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The sudden back peddling on the Kimberley closure earlier this week has been a flicker of hope in a bleak few months for South African and international racing.

But is there any real comfort in the fact that we are not alone?

News of stakes cuts in Mauritius and at Newbury Racecourse in the UK, and a hard-line adopted by US authorities on conflicted interests by the management of Arlington Racecourse, as well as Happy Valley's loss of a midweek meeting due to external threats of political unrest, could well induce a false sense of comfort for us.

Talking straight, chaotic uncertainty is the only way to describe the Northern Cape situation. Poorly handled in every public respect from the start, with reports varying and fingers wagging

in both directions as to whether Phumelela and the Racing Association were actually ever in agreement on the move in the first place, the Gauteng -based racing operator's 'delight' expressed in their press release on Tuesday seems patronising.

The essence of the news is that Phumelela is in negotiations with Gold Circle and other interested stakeholders to extend racing at Flamingo Park beyond December 2019.

We are all for Gold Circle stepping in as knights in shining armour and providing a change in philosophy and ethos with a lifeline for our friends in the Northern Cape to maintain their existence and continue providing their

unique form of racing entertainment, while playing their vital role in the cog of the SA racing machinery.

But why are these 'potentially viable options to continue racing at the venue' only now being evaluated in conjunction with Gold Circle and other stakeholders, and not considered previously?

Closure of an historic racing centre and a community must surely have been an absolutely last resort?

Yesterday the Sporting Post was informed that the move to reduce the stakes burden on Phumelela following ongoing news of financial pressure on the company had now also started to take effect.

In a letter issued to trainers, Phumelela advised that in consultation with the Racing Association a decision had been taken to reduce the number of races scheduled midweek on both the Highveld and in Kimberley from nine to eight with effect from 1 October 2019.

This was part of an initiative to mitigate the imminent re-alignment of stakes that will be announced in due course in terms of the stakes agreement formula.

Midweek low grade 9th races added to the Highveld programmes will be cancelled from 1 October and Kimberley's current nine-race programmes will be cut to eight races from the same date.

Due to the financial pressures, Phumelela state that they will generally not be splitting races in the foreseeable future - and then only in exceptionable circumstances.

While the provisional Highveld programme published for the three month period October to December 2019 does not include the minor race stakes at this stage, for the month of October these will be set at current winter stakes levels, whereafter the new minor race stakes levels will be published from November.

So some assertive action has been taken. But ... close the racing community...then hang on...there's an idea to give them a reprieve ... then take more away from them, without any consultation?

Cut-backs in racing without any apparent turnaround strategy and no drive or effort to build the game means that death is inevitable – whether we go to 9 December or sometime in 2020.

Well-known racing man Paulo do Carmo wrote a common sensical piece this week - it's a logical step by step suggestion about facing reality and changing attitudes.

But if everybody's doing tomorrow what they did yesterday, they are really just delaying the inevitable and may as well close up shop.

Meryl Tries The All-Weather

Walmer Handicap Fairview Friday

A non black-type feature tops the weekend national billing at Fairview on Friday. The fillies and mares Walmer Handicap has attracted a field of nine and should prove a competitive puzzle to unravel.



Local champion trainer Alan Greeff has a powerful three-cornered hand for the 1800m contest, with recent Listed Jockey Club Stakes winner Meryl out for a double after her breathtaking victory last time out. The daughter of Tiger Ridge was left on a 101 rating by the NHRA handicappers after getting up in the final stride to beat Raven Girl. That

run capped an excellent second on her East Cape debut and she is being kept in training for another season – a sign that she is loving her racing and will be very competitive. Charles Ndlovu, who rode such a pearler to win last time, is in the saddle again. She takes her time to find her feet and the change of surface and the 200m drop in trip are the only cautionaries for us.

Her stablemate Ontenderhooks, formerly with Candice Bass-Robinson, found her feet at just her third run in the Eastern Cape with a runaway success over Friday's course-and-distance. This is tougher and Meryl stands in her way as a major centre stakes winner.

The SP top-rated, Jacques Strydom's hardknocking 7yo Sao Paulo bounced back from an unsuccessful Flamingo Park raid early in August, when she ran on well to beat Double Black over the poly mile on 2 September. She tries the 1800m for the first time, but it is worth noting that her well-performed dam won up to 2000m.

Flying Squadron had no luck in the Jockey Club Stakes when cramped in running and being forced to ease. She has had four runs in this region and won her first start on the polytrack - so may warrant inclusion if she steps up further on the surface.

Seeking Wisdom ran a poor race in the Listed Jockey Club Stakes and dropped out to finish close on 24 lengths off Meryl. There was no official explanation for that strange effort and she could bounce back if finding her best form.

Delia's Delight challenged strongly in the Jockey Club Stakes and was beaten a shade over a length into fourth behind Meryl. Her previous poly run was slightly below par. She is 3kgs better off with Meryl and must be a serious runner.

Former KZN-based Dean Kannemeyer charge Pearl Glow showed promising earlier form but has not run for 29 weeks and has her first run in the Eastern Cape.

Rocksette appears to have lost her better form of 2018 and was

handily weighted 52kg crew and the Gavin Smith charge loves the all-weather surface. She ran on steadily behind Ontenderhooks last time and even though well beaten by 4,50 lengths, she comes in on 4,5kgs better terms and should be held again.

If she doesn't get found too far out of her ground, Meryl looks likely to follow up. The dangers are Sao Paulo and Ontenderhooks.

Fast Donkeys & Slow Cars

The Friday feature is named for Walmer, a suburb of Port Elizabeth. The connection to racing is not clear, although it is an area that was well known for its donkeys. Until the 1940s, they were still freely wandering around Walmer and were raced through the valley by school children.

Research shows that the area has a colourful history dating to 1855 when it was renamed after Walmer Castle, seat of Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports.

This is a historic series of coastal towns in Kent and Sussex which were originally formed for military and trade purposes.

William Adcock, the first mayor of Walmer, was quite a man about town and he had the distinction of being the first person to own a motor car in PE. It was a 4.5hp Benz Velo which took 15 hours to make the 128km trip to Grahamstown.

The coming of the train line to Walmer on Saturday 15 December 1906 saw 5000 people sample the new transport that day, despite bad weather.

Walmer was incorporated into the Port Elizabeth municipality on 1 September 1966.

Franco's Back

General Franco makes his eagerly-awaited reappearance in an MR 94 Handicap over 1400m at Durbanville on Saturday.

This is the son of the great Frankel, who looked a potential superstar when accelerating like a machine to romp away with his debut in April only to finish last when starting a prohibitive 7-20 for his follow-up a month later. He has not raced since.

"He has been doing very well at home, I have galloped him, he is ready and should give his full potential," Justin Snaith told Gold Circle's Michael Clower.

"If he wins on Saturday he is obviously a horse for the future but he will have to prove it here and whether he is mature enough to win against a field like this I'm not sure. It is very hard at this level. Also he has never seen Durbanville although I have galloped him round the turn at Kenilworth."

What now? Bottom up?

It is by now well documented that the horseracing industry and all its peripheral industries find themselves in dire straits, perhaps the greatest of crisis in the last 30 years, certainly since corporatization took place.

Many past experts, would be, want to be and actual experts have eloquently and not so eloquently been vociferous of their dissatisfaction with the current state of affairs using various forums and media platforms available, writes Paulo Do Carmo.

The voices are loud. What and whom has led us to the current status, and the disastrous path, down which we could potentially be heading has been discussed, finger pointed and announced with resonating echoes.

The reality is that the current status has been shaped by historical events, acts and omissions that were perpetrated over a long period of time and by the leaders of every one of these peripherals – all whilst the relevant stake holders (us), stood idle and inactive, a stark reminder of Nero fiddling whilst Rome burned.

Rome was the epicentre of the "world" at the time – What of racing?

There are many out there making suggestions – laymen, stakeholders of many origins and forms, on how it can be saved, changed, moved forward.

Some are meeting in secret, within closed networks, non inclusively and continually avoiding the lower ranks of the industry.

Several still in love with the idea of the Great Leader emerging, if only because we like reading biographies and fantastical history – focused on the myth that a perfect, virtuous and incorruptible leader will emerge from the clouds or the falling debris of what was once a thriving industry.

This has happened before, and never in a more extreme manner, than with the recent emergence of one Markus Jooste, and whilst many vilify and others defend, Markus Jooste for all his alleged crimes and doings, merely delayed the inevitable for an already obvious state of affairs, supporting a false economy within various sectors of the industry with allegedly ill gotten gains – the recipients continued with open arms and oblivious to the required action, aside from the blessing of the time.


The downward spiral of the racing industry had begun, albeit subtly, long before Markus Jooste was in full swing.

The fact is that we all ignored it and currently no-one has a definite plan or a clear cut strategy to present for support – not least the incumbents.

The incumbents is where it all starts – or so seems to be the conventional wisdom.

Factually though, it is known that in business, management and general organisational scenarios, "top-down" is always bad, "bottom-up" is always good – so why do stakeholders believe the good, the bad and the evil all starts with the incumbents (PGL. All races (excluding Features, Maiden Plates & Maiden Juvenile Plates) run in KwaZulu-Natal between 4 August and 24 November will count as qualifying races to earn points provided that the nett Merit Rating of a horse (after WFA Allowance) may not exceed 102 in the race in which it participates.

A horse that has won a Maiden race in KZN needs to run in one further qualifying race to qualify to be entered to run in any final.

Horses that have won Maiden races outside of KZN need to run in two further qualifying races for consideration in one of the finals.

The now 8yo gelding was trained by Dean Kannemeyer for his 4 wins from 1600m to 2400m from his 18 starts. He celebrates his birthday on 2 October.

Hollywoodbets Scottsville

All Really Well In The State Of Denmark?

After last Wednesday's horrific Hollywoodbets Scottsville accident, KZN racing operator Gold Circle issued a press release denying the fact that a wet patch and divots were to blame.

Yet on Sunday a walk of the track revealed that all is still not well and it may be time to face reality and take corrective action.

The release states that following the unfortunate incident last Wednesday when two jockeys came down and the subsequent criticism of the track on public forums, Gold Circle Management, the NHA and a trainer's representative made a thorough inspection of the track last Friday morning.

The inspection team consisted of Gold Circle Racing Manager Raf Sheik, National Horse Racing Authority Chairman in KZN, Shaun Parker, trainer's representative Paul Gadsby and Track Manager Michael Ndlovu. Ndlovu had not carried out repairs to the area where the falls occurred.

After a thorough inspection of the area and surrounds there was no evidence to suggest that the track surface could be blamed on the incident.

The so-called 'hole' or 'wet patch' that was reported on the day was a repaired divot that was measured 58 metres before where the incident took place and in no ways could have been responsible for the first horse stumbling.

Ndlovu rubbished claims that the track is not inspected before every race meeting.

"I personally walk the track to check that the rails are correctly position and three of my staff also walk the track to check for anything untoward and take the pen readings."

"Pen readings are taken in three places across the track after 100m and the average recorded and made public. With four of us on the track before the race meeting any obvious problems would be picked up," he said.

Gadsby was satisfied that the track was not at fault, in fact he said the surface was in excellent condition.

Parker was also complimentary of the track and felt that there was no way the incident could be blamed on the track.

On Sunday there was another incident of a faller and a walk of the track revealed a bone dry back straight and then wet patches - a highly dangerous state of affairs, with horses having to cope with dramatic changes in surface conditions.

We believe that Gold Circle are now investigating further.

Peter Tops The Charts

Trainer Paul Peter, who saddles seven runners at the Vaal today, took his season tally to 21 winners when Date Palm won the first race under Warren Kennedy at his home base track, Turffontein, on Tuesday. Both Peter and Kennedy top their respective national logs at this stage.

In an interview with David Thiselton, he puts his climb to the top of the national trainers log chiefly down to a new member of his team, the legendary Ormond Ferraris, whom he hero worshipped as a racing-mad youngster. He also heaped praise on his first call rider Warren Kennedy.

On his chances of staying at the top he reckoned he would be able to match the "big guns" in the three-year-old division.

He also has high hopes for his four-year-old filly Vistula. He said:

"Moving to Turffontein put me closer to home and I have also been given a lot of input from Mr Ormonde Ferraris. He has become part of the team and his knowledge is priceless. He has taught me how to get horses supremely fit. His horses were always known for their fitness and I can now see why. I have latched on to his work patterns and his work ethic. He used to run his yard like a military base. I got all of his grooms too. We also have a treadmill and a walker and everyone's happy. It's a very happy team and we have a lovely bunch of owners."

Peter scored a five-timer at Turffontein Standside on Saturday, three of them ridden by Kennedy and two by 4kg claimer Cole Dicken.

He said:

"I have a top jockey in Warren Kennedy. He has such good hands and settles a horse so well and is a good judge of pace. I don't give him instructions. He analyses the horses and studies the form and a horse he has ridden just once he will know backwards. He is a major, major asset,"

He continued:

"Cole Dicken has a future, he has a good head, has good balance and punches them out nicely. He is definitely worth his 4kg claim."

He added:

"Matthew Thackeray rides a lot of work for me and is my second choice rider most of the time. He is a good, underrated jockey with a lovely attitude and deserves more chances so I am going to give him more rides."

Peter finished sixth on the national log last season on earnings in unrestricted races of R11,227,938.

This season he tops the log on earnings of close on R2 million, well clear of second-placed Alan Greeff.Justin Snaith is in third place and the reigning national champion trainer Sean Tarry is next best.

Peter said:

"The big guns have powerful strings but I have a very good crop of three-year-olds."

Peter was most impressed with his older filly Vistula's seasonal reappearance in which she easily won a Pinnacle Stakes event over 1400m on the Turffontein Standside course by 2,25 lengths.

He said:

"She was only about 70% fit. I threw her out for a whole month after the Garden Province. They don't like to give us grass at Turffontein, I don't blame them because there's so much racing, so she had just done a little bit of half pace work after her rest."

The four-year-old Ideal World filly is being targeted at the Gr2 Jo'Burg Spring Fillies and Mares Challenge over 1450m on October 5 on the Turffontein Inside track. Peter said if she landed a good draw she would be a 'massive' runner.

Peter has 160 horses at present and among them are many promising unraced three-year-olds.

Of those three-year-olds to have raced he named Summer Pudding, Pax Romana ('a good stayer'), Astrix, Arapaho, Atomic Blonde, Riverstown, Sarah, Lighthearted and Heartstwings as his best.

He has lost a few of his older horses to Mauritius but mentioned Rebel's Champ, Winter Storm and Operetta as among those he had high hopes for. He said Winter Storm had run a bit below par in his last two races last season as he had needed a bit of a break and he regarded Operetta as unlucky on Saturday as she had been badly interfered with.

Peter grew up three kilometres from Turffontein racetrack and was from a family who were crazy about the game through all generations.

He loved the horses more than the punting side. He was regularly kicked off the course as a youngster in an era when under eighteens weren't allowed, but would always be back for the next meeting. Fortunately, he looked eighteen as a fifteen-yearold. He recalls, ironically, being a particular fan of the Ormond Ferraris yard horses.

Peter learned the training ropes from James Maree, whom he was with for many years.

He said:

"He is a proper horseman and many of my workriders today come from his school."

Peter recently admitted he did not run a punting stable. He is consequently one of the most transparent trainers in the country and this is much appreciated by the racing public.

His twenty one winners this season have come at a strike rate of over16% and his place strike rate of 55% is the highest among the top twenty on the log.

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Cartier – More Magic!

A feast of top-class action on Irish Champions Weekend and at Doncaster's William Hill St Leger Festival has ensured a shake up in the standings for this year's Cartier Racing Awards.



Magical (168 points) has regained top spot in the Cartier Horse Of The Year and Cartier Older Horse categories after securing her second Gr1 of the campaign in the QIPCO Irish Champion Stakes at Leopardstown on September 14, day one of Irish Champions Weekend.

Aidan O'Brien

Aidan O'Brien's star filly

has yet to finish outside of the first two in seven starts in 2019 and the four-year-old is now set for a rematch with her chief rival Enable (128), who has had her measure twice this season, in the Gr1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp on October 6.

Magical started the season with a hat-trick of wins in Ireland, headlined by a seven-length success in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at the Curragh on May 26.

Star stayer Stradivarius (128) could be a contender for Cartier Horse Of The Year honours after a smooth victory in the Gr2 Magners Rose Doncaster Cup on September 13. Trained by John Gosden, Bjorn Nielsen's homebred is now unbeaten in his last 10 starts.

Gosden dominates the Cartier Stayer category, with Stradivarius joined in the standings by stablemates Logician (48) and four-year-old filly Enbihaar (36). Both horses were also in winning action at Doncaster- Logician captured the final Classic of the season, the Gr1 William Hill St Leger, in a track record time, while Enbihaar landed her third Gr2 prize of the season in the DFS Park Hill Stakes.

Another Gosden-trained runner Star Catcher (80) closed the gap on dual Classic winner Hermosa (112) in the Cartier Three-Year-Old Filly division. Star Catcher followed up her G1 Kerrygold Irish Oaks triumph with a front-running success in the Gr1 Qatar Prix Vermeille at Longchamp, France, on September 15. Hermosa meanwhile had gone down narrowly to Iridessa (66) in the Gr1 Coolmore "Fastnet Rock" Matron Stakes at Leopardstown the previous afternoon.

Sad Day For Happy Valley

The Hong Kong Jockey Club abandoned the race meeting scheduled for Happy Valley Racecourse on Wednesday in view of the imminent threat to the safety of racegoers, jockeys and employees, and to the welfare of racehorses.

In a statement, the HKJC said that when organising race meetings, the Club always put safety as a top priority. It is our responsibility to ensure that racehorses, racegoers, jockeys and employees are safe at all times.

The Club has been monitoring the situation in Hong Kong closely. It has conducted a thorough risk assessment of the race meeting tonight and concluded that it should be cancelled in order to preserve the security and safety of people and horses.

"Our concerns are tied to potential social unrest in the vicinity tonight, the very real threat of a disturbance or possible violence at Happy Valley Racecourse, and uncertainty regarding transportation in and around Happy Valley and Causeway Bay for racegoers, jockeys and employees and horses entering or leaving the racecourse throughout the evening," a Club spokesperson said.

"This is a very difficult and most unfortunate decision to make, but public safety is of paramount importance to the Club. We hope the racing community and the Hong Kong public will understand our reasons for doing so," the spokesperson emphasised.

Newbury Stakes Under The Whip

Newbury racecourse has said it will be 'carefully reviewing' its investment in prize-money at the track due to the 'significant risk' of falling income caused by betting shop closures.

The Racing Post reports that the warning came as the course unveiled its interim results for the first six months of 2019 on Tuesday.

Betting shop numbers have started to fall following the implementation in April of the new £2 stake on FOBTs, which is expected to have a major effect on racecourse finances due to reduced income from media rights.

The importance of those rights was highlighted in Newbury's results which said it had received total media-related revenues of £2.39 million, an increase of four per cent on the same period in 2018, which was 'attributable to increased LBO [licensed betting office]revenues'.

Earlier in the year Newbury said it would maintain prizemoney levels of £5m in 2019 despite the uncertainty over future income created by the government's crackdown on FOBTs.

However, prize-money levels at Newbury have already been criticised by trainers, including last month when a Listed race offered just £14,461 to the winner.

Grant Off The Mark

Cape-based jockey Grant van Niekerk arrived at Sha Tin on Sunday with a zero in his season's win column. He rectified that situation with victory in the afternoon's second trophy contest, the Class 4 Chinese Recreation Club Challenge Cup Handicap run over 1400m.

"I'm glad the monkey's off my back," he said after guiding the Ricky Yiu-trained Simple Elegant to victory.

"With the new jockeys and with Joao (Moreira) becoming a Club rider this season, things are competitive. I can feel it with the rides I've been getting I've had to battle for them. It hasn't been tough, it's just I wasn't riding great horses at the last couple of meetings. I do believe that if I get the chance, I can get the job done too."

The South African overcame gate 11, grabbed the lead, rolled along and kicked down the straight to a length and a quarter success in a Class record time of 1m 21.15s.

Champion trainer John Size was another to notch his first score of the term.

Moreira was the man who made sure Monkey Jewellery's head was first past the post in the Class 4 Sunbird Handicap run over 1200m. The Hong Kong International Sale grad-uate's short-head win took his tally to two wins from six starts.

Zac Purton rode four winners on the day.

Saudi Cup Drawcard

The world's richest race, the US\$20m Saudi Cup, will have a glittering support card for its inaugural running on 29 February 2020.

Three of the five new races on the undercard will be run on a new turf course, with the other two to be run on the highly acclaimed dirt track on which the 1800m Saudi Cup itself will be contested.

Prize money for the five races totals US\$6,800,000. They are:

A staying handicap on turf over 3000m, with a total race value of US\$2,500,000, a first prize of US\$1,500,000, and weights ranging from 62kg to 54kg.

A middle-distance turf race over 2100m for four-year-olds and upwards, with a total race value of US\$1,000,000 and a first prize of US\$600,000.

A turf sprint over 1350m for four-year-olds and upwards, with a total race value of US\$1,000,000 and a first prize of US\$600,000.

A dirt sprint over 1200m for three-year-olds and upwards, with a total race value of US\$1,500,000 and a first prize of US\$900,000.

A dirt mile race for three-year olds over 1600m, with a total race value of US\$800,000 and a first prize of US\$480,000.

Horseracing in the Kingdom stretches back more than five decades since the Jockey Club Of Saudi Arabia was formed in 1965.

"The introduction of the Saudi Cup as an international race is without doubt the most significant event in the history of horse racing in Saudi Arabia," said HRH Prince Bandar bin Khalid Al Faisal.

"It demonstrates our resolve to develop this great sport in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and also our ambition to become a leading player on horse racing's world stage."

Early Birthday Surprise For Kantor

Trainer Ricardo Le Grange was repaid manifold for his decision to entrust hard-working apprentice jockey Krisna Thangamani with a first ride on Polytrack specialist Pennywise at Kranji on Friday night.

Le Grange's Malaysian apprentice does all the hard yards on the Argentinian-bred son of Pure Prize, but for some reason, never got a chance to partner him in a race.

Better late than never, as when that opportunity finally came his way in the SG\$85,000 Class 2 race over 1000m at the six-time winner's (all on Polytrack) 16th start, Krisna did not let it go begging.

Despite cutting the breeze three to four wide, Pennywise stuck on gamely inside the last furlong with his rider coaxing him to the line at a balanced rhythm, along with a few well-synchronised smacks on the rump.

"I have to thank Bernard Kantor. It's his big birthday in a couple of days (70 on 27 September), and he and Pat Shaw (Le Grange's ex mentor for 16 years at Kranji before he took over him) are in Portugal celebrating with other friends," said Le Grange.

"I'm also very happy for Krisna. For two years he only rode trackwork on this horse and never got a chance to sit on him in a race. Tonight, he got the chance and he gave him a great ride. Yes, they were trapped wide, but Krisna kept him rolling and they were nice and strong to the line. Krisna rides this horse every morning in trackwork because he's been a handful. He dropped Barend Vorster and Nooresh Juglall before, but Krisna gets along well with him and has done all the hard work on him."

Following that seventh Polytrack win, Pennywise has now taken his prizemoney level past the SG\$330,000 mark for Kantor.

Pure Logic!

Logician maintained his unbeaten record to win the prestigious St Leger at Doncaster on Saturday and give jockey Frankie Dettori his sixth win in the Gr1 race.

The 5-6 favourite won by four lengths to give trainer John Gosden his fifth success at the meeting. The BBC reports that Sir Ron Priestley, ridden by 49-year-old Franny Norton, finished second with 40-1 shot Nayef Road in third.

The one-mile-and-six-furlong race was Logician's fifth win in succession.

"He's amazing. He's the favourite. There are 30,000 people here and he delivered. It's great for the sport," Dettori told ITV Racing.

Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who had three horses in the field, was aiming for a third win in three years, but his best place was Sir Dragonet in fourth.

Dettori's five previous wins in the showpiece race came in 1995, 1996, 2005, 2006 and 2008.

The Juddmonte Farms-bred Logician (GB) is by Frankel (GB) out of the Daylami mare, Scuffle (GB). He is unbeaten in five starts.

Cape Star's Quiet UK Debut

The 2018 Sun Met runner-up Last Winter made his long awaited international debut at Sandown on Wednesday.

Ridden by Ryan Moore he finished sixth of six runners and 6,75 lengths off the winner in the Listed Chasemore Farm Fortune Stakes over a mile. He was ridden by Ryan Moore.

Now trained by Sir Michael Stoute, the Khaya Stables owned 6yo Western Winter entire had been off the track for 20 months and run up multiple voyager miles on his travels to Mauritius, England, Dubai and then back to England.

And the lightly raced star, once the highest rated SA galloper on the Longines International Rankings, has had little luck along the way.

He jarred himself on the off fore while in quarantine in Mauritius.

After arriving at Mike de Kock in Dubai in November 2018, he appeared well on track for the DWC but then jarred himself on the near fore at the beginning of January this year.

Lady Christine Laidlaw of Khaya Stables then made the decision to move Last Winter to Sir Michael Stoute at Newmarket.

Dean Kannemeyer said he was thrilled that the talented athlete had appeared to come through his run unscathed.

"I was chatting to Dr John Mcveigh recently. He had the opportunity to have a look at Last Winter in the flesh a few weeks ago and was very happy with him and said that he was moving well. He was pulling hard early and never quickened – but he is top class and there is plenty to come yet, I believe," he said.

Last Winter only raced six times here, winning his first four on the trot. He was then stepped up in the Gr2 Premier Trophy in December 2017, where he was beaten a nostril by a clever Gavin Lerena ride on the Bill Prestage handicapper, Milton.

His sixth outing came in the Sun Met, where he made up lengths in the final 150m under Piere Strydom to be beaten a half length by subsequent SA Horse Of The Year, Oh Susanna.


Wid Tipy: Beach Beauty got off the mark as a broodmare when her son Wild Coast scored at Durbanville on Saturday. Having his second start, the 3yo colt romped to an easy win over 1250m. A son of Drakenstein Stud's champion sire Trippi, the Drakenstein Stud bred Wild Coast is the first runner produced by Beach Beauty-South Africa's Equus Champion Older Female in both 2012-2013 and 2013-2014. Trained by Dennis Drier, Beach Beauty won 17 races during her illustrious career, winning from 1000-2000m. Her

Wild Coast (Richard Fourie) led in by Kevin Sommerville 12 graded wins including five Gr1's. The Dynasty champion recently foaled a Silvano colt, and she is booked to visit War Front's Gr1 Tattersalls Gold Cup winner Lancaster Bomber in 2019.

Stakes Cut

Mauritius Turf Club CEO Mike Rishworth issued a press release on Monday confirming that the club is in a financial predicament which it blames on off-course bookmakers not being able to work for 27 of the 37 racing fixtures in 2019. Stakes payable on all races will be reduced by 10 percent with effect from 19 October. This represents a reduction of Rs 2 million on the remaining races for this season, and will mean that by the end of 2019 total stakes paid will be Rs 98 million-same as those paid in 2018.





West Australian apprentice Jade McNaught has written her name into the record books, becoming the first apprentice in the west to ride six winners on the same programme. The 30-year-old, who has only been riding since May 2018, achieved the feat at Belmont on Saturday. Following her record-breaking achievement, which now has her leading both the apprentice and senior jockey premierships on 17 winners, McNaught said she wouldn't be affected by the big day out and would remain grounded.

KEAGAN'S Okay

KZN rider Keagan de Melo is 'very sore but seemingly fine' after falling off his mount Silent Crusade in the sixth at Hollywoodbets Scottsville on Sunday. De Melo, who has made a good start to the term with 10 winners from 85 rides, and rode the third race winner on the afternoon, came off at the 200m mark, just when making his run. The Mark Dixon-trained Silent Crusade, who looked a likely winner, appeared to peck and lose her balance and the young rider fell head first in a shocking sight. He was rushed to hospital and subsequent x-rays revealed that he had no fractures. He will undergo a CT scan to as an extra precaution on the higher part of the spine.

Chief Stipe Goes

Chief Stipendiary Steward in Kwa-Zulu Natal Shaun Parker has resigned. He commenced his career with the NHA as a Stipendiary Steward in Port Elizabeth in 1995. During his 24 year career as a Stipendiary Steward, he has held a number of senior positions in the Eastern Cape, Central Provinces and Kwa-Zulu Natal. Parker will assume the position of Head Of Stewarding with the BHA and will be based in London.

Great Cause

AP McCoy returned to the saddle to ride a winner on Quizical in the Pat Smullen Champions Race For Cancer Trials Ireland at the Curragh on Sunday. McCoy, 45, who retired in 2015, finished ahead of old friend and rival Ruby Walsh, on Aussie Valentine. Smullen, the nine-time Irish champion flat jockey, who is being treated for pancreatic cancer, persuaded McCoy and eight other former top jockeys to come out of retirement to take part in the flat race which has raised more than 2m Euro for cancer research. He could not fulfil plans to ride himself because of his illness.

Winter Blit

Drakenstein Stud's four time Gr1 winning stallion What A Winter has made a blistering start to the 2019/20 season. The triple Equus Champion produced three smart winners on Saturday.

Duncan Howells

The trainers lounge was like a morgue. Lips were hanging on the ground, the faces were glum and the vibe was in stark contrast to the laughter and banter emanating from the jockey room.

Maybe jockeys have less stress than trainers, generally. But veteran Ashburton trainer Duncan Howells suggests it's high time to make racing fun again – it's the reason the game started and why most people got into it in the first place.

The 53 year old Winning Form-sponsored conditioner, a twice KZN Champion, says that racing is a sport and trying too hard to run it like a business is a recipe for failure.

"It's always going to be a game of chance. We are dealing with flesh and blood. If you're not enjoying it and feel like pointing fingers every time things go pear-shaped, go play golf or something rather," he says as he recalls his colleagues' faces in that morbid room at the races.

Fact is that Duncan is the one man who should entitled to be as miserable as sin. His yard has just come out of the worst virus that they have ever experienced. He says it's been two years of disappointments, headscratching, frustration and agony – and plenty of questioning and more questioning.

He tells how his young horses would work up a storm and then go in the wind or start bleeding. He lost a lot of youngsters as a result of the virus.

"One starts to get paranoid and question your sanity! The horses are not reproducing their work on the track. Then the Vet suggests it could be the feed. The feed merchant suggests it's not the feed- you're just not feeding correctly. Then the whispers are out – 'Howells has lost it – he has forgotten how to train horses'. But you know you are not doing anything differently – but then you do start wondering whether you have lost it!" he smiles as he recalls a testing stretch that is now behind him.

A straight-shooting guy, who concedes to sometimes getting frustrated at the way officialdom handle apparently simple things, Duncan says that he has no excuses for not training winners being based at what he believes to be the best and most horse-friendly training centre in the country. He also lives nearby, so has a little time to take his mind off things and follow his side hobby of gardening. Although starting work at 04h30 and finishing after 17h30, means it's a long day, most days.

"Our training tracks are excellent and comparable with anything I have experienced anywhere. Winters are perhaps the one tough aspect of Ashburton – but nothing's perfect and we can live with that," he muses as he points out that in earlier years the viruses were not as prevalent as they are today.

"We have a lot more traffic and movement of horses as well as new strings here, and that may well be a contributing factor to the viruses," he contemplates as he proudly states that he took a tough decision as a seasoned professional to stop the bus and start all over again.

"Let's be honest – its human nature to try and find blame. I'm not blaming anybody- I have gone back to basics and am feeling a lot more positive right now."

> On training horses in KZN, Duncan says he wouldn't choose to be anywhere else on earth, but would like to see them revisiting the programme and racing on turf at least once a week in the holiday province.

"Horses, owners, trainers and punters need the variety and a balance between poly and turf. I am not convinced we are utilising our racecourse facilities to the optimum. I understand the need for seasonal breaks and treatment, but closing a track for three months and then exposing it to racing can cause damage. It becomes a patch of beautifully green grass, more than a racecourse in the end."

> One of his bugbears is that he feels that racing generally appears to have a fear of being transparent and upfront.

> > "When there is a problem, man up and come clean. It's the apparent lack of communication and transparency that leads to conspiracy theories, frustration and stone-throwing on the social media forums." While he has a few boxes open, and would welcome new horses, Duncan says that he would like to settle on a string of 50 horses. He tells of his top

team of personnel – headed by himself, his partner Cathy Rymill and Dela Naidoo, a proud graduate of the Summerhill School of Equine Excellence.

On any unraced lurkers in the Howells Racing

string, Duncan says that he expects a few could still put up their hands. He mentions a Trippi gelding that may be worth following.

Looking at the prospect of chasing the big trophies in the Cape during the forthcoming summer, Duncan says that he would only consider travelling South if he genuinely believed he had 'the right horse' and that he could go down early, as he did when the Var flyer Via Africa won the 2014 Gr1 Cape Flying Championship.

"I have tried the road trip ten days before the race. Eric Sands has always been a massive help. But it didn't work as well as going down well in advance and settling in properly. I also used to be busy managing a big string at home – I would be happy to take our chances whether this season or in future – but, as I say, on the right terms, with the right horse."

One of the most experienced and knowledgeable men in the game, Duncan's first runner was a winner. Her name was Whispering Magic.

It was the opening day of the 1999/2000 season, and his now Summerveld-based colleague Robbie Hill did the riding honours in the pre-polytrack days at Greyville. Still staunch supporters today, Avison and Mary Carlisle were his first owners

Duncan was always destined to follow a life with horses and was born into a racing family. His track record dates back to his years as a leading amateur jockey and his first job with Eric Sands at Milnerton. He lists his late Uncle Andy Smith (father of his cousin and top PE trainer Gavin), Roy Curling, Eric Sands and the now Australia-based David Payne as some of the biggest influences on his career

On his best horses, Duncan doesn't hesitate that Mogok's daughter Gypsy's Warning 'was really brilliant!'

Zeeno providing him with his first Gr1 success in the 2006 Gold Medallion at Scottsville was an inspirational turning point in his career.

His other Gr1's include the brilliant Gypsy's Warning victory in the 2008 Thekwini Stakes at Clairwood, his favourite racecourse. Dual Gr1 champion Same Jurisdiction won the same race six years later, while Lauderdale completed Duncan's treble in 2015.

Via Africa won the SA Fillies Sprint in 2013 and 2014, as well as the Cape Flying Championship in that memorable summer seven months later. Duncan can be contacted via www.duncanhowellsracing.co.za

Entries close at 11h00 on 21 October. supplementary entries close at 09h00 on 28 October with declarations having to be in by 11h00 on 29 October.

Miesque Matters!

The legacy of the outstanding racemare and producer, Miesque, continues to be felt, with her numerous high-class descendants continuing to excel at the highest level around the world.

Not only is Miesque's son, Kingmambo, a strong presence in pedigrees of top-class thoroughbreds through numerous highclass broodmare daughters as well as his high-class sire sons, King Kamehameha, King's Best and Lemon Drop Kid, but Miesque also features prominently in the pedigrees of several promising twoyear-olds this season.

Night Of Thunder

The dual Breeders' Cup Mile winning daughter of Nureyev is the fourth dam of smart two-year-old, Molatham (Night Of Thunder), who made it two wins from just three starts when victorious in Friday's Listed Weatherbys Global Stallions App Flying Scotsman Stakes at Doncaster.

The promising Molatham- who holds entries in the Gr2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge Stakes, Gr1 Darley Dewhurst Stakes and Gr1 Vertem Futurity Trophy- is out of the Pivotal mare, Cantal, whose granddam is Miesque's dual French classic winning granddaughter, East Of The Moon (Private Account).

Molatham's half-sister, Perfection (Dutch Art), won the Listed EBF Stallions Highfield Farm Flying Fillies' Stakes earlier in the year to give a further boost to her remarkable female line. East Of The Moon is also granddam of the very smart two-year-old filly, Alpine Star (Sea The Moon). The latter, a half-sister to Cartier Champion and four time Gr1 winner, Alpha Centauri (Mastercraftsman), has won two of her first three starts, including the Gr2 Debutante Stakes. The well-bred Alpine Star holds entries in both the Gr1 bet365 Fillies' Mile and G2 Shadwell Rockfel Stakes.

Miesque's triple Gr1 winning son, and deceased star sire, Kingmambo, is the sire of outstanding broodmare Love Me True, whose sons, Norway (Galileo) and Ruler Of The World (Galileo) both made waves at Leopardstown on Saturday.

Last season's Listed Godolphin Flying Start Zetland Stakes winner, Norway, claimed the Gr3 Paddy Power Betting Shop Stakes to garner a first group win (the colt had been third to stablermate, Sovereign, in the Gr1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby earlier this year), while Norway's own brother, Ruler Of The World, is the sire of Saturday's Gr1 Coolmore 'Fastnet Rock' Matron Stakes winner, Iridessa. Iridessa has now won 3 Gr1 races, with her previous Gr1 victories coming in last year's bet365 Fillies' Mile and the 2019 Juddmonte Pretty Polly Stakes.

Family Ties

Love Me True's sire, Kingmambo, is also broodmare sire of promising sire, and four time Gr1 winner Camelot, whose son, Sir Dragonet, ran fourth in Saturday's St Leger, and Kingmambo is also broodmare sire of Sky Crystal, whose son, Space Traveller, won both Saturday's Gr2 Clipper Logistics Boomerang Stakes, and June's Gr2 Jersey Stakes. Kingmambo's successful sire sons, Lemon Drop Kid and King's Best- a three-parts brother to the remarkable Urban Sea- have both proved top-class damsires, and King's Best is broodmare sire of this season's high-class 3yo, Headman, as well as 2019 group/graded stakes winners, I'm So Fancy, Nomandel, and Juliet Foxtrot.

This year's Listed Ruby Stakes winner, Lady Wannabe (whose dam was sired by Drakenstein Stud resident sire, Duke Of Marmalade) is inbred to Kingmambo, damsire of her own sire, Camelot, as well as Duke Of Marmalade.

Kingmambo's own brother, Miesques Son, (best known in South Africa as the sire of KZN based Breeders' Cup Mile winner, Miesque's Approval) is the sire of Whipper, whose son, Lord Glitters, captured the 2019 Gr1 Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot. Miesque's own dam, Pasadoble, also ranks as the fourth dam of Saturday's Gr1 Northern Dancer Turf Stakes winner, Old Persian- who was also victorious in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic earlier this year.

Mile Magic

Miesque's great-grandson, and fellow Breeders' Cup Mile winner, Karakontie (Bernstein), has made a pleasing start with his first two-year-olds this season, with his early runners including Tyro Stakes winner, Karak. Another from Karakontie's first crop is highclass Russian performer, Great Winner, who is closely inbred to Miesque. This grandson of Storm Cat could well further enhance Miesque's magnificent legacy over time, as could Miesque's 2018 Gr1 French Derby winning grandson, Study Of Man (Deep Impact).

Miesque's A.P. Indy sired son, Judpot, has enjoyed success in South Africa, through the likes of Gr1 winners as Along Came Polly, Coral Fever, Forest Indigo, and Juxtapose, and it is surely only a matter of time before Judpot makes his mark as a broodmare sire. His half-brother, Kingmambo, is currently damsire of more than 140 individual stakes winners.

Winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile in both 1987 and 1988, Miesque to this day rates as the most influential female BC Mile winner of all, although 2003 Mile winner, Six Perfections (whose dam is a half-sister to Miesque) is the dam of four black type horses to date, including Australian Gr2 winner, Yucatan (Galileo), French Gr2 winner, Planet Five (Storm Cat), Gr3 winner, Faufiler (Galileo), and Mount Everest (Galileo). The latter ran second to subsequent multiple Gr1 winner, Japan (Galileo), in the 2018 Gr2 Beresford Stakes.

It's Winter Forever

The twice-winning and stakes placed Trip Poker is a daughter of champion sire Trippi (End Sweep) out of the US-bred Skip Away mare Skip Poker. The latter won three times from a mile to 1800m and is a half-sister to Huambo (USA) and Chimichurra (USA). She has produced five winners, including Joey Ramsden stakes winners Liquid Mercury (exported to Dubai) and Captain Gambler.

What's there to be said that hasn't already been repeated aplenty about the top-class What A Winter?

Looking back at the past weekend, the four-time Gr1 winner sired three winners to maintain his terrific opening burst. SA national log-leading trainer Paul Peter sent out two impressive What A Winter winners on Saturday – the Narrow Creek Studbred stakes-placed Ring Of Fire really catching the eye. His stablemate and paternal half-sister Sarah showed her class, winning a 1000m Pinnacle Stakes.

Glen Puller takes the credit for the third What A Winter strike last Saturday – the Favour Stud-bred Celestial Storm accounting for fellow What A Winter filly Hildegarde.

Belle Of Speed!

A nursery of champions over the years, Lammerskraal Stud was founded in 1983 by Mike Rattray, still a leading owner today- most notably of Gr1 Champions Cup star, Rainbow Bridge.

The scenic farm is situated at the foot of the Swaarmoed Pass, in the Ceres valley. Five years ago, Pieter and Jolanda Graaff purchased the stud with the adjoining farms, Quains, Pofaddersfontein and Wanganella.

This week they proudly show a smashing colt by boom sire Vercingetorix (Silvano) out of the super-fast Lammerskraal Stud-bred Western Winter mare Blizzard Belle – a full sister to Gr2 winner Bichette (in foal to Dynasty) – who set up a new Fairview 1000m course record of 54,55 secs in January 2016 when trained by Yvette Bremner,

At the time, it was the fastest ever run by a racehorse in South Africa over the turf 1000m in the modern era, and broke Mythical Flight's 54,96 secs set at Turffontein on 5 May 2007 in the Gr1 Computaform Sprint.

The Path Of Glory

Irish Champion Pathfork, who hails from the same family as Saturday's unbeaten Gr1 William Hill St Leger winner Logician, enjoyed another good weekend, with a trio of winners.

Pathfork had double success on Saturday, with his son Viking Trail winning in Mauritius, and daughter Promise winning at Turffontein.

One of five winners on the day for trainer Paul Peter, the five-year-old Promise made much of the running to claim victory in a FM 83 handicap by a length, with regally bred Exceed And Excel daughter Queen Supreme a beaten favourite back in third and Met winner River Jetez's daughter Jetorio back in fourth spot.

Bred by Willem Engelbrecht JR, Promise has now won four of her last five starts, and has won or placed in 11 of 16 outings.

Her Gr1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes winning sire Pathfork also enjoyed success at Hollywoodbets Scottsville the following day, when the stallion's son Marchingontogether landed a Pinnacle Stakes over 1400m impressively.

The Pathfork gelding, third in last season's G1 SA Derby, has now won four times and has already earned in excess of R500 000.

Bred by Jagessar Limited, Marchingontogether was named Champion 3YO Colt/ Gelding for 2018-2019 at the recent KZN Racing Awards ceremony.

Pathfork, whose previous notable performers include graded stakes winners as Mighty High, Red Chesnut Road and My Friend Lee, is from one of the hottest families in the stud book – with Pathfork being a half-brother to 2019 Gr1 Preakness Stakes winner War Of Will, and from the same family as 2019 Gr1 winners Romanised, Siskin and Almond Eye, as well as red-hot sire Bated Breath.

Imbongi **Comes Home**

A super star graduate of the 2006 Ready To Run Sale, Imbongi has returned to his place of birth at Summerhill Stud, to retire.



A #kznbred son of Russian Revival out of a fabulous mare Garden Verse by Foveros, he won the Gr2 Gauteng Guineas, Gr2 KZN Guineas and the Gr2 Drill Hall Stakes.

Imbongi, whose name means Praise Singer, was exported – going on to win in the Gr3 Criterion Stakes in the UK and a win in Dubai in the Gr2 Zabeel Mile. He concluded the Dubai season with a gutsy third in the Dubai Duty Free on World Cup Night. He earned over R8-million in stakes. He is a half-brother to Spring Garland, the dam of Highly Decorated. This is also the family of Oracle News, Victory Moon, Imperious Sue, William Longsword and another winning export in the USA, Mahubo.

Other #kznbreds to excel overseas include the likes of Gypsy's Warning, The Apache and Wolf Whistle to mention but a few.

Racing stars Imbongi and Pierre Jourdan will be on show to the public at the end of September, at a race meeting in aid of the Coastal Horse Care Unit.

Forces Favourite Arrives

The R1,7 million Captain Al colt Regimental, owned by an illustrious group of owners, caught the eye on debut at Durbanville on Saturday when he went all the way at odds-on to seal a coup for his backers.

Ridden by the SMG Cape Town-sponsored Corne Orffer, Regimental proved too strong for the persistent and more experienced Gold Medal in the second race, a 1250m Maiden Plate, and went on to win by 0,40 lengths in a time of 76,23 secs. He was purchased for R1,7 million at the 2017 Cape Premier Yearling Sale and is out of US six-time winner Crazy About Me (Lawyer Ron).

He is owned by former Mayfair Speculators Racing Manager Derek Brugman in partnership with an international mix of owners, including Mr and Mrs Antony Beck, Anna Doyle, Kip Elser of US-based Kirkwood Stables, Dr Jill Warner of Carry On Alice fame and Henry Bozo of French-based Ecurie des Monceaux.

The Brett Crawford stable comments, published by courtesy of Phumelela Publishing, caught some punters wrong-footed as they had indicated that the obviously smart colt 'should need the run'. He behaved like a professional and won easily.

The Klawervlei Stud-bred galloper was snapped up from 7-2 and backed into the red before easing to an official starting price of 11-10.

On the Brett Crawford Racing website, it is stated that Regimental is 'a nice colt, and may be green on debut. Each way chance'.

Assistant Barry Donnely was quoted on Saturday suggesting that Regimental 'was going places and should have a money chance.'

The topliner of the sunny afternoon was a scratching decimated R140 000 Pinnacle Stakes run over 1400m.

The deceptive style of East Cape Champion Greg Cheyne produced the goods as he showed cracking judgement to get Ready Steady Go home, ahead of Catkin, Zeb and the gallant Star Chestnut, who was returned from an eight month break. It was a thriller with only 0,55 lengths separating the top four. Agent Of Fortune was never in the hunt and he looks much better than this.

Richard Fourie and Justin Snaith were in fine form again, with a well-taken four-timer. Fourie picked up five winners, and eight in two days after his hat-trick at Fairview on Friday!

What Magic!

A daughter of Galileo and a full sister to Bush Hill Stud's Flying The Flag, Magical landed a gamble to provide Aidan O'Brien with a remarkable 1-2-3 in in the QIPCO Gr1 Irish Champion Stakes at Leopardstown on day one of Longines Irish Champions Weekend on Saturday.

The well-backed favourite was perfectly positioned throughout under Ryan Moore to pounce coming into the straight and establish a race-winning move, though backers of Deirdre will wonder what might have happened had she enjoyed a clear run.

RTE reports that the first Japanese-trained horse to run in Ireland was caught in last place when the race developed and, pulled out by rider Oisin Murphy, flashed home to finish fourth.

However, the 11-10 favourite Magical still won readily by two and a quarter lengths.

Having finished second to Enable three times over the past 12 months, the mare was finally happy to meet a field that did not include that other star mare.

Magic Wand was second, Anthony Van Dyk third as O'Brien won his first Champion Stakes since 2011, but his domination was remarkable, as he also won three of the first four races.
