have produced more than one Gr1 winner, when her 3yo daughter, Front And Centre (Dynasty), won the Gr1 Cape Fillies Guineas this season. The classy Front And Centre joins young Ridgemont Highlands sire, Potala Palace (Singspiel), as a Gr1 winner produced by Alignment, with Potala Palace having captured the Gr1 Premier's Champion Stakes as a two-year-old. Alignment, whose son, Streak Of Silver (Silvano), won the (Non Black Type) November Stakes this season, has a total of nine winners to her credit thus far and is also granddam of international graded stakes winners, Excellent Result (Shamardal) and Midnight Crossing (Dark Angel). A number of the mare's daughters have since joined Alignment at stud, and her influence looks set to continue further.

Aquatint (Peintre Celebre - Sakieh)

A daughter of one of the greatest French champions of recent times, the regally bred Aquatint, whose granddam is G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner Sigy, won three times on the track, but has proved far more successful since retiring to stud. Aquatint, whose Trippi son, Afrikaburn, won the Ge1 Durban Golden Horseshoe



in 2014, was represented by her second Ge1 winner this season when her son, Kasimir, captured the Ge1 Betting World Cape Flying Championship on Sun Met day. To date, Aquatint has four winners from five runners with her other foals including Ge2 Glorious Goodwood Peninsula Handicap second, The Slade (Philanthropist). Her Arc winning sire, Peintre Celebre, has proved to be a superb broodmare sire, with his daughters having thrown over 50 stakes winners, including such Gr1 winners as Red Cadeaux (Hong Kong Vase), Talent (Epsom Oaks), Gathering (Railway Stakes), Protectionist (Melbourne Cup), Nutan (Deutsches Derby), Vadamos (Prix du Moulin) and Pakistan Star (QE II Cup).

Intriguingly, Aquatint is inbred to top miler, leading sire and outstanding broodmare sire Habitat, who is widely regarded as one of the finest broodmare sires of recent years.

Former Eastern Cape star, Stormy Appeal (Kilconnel), has proved consistently successful since she retired to stud. The multiple stakes winner was represented by her fourth stakes winner, and first graded stakes winner, when her 3yo daughter, Storm Destiny (by Dynasty), won the Gr3 Three Troikas Stakes this season. Interestingly, all four of Stormy Appeal's stakes winners were either sired by Fort Wood or by the latter's outstanding sire son, Dynasty.

Former Gr3 Pretty Polly Stakes winner, Jalberry, a regally bred own sister to last season's Broodmare Of The Year, Strawberry Lane (Jallad-Taineberry)- whose daughter Redberry Lane won again at Turffontein on Saturday, is, unlike her full-sister, yet to produce a Gr1 winner, but she has still proved a very effective broodmare in her own right. She produced her second graded stakes winner when daughter, Love To Boogie (Trippi), won this season's Gr3 Diana Stakes, and Jalberry is also granddam of this season's Gr1 WSB Cape Fillies Guineas runner up, Silvano's Pride (Silvano). Jalberry's previous winners include Gr2 Golden Horseshoe winner, Purple Diamond (Var) and the smart Singapore performer, Mr Fantastic.

While the likes of Stormy Appeal and Jalberry are yet to produce a Gr1 winner, and as such won't qualify (at the time of writing) for the Broodmare Of The Year title, all of the mares mentioned above continue to make their mark on the South African turf.

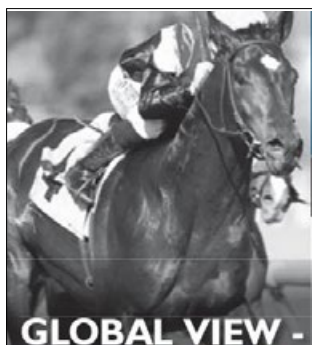

Bloodstock Selection

Are We Doing This All Wrong?

One of my favourite Michael McIntyre skits is the one about choosing wine in a restaurant, writes Oscar Foulkes.

He accurately points out that the vast majority of wine drinkers couldn't call themselves experts, of course while completely selling the audience on the hilarity of the wine list interaction. His facial expressions conveying mock knowledge are brilliant.

Most of the time, wine selection is a low stakes game. It doesn't matter when we don't know what we don't know, to borrow from Donald Rumsfeld.

Racehorses, on the other hand, even if they are cheap purchases, cost a lot to feed. The same applies to breeding them. The only significant difference is the cost of bloodstock.

Professionals in this industry (and I'm including myself) know that they are going to be wrong more often than they are going to be right. When just 3% of foals end up as stakes-winners it's a statistical inevitability.

So we develop strategies that we believe will give us an edge. Indeed, many people do outperform the averages. Pushing the stakes-winner strike rate to 10% is three times better than the average, but it still means that we are wrong nine times out of ten.

Given this fact, I wonder how Michael McIntyre would send up Thoroughbred professionals as we go about our bloodstock or yearling selection. We take notes, make serious faces, and have hushed conversations while pointing at a yearling colt's knees. We slip a hand between bridle and jaw to assess breathing capacity, or run our hands down the joints of his front legs as if we have magical x-ray sensors on our palms. Flower's First

Wilgerbosdrift stallion Flower Alley marks his maiden runner from his first SA crop when the Kumaran Naidoo trained Juniper Lane runs in the opener at Scottsville on Sunday.

The Highlands bred gelding is out of the one-time winning Tapit mare Gin Rummy, who produced the Snaith-trained one-time winner from five starts to date, Ladder Man (Twice Over).

A R180 000 KZN Yearling Sale graduate, Juniper Lane is by the 2005 Gr1 Travers Stakes winner Flower Alley who earned over \$2 million in stakes on the track. His first SA crop yearlings sold for up to R1,5 million.

A half-brother to a pair of Gr1 winners, and from the same family as the great sire Lyphard, Flower Alley has 40 stakes horses to his name thus far, headed by champions I'll Have Another, Lukes Alley and My Wandy's Gal, as well as the Gr1 winners Bullards Alley and Lilacs And Lace.

He has the distinction of being the only sire of a Kentucky Derby winner to stand in South Africa.

De Kock Star To Stud

Grade 1 winner Mubtaahij has been retired from racing and will likely head to South America for stud duty, according to bloodstock agent Donato Lanni.

The 2017 Awesome Again Stakes winner, who was trained by Mike de Kock, Kieran McLaughlin, and Bob Baffert during his career, is currently stabled at Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Kentucky and doesn't have a stallion deal finalized yet, but he will most

likely stand his first season in Argentina, Lanni said, because "interest in America was bleak."

"He's going to stand in Argentina, but we don't know where yet," Lanni said of the 7-year old son of Dubawi. "We'd love to stand him here, but we'll start there and see what happens. I believe in the horse, but, unfortunately, I don't have 100 mares to breed to him. He's bred for turf, but he's made a classic dirt horse."

Along with his Awesome Again score for Baffert, Mubtaahij won or placed in 10 other grade/group events and earned more than \$5.7 million for owner Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum.

In 2018, his final racing season, Mubtaahij placed in all four of his races—thirds in the Dubai World Cup Sponsored By Emirates Airline (G1) and San Pasqual Stakes (G2) and seconds in the Santa Anita Handicap Presented by San Manuel Indian Bingo and Casino (G1) and Lone Star Park Handicap (G3).

He raced in the Dubai World Cup three times. Along with his effort in 2018, he finished second in 2016 and fourth in 2017.

Mubtaahij began his racing career with de Kock in Newmarket and then Dubai, where he won the 2015 UAE Derby Sponsored By Saeed & Mohammed Al Naboodah Group (G2) to punch his ticket to the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), where he finished eighth.

He also competed in the Belmont Stakes presented by DraftKings (G1) that year, where he challenged Triple Crown winner American Pharoah in the final turn at Belmont Park but faded to fourth.

Bred in Ireland by Dunmore Stud out of the Pennekamp mare Pennegale, Mubtaahij sold to Form Bloodstock for \$599,760 when he was consigned by Haras d'Hotellerie to the 2013 Arqana Deauville August Yearling Sale.

He retired with a record of 5-6-4 from 24 starts and earnings of \$5,780,332. After his Kentucky Derby effort, he only finished out of the top five once—in the 2017 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1)- over his final 16 starts.

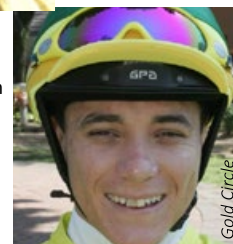
