

Classic Marshall

Milnerton master trainer Vaughan Marshall registered his second success in the Gr3 Cape Classic in three renewals when the progressive Silvano colt Silver Operator scored a workmanlike victory in Saturday's 3yo male feature at Kenilworth.

On Saturday, Silver Operator's victory was greeted with almost subdued caution – Anton Marcus, who never goes over the top, suggesting his mount was 'staying on and would probably be effective over further'.

After thanking his top-class jockey, as well as absent owner Mario Ferreira and racing manager Des Gonsalves for the support, the astute Marshall was quick to point out that they had to start somewhere with Silver Operator and tempered enthusiastic post-race interviewer Fee Ramsden's praise with a 'let's not get ahead of ourselves.'

But that's in the natural disposition of professionals that have been there and got the t-shirt and Silver Operator certainly has the credentials of a sophomore headed towards bigger things.

Bounced into the lead at the 300m, Silver Operator (16-10) had to be kept to his task as Robert Khathi produced Captain Tatters (14-1) like a potential party spoiler to give the leader some cheek late in the race.

The son of champion sire Silvano dug deep and staved off the Snaith challenger to win by 0,40 lengths in a time of 86,69 secs.

Dean Kannemeyer's Guineas hope Seventh Gear took a while to find his stride but stayed on to be beaten a further 2,75 lengths back in third.

The Kotzen-Winnaar partnership, fresh off their big win at Fairview on Friday, maintained their presence and found the fourth cheque with the well-related Prince Of Persia(40-1).

The winner's trophy was handed over by Kenilworth Racing Chairman, Robert Bloomberg.

Silver Operator has now won 2 races with 2 places from 4 starts for stakes of R237 000.

He was purchased off the 2018 Cape Thoroughbred Sales April Yearling Sale for R700 000.

Class Counts

After days of rain, the winter sun brightly and with the going officially soft, the only doubts around the hottest favourite of the afternoon was her first try at the 1800m.

But, as observed by Drakenstein's Kevin Sommerville, the Silvano progeny mature with age and it was no sweat as Richard Fourie had the stocky bay relaxed at the back of the six horse field as Morne Winnaar tried to make every post a winning one on Glen Kotzen's Glamorous Life.

At the 350m Platinum Class (7-20) was sent for home and she lengthened her stride to come home powerfully and unchallenged down the centre to win going away by 2,50 lengths in a time of 117,75 secs.

Her stablemate Libra edged the gallant Glamorous Life out of second to make it an exacta for the high-riding Snaith team.

The winner looks to make a lovely broodmare and her first Gr3 success could mark her retirement – although that is not final.

Drakenstein's Kevin Sommerville said that the decision for his boss Gaynor Rupert was a 'nice problem to have'.

Platinum Class has won 7 races with 7 places from 19 starts for stakes of R662 000.

A R210 000 National Yearling Sale graduate, the winner, who races for Drakenstein Stud, was bred by Mauritzfontein and Wilgerbosdrift and is a daughter of champion sire Silvano (Lomitas) out of the four-time winner Express Queen (Jet Master).

A brave ride by Ridgemont Highlands-sponsored Greg Cheyne was the highlight of the R150 000 Listed Ladies Mile at Kenilworth on Saturday when the Silvano filly Platinum Class showed again that she loves the mile as she produced a sustained finish to win going away.

Greg Cheyne deserved all the credit for the victory on the Drakenstein owned 7-2 favourite.

Coming down the home straight, the gaps were not wide open and it took some courage by horse and rider to squeeze through a late gap on the rail that opened the door to a smart win.

Once into the clear, Platinum Class won full of running to score by a length in a time of 102,21 secs.

Shamrock Wind was always thereabouts and stayed on nicely for second, 0,30 lengths ahead of a flying Pearl Jam.

The winner's stablemate Dynamic Diana moved up menacingly in the straight but faded late to run fourth.

A R210 000 National Yearling Sale buy, the winner, who races for Drakenstein Stud, was bred by Mauritzfontein and Wilgerbosdrift and is a daughter of Silvano (Lomitas) out of the four-time winner Express Queen (Jet Master).

Hot Hawwaam!

The July is the planned next step for Mike de Kock's top-class 3yo Hawwaam after a workmanlike no-frills victory in Saturday's R2 million Gr1 Daily News 2000 at Greyville.

A 9,75 length aggregate winner of his last two Gr1 starts, Hawwaam went through the motions off a moderate early pace in the seven horse field at his KZN debut start.

Taking up the running at the top of the home run he stayed on, drifting from the outside to the inside of the track, and duly disposed of his anticipated major rival, the very accomplished Twist Of Fate, without raising too much of a fuss or a sweat.

Into the home run, Marcus flicked Hawwaam down the neck and he moved ahead.

Drifting towards the inside rail he kept on well and unpressured to hold off the attentions of Twist Of Fate by 1,60 lengths in a time of 123,30 secs. Silvano's Pride won the fillies equivalent in 122,30 secs.

A R1 million National Yearling Sale graduate, the half-brother to Sun Met winner Rainbow Bridge was bred by Mauritzfontein & Wilgerbosdrift, and is a son of multiple champion Silvano (Lomitas) out of the seven-time winner, Halfway To Heaven (Jet Master).

He took his win total to 6 from 7 starts with 1 place and stakes of R5 628 125. Hawwaam's connections also banked the BSA Added Value Bonus of R154 000.

Silvano's Ride

A brave and beautifully judged front-running ride by Richard Fourie stole the show in the Gr1 Woolavington 2000 at Greyville on Saturday when the Snaith's Silvano's Pride ran as straight as a dye to withstand a late threat from favourite Front And Centre.

Into the home straight, Silvano's Pride galloped powerfully as Front And Centre stormed out of the pack. The Brett Crawford lugged in badly from the outside to the inside – stopping the slightly one-paced Return Flight in her tracks – and in the process costing herself plenty of valuable ground.

On the flipside, Silvano's Pride went straight and she duly won by 0,30 lengths in a faster time than Hawwaam – 122,30 secs.

Having her first run for the De Kock yard, Blossom ran on best of the rest a further 2,25 lengths away with Seville Orange finishing best of the Drakenstein quartet in fourth.

Return Flight (3,85 lengths) and Santa Clara (7,10 lengths) were disappointing.

Bred and raced by Anthony Peter, Silvano's Pride is bred on the same cross as Hawwaam – being a daughter of champion sire Silvano (Lomitas) out of the four-time winning Jet Master mare, Mary's Pride.

She went through the ring at the Cape Premier Yearling Sale in 2017 but was wisely bought back for R100 000 by her breeder.

She has won 3 races with 5 places from 9 starts for stakes of R992 375.

Mike de Kock's star 3yo Hawwaam put the cherry on top of a R7,2 million Pick 6 prize at Turffontein on Saturday when he streaked clear to an impressive victory in the R4 million Gr1 Premiers Champions Challenge.

Hawwaam, who started a red hot odds-on order, was always in a good position and he won his biggest prize to date amid roars of approval from the festive Champions Day crowd.

Hawwaam and stable companion Soqrat, who ran a fast finishing fourth in Friday evening's KRA Guineas, will be entered for the Gr1 Rising Sun Gold Challenge, the Gr1 Champions Cup and the Gr1 Daily News.

Hawwaam won unextended by 4 lengths in a time of 124,13 secs.

The good mare Cascapedia tried her heart out in second, with the vastly improved Divine Odyssey a further quarter length back in third.

The 2016 champion Legal Eagle made up lengths from last to stay on into fourth.

Completing a nice hat-trick of features after the Sun Chariot and Caradoc Gold Cup, Sunshine Silk has relished the step up in ground and showed resolve and courage when pegging back the perpetual motion machine Dromedaris late in the 3200m contest.

Gavin Lerena knows her well and timed the effort to perfection as Sunshine Silk beat the year older gelding by a convincing half length in a time of 215,44 secs.

Sunshine Silk was bred by Gold Star Stud from champion Silvano (Lomitas) out of the Al Mafti mare, Vanilla Silk. She was purchased for R475 000 at the National Yearling Sale and took her stakes total to R926 200 with her sixth win and 12 places from 21 starts.

Bred on the same Silvano/Al Mufti cross as Gr1 winners Al Sahem, Bold Silvano and Kings Gambit, Sunshine Silk is an exciting player in our thin staying ranks

Gold For Snaith

Justin Snaith opened his 2019 SA Champion Season feature account on testing underfoot conditions at Scottsville on Sunday as Gr2 winner and Vodacom Durban July entry Miyabi Gold won the R150 000 Listed The Scarlet Lady with authority.

The jockeys decided to stay off the decimated going against the running rail and it was replacement rider Serino Moodley who belted off as if he had a bus to catch on the Hills' grey Kilmokea.

The daughter of Kildonan was many lengths in front but started buckling at the 350.

Richard Fourie had been biding his time on Miyabi Gld in fourth position and the daughter of Silvano picked it up and stretched clear to beat Sabina's Dynasty by a length in a time of 108,30 secs.

It was a good effort by the top two given their ring rustiness – Miyabi Gold had not run since Met Day, while Sabina's Dynasty, who races under a restructured owner partnership, had last seen action in the 2018 Summer Cup.

Justin Snaith, who had won with the promising 2yo debutante Miss Florida in the same silks earlier in the day, had expressed some confidence about the 7-2 favourite and pointed out her excellent Gr1 Majorca Stakes effort. He said that he was thrilled that Miyabi Gold had gotten this victory under the belt in the testing conditions.

A daughter of champion sire Silvano (Lomitas), Miyabi Gold is out of the four-time winner Mkushi Gold (Western Winter) and is thus a half sister to 2015 Consolation July winner Ultimate Dollar (Jet Master) who also ran in the familiar Jonsson silks out of the Snaith stable.

Miyabi Gold has won 4 races with 2 places from 10 starts and stakes of R563 750.

Classic Hawwaam!

The highly anticipated return clash of the PE-based Gauteng Guineas winner National Park and boom Mike de Kock colt Hawwaam failed to materialise when the latter stormed to a runaway victory in the R2 million Gr1 SA Classic at Turffontein on Saturday.

Always highly regarded after winning his first three races on the trot, and then running on too late when outgunned by National Park in the Gauteng Guineas last time, Hawwaam came back firing on all cylinders on Saturday with a victory that had pure class written all over it.

With Richard Fourie implementing a brave new tactical approach by dropping National Park out to track Hawwaam early, it was the longshot Approach Control who ensured a decent gallop from Alyaasaat and Roll Of Drums, with Zillzaal and Barahin further back.

As Approach Control came up for air at the 400m, Hawwaam and National Park launched a pincer type move – both powering home from either side of the track.

At the 200m it was race over though as National Park appeared to falter and Hawwaam in full flight.

The dashing son of Silvano kept on strongly to put 5,75 lengths between himself and stablemate Barahin who cruised past National Park to bank second. The winner's time was 109.35 secs.

The PE raider looked dangerous momentarily but was well beaten by 7,25 lengths and his brilliance may not extend beyond the mile – and he has had a tough campaign, punctuated by plenty of time on the road between his home base and Johannesburg.

Hawwaam has now grossed R1 978 125 with his 4th win and 1 place from 5 starts. He also banked the R154 000 BSA Added Value Stakes incentive.

Take On The World

Mike de Kock's Silvano colt Hawwaam staked his Cape Guineas claims in just over 97 seconds at Turffontein on Saturday when he charged clear to maintain his unbeaten record with an eye-catching victory in the R500 000 Gr2 Dingaans.

Jumping from a wide draw, the winner of South Africa's historic first 'no crop' race on Charity Mile day was last turning for home, and had the best part of ten lengths to make up at the 500m marker.

But after the KZN raider Thanksgiving had hit the front at the 350m looking very dangerous, Gavin Lerena unleashed Hawwaam and the son of Silvano simply lengthened his stride impressively to make up lengths to win going away and full of running by 3,40 lengths in a time of 97,63 secs.

It was a nice effort from the Duncan Howells-trained Thanksgiving who had run a half length second to Stream Ahead in the Listed KZN Guineas Trial at his last start.

Green Haze showed his Graham Beck Stakes run to be all wrong and turned the tables on National Park – finishing a further 1,80 lengths back in third.

The fancied Graham Beck stakes winner National Park tried to go all the way, but came under early pressure in the home straight and hung on for a modest 7,40 length fourth. He seems much better than this.

KZN challenger White Lightning was pulled up and finished an official 32,25 lengths off the winner. The stipes report may tell us more.

Bred by Wilgerbosdrift and Mauritzfontein, Hawwaam was a R1 million National Yearling Sale graduate for Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum.

A son of multiple champion sire Silvano (Lomitas), he is a half-brother to Cape-based unbeaten Ideal World stakes winner Rainbow Bridge.

These two extremely smart males are out of the very versatile seven-time winner Halfway To Heaven (Jet Master), whose successes included the 2013 Gr3 Prix Du Cap. She was trained initially by Eric Sands and after changing hands, by Mike de Kock, during her racing career.

Halfway To Heaven is out of Pas De Basque, a somewhat light on pedigree Rambo Dancer mare that stood at Ingrid Klug's Wynnholme Stud until her passing from a heart issue two years ago – she left behind a filly by Duke Of Marmalade.

A Second Chance

Withdrawn on the eve of the 2017 Vodacom Durban July, Justin Snaith's Silvano gelding Elusive Silva showed that horseracing can sometimes deliver second chances.

The big chestnut bounded home relatively unfancied to win the R500 000 Gr2 WSB 1900 at Greyville on Saturday and set himself up for a run on 7 July.

The shock scratching of Glen Kotzen 3yo Pack Leader threw the WSB 1900 even wider open and with a preferential July consideration ticket up for grabs, there was plenty to play for, with ten of the twelve runners being entries for the R4,25 million spectacular.

From the worst of the draw, Bernard Fayd'herbe – who was also aboard Star Express – had Elusive Silva settled at the rear as Kampala Campari led Crowd Pleaser and Strathdon in the run for home.

Avoiding traffic, Bernard Fayd'herbe took Elusive Silva from the rail and switched him to the centre of the straight for his run.

With his long stride carrying him past the leaders, Elusive Silva had the race under control at the 200m and ran on powerfully to beat the consistent Dark Moon Rising by a half length in a time of 116,34 secs.

The top four are all July hopefuls and did their big race prospects no harm.

The 5yo was off the track for seven months after sustaining that July-bid ending injury in June last year. He was prepped in the Peninsula but the Sun Met may have come tooo quickly after that.

This was his second run after running a decent fifth behind Head Honcho in the Sledgehammer on 22 April.

A dual Gr3 winner previously, this was a career peak win and he took his tally to six victories with 3 places from 16 starts and stakes of R896 750.

He said that, given the highs and lows experienced by many horses during their careers, it was good to see Star Express back where she should be.

The Avontuur –sponsored Callan Murray said that he had worked Star Express a week earlier and that she had felt good – but that he still couldn’t believe how strongly she galloped to the line.

“I knew she was fit and well and initially I got trapped deep. I must say I had no intention of being so far forward in terms of my riding instructions. But that’s the way the race unfolded and she really ran on so well,” said the talented young jockey.

The surprise for many of us watching from the sidelines was that when Star Express moved forward so early in the straight, that little, if anything, ran on to challenge her.

She beat the revitalised Premier Dance by 1,25 lengths in a time of 113,49 secs.

A R160 000 2014 BSA National 2yo Sale purchase by John Freeman, Star Express has undergone a few restructures in the partnership that owns her but has proven a gem with some black-type to boost her R644 250 stakes kitty.

Star Express has won 5 races with 6 places from 17 starts and can boost her paddock value further when she lines up in the Paddock Stakes next month.

Bred by Dr Ian Heyns, Star Express is a daughter of champion Silvano (Lomitas) out of the three-time winner Majestic Star (Doowaley). The latter is a half sister to Star Of Liberty – dam of champion sprinter, Bull Valley (Toreador). This is the same family as the well performed, and currently for sale, Tara Laing galloper, Star Burst Galaxy (Var).

The winner has a half-sister called Stellar Motion (#63) from the first crop of Champion Sprinter Captain Of All on the Cape Premier Yearling Sale next month.

The smart stayer Strathdon – a half brother to Cape Guineas winner Tap O’Noth – registered a hat-trick of wins when scoring a career peak success in the R250 000 Gr3 Cape Summer Stayers Handicap at Kenilworth on Saturday.

On a red-letter day for the Foster family, who have been supporters of SA racing for 40 years, their Gr1 Cape Guineas success with Tap O’Noth was rounded off in scintillating style by the year older Strathdon, who confirmed that he is well on track for a shot at the Gr2 Western Cape Stayers on Sun Met day.

After Red Peril had filled his customary pacemaking role for much of the 2500m journey, Strathdon moved in menacingly down the inside at the 300m under Grant van Niekerk and drew level with I Travel Light and Our Emperor.

With Our Emperor shifting in on to I Travel Light under pressure, Strathdon stayed out of trouble and ran on strongly at 11-10 to win by a length in a time of 156,27 secs.

I Travel Light would have been a welcome birthday winner for visiting German jockey Martin Seidl, who is yet to open his account.

Our Emperor maintained his consistent form in third, with the rest in a different race.

Bred by Alec Foster, Strathdon is a son of champion sire Silvano (Lomitas) out of the one-time winner Wintersweet (Western Winter).

He has won 6 races with 3 places from 13 starts for stakes of R509 200.

Sweet Summer Girl

The Silvano mare Girl On The Run booked her Sansui Summer Cup berth with a thrilling hard-fought victory in the Gr3 Victory Moon Stakes at Turffontein on Thursday evening.

The traditional Summer Cup last chance saloon lived up to its billing and the outcome may have influenced some decisions – both for punters and trainers, with Girl On The Run and Coral Fever putting up their big-race hands with a forward showing.

The 1800m contest hosted twelve runners, with the likes of Abashiri and Orchid Island using the race to build fitness in advance of the Gauteng flagship on 25 November.

Gavin Lerena, who wasted down to a commendable 54,5kgs, had Fort Ember out front for most of the trip but the daughter of Elusive Fort was closely watched by Donovan Mansour on Girl On The Run all the way around.

With Muzi Yeni riding a fast gaining Coral Fever for all he was worth all the way up the home straight, Mansour brought Girl On The Run to lead at the 200m – and despite Jubilee Handicap winner Coral Fever appearing to have superior momentum, Girl On The Run came right back at the Robbie Sage galloper to get the nod on the photo-finish by a short head.

The winner's time was 111.38 secs and ended a frustrating run of narrow defeats for the Johan Janse van Vuuren team.

Master Switch stayed on well for third, with Orchid Island (Delpech declared a half kilo over) obviously needing the outing after a 22 week break to run fourth. She should strip fit for the Summer Cup.

The Maine Chance Farms-bred 4yo Girl On The Run is a daughter of champion Silvano (Lomitas) and is out of the unraced Girl From Granada (Badger Land).

This was her second stakes success after winning the 2016 Gr3 Yellowwood Handicap.

She has won 6 races with 8 places from 15 starts and stakes of R860 625.

On The Double

After his catch-me-if-you-can performance on Snowdance in the Western Cape Fillies Championship at Kenilworth just 24 hours earlier, Bernard Fayd'herbe showed his fine judgement – coincidentally from a carded 17 draw again – on the talented Nebula.

Fayd'herbe had found the near-rail position on Nebula after just 200m as the 2015 winner Stonehenge took up his customary forward role ahead of Master 'N Commander and True Master.

With the well-supported Ollivander (getting 7kgs from the winner) arriving too late, Nebula was always going too well and romped home to win by 2,25 lengths in a time of 121,30 secs – he clocked 123,23 secs under 7kgs more in 2016. This time smashed the course record set by In A Flash in November 2007.

Fayd'herbe gave his mount all the credit, saying that 'everything worked out well once we got on to the rail'.

Trainer Brett Crawford, who only saddled the one runner on the day, said that Nebula had enjoyed a good prep and that 'he likes to run fresh'.

Purchased by Tony Millard for R3,75 million at the 2014 Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale, the full-brother to 2013 Met winner Martial Eagle was bred by Wilgerbosdrift Stud and is by champion sire Silvano (Lomitas) out of the five-time winner, Seeking The Wind (Jallad).

The handsome Nebula races in the red and black of Hong Kong-based owner Edmund Siu and took his stakes earnings to R671 675, with 5 wins and 6 places from his 18 starts.
