Return Flight stayed on relentlessly under a well judged ride to beat Insignis by 1,25 lengths in a time of 126,33 secs.

The champion duo of Sean Tarry and Piere Strydom, who have endured the inevitable ups and downs of a tough game, were victorious after the smashing R20 000 bargain buy Return Flight had slammed her rivals to win the R750 000 Wilgerbosdrift Gr2 SA Oaks.

With instructions to ride Return Flight economically in view of her stamina uncertainty, Piere Strydom found himself searching for plan B as he pinged the gates and found himself in front.

"She jumped well. I looked around. There was nobody there. I thought I would have to lead. But then Craig Zackey came around me on Seville Orange and I was happy to sit second. She followed the leader and when I asked her, it was race over. She is a lovely fillv!"

The Oaks was not run in a rush. Return Flight's winning time of 161,78 secs was over 2 secs slower than the SA Derby run a half hour later

The eventual favourite Blossom, ridden by replacement rider Luke Ferraris, would not have enjoyed the sedentary pace but came out of the pack to run second, ahead of the game Seville Orange.

Owner Chris van Niekerk said he felt a 'pang of guilt' every time reference was made to the R20 000 he paid for her at the CTS 2017 March Yearling Sale.

Return Flight was bred by Mike Sharkey and is out of the fourtime winner Heading Home (Special Preview).

She has won three Gr1's in her 5 wins with 4 places from 10 starts and took her career earnings to R1 898 475.

Bargain Buy's Gr1 Score

Anton Marcus took the R1 250 000 Wilgerbosdrift Gr1 SA Fillies Classic by the scruff of the neck at Turffontein on Saturday and went all the way on the 2017/18 Equus Champion 2yo Return Flight to deny Mike de Kock a hat-trick in the prestigious classic.

Marcus, a master of judging pace, played down his achievement, giving the filly all the credit and confirming that she was running on 'pure heart' in the final 150m.

With Warren Kennedy looking to capture the second leg of the SA Triple Tiara on Gauteng Fillies Guineas winner and favourite Nafaayes, the unknown of the extra 200m was always a question mark against a few of the runners.

Kennedy did nothing wrong as he had Nafaayes relaxed in fourth and five lengths off as Marcus took Return Flight out to lead and he controlled things from there all the way around.

With Nafaayes under a left handed whip and appearing to gain, Return Flight hung out under pressure which allowed Nafaayes to draw level at the 150m marker.

But it wasn't a prize Marcus was giving up too lightly, and he put his head down and gathered his mount in that familiar style. Return Flight never looked like getting beaten again and she rallied and held Nafaayes by 0,80 lengths in a time of 112.09 secs.

A daughter of past SA Triple Tiara winner Cherry On The Top, Blossom charged home from way back to grab third and signal her SA Oaks prospects.

Three Troikas winner Storm Destiny was also gaining late for fourth, and is another who looks to be competitive in the Oaks.

Return Flight, a daughter of last season's Champion freshman sire Pomodoro (Jet Master) won the Gr1 Thekwini Stakes on Super Saturday last term.

Money, Money, Money

The Riverton Stud bred Pomodoro colt Cirillo has proven a genuine moneyspinner for owner Chris van Niekerk. He took his earnings to over R4,3 million on Saturday – without having won a stakes feature in his 12 starts to date.

The stakes placed galloper was astutely dropped back in distance by trainer Sean Tarry after running a well beaten fourth in the Cape Guineas behind Soqrat at his last start. He had won the R2,5 million CTS Ready To Run Stakes in November at his penultimate start.

A popular Pick 6 banker, Anton Marcus had Cirillo in touch with the leaders in the R5 million CTS 1200 for much of the race as Temple Grafin and Celestial Storm showed the way.

At the 350m marker Marcus brought the consistent colt up the outside and he bounced away from his field with only Elusive Trader putting up any resistance.

At the line, Cirillo won under the hands by 3,50 lengths in a time of 71,02 secs.

Elusive Trader tried hard but had no answers, with Seventh Sea and Joburg visitor Palace Chapel rounding off the quartet.

In the big money sales race, another Joburg visitor in Joey Soma's Comaneci squeaked into fifth to bank the R200 000 final cheque.

The enigmatic Gr1 winner Van Halen disappointed again, finishing well downfield.

Trained by Sean Tarry for his leading owner Chris van Niekerk, the R300 000 Cape Premier Yearling Sale purchase has won 4 races with 6 places from 12 starts for stakes of R4 311 750.

Bred by Riverton Stud, Cirillo is by Pomodoro (Jet Master) – who won the July in the same silks – out of the Lake Coniston mare, Miss Wordsmith.

The 2012 Vodacom Durban July winner and South Africa's Champion First Crop Sire elect Pomodoro rounded off a cracking opening season when he sired his first Gr1 winner courtesy of the R20 000 purchase Return Flight, who spread-eagled her field to win the R750 000 Gr1 Thekwini Stakes at Greyville on Saturday.

Outgoing SA Champion trainer Sean Tarry, by his own admission having seen his team 'drop the ball' in the first half of the season, finished like an express train to bring the curtain down on our final major raceday.

Jumping from a good draw with Anton Marcus in the saddle, Return Flight had been earmarked as his likely 3rd career Gr1 winner for her original pilot, the bitterly disappointed and injured Lyle Hewitson, and enjoyed good betting support to start at 16-1.

Relaxed behind Mazari early on, Anton Marcus took Return Flight up the outside at the 350m marker and she came home strongly to beat the late finishing Joburg visitor Railtrip by 1,75 lengths in a time of 96,98 secs and give the new Highlands-Ridgemont rider his 101st Gr1 success.

Brand new trainer Chesney van Zyl saddled the runner-up, who got the better of his brother Gareth's runner Can You Feel It, who ran 2,25 lengths back in third.

A R20 000 CTS 2017 March Yearling Sale buy by Rainbow Beach Trading – she came up as the second lot on that sale – Return Flight was bred by Mike Sharkey and is by Pomodoro (Jet Master) out of the four-time winner Heading Home (Special Preview).

Return Flight has won 3 races with 2 places from 5 starts for stakes of R613 625.

Pomodoro, who ran in the same silks for the same trainer when winning the Vodacom Durban July at this track, will stand at Klawervlei for a fee of R12 000 (unchanged) in 2018.
