

While stakes levels remains a major unresolved issue on the South African horseracing landscape, we are back into the big race swing in the Cape and Gauteng, with Saturday seeing double feature action at Durbanville and Turffontein.

The last two winners of the Gr3 Matchem Stakes have gone on to win the Met, while further back the honour roll boasts present day sires, and even an SA Horse Of The Year in Variety Club.

The Matchem, named in honour of the famous foundation stallion Matchem (1748 – 21 February 1781), was traditionally the starting gun of the Cape Summer Season, but with a shift in a cash-stressed marketing focus and an abbreviated programme, that doesn't apply today.

On Saturday the Durbanville co-feature is run for R125 000, twenty one years after it was won by Vaughan Marshall subsequent super sire Captain Al for a gross R100 000.

It was traditionally run at Kenilworth but was switched to Durbanville in 2010, and on the revamped surface, the draw is important, but slightly less so.



The earliest record of the Matchem Stakes dates back to 1958. It was then open to 2 and 3yo's and run on 19 April over 1400m at Kenilworth for a stake of £1250. The idea of running juveniles against 3yo's over 7 furlongs in April, at what was more or less weight for age terms, came in for a lot of stick though, with many feeling it was too much to ask of the youngsters.

However, on the day a total of 6 run-

ners faced the starter, including a pair of 2yo's (Kowloon and Avon) and four 3yo's. The 1958 running of the Matchem proved the quality and strength of the juvenile crop. Although the game filly Kowloon cantered to post as the favourite, she failed to show and it was left to Mr A Kruyer's colt Avon.

Ridden by M Strydom and carrying 7st 8lb, Avon brought the field into the straight and never looked like being headed, scoring by half a length from





the fast-finishing Southern Drawl (8st 13lb) who had been hampered when making his run.

Avon was a bay colt by Naval Prince out of Avonet and was bred by J.R.A. Bailey. He was owned and trained by Mr A Kruyer.

Fast forward to 2020 and Saturday's field of nine is headed by Snaith's former Equus Champion Sprinter Kasimir (like 2019 winner One World, a son of past winner Captain AI), who has his first run since staying on steadily in the Gr1 Mercury Sprint at Hollywoodbets Greyville. His Durbanville form is good.

Adam Marcus' Twist Of Fate has his first run as a gelding after his disappointing

(he was apparently haemoconcentrating) Durban July effort. He will be running fresh in view of the late end to the SA Champions Season on the East Coast.

A field of eleven fillies and mares line up in the Gr3 Diana Stakes on the same afternoon. The fairer sex event is run for R25 000 less than the males.

The field is loaded with class and includes Candice Bass-Robinson's Clouds Unfold, who returns from a suspension after having bled in the Gr1 Garden Province Stakes last time. She won her start over 1400m and from the 1 draw must be the horse to beat.

Cape Fillies Guineas winner Missisippi Burning enjoyed a promising SA Champions Season and after a short break, she is too good to leave out of calculations.

The 1400m specialist Pretty Young Thing ran a cracker in the Garden Province Stakes last time despite casting a shoe. She is very effective this trip and with Anton Marcus behind the controls, she must be in the mix.

Glen Kotzen has fitness on the side of his charge Third Runway, who won her last outing over the course and distance with ease. She loves this distance and has shown herself to be a dangerous forward galloping sort in the best of company.

The Merit Of It

The National Horseracing Authority have advised that Black Knap has had his merit rating raised from 94 to 98 after he won the Listed Settlers Trophy over 2000m at Durbanville on Saturday.

The Handicappers took into account that Black Knap carried half-a-kilo overweight when arriving at this vas-

sessment, which was reached using 4th placed Herodotus as the line horse. As such, he remains unchanged on 102.

Runner-up Bayberry goes up from 99 to 101, while 3rd finisher Silver De Lange (who was half-a-kilo under sufferance at the weights) was raised from 89 to 90.

There were no other increases, however, two horses received a ratings' drop.

Crome Yellow is down from 106 to 104, and Duchess Of Bourbon was cut from 95 to 92.



History-bidding Enable has come in to favourite with Hollywoodbets for Sunday's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, when she could make history by becoming the first to win the famous race three times. Tellytrack (Dstv 249) will broadcast both days of the meeting from ParisLongchamp.

A wholesale shake-up of the betting market took place on Monday as punters cottoned on to the likelihood of a soggy racing surface, which is not expected to suit the erstwhile favourite,

While a sound surface prevailed at Longchamp for trials day just a fortnight ago, subsequent rain, including 19mm from Sunday into Monday, has led to going described officially as very soft and further heavy rain is forecast for Friday.

The latest penetrometer reading for the Paris track is 4.0, close to the 4.1 on which last year's Arc was staged.

The testing conditions that day are thought to have contributed to Enable's defeat by Waldgeist, but punters have evidently decided she is more likely to relish the mud than Love.

Enterprising backers have been casting about for alternatives to the two who have dominated betting on the Arc for months.

Stradivarius, outpaced on good ground on trials day but an impressive Gold Cup winner on soft in the summer, crashed down to 7-1 after being twice those odds on Sunday, while In Swoop is a general 16-1 shot from 25-1.

Some riders do not yet know whether they can compete in France this weekend. Talks continue between the British Horseracing Authority and Public Health England, which could free jockeys from the need to self-isolate on their return, providing they follow a testing regime and adhere to separation protocols for the following week

Jockeys like Andrea Atzeni and Oisin Murphy might therefore be able to ride in France this weekend and still be able to take part in Future Champions Day the next Saturday. Conceivably, Atzeni could recover the mount on Stradivarius, for whom Olivier Peslier is currently booked. Murphy, meanwhile, might be offered an Arc mount by Aidan O'Brien.



While Hollywoodbets are offering full previews on their and betting facilities on the Arc, Phumelela's Robert Garner provided the Sporting Post Sprint with the provisional TAB pools for the Arc race meeting as follows:



SETTOTAKE ONTHE WORLD!



With their 'have horse will travel' approach to life and business, the Spies family have conquered all corners of South Africa and even North of the Limpopo from their Vaal base for the past 35 years. Now the time has come to spread their wings beyond Africa. The richly endowed Saudi Cup meeting at King Abdulaziz

Racetrack in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, is next on the radar.

Having turned 50 earlier this month, and with a sparkling silverware collection of Gr1 trophies, and even a Zimbabwe Champion Trainer trophy on the mantelpiece at his Vaal home, Hollywoodbets trainer Corne Spies is

ready for new challenges - and maybe even to conquer the world.

His recent Gr1 winning son of Oratorio, Van Halen, and the stable's rising star and Gr2 Golden Horseshoe winner Nourbese - Drakenstein stallion Futura's first stakes winner - have already transferred into quarantine in



Johannesburg, in preparation for an incredible journey via Mauritius and Europe into Saudi Arabia.

It is ironic that the time-tested Spies approach of sourcing the genuine value is being showcased to the world by the pair, who cost less than \$14 000 between them!

A dual Gr1 winner, Van Halen, was bought for a mere R100 000 at the 2017 Cape Premier Yearling Sale, while the exciting 3yo Nourbese was a R140 000 buy from the 2019 Emperors Palace National 2YO Sale.

While we are looking five months ahead, Van Halen could be a likely

candidate for the \$1,5 million Saudia Sprint, won earlier this year in a thriller by New York Central who pipped Matera Sky.

The Saudi authorities are keen to promote their sport and with the headline Saudi Cup stakes breakdown awarding \$10 million to the winning horse, \$3,5 million to the second and then generous bites all the way down to \$200 000 for tenth finisher, it's a raceday worth pursuing with even a half decent horse.

"It's a time consuming and costly exercise but they are both top horses and we'd like to take our chances. I have been an international trainer for some years, you know," laughs Corne in an obvious reference to his Zim championship crown.

But he frowns and on a serious note the Equine Sciences graduate talks about the current climate here, where he says he is extremely worried about the stakes situation.

"The stakes model versus the cost reality is out of sync. It's been on the decline for over a decade and now the bottom has fallen out of it. Stakes is a priority that needs to be remedied as soon as possible. Billionaires may be happy to race for rosettes. But the core middle class owner base at the base of the pyramid is diminishing fast. While nobody enters the sport with his eyes



open and genuinely expecting to get rich, when one sells racehorse ownership, the fun aspect has to be balanced with the bonus of a break even or a possible return. Right now, there is no light and I hope that the powers-that-be can do something soon. I don't have the answers, but our in-house marketing has never really worked for racing. We have left it to sponsors to do the work. We need to find professionals to do a professional job of marketing the sport. Once stakes are in order and remotely realistic again, I feel things can resume to something reasonable," he adds.

On his season plans, Corne says that he won't be heading to Cape Town for the summer season.

"We tried it over the last two years. We succeeded at the bottom end but our top horses didn't deliver. It's expensive to go and sets one back a bit. I also feel that the national 3yo programme needs to be looked at. The Gauteng Guineas is the start of the SA Triple Crown in early February. The Cape Derby is run three weeks later. With the overlap, there is little opportunity either way for the Cape guys to go for the Highveld features and vice versa."

For now, he steps the very smart 2019 Golden Slipper winner Cockney Pride out in the Gr2 Joburg Spring Challenge at Turffontein on Saturday. She hasn't run for nine months, since finishing downfield in the Cape Fillies Guineas last year.

"She is a really lovely filly and we are starting her on Saturday. She will need the run," he said.

He adds that we can also look out for his very smart sprinter Singforafa, as well as his Summer Cup entry Imperial Ruby.

"Imperial Ruby won the Gold Bowl as a 3yo. As a Silvano, he will only improve with age and will be better this term.

He has drawn poorly in the Summer Cup but it's nice to have a big race







runner, so we will monitor how the field evolves and make a decision later on about him."

The BSA National 2yo Sale catalogue is now online.

Corne says that they have been fortunate to have bought very well at this sale, but he is not sure yet to what extent his buying power will extend. He says that he never worries about looking at the catalogue too far in advance, as there is 'always quality'.

"Looking at the catalogue only really tells one which horses will go for money. With limited budgets, we prefer to go and do physical inspections without the pedigree page at the sale and pick from there. That way we can often buy reasonably priced horses with less fashionable pedigrees."

While he has rationalised his string down

to 100 horses, he notes that while many have suffered economically during 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, he also knew of people on the other side of the coin whose businesses had prospered.

"That's the nature of life. And there are always folk willing to take a chance in bad times. But we really absolutely need to sort the stakes situation out sooner rather than later. That will incentivise buyers again and put money back in breeders pockets - thus arresting the decline."

Corne points out that many people in racing know only racing. He doesn't have small children - Carmen is 18 and in matric, while 23 year old Xander is doing articles as a trainee attorney - but says that it is clear that many families depend on the sport.

"We need to make it work. MOD has the right values. We now need to get the right guys into the right positions and start taking much less out of the game than has been the case in recent years.

Looking after all our customers and making the right calls for racing will get the engines firing again." -

The controversial omission of the Equus Awards for Stayer of the Year is yet more proof that the staying horse is in decline in South Africa. Whilst there is no disputing the fact that our racing programme is very much geared towards speed, there must always be room for the staying stallion, for ultimately their loss will see a reduction in the gene pool of those horses generally considered responsible for soundness in the breed.

Over the past decade, breeders have looked to Silvano and Dynasty as the prime source of classic stamina. With the recent announcement of Silvano's retirement and the latter's passing last year, that leaves only a handful of proven staying stallions, a woeful state

of affairs considering that the country's most valuable and iconic races, the Gr1 Durban July, Met and Summer Cup are run over 2000m or beyond.

Classic horses are the meat and drink of Mauritzfontein Stud and history shows that its policy of standing high-class middle distance stallions such as Janus, Wilwyn, Free Ride and most recently Fort Wood, has brought with it great success.

Current resident stallion, the Kingmambo horse Ideal World, also fits that mould, his best runners excelling over ground.

Champion daughter Smart Call won the Gr1 Woolavington 2000 at three before scoring an epic victory in the 2016 Met, a feat repeated by paternal half-brother Rainbow Bridge in 2019.

Ideal World's classic winners include Gr1 SA Derby winner Samurai Warrior, Gr3 Track and Ball Derby hero Cape Speed and Track and Ball Oaks victress and Gold Cup second Zante. His marathon runners include Hermoso Mundo, who was named the country's Champion stayer of 2017 with his historical Gold Bowl/Vase/Cup treble and Kenilworth Cup winner Mercurana, while Shady World and Onesie both captured the country's longest race, the 3600m Port Elizabeth Gold Cup.

It's no secret that the progeny of Klawervlei Stud's Twice Over show their true colours over ground.

Best known as the sire of dual July





winner and Horse of the Year Do It Again, his tally of stakes winners also includes Gold Cup third Doublemint, who claimed both the Gr3 Chairman's Cup and Winter Derby.

Remarkably, daughters of Twice Over filled two of the three top spots in last season's Gr2 Track and Ball Oaks won by Moon In June, with third place going to Ballet Shoes, who had also finished third to Summer Pudding in the Gr2 SA Oaks.

Fort Wood's champion son Elusive Fort captured both the Gr1 SA Derby and Daily News 2000 and not surprisingly, he is passing on his class and stamina. Siren's Call captured two legs of the Triple Tiara including the Gr1 SA Fillies Classic, Secret Potion won the Gr2 SA Oaks while Out Of Your League emulated his sire in last season's Gr1 SA Derby.

Fort Ember won the Gr2 Gold Bracelet and was runner-up in the Gr1 Summer Cup, while Chitengo proved herself a stayer of note by winning the Aquanaut Handicap.

Wilgerbosdrift resident Flower Alley, the sire of a Kentucky Derby winner prior to his arrival in South Africa, is fast proving himself a fine source of middle-distance runners, his progeny improving as they mature. His first South African crop includes Oaks Trial victress Fayrooz, as well as Gr1 SA Fillies Classic runner-up Marygold, Gr2 SA Oaks second Pomander and East Cape Derby second Rock Aloe, while Bayberry, who chased home unbeaten Katak in the Gr3 Pocket Power Stakes over 2400m, was beaten a neck in last weekend's Listed Settlers Trophy.

The son of Distorted Humor already counts a potential classic contender in second-crop daughter Princess Calla, following her eye-catching third in the mile Gr1 Thekwini Stakes behind champion Anything Goes and War Of Athena.

Go Deputy is a prime example of a stallion who has received neither the

recognition, nor the support, he deserved.

A Gr1 turf winner over 2400m, he not only sired Triple Crown winner Abashiri, his record as a staying stallion is exemplary. Royal Badge and Current Event both claimed the Gr3 Cape Summer Stayers Handicap, Tambalang won the Aquanaut Handicap while Icy Trail took the Gr2 Premier Trophy and Arezzo the Settlers Trophy.

His daughters in particular excel over ground and include Gr2 Gold Bracelet

winner Flying Ice as well as the Queen Palm winners Deputy Ryder and Adobe Pink. Widow's Peak claimed the East Coast Oaks and ran second in the East Coast Derby while Gold Cup third Flichity By Farr was runner-up in the Gr2 SA Oaks and together with Flying

Clifton Stud's Mambo In Seattle too is an undervalued stallion despite his early achievements while based in the Western Cape.

Like Ideal World, he is a son of Kingmambo capable of siring classic performers, witness Majestic Mambo and Mambo Mime, both of whom placed in the Gr1 Daily News 2000, and fine stayers such as Fortune Fella (Gr3 Caradoc Gold Cup) and Smart Mart (Kenilworth Cup).



Darley's Dubai Millennium horse Dubawi has long been established as an outstanding sire.

Already the sire of 43 individual Gr1 winners, Dubawi produces top-class horses with monotonous regularity and is by some way the best thoroughbred stallion currently standing at stud in Britain.

This year alone, Dubawi has been represented by a slew of high-class gallopers notably Gr1 winners Ghayyaith, Lord North and Space Blues.

Dubawi is also now making his mark as a sire of sires, and looks poised to become an important sire of high-class stallions.

While subsequently exported to Japan, Dubawi's 2000 Guineas winning son Makfi is a proven source of G1 winners, with his five Gr1 winners to date headed by Gr1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains/G1 Prix de la Foret winner Make Believe. The latter has made a sensational start to his stud career with his first crop currently including this year's French Derby winner Mishriff and fellow group winners Rose Of Kildare and German champion Ocean Fantasy.

Makfi made news over the weekend with his son Attorney landing Saturday's Gr3 JRA Colin Stephen Quality Handicap at Rosehill.

The deceased Poet's Voice, whose third dam was a 3/4 sister to champion US sire Exclusive Native, also made his mark prior to his untimely death in 2018.

The Gr1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes winner is currently responsible for 21 stakes winners headed by the Gr1 winners Trap For Fools and Poet's Word.

Poet's Voice enjoyed notable success in Italy, where his progeny include the classic winners Poeta Diletta, Summer Festival, Sand Zabeel and Mi Raccomando.


Dubawi's Gr1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) winning son New Bay has also made a promising start to his stud career and he came up with his first group winner when his gelded two-year-old son New Mandate captured the Gr2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge Stakes on Saturday.

From the family of top sires Oasis Dream and Kingman, New Bay, whose daughter Saffron Beach won the first race at Newmarket on Saturday, looks poised for a successful career at stud.

However, Dubawi's most exciting sire son thus far is undoubtedly his 2000 Guineas/Lockinge Stakes winning son Night Of Thunder. His first Northern Hemisphere crop has already produced no fewer than eight group winners, headed by G2 Dante Stakes winner Thunderous, Italian classic winner Auyantepui, and Jersey Stakes hero Molatham.

In South Africa, Dubawi's Gr1 SA
Nursery/G2 Dingaans winning son
Willow Magic has made a promising
start to his stud career with Willow
Magic's early winners headed by
Saturday's debut winner Somasonic and
MK's Pride -a winner of two of just three

MJ OUT FOR 6 MONTHS

While his timing is lethal on the racetrack, Sun Met winning jockey MJ Byleveld has not had the same good fortune when it comes to injuries.

He was hospitalised early on Tuesday morning after falling heavily during trackwork at the Vaughan Marshall yard at Milnerton.

The Avontuur-sponsored rider told the Sporting Post Sprint from his hospital bed that he had suffered a fracture of the tibia and his ankle after his mount tragically suffered a heart attack.

MJ was awaiting the specialist, but sounded in groggy good spirits as he chatted to us and said that he had no idea how long he will be off.

He was set to undergo surgery this morning and is expected to be out of action for 4 to 6 months.

The dynamic rider has had no luck over the past few years, usually on the eve of the Cape Summer Season. That's poor timing as he is attached to a top-class yard!

It's a case of deja vu!

In 2019 he suffered a neck injury that kept him out for many months. "I'm devastated. I didn't need this kind of news on the eve of the Cape Summer Season," a visibly disappointed MJ Byleveld told the Sporting Post in September 2018 just prior to undergoing complex back surgery.

In August 2016 he had an operation to repair the right leg injury he suffered when he was kicked by Ready To Attack after the 2015 Langerman.

The aspect of the absence of medical care at trackwork has again been highlighted, with onlookers informing the Sporting Post that the injured jockey had to wait 'forever' and as long as forty minutes for medical help.

The racing industry surely owes our workriders better.

Beleagured and rudderless racing operator Phumelela continue to stumble from one management crisis to another. Latest is that the Vaal Racecourse was presented for racing in a less than satisfactory condition for Tuesday's meeting, with a track inspection undertaken by concerned jockeys and trainers delaying the first.

The sorry saga of the Vaal track management goes back years and once again we have stakeholders asking for a copy of the O'Connor Commission of Inquiry instituted in October 2018. Simply – we don't have a copy of the report and don't have anybody on record as having even seen it.

Then Phumelela CEO John Stuart appointed Andy O'Connor, a former chairman of the NHA, to lead a commission to review the track management systems for Phumelela after repeated track problems surfaced.

According to Stuart at the time, O'Connor's independence and integrity was above reproach, making him the perfect candidate to lead a team tasked with making recommendations to Phumelela.

Part of O'Connor's mandate was to investigate track management processes and the ways in which they could and should be improved, to draw up Standard Operational Procedures regarding the implementation of improved track management processes, and to ensure the alignment of the maintenance of training and racing tracks, with the feature race calendar at the various racing courses.

"How is it possible that we have the same problem every year? If I was in charge they would have fired me ages ago," Vaal-based Andrew Fortune told the Sporting Post Sprint.

In a reference to various patches covered with loose grass, Fortune said it was

common sense that loose grass would not simply grow without creating a divot and planting a root.

"I'm afraid it's another case of the wrong people in the wrong jobs. Why do we keep repeating the same old nonsense year in and year out?" he asked.

He said that the racemeeting proceeded, with jockeys, owners and trainers not wishing to participate, allowed to exercise their right of withdrawal and those jockeys riding having to take care to avoid the bad patches.

"Bills have to be paid. Everybody is under pressure. Some of us don't have a choice but to race. And then what about Thursday?" he asked saying that the image of the sport had once again suffered due to a lack of management.

There has been no official explanation or apology by the racing operator.

NHRA CHIEF; 'BREMNER YARD IN CLEAR'



With local tensions continuing to simmer just below the surface, Phumelela have failed to engage with the public and general stakeholders almost a fortnight after the Black Thursday incident at Fairview Racecourse that claimed the life of a racehorse and caused injuries to many others, as well as certain individuals.

Between 150 and 200 protesters stormed the Fairview training centre and broke the locks of the stables, freeing around 28 horses early on the morning of Thursday 17 September.

The National Horseracing Authority reacted quickly on news of the incident, diverting senior management to Fairview.

A meeting was convened by NHRA CEO Vee Moodley on the same afternoon, where local trainers indicated their willingness to go ahead with the scheduled racemeeting the following day.

All of the Yvette Bremner runners were withdrawn, and after a Friday morning information catch-up with participants, the racemeeting went ahead without incident.

The Yvette Bremner yard, which was the apparent target of the attack, was subsequently closed, with the trainer and her partner Hedley McGrath – a longstanding leading owner – indicating in mainstream media articles that they may be moving overseas.

Racing operator Phumelela issued a statement to a local horseracing media platform, Clocking The Gallop, on Sunday 20 September stating that they did not wish to engage in debate via the media on the unfortunate incident.

They said that their 'focus has been and will remain on ensuring the continuation of undisturbed racing at Fairview and the safety of spectators, personnel employed at the track and the horses'.

The Sporting Post has learnt that the EFF have since laid criminal charges and intend pursuing a civil action against Nitro Security, the company owned by a DA ward councillor, and who were contracted to guard the Bremner yard.

This follows allegations that a dismissed worker was shot in the leg with live ammunition. The worker was apparently hospitalised for several days.

Zukile Matshisi, 49, was allegedly among the protesters who released 28 racehorses from Bremner's yard at the racecourse.and was arrested on charges of public violence and malicious injury to property. The case was adjourned to October 26.

While there is clearly divided opinion in the inevitable blame game and finger pointing, the National Horseracing Authority appear to have actively played their role in terms of their sphere of control and responsibility in a highly charged and sensitive environment.

And the spotlight has once again shifted back to racing operator Phumelela, who run racing in the Eastern Cape and, very importantly, own the land on which the majority of the Grooms working at Fairview reside including the employee who was dismissed after having been found guilty of stabbing a horse in February.

The lack of control and the cocktail of proven incendiary influences in a generally peaceful community are what is alarming certain stakeholders, who have

expressed concern that the Fairview environment is a powder keg ready to explode at any time again – as nothing has effectively changed in terms of controls or policies post the 17 September incident.

The National Horseracing Authority have done their bit and their rules are clear:

Referring to compliance with legislation, rule 12.1 states that a trainer shall ensure that he complies with all legislative requirements and prescripts, and in particular the Basic Conditions of Employment Act, insofar as the employment of stable personnel is concerned.

Rule 12.2 vstates that a trainer found guilty by a competent body of non-compliance with the Labour requirements, may be required to re-apply for a trainer's licence and the non-compliance will be taken into account when such re-application is considered by the licensing board.

NHRA CEO Vee Moodley, the Sporting Post on Monday that he was satisfied that his team had performed their duties with diligence and due urgency and that they were acting within the parameters of their rules and regulations.

He confirmed that based on all evidence and known facts to date, that no licenced individual had warranted a charge in terms of any of the NHRA's rules.

He also said that the NHRA is satisfied that the Bremner yard had fulfilled their duties according to the abovementioned rules.

The NHRA chief said that he was unable to comment on any charges laid with the SAPS by any outside party.





What A Winter's second success at Durbanville came when his daughter Pippielangkous made most of the running to score a game, short-head win over 1000m. Bred by Mr Erhaadt Strooh, the mare has now won four times, with the speedy Pippielangkous having scored all four wins over 1000 metres.

Hong Kong racing moves from the regular Wednesday slot to Sha Tin tomorrow with the China National Day public holiday being celebrated throughout mainland China, Hong Kong, and Macau.

Champion trainer Ricky Yiu's stable stalwart Jolly Banner is looking to land

a third Gr3 win for his handler in the National Day Cup Handicap ahead of what is likely to be the classy veteran's sixth and final Hong Kong racing season.

"This will be one of his last few runs probably by the end of the year we will try and send him back to Australia - he's a nine-year-old, so we need to take it race-by-race," Yiu said.

The Lonhro gelding has been nothing short of consistent across his career with HK\$14.8 million to his name from 42 starts, featuring seven wins and 23 top three finishes, since his handler picked him out at the 2013 Australian Easter Yearling Sale for AU\$300,000 (approx. HK\$1.6 million).

"It was love at first sight!" Yiu said. "I rang up the client, who is the owner now, and straight away said we need to buy this horse – he'll do well, I like him a lot, he's a natural runner."

The 109-rater's last two wins have come at G3 level, firstly the 2019 Bauhinia Sprint Trophy Handicap (1000m) at 89/1 and latterly the Premier Cup Handicap (1400m) three starts ago in June, both times with Matthew Poon in the plate.

From three runs down the 1000m Sha Tin straight, the game galloper has finished no worse than fourth, with a second-place finish also to go with that stunning Bauhinia Sprint Trophy win, which came at his first try at the straight dash.

Both the gelding's Pattern race successes have come against small fields – five and four opponents – and tomorrow he faces six others, breaking from gate six with Poon again holding the reins.



Manchester United will look to take advantage of tired legs when they face a Tottenham side who have played three games in six days as they target their first home win of the season.



The Red Devils suffered a humiliating 3-1 home defeat to Crystal Palace in their opening fixture but managed to beat Brighton 3-2 at the Amex Stadium last weekend, but they were lucky to claim all three points as the Seagulls hit the woodwork five times and also scored their winning goal from the penalty spot, awarded on a VAR review after the final whistle had blown.

United's performances have been underwhelming and Solskjaer must ensure that his troops put on a much more convincing showing this time around and play with the swagger that characterised the late season sprint which sneaked them into the top four in the last campaign.

The Red Devils are unbeaten in their last three Premier League meetings with the north Londoners, winning twice with Rashford scoring in both of those wins. Look out for what price Hollywoodbets have him as an anytime scorer.

Majority of United fans have expressed their desire to see Donny van de Beek start ahead of Paul Pogba against Spurs on Sunday. The Dutchman is yet to start a league game for the Reds despite scoring against Palace after being summoned from the bench, while Pogba's performances in his first two outings have left a lot to be desired.

Tottenham

Two days after their unfortunate 1-1 home draw with Newcastle United, Spurs played Chelsea in the Carabao Cup before facing Maccabi Haifa two days later in the Europa League, leaving Mourinho's men with three days to prepare for Sunday's crunch clash with United

To make matters worse, Mourinho, who is already without Gareth Bale, won't have Heung-min Son available with the influential attacker facing a lengthy spell on the sidelines after suffering a hamstring injury against Newcastle.

Son's absence is a huge blow for Spurs as the 28-year-old had been in superb form, scoring four times during the 5-2 win at Southampton and started brightly against Newcastle, hitting the post twice before being forced off.

With Bale and Son unavailable and Dele Alli – who scored in December's 2-1 loss at Old Trafford – out of favour, Mourinho will rely on star striker Harry Kane to bag the goals and fire his side to victory.

The North London outfit have won one, drawn one and lost one from their opening three Premier League matches this season – already placing them under pressure to deliver better results.

Spurs face a couple of problems but after seeing Crystal Palace deservedly pick up maximum points at Old Trafford, coupled with United's unconvincing performance at Brighton, Mourinho's men will fancy their chances of victory.
