The Show Goes On

With their stars National Park and Legal Eagle both back in full work, Yvette Bremner's Dippin Blu yard at Fairview enters their 23rd day on an improvised internal structure after a stabbing incident last month led to an upheaval in the top team's personnel ranks.

While there is no guarantee that either will run, the only horse to have defeated Hawwaam on his Gauteng home ground, National Park (127), and the former SA Horse Of The Year, Legal Eagle (123) are in the nominations for the 20 March Fairview meeting.

While the horse-stabbing incident, allegedly by a Groom in the employ of the Dippin Blu team, in early February apparently led to dissent in the ranks of their staff, the Fairview outfit dominated the news for over a week as they coped with absent Grooms, refused to not be allowed to care for their horses and race, and employed private security to counter threats. The Port Elizabeth High Court granted an order in their favour on 19 February.

Their yard has since been reduced through rationalisation from 112 horses inhabiting four barns to 80 (including 24 babies) in three barns.

The alleged perpetrator of the stabbing incident was dismissed by an independent CCMA Commissioner after failing to turn up for a hearing. His next CCMA hearing is on 18 March and all of the other Bremner Grooms are due at the CCMA on 23 March.

Bremner stable spokesman and leading owner Hedley McGrath told the Sporting Post today that the team had improvised through the loyal commitment of their staff, including Carl Hewitson, Rocky Agrella, Juhany van den Berg, as well as through the assistance of a local missionary organisation who had made a team of six people available.

These folk are apparently being assisted with getting their lives back on track after setbacks in their personal lives.

"We have been forced to make a plan logistically with feed too. All our feed is pre-packed off-site too and is tailored for each individual horse and delivered. The same applies to our oat-hay, teff and lucerne. It's been tough, but we have resolved not to be forced to stop doing something we love and have a passion for," he added, confirming that they believed that they had been compliant in all processes and together with their legal team, hoped to see a resolution in the not too distant future.

The yard has ticked over well in the past month, with the smart Via Seattle raising the rafters, going down narrowly in the Listed Lady's Pendant last Friday.

An outside observer who visited the yard this week told the Sporting Post that the Bremner stables were an example. "They are immaculate and clean – spic 'n span- and the equine inhabitants are all happy. It's remarkable how they have managed to do what they have done," he said,

Regrettably all horses are still being accompanied in training, in the paddocks, on the walkers and to the races by the private security guards.

Hedley would not be drawn on what must be the exorbitant costs of the security employed.

"The safety of our people and our horses are a non-negotiable aspect. It is just so sad that we have had to resort to this way of life. At the same time it goes to show what can be done with commitment and loyalty, and a measure of innovation."

Racing at Fairview starts at 12h05 on Friday.

View To A Thrill!

The Fairview Friday ten-race programme opens what should be a cracking weekend of racing.

It is interesting to note that Ascot Stud's progressive sire Global View, who produced his fourth first crop winner from just six runners, when his 2yo daughter Storyland romped to a facile debut win at Fairview last Friday, has another debutante in the third race.

The Gary Player Stud-bred Frosty Rain, a R150 000 National Yearling Sale purchases, is out of the winner producing Al Mufti Mare, Torrential Rain. Alan Greeff and Greg Cheyne are a hot combination and it would not surprise to see Global View maintain his streak.

Currently South Africa's Leading First Crop Sire by earnings and individual winners, Global View is also the sire of first crop winners Delicasea (unbeaten in two starts), Global Drummer and Fireview. Both Storyland and Delicasea are entered for the Listed East Cape Fillies Nursery.

A son of the world's premier sire Galileo, Global View won the Gr3 Generous Stakes at two and Gr2 American Turf Stakes as a three-year-old, and he is bred on the same Galileo/Storm Cat cross as Coolmore sires, and multiple Gr1 winners, Churchill and Gleneagles.

A Classic Showdown

Gr1 SA Classic Turffontein

The 1800m test could be the key for the proven class horses as they line up for the R1 million Gr1 SA Classic on Saturday. Ikigai won the Guineas so well, he looks sure to find the 1800m, but unlikely to try the SA Derby. Then there are the likes of Green Laser and Youcathurrylove lower down the ratings who have the legs. It has the makings of a fascinating race and looks tougher to unravel than the fairer sex equivalent.

A son of Vercingetorix, Ikigai has won the Tony Ruffel and the Gauteng Guineas in the manner of a really decent 3yo and now steps up to the 1800m with plenty in his favour. If he stays, he should go very close.

Second of the Tarry trio, Shango, won the Dingaans in good style on Summer Cup Day and then showed resolution when beating the older Approach Control in a January prep start. He missed the Gauteng Guineas on a vet's certificate and comes in here with a wide draw to beat. Being a son of Captain Of All, there must be some stamina doubts and only time will clarify that aspect.

Mike De Kock's New Zealand-bred Frosted Gold has earned himself something of a bridesmaid tag behind the Tarry horses over the last ten months. If he stays the 1800m he must be a threat as he has maintained a consistent form-line throughout his 3yo campaign and could be ready to turn the tables.

Astrix showed up prominently in the Gauteng Guineas after a break when finishing under four lengths behind Ikigai. He has a very wide draw to overcome and will need to improve a little bit.

Corne Spies' Imperial Ruby has done little wrong since a surprise maiden win on Summer Cup Day. The son of Silvano has won three of his last four starts and beat Christopher Robin going away last time.

While he has a wide draw to overcome and is probably better suited to the SA Derby test, he could be dangerous in the hands of Piere Strydom.

The 2yo Gr1 winner Got The Greenlight returned to action with a weak fourth in the Tony Ruffel stakes and then, wisely or not, travelled to Cape Town in pursuit of the rich CTS 1600 prize. While he only finished only 3,3 lengths off Count

Jack and earned a cheque, he returns home off a less than ideal prep but may have the class to assert himself.

Battle Of Alesia has been a model of consistency after his maiden and was staying on without

threatening when fourth behind Shango in the Dingaans. He could be looking for this ground and may be better than rated.

Rock The Globe is the third of the Tarry trio and has his second run since an undistinguished showing in the Cape Guineas. He did win his last start but looks to have back-end of quartet prospects in this field.

Youcanthurrylove definitely stays the 1800m and won four of his first seven starts before pulling up distressed after the Gauteng Guineas. If he is over that setback, he is certainly one for the bigger perms.

Paul Matchett's Rooi Tom tries the 1800m for the first time after winning a good race in MR88 company at the Vaal last time. His connections have not exposed him to a lot of feature racing against his own age group but he looks capable of running a place.

Secretariat Stakes winner Leopold finished four lengths off Ikigai in the Gauteng Guineas, but has the scope for improvement and he looks sure to enjoy the step up in trip. He jumps from the pole position draw.

Marshall is the second of the De Kock duo and has his third run since a break after pulling up unsound in the Dingaans. He has done little wrong and has a chance if overcoming his wide draw.

Third of the Paul Peter trio, Western Fort, is the mount of stable jockey Warren Kennedy and could be the stable elect on his lightly raced form profile. But his wide draw will not be in his favour.

Sea Cottage Stakes winner Green Lazer, was not disgraced when staying on for third behind Ikigai last time. The son of Gimmethegreenlight is well drawn and it will be in his favour that he has won over the 1800m.

Master Supreme hails from the in-form Candice Dawson yard and this good-looking son of Master Of My Fate posted an eye-catching maiden follow-up when winning over 2000m at Turffontein in a lowly rated handicap. Having just his fourth start, he is largely unexposed and could be just about anything.

Whiskytangofoxtrots has run two fair races after shedding his maiden certificate at the Vaal in early January. He does have a wide draw to overcome and his form may not be strong enough to assert himself in this company.

It's a race where one needs to go with a few. Ikigai and Frosted Gold look best, with the Got The Greenlight and Shango inclusions. The list doesn't end there.

It's Tough!

Competing against the best of your age and winning from a mile to 2450m in the space of eight weeks takes some kind of special horse!

The great Horse Chestnut won the inaugural SA Triple Crown in 1999, Sorrento stallion Louis The King did it in 2014, and Abashiri was the star of the show in 2016.

The R6-million SA Triple Crown for 3-year-olds is the richest series of races in Africa.

The alternate first leg, the R1-million Cape Guineas run at Kenilworth on Saturday 21 December 2019, was won by Brett Crawford's Kilindini. He is not entered on Saturday as he has left for Hong Kong where he will join the stable of Tony Millard.

The Gauteng legs commenced with the rain delayed R1-million Gr2 Gauteng Guineas won by Ikigai under the lights at Turffontein on Wednesday 12 February.

The third and final leg will be the R2-million Gr1 SA Derby to be run over 2450m at Turffontein on Saturday 4 April.

A bonus of R2 million will be paid to the owner/s of the horse that wins all three legs of the Triple Crown.

Derby Countdown

A total of 139 horses (up from 96 at the same stage in 2019) remain engaged for the 2020 Investec Derby at Epsom Downs on Saturday, June 6, following the first scratchings deadline, details of which were revealed today.

The 241st running of the premier Classic takes place on the second day of the Investec Derby Festival and carries a total prize fund of at least £1.5 million, making it the most valuable race run in Britain.

Those remaining in the race were all entered as yearlings in December 2018. There is a £9,000 second entry stage on Tuesday, 7 April and an £85,000 supplementary entry stage on Monday, 1 June.

Aidan O'Brien registered a record-equalling seventh Investec Derby victory in 2019, courtesy of Anthony Van Dyck, and Ireland's multiple champion trainer has 47 entries going forward as he chases an unprecedented eighth success in the 12-furlong showpiece.

O'Brien's formidable team includes Innisfree, Year Of The Tiger and Mogul, who filled the places in that order behind Kameko (Andrew Balding) in the rearranged G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy at Newcastle in November. The G1 National Stakes runner-up Armory and G2 Royal Lodge Stakes victor Royal Dornoch are also engaged for the Ballydoyle trainer.

The total number of entries trained by the O'Brien family stands at 55, with four entries each for Aidan O'Brien's sons Joseph, who rode Camelot (2012) and Australia (2014) to Investec Derby success, and Donnacha, who landed the 2018 Investec Oaks on Forever Together and commenced his training career at the end of 2019.

Seconds Look Unlikely!

Wilgerbosdrift Gr1 SA Fillies Classic Turffontein

Trainer Paul Peter was the big buyer at Friday's Cape Yearling Sale and he now faces another major assignment this weekend. He saddles the unbeaten Summer Pudding in the R1 million Wilgerbosdrift SA Fillies Classic and, while she probably looks the best bet in years to wear the SA Triple Tiara, some stiff competition will keep her honest.

The beautifully bred and well-related Summer Pudding has won her first four starts with authority and overcame what her trainer labelled was the 'most difficult' leg of the SA Triple Tiara for her last time. Now stepping up to what should be a more favourable trip, she stands out as the one to beat – but had the Oratorio filly Rio's Winter stalking her in the Guineas.

Beaten just a quarter length there, Rio's Winter has the more favourable draw and Piere Strydom will be keen to set the record straight.

Corne Spies' Listed Devon Air Stakes winner What You Are looks to be in the deep end as she tries ground – she is a daughter of champion sprinter Captain Of All – after plenty of travelling in her 3yo career. She caught the eye when staying on behind Benji over 1100m at the Vaal in her first run back home.

The 2019 Emperors Palace Ready To Run Cup runner-up Gaian Glory gets the services of Cape heavyweight Bernard Fad'herbe and was outgunned when 8 lengths behind Ikigai in the Tony Ruffel Stakes last time. Back against her own sex, she surely has place cheque prospects if she stays.

Starling Stakes winner Mill Queen returned from a break to run under a length fourth behind Summer Pudding in the Gauteng Fillies Guineas. That was a cracking effort and if the daughter of Querari can get some luck from her draw, she must go into the quartet mix.

A smart third in the Fillies Mile when beaten just over a half length by Summer Pudding, Marygold may have found things a bit hot in the Fillies Guineas when running just out of the money. With a nice draw in her favour, she could be one for the bigger perms if ridden with restraint.

Keep Smiling is bound to prefer the extra here after failing to make any impact in the Guineas last time. Her form over more ground, and her eye-catching second to Summer Pudding in the Fillies Mile, suggest she could be the surprise package – but she has a wide draw to beat.

Dancing Feather travels from Summerveld and is the only raider in the race. The daughter of Duke Of Marmalade has shown some above average ability and could be the quartet kicker. Her regular pilot Warren Kennedy rides the favourite, so he may have her tactical measure.

Kayla's Champ is solidly held by Summer Pudding on her last two starts and may have an outside place chance at best.

Snow Palace looks well held on her recent form and cannot be fancied.

Virtuosa ran a forward race in the first leg of the SA Triple Tiara when only fading out late to be beaten just under 4 lengths by

Summer Pudding. She was in the mix till very late and she may prove more effective being ridden with some restraint.

Poorly drawn, Magic School was beaten over 5 lengths in the Gauteng Fillies Guineas after failing to show from a slow start. She now goes a further 200m and there must be some doubt that she will cope with it.

Second of the Laird duo, Flying High was comprehensively beaten in the Gauteng Fillies Guineas last time and looks well held by the top trio here.

A one-time winner and the third of the Alexander trio, Just Kidding looks to be outgunned on what she has shown so far. That said, she could up her game over the extra.

Crying out for more ground and

with a classic look about her, Summer Pudding should set up a Triple Tiara date with a big run here.

She looks tough to beat

Cherry Picking

The fillies are catered for with the R3.75-million / R4-million Wilgerbosdrift SA Triple Tiara, the richest series of races for fillies in Africa.

The Mike de Kock trained Galileo flyer Igugu was the first filly to win the Triple Tiara. That was in 2011 and Ormond Ferraris-trained Cherry On The Top emulated that feat in 2013.

The alternate first leg was the R1-million WSB Gr1 Cape Fillies Guineas run at Kenilworth on Saturday 14 December 2019 and won by Adam Marcus' Mississippi Burning.

The very well-related Summer Pudding won the rain-delayed first Gauteng leg, the R500 000 Wilgerbosdrift Gr2 Gauteng Fillies Guineas on 12 February under the lights at Turffontein.

Saturday's favourite Summer Pudding is by champion sire Silvano (Lomitas) out of seven-time winning stakes winner Cherry On The Cake (Strike Smartly) – the latter a half sister to 2013 SA Triple Tiara winner Cherry On The Top (Tiger Ridge)..

The third leg is the R750 000 Wilgerbosdrift Gr2 SA Oaks to be run over 2450m on the Turffontein Standside on Saturday 4 April.

A bonus of R1 million will be paid to the owners of the filly that wins all three legs of the Triple Tiara.

Rain Rules On A Summer Day

KZN-based Pound Bloodstock acquired the top two selling lots – both sons of deceased champion Soft Falling Rain – at the 2020 BSA Cape Yearling Sale held in glorious summer weather at the Mistico Equestrian Centre near Paarl on Friday.

It was KZN-based Garth Puller who bought the top lot in 2019 – a R360 000 daughter of Soft Falling Rain – and while high-riding Paul Peter had writer's cramp, signing for 27 lots, Puller's Summerveld neighbour Sterling Miller grabbed the limelight this time round when paying the same price for Mauritzfontein's # 104, a half-brother to three

winner, including the smart Miranda Frost.

The handsome colt is out of a winning own sister to globetrotting Maiden Cup winner Mr Brock.

Miller's Pound Bloodstock also signed the chit at R300 000 for the second highest price lot – # 41, another son of Soft Falling Rain – consigned by Wilgerbosdrift – out of a daughter of Mike de Kock's Cape Fillies Guineas winner Emerald Beauty.

With 23 of the 179 lots withdrawn and 38 not sold, 118 yearlings found buyers for an aggregate of R7 905 000. This total was down 22% on 2019, when 26 more were sold.

The average of R66 992 stood up nicely and was 3% up on last year.

In contrast, the median of R40 000 was down 20% year on year.

Wilgerbosdrift was the top vendor with 13 of their 17 babies selling for an aggregate R1 470 000, with an average of R113 077.

Paul Peter Racing topped the buyer charts, their 27 lots costing a total of R1 710 000 at an average of R63 333.

Soft Falling Rain headed the sire listing on aggregate, 8 of his 9 progeny selling for R1,4 million at an average of R175 000.

Good Times Good Buys!

Good weather, a diverse catalogue and the prospects of finding a value-for-money buy with the hopes of a shot at the linked sales race on Cape Derby Day in 2021 contributed to a good turnout at the Cape Yearling Sale on Friday.

A striking feature of this year's sale was the healthy attendance, with trainers and buyers from all over South Africa participating in one of the country's best value for money thoroughbred auctions.

The magnificent Mistico Equestrian Centre again played an admirable role in hosting the sale, which has proven a smash hit with buyers and vendors alike. A tough economic market ensured that once again, the sale proved a buyers' market, and it was great to see so many buyers leaving the sale with the horses they wanted.

A number of Cape trainers picked up some bargain buys, while Gauteng conditioner Paul Peter came away having purchased 27 yearlings, his buys including the sales' top filly, the Varsfontein Stud consigned Mychancetodream (# 138), a filly by Ascot Stud's very promising Galileo sire Global View, who was knocked down for R240 000.

The well bred Mychancetodream is out of the twice winning Silvano mare Silvery Dream, a half-sister to the Glen Kotzen trained dual Gr1 winner Eyes Wide Open.

Deceased sire Soft Falling Rain supplied three of the top four colts sold and had previously been responsible for the sales topping yearlings at both the 2018 and 2019 sales!

The exciting prospect of finding a potential winner of the inaugural BSA Cape Yearling Sale Cup, scheduled to be run on the prestigious Cape Derby Day in February 2021, was the talk amongst many buyers.

Graduates of the Cape Yearling Sale will also be in line to earn the R60 000 bonus payable by BSA to maiden winners of Juvenile races in South Africa.

The National Yearling Sale now lies on the horizon.

It will be held at the TBA Complex in Germiston and commences on Wednesday 22 April at 11H30 with lots 1 – 170 offered.

On Thursday 23 April the sale continues at 11h30 with lots 171 – 340. The third and final session is on Friday 24 April when lots 341 – 479 are sold.

Massive Fine For Smith

Top US jockey Mike Smith has been hit with a nine-day whip ban and huge fine for his ride on runner-up Midnight Bisou in the inaugural \$20 million Saudi Cup on Saturday.

Smith, winner of the international jockeys' challenge in Saudi Arabia on Friday, will forfeit 60 per cent of his share of the \$3.5 million prize-money for second place in the world's richest race.

Smith was fined more than \$200,000 for excessive use of the whip aboard Midnight Bisou. The fine is the largest ever handed down to a jockey for a riding infraction.

Under Saudi racing rules covering the February 28 and 29 cards, a jockey is permitted to strike a horse no more than 10 times. The stewards ruled that Smith struck Midnight Bisou 14 times. He was given eight days for the whip violation plus an additional day for using the whip with no regard for the horse's stride.

The fine was based on the money Smith earned for riding the second-place finisher, who earned \$3.5 million. Smith's 10% cut comes out to \$350,000. Under a sliding scale that includes fines of up to 100%, Smith has to forego 60% of his personal earnings or \$210,000

On a night of deep frustration for the Hall of Fame jockey, Smith had earlier picked up a two-day ban for failing to weigh in after the fifth race.

Midnight Bisou was held up in rear in the Saudi Cup before mounting a challenge against the inside rail in the home straight.

The Steven Asmussen-trained five-year-old made up a lot of ground to get within touching distance of Maximum Security, who kept finding for Luis Saez to score by 0.75 lengths.

Smith, whose record in the world's biggest races has earned him the nickname 'Big Money Mike', landed a \$30,000 bonus for winning the jockeys' challenge on the eve of the Saudi Cup card at King Abdulaziz racecourse in Riyadh.

World's Richest Race Drama

Not quite a Cinderella story, nor a fairy-tale – the story of Maximum Security (USA) has been pure drama.

The Kentucky-bred son of New Year's Day, who was disqualified from the most important dirt race in America and went on to earn a 3-year-old championship, took his show on the road and turned tragedy into comedy, bringing smiles to the face of his fans and connections with a determined victory in the world's richest race, the \$20 million Saudi Cup on Saturday.

Breaking alertly from post seven under Luis Saez, the Jason Servis-trained charge was caught in a chess match throughout with Pegasus World Cup winner Mucho Gusto (USA) and Irad Ortiz Jr, stalking the speedy pair of Capezzano (USA) and North America (GB) in tandem before Mucho Gusto forged past those two and Maximum Security quickly followed.

Ortiz then went wide around the lone turn, forcing the eventual winner at least five-wide turning for home and then coming out even more at the top of the stretch.

Saez acted quickly and shifted paths to inside the eventual fourth-place finisher, forging past and then holding off the late charge of runner-up and fellow American champion Midnight Bisou (USA), as well as globetrotting Gr1 winner Benbatl (GB).

The final margin was three-quarters of a length, with two lengths separating the aforementioned top-class mare and Godolphin colour-bearer.

The order of finish was completed by Mucho Gusto, Tacitus (USA), Gold Dream (JPN), Chrysoberyl (JPN), Mjjack (IRE), Magic Wand (IRE), Gronkowski (USA), McKinzie (USA), Great Scot (GB), North America and Capezzano. The final time for 1800m on dirt was 1:50.58.

Owned by Gary and Mary West, Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, the West homebred won for the seventh time in nine starts and increased his career earnings to \$11,801,900. He adds today's win to top-level victories in the Cigar Mile, Haskell Invitational and Florida Derby.

Luis Saez, jockey, Maximum Security, said: "Oh my god, this is amazing, to win the race, to be here, to travel from far away and to have a victory for United States, for Panama, for all my people, this is something I don't have words for. This is the true Kentucky Derby winner. I'm so glad to be on the horse. This is a big deal. I would like to thank god, the owners for letting me ride the horse and I would like to thank my brother. I know you are watching me, I love you."

Jason Servis, trainer, Maximum Security said: "You know, I was a little upset with Irad Ortiz who kept me tearing me out down the backside and who carried me out in the turn and when Max dropped inside he came down on me, but that is a story for another day. Really, that horse has got a lot of heart, he is some horse, he is amazing. It's got to be some vindication. He ran hard, I thought he was creased up in behind. He was really doing good. I am a bit superstitious and didn't want to over-talk him but the last three days, when he breezed the mile and one (1800m), he just ran and came off the track there was just a presence about him and I tried to stay calm, but I was really feeling good the last few days. Seven in the Florida Derby, seven in the Kentucky Derby, seven in the Haskell, he drew the seven in the Pennsylvania Derby and that is when he ended up in the clinic, and then when he drew the seven for this race...I was a little apprehensive about sending Garrett (son and work-rider) up to the stage because I was thinking if he draws 13 or 14 he will feel bad. When he pulled out the seven I texted (part-owner) Mary West and she is like 'you are kidding, right?' It's a good story. I have a great team with Coolmore and the Wests and they have great managers. We will have a conference call tomorrow morning and take it from there."

MV Magnier, representing part-owners Coolmore, Maximum Security said: "All I can is that we are very lucky people that Gary and Mary West let us into the horse and all I can say, it is an absolute credit to the two gentlemen on my left, the job they have done with this horse, it's quite incredible. There were a couple of flutters all right, but Jason was very confident beforehand. The best man was riding. He gave him a fantastic ride."

Lyle's Got To Be Bigger In Japan!

Reigning SA Champion Jockey Lyle Hewitson will open his Japan campaign on Sunday.

The South China Morning Post reports that Hewitson has flown out to Japan to join the powerful Northern Farm operation, who will have first call on his services on a two-month contract.

He was going through all the paperwork like undergoing a medicals, setting up bank accounts and other issues earlier this week before two days of trackwork at the Miho training centre.

Hewitson then goes into lockdown on Friday night before the weekend's cards, where he has secured a Gr2 mount on Sunday.

"I can't wait to sit on some good stock and get some confidence back in my riding," he said. "I think it's going to be a good move to experience something new and succeed a bit more."

Hewitson hopes to return to Hong Kong for another stint down the road and is particularly thankful to those who kept backing him in.

A two-time champion here, the 22-year old was never able to build any real momentum after a two-week suspension derailed him early in the season.

Hewitson wasn't afforded many opportunities after that and has been forced to battle on a host of long-shots, finishing his contract with three wins, nine seconds and 11 thirds from 251 rides and a tick over HK\$7.3 million in prize money.

A ROYAL WIN

SHS Princess Charlene Of Monaco celebrated her first winner as an owner when Bella Rosa won over 1450m at the Vaal on Tuesday.

Bella Rosa, sporting Princess Charlene's black-red-and-white silks with the Monaco Coat Of Arms, had five lengths to find with 200m to run and looked unlikely to get close, but she suddenly took off under Diego De Gouveia, swooped on the leader and won going away.

Tabnews report that trainer Stuart Pettigrew, a shrewd and under-rated horseman who fully deserves to have his name connected to a patron of this ilk, was understandably delighted with the feat.

Pettigrew commented: "It's just fantastic to have Princess Charlene in the yard, I am privileged and honoured. She's one of the most down-to-earth people I've met. Last year, at the time when Turffontein staged the Princess Charlene Maidens, she came to Randjesfontein with a helicopter and visited us at the stables."

Bella Rosa, by Count Du Bois from a well-related mare by Black Minaloushe, was a R200 000 purchase at the 2018 CTS Cape Premier Yearling Sale. Bred at Klawervlei, she has a good female line and half her purchase price is recovered after six runs.

South Africa's only brother-sister training partnership of Barbara Kennedy & Wayne Badenhorst saddled their second winner at Hollywoodbets Scottsville on Sunday when the Elusive Fort gelding Frankie Two Shoes escaped the maiden ranks.

The in-form apprentice Jason Gates, who also received his white blazer on the day for riding his 60th winner, was aboard the 12-1 shot who kept on powerfully to win by 3 lengths from Red Hot Night and the fancied 18-10 favourite James Peter, who was ridden by the winning trainer's husband, Warren Kennedy in third.

Gates, who rode a smart double at the Vaal on Thursday, appears to have matured after bumping his head a few times along the way – being labelled 'lazy' by a trainer and also running into

a measure of trouble with the Stipes.

The interestingly named Frankie Two Shoes, who was in command for a long way, was winning at his 17th starts and had previously accumulated 7 places for R99 000 in earnings.

Former Dean Kannemeyer assistant Barbara Badenhorst's Mom Janet owns the Limpo Trading-bred gelding.

It was the family partnership's second winner from 14 runners runners this season.

Hawwaam Is Home

The Mike de Kock yard have revealed Hawwaam was sent back to Randjesfontein after the Sun Met and has stayed in work.

David Thisleton writes that Hawwaam's ultimate goal is an overseas campaign but it was decided by the connections that rather than subject him to a long an arduous journey straight after his Met run they would wait until after the EU Audit on African Horse Sickness, which is due to take place this year, to see whether there would then become the advantage of a shorter route in the foreseeable future.

Hawwaam has been entered in the Grade 1 Premier's Champions Challenge, which he won with consummate ease last year, and his route into that race will either be through the Gr1 HF Oppenheimer Horse Chestnut Stakes or a Pinnacle Stakes event.

Industry Reacts To Welfare Concerns

Bloodstock SA CEO Michael Holmes confirmed to the Sporting Post on Tuesday that a minimum first bid of R10 000 had been introduced at sales with immediate effect.

The National Horseracing Authority announced on Monday that an NHA official, accompanied by a representative from the Highveld Horse Care Unit, visited an Mpumalanga farm on Thursday and returned on Saturday with the support of the South African Police Services, armed with a Court Order to confiscate fifteen thoroughbred horses from the farm in question.

The horses were transported to the Highveld Horse Care Unit, where six had to be euthanased due to their extremely poor condition. BSA CEO Michael Holmes also said that they were working closely with the Highveld Horse Care Unit to ensure that the surviving horses are homed and cared for.

It is commendable that the NHA took decisive and prompt action. The sad thing is that the damage was already done and that anybody could technically walk into a sales venue with an ID and qualify to become a bidder.

The Sporting Post has been contacted by various owners and breeders, who have expressed their sadness and disgust with the actions of the individuals involved. Criminal charges may follow, according to the NHA.

The buyer of the horses from an earlier sale, whose name is known to the Sporting Post, is apparently not licenced with the NHA and is alleged to have misrepresented certain facts. It is not known what the intention was with the purchased horses.

It is not a regulatory requirement that buyers at any thoroughbred auctions require to be registered with any industry regulatory body. The sales company has not done anything wrong.

The question of liability and blame is obviously an emotional one. The introduction of the minimum bid can certainly go some way towards the curtailment prospects of cheap multiple purchases, which can be a warning signal that the purpose of purchase may not fall within the general sport or recreational spectrum which vendors would find acceptable.

“If a person that is not registered within racing structures wishes to buy, they should at least produce an accreditation and certification that they are, let’s say, a member of a polo club, for example. We will never fully curtail potential abuse, but we need to implement restrictions and controls,” suggested one distraught owner.

The issue of welfare is one of the leading challenges facing horseracing in the 21st century and was discussed at the recent Asian Racing Conference as the morally correct course of action in a world where social norms demand that everything be done within the reasonable bounds of control to ensure optimal protection for horses.

The Thoroughbred Breeders Association, in conjunction with other trade organisations, has recently announced a new initiative, with the establishment of an independent working group, to provide sustainable recommendations for equine welfare.

No Whips In League Racing

Senior jockeys will be banned from using the whip for encouragement for the first time in British racing when a £1.8m series of races based on a league format launches later this year.

The Racing League, the brainchild of Jeremy Wray, a former chairman of Swindon Town FC, will unfold across six evening meetings this summer, each of which will have six handicaps with a prize fund of £50,000 per race.

While details of the participants, human and equine, have yet to be confirmed, 12 teams, each consisting of between two and four trainers, three jockeys and 30 horses, will field a runner in each of the 36 races, with league points awarded according to their finishing positions.

All of the meetings – at Doncaster, Lingfield, Newcastle and Windsor – will be televised by Sky Sports Racing, and jockeys will wear team colours rather than the silks of the horse’s owner.

The team with the most points at the end of the competition will earn a bonus prize shared between the team members, stable staff and a team ambassador who will be “picked at random from the public at the start of the competition”.

The Racing League’s decision to ban the use of the whip for anything but “safety and correction purposes” could prove controversial, not least as the British Horseracing Authority has only recently launched a consultation on use of the whip following a recommendation from the independent Horse Welfare Board.

It also remains to be seen how punters and racegoers will react to top jockeys riding a finish with only hands and heels, as is the case in a limited number of contests for apprentice and conditional riders.

“I’m conscious that at the moment, the whip is again a centre of attention,” Wray said, “but my understanding of the welfare report that came out [last week] is that what we’re doing is probably in line with future thinking of what they need to look at. If the Racing League provides 36 races of data for people to analyse, that can only help, surely.”

Under the BHA’s rules for hands and heels races, riders who mistakenly use their whip for encouragement face a fine or suspension but their mounts are not disqualified for betting purposes. The same rules are expected to apply for Racing League events.

The full list of Racing League fixtures will be confirmed within the next few weeks, and the inaugural meeting will be held on 16 July.

The Summerveld Sizzler!

Garth Puller

Pragmatic is Garth Puller's middle name. The man who has achieved multiple accolades over his half century in the game was the proud inaugural winner of the Hollywoodbets Sizzling Summer Challenge after the final racemeeting in the novel series at Hollywoodbets Greyville on a wet last Friday evening.

The R750 000 competition was run over three months and gave trainers, jockeys and owners the opportunity to earn points for every KZN racecourse appearance. The top six in each individual category were rewarded with a certificate and cheque from R100 000 to the first finisher, up to R10 000 to sixth placer.

Garth told the Sporting Post on Monday that the energy and initiatives introduced into KZN racing by Gold Circle and the Hollywoodbets team was something that the entire industry nationally should embrace and take serious note of.

"Sometimes when we are doing the same things over and over in the same situation, we fail to see the opportunities that minor changes and doing things slightly differently may bring about. The energy and passion that Hollywoodbets brings to the KZN racing table is there for all to see. The root problems of racing still need to be addressed obviously, but when there is a vibe and a tangible enthusiasm and genuine will to improve the show for all stakeholders, that is contagious and it will snowball and raise spirits," he said, as he spoke of the thrill and needle that the Sizzling Summer Challenge had injected.

How does one invigorate and excite a man who reached the pinnacle multiple times during his decades in the saddle, rode 7

winners on a sunny Kenilworth afternoon 40 years ago, and has won most of the Gr1 trophies in South Africa?

"Just goes to show. Create a competitive platform, offer an incentive, involve the public and keep it alive and buzzing on social media. I don't believe there is a trainer in this province that didn't buy in and say let's give it a go. I haven't seen the stats or turnover figures, but I am sure that field sizes were bolstered and I know interest was created from the chirps and feedback on course. Human nature is just like that – we respond to challenges instinctively. And ultimately, everybody wins- from Hollywoodbets to Gold Circle and KZN racing."

Asked if his victory was a plan come together and whether he had adopted a strategy, Garth modestly admitted that he had maintained a 'business as usual' approach in the early stages.

"Look, my yard was probably perfectly suited to making a big bid in this competition. I have 90 horses but don't quite have the feature firepower to match the big guns in the SA Champions Season. So for now, my focus is on the quieter local season months and I was leading the KZN Championship when the competition started on 1 December."

Interestingly, Garth is still at the top of the regional log in terms of both winners and stakes – his 36 winners and 103 placed horses having earned stakes of R3 276 375 prior to Wednesday's Hollywoodbets Greyville meeting.

He added that the Sizzling Summer competition format was positive in that it allowed the smaller yards to also target the owner/horse category.

Garth noted that the table-topping horses like Bint El Malak, Jeydan's Shreya and Explosive Beauty had run 6 or 7 times each.

"I have a 3yo, Twice Golden, who I hold in high regard. He won 3 races from his 4 starts in the competition period. But here's an example where I wouldn't have risked overracing a younger promising 3yo in order to leverage the log standings. His future is more important than the short term gains. But the sound older horses can race regularly, and well done to Paul Lafferty and his team, and owner Brian Riley for Bint El Malak's achievement in winning the owner/ horse category. Warren Kennedy is also riding so well and certainly deserves the championship title this season."

Garth said there were suggestions late in the competition to move some of the polytrack racing to the turf.

"If anybody wondered if people weren't taking the incentive seriously, then think again! I personally argued against the idea of switching surfaces as it would effectively have been moving the goalposts after the game had started," he added.

Garth won his last ever race as a jockey on 27 December 2005 and also his first that he saddled as a trainer when Foreign Gal scored at Clairwood under Anton Marcus on 1 August 2012.

He started out with one horse and has built his string to 90. We asked him what he felt about Summerveld and what the secret to his growth and success was in an industry where many trainers were under serious pressure.

"Look it's very hard work as a start. I don't play golf or enjoy much relaxation. I get to the yard before 04h00 and I leave after 18h30 in the dark. I am hands-on and involved. I'm probably a bad delegator in the managerial sense but have a great team of personnel and support players. Michael Clarke and Samantha Swanepoel are my assistants, Eric and Bishop my Head Grooms, Gareth Howells is our farrier, Mem Bosma and Annie Palmer our physio's. Cathy Steele is my rock-solid PA in Cape Town, and my fiancé is Wendy Heyns. Everybody plays their key role in a team effort," he reflected.

Garth says that when he leaves in the evening, he knows what's happening with every single horse. "And I'm from the coast, so Clairwood will always be my favourite. But Summerveld is world-class and we are lucky to have the facility."

On his 90-strong string, Garth feels that he probably owns 'too many shares' himself.

"But I am fortunate to enjoy some great support from a diversity of owners. David Ferraris also uses us, since his Dad Ormond called it a day, to introduce his Hong Kong-destined purchases to racing. Which adds a nice dimension to the daily challenges of running a successful team. As I have said before, I'd love to have a few Group competitive horses for the champions season."

Garth, a recipient of the Anita Akal trophy at the 2018 KZN Racing Awards, where his name was inscribed alongside famous contributors to the sport like Felix Coetzee, Chris Saunders, Roy and Gladys Meaker

and Des Scott, said that Hollywoodbets also played a key role in supporting and sponsoring trainers. And he was one of those fortunate enough to race under the purple and yellow flag.

"It's no secret that the costs of training – like living- have soared in recent years. So any support is gratefully received. Owen Heffer and his team are different class and racing must keep them involved."

And was he taking Wendy on an overseas trip with the R100 000 cheque to celebrate the big win?

"You're joking. I'd love to. But In this game, the money goes out the back door quicker than it comes in the front door! It's spent on horses already. So while we are proud to have won the inaugural Sizzling Summer Challenge and hope it becomes an institution, we won't be splashing out this year. Good luck to the players in the Sizzling Punter's Challenge. That's going to stimulate plenty of interest during March, I believe!"

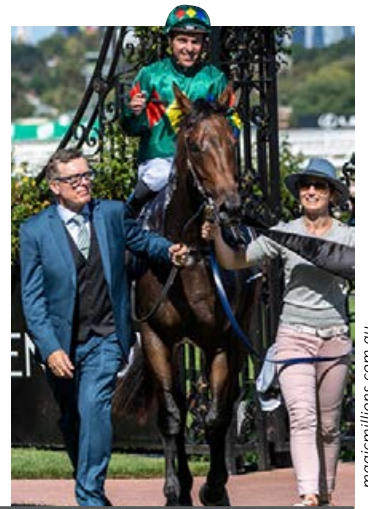
Lisa's History

Their representative for the feature £625,000 Magners Cheltenham Gold Cup will be Lostintranslation, who earlier in the campaign recorded a decisive success in the Gr1 Betfair Chase at Haydock Park in November but has not been seen out since pulling up in the Gr1 Ladbrokes King George VI Chase at Kempton Park on Boxing Day. The Cheltenham Gold Cup went to team Tizzard in 2018 with Native River, who is currently on the sidelines with a tendon injury.

Bint Banks The Bucks

Summerveld trainer Paul Lafferty was thrilled his charge Bint El Malak could win the lucrative Hollywoodbets Sizzling Summer Horse challenge for stalwart owner Brian Riley.

David Thiselton writes on www.goldcircle.co.za that Riley also owns the third-placed horse Explosive Beauty in partnership with Sherwin Jerrier.

Lafferty said, "Brian and Sherwin are two of the gentlemen of the game, every stable would like to have people of this ilk in their yard."

Lafferty said that once Bint El Malak, a four-year-old Kings Chapel filly, had gathered 14 points with a win on the first day of the challenge, which stretched out over three months from December 1 to February 29, it was decided to try and win it.

That first win was in a qualified maiden in her 13th start, but nevertheless she started out her handicapping career in fine style with two seconds, a win, a third and a sixth. This increased her tally to 75 points and she finished eight clear of Wendy Whitehead's Jayden's Shreya.

Lafferty said, "I didn't think she would improve that much, but she did and is still in fine shape so will probably be out again soon."

The competition came at the right time for the yard because in about October last year they had finally overcome a persistent virus which had blighted them for about a year.

The yard then hit form and Lafferty finished second in the Sizzling Summer Trainer's competition.

He said, "Garth Puller was too strong but I think we had the highest percentage if I'm not mistaken. Well done to the Puller yard. Alyson Wright in third place also pressed hard and won a number of races for their clients, who have got to be happy."

Lafferty praised Hollywoodbet for the initiative in providing this excellent incentive.

Lafferty and team are determined the yard will never be affected so badly by a virus again and have taken extreme precautions. He said, "We check bloods everyday and it was a very tough time, the blood pictures were shocking. But the horses have come well and now we take many measures, including spraying the boxes with viruscides and administering herpes injections every three months."

The Magic Mares

When Golden Ducat (Philanthropist) captured the recent Gr1 ARF Commemorative Cape Derby, he became the third G1 winner, from as many runners, for his Gr3 Prix Du Cap winning dam Halfway To Heaven, following Rainbow Bridge (Ideal World) and Hawwaam (Silvano).

South Africa's Broodmare Of The Year for 2018-2019, the Jet Master sired Halfway To Heaven thus joins a list of some of history's greatest broodmares in producing three Gr1 winners. Since 1940, eight mares in South Africa have produced three Gr1 winners, with this list including, in more recent times, the likes of Teclafields (Northfields) and First Lisa (Double First).

The former is dam of African Lion (Champions Cup), Circle Of Life (Garden Province Stakes) and Zebra Crossing (J&B Met), while First Lisa's trio of Gr1 winners including full-siblings Divine Fashion (Garden Province Stakes) and Counter Action (Champion Stakes, Queen's Plate), as well as Gr1 Paddock Stakes winner Perfect Order (Elliodor).

Internationally, there are a number of broodmares to have thrown three Gr1 winners since the pattern race system was first conceived in 1971.

Theatrical mare Green Room never raced but she has produced a trio of Gr1 winners in the form of Lord Shanakill (Prix Jean Prat), Together Forever (Fillies' Mile), and Forever Together (Investec Oaks), with Lord Shanakill a son of Speightstown, and Together Forever and Forever Together daughters of Galileo.

Legendary broodmare Fall Aspen (Pretense) is one of the greatest broodmares of the modern era. The Gr1 Matron Stakes winning mare left behind no fewer than four Gr1 winners (sired by four different stallions) – Fort Wood (Grand Prix de Paris, champion sire), Timber Country (Preakness Stakes), Hamas (July Cup), and Northern Aspen (Gamely Handicap).

The remarkable Fall Aspen, who produced a grand total of eight graded/group winners, continues to be a major force in pedigrees today, and her daughters have gone on to produce such notable Gr1 winners as Dubai Millennium (sire of outstanding sire, and promising sire of sires, Dubawi), Elnadim, Mehthaaf, and Medaaly.

Perhaps the most dominant mare in recent times has been the late, great Urban Sea (Miswaki), whose wins included an upset triumph in the 1993 Prix de l'Arc De Triomphe. The chestnut really made her mark at stud, however, with Urban Sea's four individual Gr1 winners headed by Epsom Derby winning half-brothers and outstanding stallions Galileo and Sea The Stars, both of whom have sired classic winners. Also dam of the Gr1 winners Black Sam Bellamy (a full-brother to Galileo) and My Typhoon (Diana Stakes) and four other stakes winners, Urban Sea's daughters are also now making their mark, with Urban Sea the granddam of Gr1 winners Athena and Bracelet.

Inbreeding to Urban Sea has already proved successful, with this pattern producing, among others, Investec Derby winner Masar. In contrast to Fall Aspen and Urban Sea, a stakes winner at both two and three, the remarkable New Zealand based Eight Carat (Pieces Of Eight) failed to trouble the judge and failed to win in five starts. Lack of racing success, however, failed to prevent the mare (whose third dam was a full-sister to breed shaping sire Royal Charger) from becoming a magnificent broodmare.

Broodmare Of The Year in New Zealand on three occasions,

Eight Carat left behind five individual Gr1 winners in the form of Diamond Lover (Railway Stakes), Kaapstad (VRC Sires' Produce Stakes), Marquise (Captain Cook Stakes), Mouawad (Australian Guineas), and the champion Octagonal. Both Octagonal, whose progeny included champion racehorse and sire Lonhro, and Kaapstad went on to enjoy success at stud, while Eight Carat's broodmare daughters went on to form their own dynasties.

Among the notable female line descendants of Eight Carat are top sire Commands, and the Gr1 winners Danewin, Don Eduardo, Verry Elleegant (inbred to Eight Carat), Shooting To Win, Emerald Dream, Tristalove, Hiyaam, and De Beers.

In stark contrast, the unbeaten Personal Ensign (Private Account) was as good at stud as she was brilliant on the racetrack. Never beaten in 13 starts, and a remarkable winner of the 1988 Gr1 Breeders' Cup Distaff, Personal Ensign not only produced three Gr1 winners, Miner's Mark (Jockey Club Gold Cup), My Flag (Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies) and Traditionally (Oaklawn Handicap), but her daughter My Flag emulated Personal Ensign in becoming both a Breeders' Cup winner and the dam of a Breeders' Cup winner, with her daughter Storm Flag Flying landing the 2002 Gr1 Breeders' Cup Fillies Juvenile. Personal Ensign also ranks as the granddam of young Cape sire Fire Away (War Front) and the latter's Gr1 winning half-brother Mr Speaker (Pulpit).

The Gr1 winning Toussaud (El Gran Senor) was another top-class racemare, and she proved even more successful than Personal Ensign at stud. She produced four Gr1 winners (to four different stallions) in the form of Chester House (Mr Prospector), Empire Maker (Unbridled), Chiselling (Woodman) and Honest Lady (Seattle Slew).

Honest Lady is the dam of Gr1 Forego Stakes winner, and Gr1 sire First Defence (Unbridled's Song), Chester House sired Gr1 winners Divine Park and Ventura, while Empire Maker became a top stallion in his own right and is the grandsire of US Triple Crown winner, and prominent young stallion, American Pharoah (Pioneer of The Nile).

A stakes winning daughter of dual Derby winner Kahyasi, Hasili is one of the greatest mares of the modern era, with her sons and daughters faring well on both the track and at stud. Not only is she dam of five Gr1 winners (including two Breeders' Cup winners), she is also dam of champion sire, and top broodmare sire, Dansili.

Hasili also ranks as the granddam of successful South African sire Ideal World (Kingmambo), and is granddam of Gr1 winner Romantica, and group winners Mirage Dancer and Obligate..

Similar to Personal Ensign, Dahlia was a great champion, who went on to prove outstanding at stud. The daughter of Vaguely Noble made a mockery of the idea that tough racemares don't succeed at stud – with Dahlia's victories, from 46 starts, including major races in France, Ireland, Britain, Canada and the USA. Twice Horse Of The Year in Britain, Dahlia went on to produce four Gr1 winners in the form of Dahar, Dahlia's Dreamer, Rivlia, and Delegate, and she is granddam of St Leger winner, and Gr1 sire, Nedawi, and third dam of Gr1 Gold Cup victor Rite Of Passage (Giant's Causeway).

In more recent times, the Canny Lad sired Shantha's Choice produced three Gr1 winners in the form of Manhattan Rain, Platinum Scissors and Redoute's Choice, with the latter going on to become a multiple champion sire in Australia, whose progeny include Australia's multiple champion sire Snitzel. Manhattan Rain is the sire of Golden Slipper She Will Reign and former Met winner Whisky Baron.

BREEDING

Oratorio's Weekend Treble

Avontuur's triple Gr1 winning sire Oratorio had another good weekend, when the evergreen son of Danehill supplied a trio of South African winners.

The Gr1 Irish Champion Stakes winner had three winners in KwaZulu Natal this weekend, with Oratorio's first success coming courtesy of his three-year-old daughter Sacred Blues.

Trained by Garth Puller, the Terry Andrews bred Sacred Blues got off the mark when shedding her maiden over 1900m at Hollywoodbets Greyville on Friday night.

Out of the National Emblem mare Ladyisingtheblues, Sacred Blues had been second two starts previously.

Oratorio went on to enjoy a double at Hollywoodbets Scottsville on Sunday, with his Song Of The Forest and Chantyman landing races four and six respectively.

The Louis Goosen trained Song Of The Forest made it win number four, when the Oratorio filly stayed on under Billy Jacobson to score a short head win over 1400m, while her paternal half-brother Chantyman picked up his seventh win when defying 62kgs to win over 1000m on Sunday.

Bred by Avontuur in partnership with Zenzele Stud, Chantyman took his earnings to over R620 000 with his win on Sunday.

The Oratorio progeny have already banked more than R6.6 million this season, with his notable representatives including Gr2 New Turf Carriers Western Cape Stayers winner Snapscan, Gr2 New Turf Carriers Merchants winner Mardi Gras and the subsequently exported Racing Association Stakes winner/Gr1 Cape Guineas runner up Viva Rio.

All Paths Lead To...

Ridgemont Highlands Irish champion Pathfork, who is currently standing at Sandown Stud, had a notable double on Wednesday at Hollywoodbets Greyville.

Three-year-old Retail Therapy got off the mark, breaking her maiden when victorious by a short head over 1200m. Trained by Johan Janse Van Vuuren, the Dr Ian Heyns bred Retail Therapy had been fourth on her previous start and she has now won or placed in six of her nine starts.

Pathfork's second success came when his son Final Assembly powered home in the closing stages to land his second victory by just over three parts of a length.

Trained by Lezeanne Forbes, the gelded Final Assembly is out of the National Assembly mare Jungle Assembly, and is thus bred on the same Pathfork/National Assembly as multiple stakes winner Madame Speaker.

Winner of both the Gr1 boylesports.com Vincent O'Brien National Stakes and Gr2 Galileo European Breeders Fund Futurity Stakes in 2010, Pathfork is having a fine season this year, with his leading representatives including Gr3 Lebelo Sprint/Gr3 Tommy Hotspur winner Mr Flood, Gr3 London News Stakes heroine Jet Start and Model Man Mile victor Fools Gold. A half-brother to 2019 Gr1 Preakness Stakes winner War Of Will, Pathfork is currently responsible for 17 black type horses, including Gr1 Allan Robertson Championship winner Mighty High.

Glen opened his account with the strategically placed Var filly Point Of Sale for Drakenstein Stud in the R150 000 Listed Ibhayi Stakes.

Just a maiden winner before Friday, Point Of Sale carried a handy 51 kgs with Sandile Mbhele declaring a half over. Getting weight from the boys, she was cleverly ridden by Sandile Mbhele to take them on early and strode out smartly to beat fellow Capetonian Stopalltheclocks (7-2) by 1,75 lengths in a time of 84,82 secs. Topweight and local star Foreign Source (19-10) may have needed the run after a 15 week break and he ran on into third, a further 1,25 lengths back.

Bred and raced by Drakenstein Stud, Point Of Sale has won 2 races with 4 places from 8 places for stakes of R213 750. She is by champion Var (Forest Wildcat) and is the fourth foal of the four-time winning Casey Tibbs mare, Cash Register – an own sister to the Kotzen's 2009 Vodacom Durban July winner, Big City Life. Fresh off a feature success at Fairview on Friday, promising Sandile Mbhele rode a grandstand finish to win the R150 000 Listed Kenilworth Cup at a sun-drenched Kenilworth on Saturday on the 45-1 long-shot, Mercurana.

The half-brother to Candice Bass-Robinson's sensational 2017 Vodacom Durban July winner Marinaresco didn't boast the greatest of form coming into Saturday's 3200m feature. He was also in under sufferance off his 77 rating.

But he clearly stays all day and under a galloping weight assisted by a superbly judged finish, he scythed through a narrow gap down the centre and got the better of Snaith's free running Swift Surprise (11-4) to win by a neck in a time 213,43 secs. Strathdon (5-2) was always thereabouts and just failed to kick when it counted, finishing a half length back in third. Peter Wrensch would have been thrilled with his soldier Troop The Colour (25-1), who took off late in his inimitable late dash style to grab fourth, a further half length back in fourth.

The game pacesetter Dynasty's Blossom stopped late to finish just over two lengths off the winner.

Just under four lengths covered the field, with the mercurial past Cape Guineas winner Tap O'Noth finishing last under top weight.

Bred by Wilgerbosdrift & Mauritzfontein, Mercurana is a 4yo gelded son of Ideal World (Kingmambo) out of the twice winning Fort Wood mare, Fortuna.

A winner of 3 races with 2 places from 15 starts, Mercurana has banked R198 800. He cost R300 000 on the National Yearling Sale.

Kenilworth Cup (Listed) 3200m

Winner Mercurana was the 45/1 outsider of the eight horse party; raced in the rear; was at the back 2.5 lengths behind the leader at 200m; bumped twice 50m; ran on best late Runner-up Swift Surprise (best handicapped) raced 3rd; outrun late Third Strathdon raced 6th; ran on strongly
Time: By far the slowest of the three races around the turn comparatively, there was

no pace on at all early, and very tightly bunched 200m out, just 2,5 lengths covered all. As usual, a false run staying race, decided in a sprint home. We gave the fourth 72 which makes the winner (prev 73/67/75/73/72) 74, the runner-up (prev 87/84/80/82/93) 73 and the third (prev 95/103/88/96/101) 90

Mercurana's Big Jump

The NHA Handicappers have reported back on this past weekend's feature races.

Listed Kenilworth Cup (Handicap)

MERCURANA has seen his rating adjusted from 77 to 97 after his success in the Listed Kenilworth Cup (Handicap) over 3 200m on the Kenilworth summer course on Saturday. It must be borne in mind that MERCURANA was fully 18 pounds under sufferance as the race was benchmarked 93 MR = 52kg, and together with the minimum 2-pound increase which is mandatory for any win in a handicap, this equals the 20 point increase he received. That is to say, were the race to be run again MERCURANA would have to carry 53 kgs, or 1 kg (2 pounds) more than the 52 kgs he carried here.

The Handicappers took the view that third placed STRATHDON made for the best line horse and as such he remains unchanged on 109, however runner-up SWIFT SURPRISE (who was also under sufferance) was raised from 91 to 95. Fourth placed TROOP THE COLOUR was raised from 67 to 80. He in fact ran to 92 on literal numbers, but the handicappers were of the view that he was flattered by his margin of defeat in a race which was slowly run and as such he only received half of the achieved adjustment.

The only drop was for DYNASTY'S BLOSSOM, who goes from 108 to 106.

Listed Ibhayi Stakes

POINT OF SALE remains unchanged on a mark of 96 after she shouldered bottom weight to victory in the Ibhayi Stakes

for three-year-olds over 1400m on the Fairview turf course on Friday. Third placed FOREIGN SOURCE was used as the line horse and so remains unchanged on 107. Rating the race in this way in fact has POINT OF SALE running to 95, one pound below her rating.

The only horse to get a ratings increase was runner-up STOPALLTHECLOCKS, who goes up from 91 to 96, but there were drops for several runners. Fourth placed HOOVES OF TROY is down from 104 to 102, VIKING MOON drops from 105 to 103, and lastly BOLD STRIKE is down from 78 to 76.

Listed Lady's Pendant

ELUSIVE HEART was given a slight rating's increase from 105 to 106 after she captured the Lady's Pendant for fillies and mares over 1200m at Fairview on Friday. Third placed OUTLANDOS D'AMOUR was considered the best line horse to use in assessing this race and remains unchanged on 101 as a result, but runner-up VIA SEATTLE was raised from 98 to 105. Fourth placed VIVIR was the only other horse to receive a rating's increase and goes from 86 to 93.

Three horses were given a drop, with MISS SMARTY PANTS trimmed from 105 to 104 and CARLITA dropping to 100 from 102. The remaining drop was for WORLD RADAR, who goes from 105 to 101.

It is worth noting that on this occasion the veterinary surgeon reported her to be both not striding out and in season, however, the Handicappers considered that WORLD RADAR has lost a considerable amount of Weight For Age since she was awarded a 105 rating for her debut win and dropped her on that basis. It was also taken into account that WORLD RADAR did not run to her 105 rating when winning two subsequent races following her debut success, nonetheless she won both races very easily and didn't need to equal a mark of 105 to win. However, with the WFA loss since last July (when she received her 105 rating) it was felt that, all these considerations notwithstanding, a rating of 101 looks fairer at this juncture.
