Paul Matchett's speedy Basadi Faith booked her Allan Robertson Championship berth at Scottsville later this month when she kept her perfect record intact when winning the R400 000 Gr2 SA Fillies Nursery at Turffontein on Saturday.

While she stepped up a notch on Champions Day and didn't have things as easy as she did in the Ruffian Stakes, the smart filly showed resolution and a dash too much speed when registering her biggest victory to date.

Devin Habib, who has been in the saddle at all her four victories, once again showed that he has plenty of ability and confidence when given the opportunities.

The young rider was unflustered in his handling of his favourite filly and produced a polished performance as Basadi Faith galloped on relentlessly to make it four wins from four starts, going on powerfully to beat the improved again Cavivar by 66,98 secs.

Another good winner bred by Favour Stud, Basadi Faith was the second leg of a weekend feature double for Varsfontein stallion Master Of My Fate.

A bargain R45 000 Cape April Yearling Sale graduate, the very smart 2yo took her earnings to R475 000 and looks to have a very bright future.

Anton Marcus rode the hardknocking Favour Stud-bred model of pure consistency, who ran on powerfully late from his pole position draw to dispose of National Park – the only horse ever to beat Hawwaam – by an unextended three quarters of a length in a time of 95,91 secs.

His sire's very first winner, stakes winner and graded stakes winner, Twist Of Fate has now registered three group race victories, and a meritorious runner-up claim in the Gr1 Cape Guineas.

Owned by the River Palace Syndicate, Twist Of Fate is out of the twice winning Counter Action mare, Crescent Lily, a winner of the Listed Breeders Guineas at Fairview.

A R20 000 buy off the CTS March Yearling Sale, Twist Of Fate has won 6 races with 6 places from 13 starts for stakes of R2 212 850.

It's Called Faith!

The standout eyecatching winner of the Turffontein bumper feature afternoon, the Favour Stud-bred Master Of My Fate filly Basadi Faith looks to have a bright future as she made it three wins on the trot with a runaway score in the R150 000 Listed Ruffian Stakes.

Trainer Paul Matchett, showjumping owner Juanita van der Merwe and jockey Devin Habib have some exciting times ahead judging from the manner of the emphatic victory of the well-related Basadi Faith, whose raw speed doused the hopes of the highly regarded favourite, Gin Fizz, — in the process the winner clocking a time almost a second faster than the boys under an unpressured ride!

The odds on Gin Fizz, a runaway winner by over 7 lengths on debut, started at red hot odds-on, but after playing up in the preliminaries, she was comprehensively walloped in the 1000m dash.

Basadi Faith and Gin Fizz paced it for much of the race, but when Devin Habib asked for an effort it was how far as the daughter of Master Of My Fate lengthened her stride to win by 4,50 lengths in a time of 57.91 secs.

Gin Fizz was outgunned in second, with Emerald Tiara a further 0,75 lengths away in third.

Bred by Favour Stud, Basadi Faith is a daughter of Master Of My Fate (Jet Master) out of the twice winning Captain Al mare, Coral Colour – she is closely related to star racers National Colour, Rafeef and Mustaaqeem.

A R45 000 CTS April Yearling Sale graduate, and subsequently sold for a higher price according to reports, the winner has won 3 from 3 for stakes of R225 000.

Tyrone Zackey is a master with the staying types that require patience and his daughter Nadine's astute eye found Gift For The Gap at the National Yearling Sale – a perfect fit for her Dad.

After Lumber Jackaroo had shown the way to Flash Burn and Nimcha early, the in-form Marco van Rensburg had Gift For The Gap nearer last after abandoning plans to place his mount.

"I set off trying to place him but they all went that fast I opted to drop him out. He settled well and we followed the favourite in the run for home," he said afterwards.

And after Hollywood's Seattle Force and the favourite Protea Paradise had looked dangerous, it was Gift For The Gap who came storming up the outside, hotly pursued by Sean Tarry's unbeaten Last Of The Legend.

In the run to the wire, the 15-1 Gift For The Gap finished the better and he beat Last Of The Legend comfortably by half a length in a time of 126.22 secs.

Master Magic caught the eye, making up lengths to be beaten under a length into third, with Seattle Force showing that he had benefitted from the change in scenery to be beaten just a length into fourth.

The favourite Protea Paradise flattered briefly but ran 7th, beaten 2,75 lengths and had no visible excuses.

A thrilled Tyrone Zackey said that from day one 'the winner had a mind of its own'.

He said that he realised that the 'Derby is hard'.

"But Marco van Rensburg rode a good race and we will take our chances – they only get one shot at the SA Derby," he quipped.

An Oldlands Stud-bred gelding out of the one-time winning Fort Wood mare Idler, Gift For The Gap has won 4 races with 4 places from 13 starts for stakes of R315 687.
