

Dual Northern Cape Champion trainer Corrie Lensley expects to saddle his first runners out of his new Milnerton base on 25 February. The lifetime horseman will retain his highly successful Flamingo Park yard as a satellite base.

Speaking to the Sporting Post Digest on the eve of his and wife and Assistant Trainer Emmie Le Grange's 'great trek' South in a few weeks, the uber positive Corrie said it's never too late in life to take up new challenges and break out of one's comfort zones.

"I was offered the boxes at Milnerton and the step is a strategic one for my business. I have trained plenty of winners on the turf in Gauteng and at Bloemfontein in the old days, so I probably won't be needing any coaching," he laughed as he stressed at the same instance that he wasn't making the move with 'stars in my eyes'.

A twice Northern Cape Champion, and current leader on the local trainer's log, the vastly experienced Corrie says that he is under no false illusions about the poser of boxing amongst some of the best trainers in South Africa. It will be business as usual in Kimberley and he and Emmie will be commuting between the two yards.

The bright lights of Cape Town are a world away from the farming community of Ellisras where he grew up.

"Luckily there is no time to socialise – training horses is a 24/7 occupation, so I'm not concerned about being a square peg in a round hole in the dance clubs in the big city," he laughed as we asked him how the move came about.

"KR Chairman Robert Bloomberg and his colleague Jonathan Snaith were so accommodating and extended what I felt was a genuine hand of friendship. I realise that they need to bolster their fields, but I also believe the opportunity came at the right time for me.

If one doesn't try something new, how will one ever know the outcome?" he suggests.

Obviously the Northern Cape Racing shake-up has influenced Corrie. 2019 was a forgettable year for the long established jurisdiction. But he doesn't believe there is any danger of racing ceasing to exist there.

"I was amazed with the manner in which the locals united when we were threatened with closure. People who had previously been our detractors put their hands up in support. Who knows what the future holds? But I honestly cannot see Flamingo Park disappearing from the SA landscape. It's too much of a strategic component," he adds.

Corrie has 33 boxes to fill at Milnerton. He has some lovely youngsters on the farm, bought for him by his loyal clients, and he will be taking some suitable horses down with him.

"In this age of cut-throat competition and general negativity, I have been bowled over by the words of kindness, support and encouragement that I have received from future colleagues, breeders and owners, and people I hardly know. It gives one a sense of hope for the sport, despite all the challenges around us."

While the 21st century Milnerton is no Summerveld or Randjesfontein, Corrie says that for him the new stabling will be something of a step up in the world.

"I love the boxes at Milnerton. They are so spacious compared to my 'matchboxes' at my present homebase. And we have sand to train on, too! One only fails to appreciate things when you take them for granted sometimes," he muses wisely.

Corrie got into racing via his uncle, Boet Horn, a farrier and small-time trainer. His uncle introduced him to Pat Shaw's father, Bernie and Charl du Toit, who trained for Frik Kroon. He says that his love for racehorses comes from old school conditioners like Willie de Beer and Nick Joubert.

Ironically, like some older Cape trainers came through the Cape Hunt ranks, Corrie cut his teeth in bush racing. He says it is nothing like the perceptions that some people project.

He joined Bill Human, first as a stable employee and then as an assistant. Seventeen years ago he trained from Bloemfontein before moving to a private facility in Potgietersrus, raiding to Bloemfontein and Kimberley. "I used to drive my own truck. It was 780km there and 780km back, but I wouldn't have done it unless I enjoyed it."

The rest is modern Flamingo Park history and the Cape rush-hour traffic should be a walk in the park for him!

Saluting A July Hero

Gr3 Sea Cottage Stakes Turffontein

A race named in honour of a legend of the South African turf, the R200 000 Gr3 Sea Cottage Stakes headlines the Turffontein inside track programme on Saturday. A conditions contest for 3yo's, it could herald another classic prospect in advance of the Gauteng season.

This feature dished up the Gr1 Daily News 2000 winner Majestic Mambo in 2018, and Mike de Kock won it with the good filly Orchid Island the previous year.

De Kock has two runners on Saturday – and the Visionaire filly Virtuosa tops the SP ratings. After Ryan Moore's fleeting visit to ride Rainbow Bridge, it is interesting to note that French rider Jerome Moutard takes the mount on the filly.

"Nothing strategic here! Jerome is on a work-

ing holiday and wanted to see the country. He was introduced to me by a friend of a friend," confirmed Mike de Kock.

Virtuosa must have a serious shout if one puts a line through her last outing against the boys when she ran some 7,75 lengths behind surprise winner Leopold in the Secretariat Stakes. The latter failed to frank the form when beaten under two lengths behind Florida Quays on Saturday, but the manner of Virtuosa's previous two wins in lesser company was convincing enough to suggest she could challenge.

Her stablemate Spero Optima carries joint topweight and has won 2 of his 4 starts in good style. The R800 000 National Yearling Sale graduate clearly stays the trip and caught the eye when beating establishing elder Glider Pilot last time – the latter coming out to win his first race in over two years last Saturday when holding off the battle hardened stakes winner, Dawn Assault.

Robbie Sage's Green Laser has run two fair races as a 3yo after showing good ability behind subsequent (disappointing) Gr1 Eden Roc early on. He should be much fitter on Saturday and from a good draw with Gavin Lerena up, he must go into exotics.

what he has shown to date.

Sean Tarry's recent Workriders maiden winner Cornish Pomodoro has his third start and could be anything. He is sure to stay the 1800m on breeding and could be the surprise package.

Whiskytangofoxtrot put it all together at his sixth start when running on well to beat Bravo One by 2,75 lengths at the Vaal. He looks outgunned here.

Widely drawn, the second of the Corne Spies duo is the Silvano gelding Imperial Ruby, who proved his shock maiden win was no fluke when he followed up on Christmas eve. But he appears to be likely to be comfortable over further.

Pax Romana has his first run as a 3yo and his first since being gelded. A runaway maiden winner at the end of last season, his fitness after a 25 week break must be in doubt.

Spero Optima could be the horse to side with. His stablemate Virtuosa has some class, while the lightly tried pair of Mohican and Cornish Pomodoro could be best of the balance.

Sea - A Star!

Saturday's Turffontein feature honours the memory of one of the greatest horses to grace the turf in this country.

Despite his 20 wins from 24 lifetime starts, SA Champion 2yo and 3yo titles and dual Horse Of The Year accolades, Sea Cottage is probably most famously remembered as the favourite that was shot three weeks before the 1966 Durban July Handicap.

Approaching that year's race with 11 wins from 12 starts, he a 'racing certainty'. Bookmaker Sonny Chislett stood to lose his shirt if the horse won and in conjunction with Monaco Club proprietor Monty Labuschagne, hatched a plan to 'stop' the colt.

Local henchman Johnny Nel was hired and on the morning of 10 June 1966, he took aim from a concrete shelter on the Blue Lagoon bridge, hitting the star in the hindquarter. With the bullet lodged beyond the reach of veterinary instruments, there was not much that could be done, but the horse made such a remarkable recovery, that he resumed training and took his place in the July field three weeks later. Sea Cottage put up a courageous effort but, badly hampered at the 400m mark, he finished something of an unlucky 4th.

When Sea Cottage returned to the scene of his defeat at Holly-woodbets Greyville as a 4yo on 1 July 1967, he was set to concede his nearest market rival, the year younger Jollify, nearly two stone. But he wore the youngster down and got up to dead-heat in what is still the most talked about finish to the great race.

An interesting bit of trivia is that Sea Cottage was the first Summerveld-trained horse to win the Durban July all those 53 years ago.

Now South Africa's premier training centre, it had been opened at the beginning of that season. Jockey Robbie Sivewright, Sea Cottage's partner at 23 of 24 starts, remembered him as 'a horse with an unbelievable action and a devastating finish which he could sustain for 2½ furlongs. He was a horse the like of which is seen but rarely anywhere in the world'.

Sivewright was adamant Sea Cottage could have won the 1966 July three weeks after the shooting were it not for a bump from Cuff Link, which broke the champion's rhythm.



In the current economic climate it was hardly surprising that the average and median prices were down on last year. But, truth be told, in the grand scheme of things the Cape Premier Yearling Sale leads the field in the South African sales arena in comparison to everything else.

The average price per lot was down 25% on 2019, while the aggregate fell 32.4%.

In 2019 some 17 lots sold for R1 million or more, while this year just five passed the magic million mark.

"Considering the economic climate, both macro and micro, we came into the sale with limited expectations," conceded Wehann Smith, CEO of Cape Thoroughbred Sales.

"But all said and done, it's still a significant amount of money (sales totalled R56,490,000) and we still see a R3-million colt and a R2,2-million colt and two fillies over R1 million in trying times as positive. The most positive thing of all, as I went through the buyers' list, is that there's certainly new money and new international money- so internationals are faster to seize the opportunities than us locals, with exports opening up soon."

Maine Chance Farms' reigning champion South African sire Silvano's son I Want It All topped the sale. Consigned by Drakenstein Stud (As Agent), I Want It All (# 99) was knocked down to Nic Jonsson and Bjorn Nielsen for R3 million and will race for Justin Snaith.

Out of the Giant's Causeway mare Song Of Happiness, and thus bred on the same Silvano/Giant's Causeway cross as recent Gr1 Summer Cup winner Zillzaal, I Want It All is a half-brother to Dontworrybehappy, who was knocked down for R3,2 million at last year's Premier Sale.

His sire had three other lots fetch R900 000 plus, and Silvano ended the 2020 Cape Premier Yearling Sale selling six lots for a gross total of R6 800 000. The triple Gr1 winning son of Lomitas is the sire of the record breaking Masaki, who was knocked down to Shadwell South Africa for R9 million to top the 2019 Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale.

A 'first' for the sale is that a South African-bred yearling was bought specifically for the Australian market, and will be travelling to that country, after a stop in both Mauritius and the UK.

All That Jazz, bred by Avontuur, is a daughter Trippi out of former champion South African sprinter Val De Ra and was sold to New Zealand-based agent Ric Wylie, for R1,65-million.

Wylie earlier bought a Visionaire filly for R600 000.

"They've been bought for Australia, but they'll be going the long way, with a quiet summer in England being broken in," Wylie said. "It was my client's idea to try to buy some fillies here, and they were two of our best five."

There were some new sires on the sale and CTS's Wehann Smith was not unhappy with how they sold.

Ridgemont Highlands first season Redoute's Choice stallion Rafeef equalled the mark set by Vercingetorix at Nationals in 2018, when the hammer fell at R2,2 million for a colt (#145, see above) pur-

chased by international bloodstock agent, Amanda Skiffington.

"We've had some luck with first-crop sires before, and after going through a lot of horses, we thought he was the best colt. He wasn't cheap, though," said the agent, who confirmed the young-ster would be going into training with Brett Crawford.

The R2,2 million was equalled by #174, the Gimmethegreenlight half brother to Sun Met hope Vardy, offered by Klawervlei Stud.

It only became apparent afterward that a bidding war had developed between two different partners in Adam Marcus's new star colt, with the stakes being raised by a table of Bernard Kantor, and another with EIB's Chris Santos, who was bidding on behalf of Jimmy Sarkis. Santos won the tussle an said: "I only got a late call about him, as Jimmy Sarkis owns some of Vardy and, I believe, some of the mare. He was a strong colt, and after Vardy did what he did, I knew that he would be popular."

232 lots were catalogued, after withdrawals 216 were offered and 173 were sold. In 2019 226 were catalogued, 216 offered 192 sold.

The aggregate was R56,490,000 (2019 - R83 560 000), the average R326,531 (2019 - R435 208) and the median R250,000 (2019 - R300 000). See the full price list here

Cheyne Hits His 100

Eight-times East Cape Champion jockey Greg Cheyne looks the man most likely to give runaway log-leader Warren Kennedy something to think about this season.

The 43 year old Capetonian maintained the arms-length pressure on the Winning Form-sponsored Kennedy when he booted home his 100th winner of the season at Fairview yesterday. Kennedy is on 141

winners with his next engagements at Hollywoodbets Scottsville on Sunday.

Cheyne is in a solid second position, with the suspended Muzi Yeni and Cape star Richard Fourie tied on 64 winners in third.

Cheyne has ridden over 60% of his winners this term at his happy hunting ground of Fairview and he rode a typically professional race to get the second favourite Seattle Mermaid home for Alan Greef in the sixth.

It was a gutsy win in mixed company in wet conditions for the daughter of Sail From Seattle who races in the Sheckter, Parker and Puggia partnership.

Cheyne's 100 came up at a win strike-rate of just under 22%. Close on 36% of his rides run places.


The Ridgemont-Highlands sponsored jockey told the Sporting Post that he was pleased to have achieved the milestone but would not be proactively chasing the national title just yet.

"I have a nice balance in my programme and will assess my situation in the final quarter of the season to see whether it is worthwhile travelling more extensively," he added.

Cheyne, who won the inaugural Sun Met on Whisky Baron for the Kieswetter brothers, rides longshot More Magic in the big race next Saturday.

Hawwaam - Change In Plans

Plans to take star colt Hawwaam to Australia right after the 2020 Gr1 Sun Met have had to be altered, following a recent change of rules in Australia.

Hawwaam will now be exported to the UK, via Mauritius.

"The Australians now require runners travelling from South Africa to spend six months in the UK en route to Australia. Residency in UK was 60 days, this changed three months ago to 180 days and I have no idea why. Hawwaam will go into quarantine two weeks after the Met, then on to Mauritius where he will spend three months and then on to the UK for a further six months," said Mike de Kock.

"The change of Australian protocol has hurt our contingency plans and business plan for setting up an operation in Australia. In effect it will take Hawwaam more than nine months to get to Australia. He will be in training in the UK for his period of residency there and will be entered to race. After the six-month period it will be up to Sheikh Hamdan to decide whether he still wants Hawwaam to go to Australia." Mike is not sure whether he would continue training the four-year-old in England.

Met - All Set!

The nationally representative assault on Kenilworth on Met day includes northern regulars Sean Tarry and Mike de Kock, with Lucky Houdalakis, Corne Spies, Joey Soma, Paul Peter and Ashley Fortune also bidding for the big money. Geoff Woodruff has a single entry – which will race out of his Milnerton satellite yard.

Gavin Smith, Alan Greeff and Yvette Bremner are set to travel from the Eastern Cape, while Dennis Drier and Frank Robinson are the two KZN hopefuls in the mix.

Saftote betting on the big day opens on Monday 27 January with an anticipated Pick 6 pool of R18 million in the offing.

IOL reports that the likes of media mogul and businesswoman Bonang Matheba as well as Miss Universe Zozibini Tunzi will be at the forefront of the fashion for the big day.

Under the theme African Luxury: Visionaries, Matheba is not only the face of the event but will also bring House of BNG MCC as the official celebration partner.

"We want to pay homage to the visionaries in 2020 by affording a platform at the Sun Met where creatives of all kinds can showcase their ideas through fashion, music, and horse racing — where imagination comes to life in all aspects," said Anthony Leeming, Sun International Chief Executive Officer.

Milnerton trainer Eric Sands bids to win the Sun Met for the second consecutive year with Rainbow Bridge, who races under new ownership next Saturday.

The veteran conditioner could hardly have anticipated the public reaction – positive and negative – to his discretionary engagement of Ballydoyle jockey and multiple British Champion Ryan Moore.

The Sporting Post broke the news on Saturday at lunch-time that Moore had been requested to ride Rainbow Bridge- with the

obvious conclusion that Gavin Lerena had been given the boot.

Lyle's A Happy Jock!

Lyle Hewitson earned a long-awaited and deserved first Happy Valley win on Wednesday evening to help trainer David Ferraris continue his solid form this term, particularly with his stable's old-stagers.

The two-time South African champion jockey has had a stark introduction to Hong Kong racing, with his stats rolling into the nine-race card reading one win from 174 rides – a win strike rate of 0.57%.

But Hewitson has not buckled in the face of limited opportunities. After enduring a barren four months before sealing his breakthrough Hong Kong win at Sha Tin, the extra 24 days for his Valley follow-up must have seemed a breeze.

"It's probably a lot more exciting here at the Valley with the atmosphere," Hewitson said after driving the Ferraris-trained Kiram (116lb) to a neck verdict in the Class 3 Hung To Handicap (1650m).

"Without blowing my own trumpet, I feel I've been riding really well and getting positive results from limited opportunities.

Obviously, when I get that little bit of a squeak I have to make the most of it."

Ferraris, 56, was pleased for his 22-year-old countryman whose talent, he believes, deserves more success.

"It's lovely," the trainer said. "Lyle should have ridden a lot more winners, but as a client of mine said, this is a cruel place; and there's no reason why certain jockeys should be riding winners and he isn't, because he is, in my opinion, better than a lot of them riding here. But that's the way it goes." **Read more here**

Favourite Jumps From 12 Gate

Hawwaam's big-race rider Anton Marcus told the Sporting Post that the 12 gate 'gives me options'.

Sun Met Chairman Hassen Adams, a past winning Met owner, confirmed his support for racing and said that sponsors were 'like dinosaurs' but that Sun International was looking forward to a long association with the Cape flagship feature.

Racing Association CEO Larry Wainstein was also present and called the Met 'the race of South

Africa'. He said racing was going through times but was resilient and reminded all those assembled that 'no one person was bigger than the game'.

Given the size of the field and the fair nature of the Kenilworth track, none of the draws allotted are likely to cause undue sleepless nights for the connections looking to win one of South Africa's most prestigious races.

Last year's winner Rainbow Bridge pulled a 5 gate and will be ridden by international rider, Ryan Moore, who will be having his first Met ride and only his third race at the scenic track.

Justin Snaith second-stringer Bunker Hunt drew 2, but the Cape champion trainer indicated he would have preferred a wider slot.

Vardy? Try Waady!

One of the more admirable performers this season has been HH Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Waady, a hard-knocking sprinter who hails from the yard of leading trainer Doug Watson.



The front-runner returns to turf this evening after three excellent runs on dirt and warrants a good look by analysts—especially given his past successes, including a win in the 2015 Gr3 Sprint Stakes at Sandown. The task at hand for the 7-year-old son of Approve is the 1000m \$175,000 Listed Dubai Dash down the straight turf chute in front of the Meydan Grandstand.

"We're going to give it a go with him," Watson said. "He's improved so much mentally and that's really helped him improve on dirt. He's rated about 100 on dirt and we think we should give him a chance to get his rating back up on turf. He used to be rated about 109 or so on the grass back in Europe. The way he's moved forward mentally, it would be nice to see if he's changed all-around—plus his forte used to be five furlongs on the turf. He's a Group winner, he's doing great and he just really likes to run."

Waady began the season on 7 November with a good-looking defeat of Pop the Hood, who would go on to win sharply last Saturday over the same 1200m. Sent off at 14/1 on the international market that day, he did not get much more respect next out in the Garhoud Sprint (Listed), but still ran a fine second to Ibn Malik, one start before finishing fourth in the Gr3 Dubawi on 2 January astern Gladiator King, Ibn Malik and Drafted.

Mauritius Stocks Up

About two months before the launch of the new season, 121 new horses have been acquired by Mauritian owners.

Of these, 92 are already there, while the other 29 are awaiting quarantine in South Africa before being shipped to Mauritius.

Those belonging to the last 4 cargo batches of 2019 (September, October, November and December) have logically not yet started at the Champ de Mars.

The horses previously arrived, in May, July and August, have practically all already run here, except for Aegean Aire (May), Bound By Duty, Giant Cruise, New Abbey, Perpetual Flame, Time Is Gold, Var Express (July) and 15 of the 18 arrivals in August.

All told, Gujadhur has the largest number of new horses on site (15) ahead of Hurchund (11) and Sewdyal (11).

Olmeca Black is the only new member of Perdrau currently in Mauritius, while J M Henry, Jones and Raj Ramdin Stables have 3 each.

Wagga's Eyes Are Wide Open!

Warren Kennedy

South African national log-leading jockey Warren Brian Kennedy reflects back on 2019 as a life-changer of a year. He got married, had a daughter, rode his first Gr1 winner and has not been headed in the chase for his maiden national championship title.

2020 hasn't started half badly either. Warren, aka 'Wagga', recently became a Winning Form-sponsored rider and is looking forward to being an ambassador for the popular brand, and for racing.

A journeyman who became a championship contender. That's the likely title of the Warren Kennedy renaissance saga.

And at age 39, the Hillcrest resident says he has never felt better. If Uruguay number eight Diego

Ormaechea could score a try – even if it was against Spain- at the 1999 Rugby World Cup having already turned 40, Warren says there is nothing stopping him picking up his first national title at an age when most of us are suffering the wear and tear, facing a midlife crisis and generally questioning the meaning of

fit and strong. Confidence is the ultimate race-riding elixir. It's a whole different ballgame when one is contented in life and riding winners. I have always enjoyed good support from loyal trainers, but am now making more of the right decisions and things are falling

to have been given the Winning Form opportunity – I was keen to link with a sponsor who is well established and involved in the racing game," he adds as he chats to the Sporting Post ahead of another busy week.

Warren has been engaged to ride Eyes Wide Open in the Sun Met and Temple Grafin – both for Glen Kotzen- in the Majorca Stakes next Saturday. He finished a decent fourth on Eyes Wide Open in the 2019 July, where he had to ease off the heels of the winner

Do It Again at the 250m marker.

Kotzen said at the time that owner Hugo Hattingh had made the sporting decision not to object. But the Paarl conditioner also felt that one paragraph of 30 odd words in the official report had hardly done the incident justice.

"In terms of the American rules, it would have been worth our while to object as Do It Again could have been considered for disqualification. But the South African rules dictate that we would have to show that, but for the interference, Eyes Wide Open would have finished ahead of Do It Again. I am not suggesting my horse could have beaten Do It

Again. But I'd estimate the incident cost him a length," he told us at the time.

> Warren says that it's an honour just to have a ride in one of the country's great races.

"He is a course and distance Gr1 winner and the Kenilworth summer course straight suits him beautifully," adds Warren, who says that he will be doing his best in a strong field.

We asked him whether his recent rise to prominence has made any difference in his life.

"Not materially or emotion-

ally – I'm still the same person. But I get the feeling that more people recognise me at the airport and in public places. I also know now how a guy like Anton Marcus feels as the public on course now ask about practically every ride I'm on. But that's the price and pressure of the position I'm in, and I try to project a positive image of the sport in every environment I find myself in," he adds maturely.

Warren has ridden 141 winners so far this term at a strike rate of 18%. His statistics make for interesting reading – 375 places at a strike-rate of 50%! He is almost 40 winners ahead of East Cape champion Greg Cheyne, and over 70 ahead of Cape star Richard Fourie.

He looks virtually unstoppable.

He tells us that his goal is to try and surpass the 300 winner mark. Anthony Delpech holds the SA season record at 334 winners. Is that in danger?

"I'd really be very happy to achieve my personal target of 300 winners, to be quite frank. My intention is to assess my position in April and then make a decision as to whether I should travel more and also further afield. I have enjoyed success in the Eastern Cape and may even look at the Western and Northern Cape. This opportunity doesn't present itself often given the enormous depths of talent in our jockey ranks. So I need to do my very best when I have the winning post in sight," he adds modestly.

Warren already spends a lot of time in the air and confirms that he flies with whatever carrier is available.

"Mango, Kulula and SAA are much of a muchness to me. I am enjoying the hard work and commitment, even if the travelling is pretty taxing and keeps me away from Barbara and Jamie more than I'd really like to be. But I do ensure that I spend all of my free time with them."

As to the demands of being a father, he says he is 'absolutely loving it'.

"Jamie is not even eight months old yet and she is sitting up and crawling. And Barbara has been a star Mom with the help of my Mother-In-Law. So I have had things quite easy so far. Wait till she starts walking and really gets mobile!" he laughs nervously, but clearly proudly.

A natural lightweight at 51kgs, Warren, a son of a jockey, signed up at the SA Jockey Academy in 1995 and came out of his time in 2000.

He has walked a long road since he weighed just 28kgs and was threatened with the boot if he didn't bulk up. His move to the then newly opened Port Elizabeth academy changed his life. His first winner was for the late Oom Nic Claassen in the Lady's Pendant at Fairview on 15 May 1998 on Coded Missile.

His fortunes began changing for the better when joining the Gavin van Zyl operation at Summerveld a few years ago. He was the sixth surviving Van Zyl stable jockey, but became the longest standing. That was a sign of his ability to absorb and learn.

A top former jockey, Gavin van Zyl is on record, summing Warren up:

"When he joined us he was prepared to work with me in becoming what I was looking for in a jockey. We were going to start from a point and make it a work in progress and iron out certain aspects. One of Warren's strongest points is that he doesn't get offended- even with criticism or on the occasions I have had to jock him off. He has never sulked and has been prepared to stick it out for the long haul. We have thus been able to build together. He has always had the talent. He was silverware, but just needed polishing. It has been rewarding to see him grow in confidence as a rider."

It was towards the end of the last season that Warren decided he could lift his game and have some fun chasing a national title.

The season ended on a high. He rode six of eight winners at the Vaal on 4 July . Then scored his first Gr1 win, riding the Gavin van Zyl-trained Gabor to victory in the Thekwini Stakes at Greyville on eLan Gold Cup day.

Warren enjoys the continued support of Gareth and Gavin van Zyl and others in KZN, and importantly of the powerful yard of Paul Peter and others in Gauteng.

"Nobody can do this without the backing of top owners and trainers. I am in a fortunate position and am thankful to the loyal support of so many people who make my success possible. It starts at home with my family, to the hardworking stable staff and the trainers, to the owners who invest and pay the bills, and to the punting public who love the game. I hope I can do my bit, with Winning Form, to build racing up again," he adds.

The Stats Don't Lie!

Just look at this improvement! Warren finished in 28th place in the 2014/2015 season with 39 winners at a strike rate of 6,2%.

In the 2015/2016 season he rode 67 winners at a strike rate of 8,8% for 17th place.

In the 2016/2017 season he rode 84 winners at a strike rate of 11,9% for 17th place.

In the 2017/2018 season he rode 79 winners at a strike rate of 10,6% for 14th pace.

Last season he broke through the 100 winner mark for the first time, riding 139 winners at a strike rate of 12,2% and finished 7th on the log.




Short Heads

Ideal World has two yearlings at the 2020 Cape Yearling Sale – a filly (#77) whose dam is closely related to Horse Of The Year Celtic Grove and the stakes placed dam of July winner Marinaresco, and a colt (# 180) from the family of Epsom Derby runner up Glacial Storm.

Jackpot Quickmix – TAB Apology

The payout of R759- 40 for Jackpot Quickmix Two on Sunday 19 January 2020 was correct, but the incorrect net pool was displayed.

TAB apologises for the confusion and consternation this caused to TAB and TABGold customers.

The error arose from a R11,178 carryover from Jackpot Quickmix One on Sunday 19 January 2020, which was removed and added to TAB's Jackpot carryover reserve in terms of TAB's carryover policy.

The system, however, added this carryover to the Jackpot Quickmix Two net pool for display purposes.

It was mistakenly not deleted with the result that the final net pool displayed was R32,545 and not R21,367-20 as should have been the case.

The system did not take the carryover into account in calculating the dividend and the official payout of R759-40 to 28.136 winning tickets was correct as displayed.

A.P.'s Super Saturday

Descendants of pensioned champion sire A.P. Indy were to the fore in North American stakes races last Saturday. A.P. Indy male line descendants won nine stakes races and collected all three graded races run in the USA on the day.

His grandson Tapit was the principal party responsible for Saturday's success, being sire of Saturday's graded stakes winners Enforceable (Gr3 Lecomte Stakes) and Silver Dust (Gr3 Louisiana Stakes). The Gainesway Farm resident was also responsible for Saturday's Wayward Lass Stakes winner Jehozacat. The latter out of a multiple Gr1 winning half-sister to outstanding sire Kitten's Joy, Jehozacat must rate as a hugely valuable broodmare prospect!

Triple US champion sire Tapit is also broodmare sire of Saturday's Silverbulletday Stakes winner Finite (Munnings), while his Gr3 winning son

Bandbox is the sire of the same day's Geisha Stakes winner Artful Splatter.

In winning the Silverbulletday Stakes, Finite beat Tapit's daughter Ursula into second place, thus denying Tapit a notable feature race four-timer.

Jubilee

Other A.P. Indy horses to win stakes races on Saturday were Gr1 E. P Taylor Stakes winner, and dual Canadian champion Starship Jubilee, who won the Sunshine Millions Filly And Mare Turf Stakes, as well as Gr1 Hopeful Stakes winner Mind Control, who landed the Gr3 Toboggan Stakes.

Starship Jubilee was sired by A.P. Indy's multiple stakes winning son Indy Wind, while Mind Control was sired by A.P. Indy's Travers Stakes winning grandson Stay Thirsty (by Bernardini). Stay Thirsty also enjoyed a feature race double on Saturday with his gelded son Alwaysmining landing the Jennings Stakes on the same day. Bernardini sire sons enjoyed a good day on Saturday, with the sire's multiple Gr1 winning son To Honor And Serve responsible for Fire Plug Stakes winner Honor The Fleet.

Like his sire, Bernardini has become an excellent broodmare sire, and is already damsire of the Gr1 winners Mo Town (Uncle Mo), Catholic Boy (More Than Ready), Serengeti Empress (Alternation), Wicked Whisper (Liam's Map), Maxfield (Street Sense), Angel Of Truth (Animal Kingdom) and Dunbar Road (Quality Road).

Fast

Yet another from the A.P. Indy male line to impress on Saturday was Fashionably Fast (by Lucky Pulpit) who made it five wins in a row when he claimed the California Cup Sprint Stakes at Santa Anita Park.

A.P. Indy, champion sire in North America in both 2003 and 2006, remains the primary source for the once powerful Bold Ruler male line.



Seattle Slew's outstanding son left behind 156 stakes winners, and has become a highly successful sire of sires and an outstanding broodmare sire. A.P. Indy is also damsire of the unbeaten Khozan -whose son Liam's Lucky Charm won the Pasco Stakes on Saturday. Inbreeding to A.P. Indy is also becoming a noted factor in pedigrees, and this pattern has already produced graded stakes winners like American Anthem (Bodemeister), Coal Front (Stay Thirsty), and Once On Whiskey (Bodemeister).

The 'A.P' influence is seen to good effect on the North American Sires Lists — Tapit finishing third on last year's US general sires list, while Tapit sons Constitution

and Tapiture finished second and fifth respectively on the Leading First-Crop Sires List.

There were no fewer than 7 A.P. Indy male line descendants on the top 20 of the 2019 Leading US First-Crop Sires List. The A.P. Indy sired Florida Derby winner Take Charge Indy, who was recently repatriated to North America, ended 2019 as the Leading Third-Crop Sire (by stakes) with his progeny banking more than \$6.1 million last year.

Already sire of top US stallions Bernardini, Flatter, Malibu Moon and the ill-fated Pulpit, A.P. Indy has another potentially successful sire son to his name in the form of champion Honor Code (a half-brother to Cape stallion Noble Tune), while the sire's Belmont Stakes runner up Commissioner, whose first crop are now three, is responsible for recent Gr3 Kitten's Joy Stakes winner Island Commish.

On Tap

Tapit in particular looks set to ensure the ongoing success of the A.P. Indy male line, with the multiple champion sire already responsible for Gr1 producing sires Concord Point, Flashback and Tapizar, while his Belmont Stakes winning son Tonalist, who is from the same female line as A.P. Indy, is also showing signs of promise as a sire. Frosted, one of Tapit's best sons, will be represented by his first runners this year.

The sire of 25 Gr1 winners, Tapit enjoyed another tremendous year in 2019, with the son of Pulpit responsible for 26 black type winners including 13 individual graded stakes winners. He ended 2019 with more stakes winners for the year than champion sire Into Mischief, as well as the likes of such star sires as Curlin, Giant's Causeway, Quality Road, Kitten's Joy and Candy Ride, and Tapit appears to be headed for another tremendous year in 2020. Tapit's tally of stakes winners now stands at more than 130.

This male line's success, however, has by and large, been limited to North America, with A.P Indy's sire sons having enjoyed mixed success elsewhere.

Africa At Inglis

Avontuur's super sire Var is set to make his presence felt at the 2020 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

His champion daughter Via Africa is represented at the 7 and 8 April sale by a colt sired by Arrowfield Stud's multiple champion sire Snitzel.

Consigned by Newhaven Park, as Agent, the Snitzel colt (# 271) is the second foal produced by Var's outstanding daughter Via Africa – South Africa's Champion Sprinter of 2013-2014.

The brilliant Via Africa, one of ten Gr1 winners sired by Var, won ten of only 18 outings, with her notable triumphs including scores in all of the Gr1 Cape Flying Championship, Gr1 South African Fillies Sprint (twice), and the Gr2 Southern Cross Stakes.

Her sire Var is enjoying another tremendous season in 2019-2020 and is currently third on the South African General Sires List, with his progeny having already banked over R5.5 million this season.

The sire of brilliant recent Gr1 L'Ormarins Queen's Plate winner Vardy, Var has three lots on the 2020 Cape Yearling Sale. These include a colt out of a dual winning daughter of high-class sprinter Shoot The Booze, a filly from the family of Mother Russia, Nother Russia and Winter Solstice and a colt out of Captain Al's Fillies Guineas runner up Reason To Believe.

Again, Again - & Again!

Klawervlei's European champion, and four time Gr1 winner Twice Over enjoyed another good weekend, when the son of Observatory sired a trio of winners at three different racecourses.

Twice Over's first winner this past weekend came when his son Forged In Flame ran on strongly to shed his maiden over 1400m at Kenilworth on Saturday afternoon. Bred by the Waterford Stud, the three-year-old Glen Puller trained gelding flew up close home to score by a short head in courageous fashion.

Fourth in his two previous starts, Forged In Flame is out of the Parade Leader mare Smouldering.

A dual winner of the Gr1 Emirates Airline Champion Stakes, Twice Over made a blistering start to his stud career with his very first crop producing all of reigning South African Horse Of The Year Do It Again, Gr1 Tsogo Sun Gold Medallion winner Sand And Sea, Jet Master Stakes winner Run Red and the gallant Doublemint. The latter picked up his fourth graded victory when he was victorious in the recent Gr3 Heineken Chairman's Cup, and Doublemint has now earned in excess of R1 000 000 in prize money.

We Just Love The G G's!

While the Michael Roberts tribute raceday didn't play out entirely to the script, with the weather forcing a late switch from the Pietermaritzburg turf to the Hollywoodbets Greyville polytrack, Brett Crawford's progressive 4yo G G's Dynasty saved the day for favourite backers when he stormed to a popular victory in the R150 000 feature. Overnight rain and the forecast of more downpours initiated the move to abandon the Hollywoodbets Scottsville plans and the eight-race card moved to the Durban city track, with the feature distance adjusted from the original 1750m to 1800m. The move would have not pleased a few, including trainer Dennis Drier and his patrons, who were defending their feature title with the 7yo Wealthy – a good few lengths more effective on the Scottsville turf - but who sportingly took their chances.

Winning rider Anton Marcus made the observation that he was never really worried about G G's Dynasty taking to the poly – but was more concerned about the dice falling in the favour of his major opponent, Born To Perform, who has proven his ability on both surfaces. But after Amor Adiente had made most of the running, with Born To Perform relaxed some way off the pace, as is his preference, Marcus needn't have worried as G G's Dynasty stormed to the lead at the 250m and ran on strongly under an easy ride to win by a half length in a time of 106,23 secs - a new course record. Tony Rivalland's once promising 3yo of last term Tristful (13-1) came out of the pack and ran on well to shade the late finishing Born To Perform (53-20), with Blackball (15-2) only finding his feet late for fourth, a length off the winner.

Christmas Handicap winner The Dazzler (14-1) was thereabouts for a long way but faded to a 2,75 length fifth.

Guest of honour Michael Roberts thanked Gold Circle for hosting the tribute - although he added that he was naturally disappointed that the meeting was lost to Hollywoodbets Scottsville – a course close to his heart. The Smyrna Maiden Plate opened the programme and it was at the age of 14 in

1968 that the legend won his first race – at Scottsville on a horse called Smyrna. Anton Marcus said that he couldn't thank assistant trainer Peter Muscutt enough. He recalled looking up to Michael Roberts as a champion in his younger days. "It's a real privilege for me to win this race," he added. Peter Muscutt, who runs the Crawford operation at Summerveld, called the winner an honest and genuine 'push-button' horse, and thanked owners Greg Bortz and Braam van Huyssteen. He endorsed Marcus' thoughts on the honour of standing on the winner's podium and said he had
