A semblance of sanity was restored at Hollywoodbets Greyville on Saturday after a few tough results when the heavily supported Gr1 Gold Medallion winner Eden Roc won the R600 000 Gr2 Golden Horseshoe to maintain his unbeaten record.

Sean Tarry and Lyle Hewitson won the Gr3 Betting World 2200 earlier in the afternoon and the top stable was on the mark again with the heavily backed 7-10 favourite Eden Roc, who cruised up on the outside of his field amid roars from the enthusiastic crowd.

With regular pilot Hewitson riding with characteristic confidence and balance, the son of Var won impressively – albeit narrowly – as his stablemate Putontheredlight powered home under Gavin Lerena down the inside.At the line, the pressure was probably slightly deceptive, but the popular selection had won by 0,30 lengths in a time of 85,72 secs.

Vaal-based Ashley Fortune's Invidia stayed on best of the rest for third, a further 1,80 lengths back.

The Spies yard maintained their good form with 30-1 shot Loosen Your Tie, producing a sterling effort after his recent Scottsville maiden success to run fourth.

An elated Hewitson called Eden Roc a 'fantastic animal'."He has the demeanour and ability and showed again that he deserves to be contesting these races. I'm also very fortunate to be riding these top horses," he added.

A R340 000 National Yearling Sale purchase, the Varsfontein Sud-bred son of Var (Forest Wildcat) is out of the Captain Al mare, Townsend and races in the famous Chris van Niekerk silks.

Eden Roc is bred on the same Var/Captain Al cross as the graded stakes winners Ghaalla and William The Silent.

He took his earnings to R915 625 from his perfect three from three record.

After an unsuccessful objection in the earlier feature, Tarry and Hewitson bounced back like the professionals they are to seal the big win with the Varsfontein bred son of Var who races in the familiar blue and red Chis van Niekerk silks.

With Lyle Hewitson determined to get over the pain of his narrow miss, he had Eden Roc relaxed a few lengths off the gallop set by the filly Spring Break.

At the 200m Hewitson – riding his fourth Gr1 winner – made his move and Eden Roc grabbed a match winning lead to hold off the late rattle down the wide outside of favourite and SA Nursery winner Frosted Gold by 0,60 lengths in a time of 67,99 secs.

Mike de Kock and Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum celebrated a super feature double at Turffontein on Saturday with the National Yearling Sale recordbreaking Var filly Ghaalla setting up a Cape Fillies Guineas date when producing a late finish to win the R275 000 Gr3 Fillies Mile.

Neglected in the betting and jumping from a wide draw, the Var filly Ghaalla was some way off the gallop set by the Gr1 winning favourite Return Flight.

At the 400m Return Flight came under pressure and the longshot I like It made up ground doggedly down the rail with an upset on the cards. The daughter of Solskjaer ground away under Sherman Brown but Randall Simons had got Ghaalla interested and she started flying.

It was heads up and heads down at the line with Ghaalla getting the verdict by a short head in a time of 98,93 secs.

I Like It ran the race of her life – after winning an Assessment Plate at the Vaal last Tuesday!

The Starling Stakes winner Ronnie's Candy came flying up late for third.

Mike de Kock reported afterwards that he believes Ghaalla to be a Triple Tiara type filly.

Bought for R5 million by Form Bloodstock for Shadwell SA at the 2017 BSA National Yearling Sale, the price tag of the Varsfontein Stud bred Ghaalla surpassed the previous R4,75 million paid for Savannah Cat in 2015.

She has now won 2 races with 3 places from 7 starts for stakes of R388 213.

The Varsfontein bred daughter of Var (Forest Wildcat) is out of the winning Captain Al mare Fidelity, a three parts sister to Gr3 East Cape Derby winner Captain Splendid and a half-sister to Gr2 winning sire Master Of My Fate, and the four time stakes winner Justthewayyouare.

Her second dam is Equus Champion Promisefrommyheart, whose six career wins included successes in the Gr1 Triple Tiara 1600 and Gr1 SA Fillies Guineas.

Winner Ghaalla (3rd best handicapped) was drawn wide; raced 6th; led 100m; an enquiry is to be held into jockey Simons' use of the crop in the concluding stages

Runner-up I Like It was slow into stride; raced 5th; led 250m; beaten a short head

Third Ronnie's Candy (best handicapped) raced 8th; ran on well **Time:** This race was delayed by an hour because of lightning. The pace was quite slow early, and in a time 1.3 seconds slower than the Dingaans the race developed into a sprint over the final 500m. A false run race then, and not a result to totally put faith in. The ratings are kept purposely conservative, and hard to arrive at.

The daughter of Gimmethegreenlight accelerated nicely but ruined her chances by hanging in badly and costing herself valuable ground. She had to be checked late as she found trouble where none really existed. It is possible that, even running dead straight, she would have lacked the toe to beat the Laing star.

At the line, the 4-1 Star Burst Galaxy was too strong and she clocked 69.77 secs for the 1200m to win easily by 1,75 lengths.

Beataboutthebush finished two lengths ahead of Starling Stakes winner Via Seattle, who ran a cracker after a 25 week rest.

Newly relocated from Gauteng, Secret Star stayed on well a further quarter length back in fourth.

Bred by Dr Ian Heyns, who has three horses carrying his flag in the Vodacom Durban July on Saturday week, Star Burst Galaxy is a daughter of Var (Forest Wildcat) out of the three-time winning Doowaley mare, Majestic Star.

Top Cape jockey Aldo Domeyer rode the first leg of a feature double as he and trainer Robbie Sage delivered a knockout blow in the Champions Day Pick 6 opener.

The Var colt William The Silent got the better of the more fancied Cirillo to win a prolonged duel and grab the silverware in the R1 million Gr2 SA Nursery.

William The Silent and the Sean Tarry-trained Cirillo were quickest out and they led the charge down the outside of the track.

At the 400m, Domeyer asked William The Silent for an effort and he started a gradual drift towards the inside, carrying Cirillo with him.

The two went hammer and tongs with Khumalo throwing the left—handed whip at his mount, but the 45-1 William The Silent always had his measure and went on to win by a short head in a time of 67.3 secs.

Chimichuri Run came out of the pack late to keep the 16-10 favourite Bold Eagle out of the top three.

Chesney van Zyl's unbeaten Bold Eagle never got into the race and may be looking for further.

The Drakenstein Stud-bred William The Silent is a son of Var (Forest Wildcat) out of the five-time winner Tick Tock (Captain Al).

A R600 000 National Yearling Sale purchase, William The Silent has won two of his three starts for stakes of R693 750.

His win here was a demonstration of just how the 2yo's improve. William The Silent had run 10 lengths behind Bold Eagle in the Storm Bird Stales last time out after winning well on debut.

Raiders Play Second Fiddle

The home team dominated the finish of Sunday's R250 000 Gr3 Poinsettia Stakes at Scottsville with Dennis Drier and Duncan Howells sending a message to the generally rampant Cape raiders that the SA Champions Season silverware won't be handed out without a fight.

Sean Veale may not be the neatest rider in town, but he is very effective and when he gets the chance he takes it with both hands.

He had the Maine Chance owned and bred galloper a few lengths off the first wave of early speed down the inside as stablemate Anime and Isingimoya led the charge.

At the 250m marker Veale switched and produced Sommerlied down the middle as Anton Marcus brought the year younger Neptune's Rain down the outside from miles back.

In a thrilling drive to the wire, Sommerlied got the verdict by a quarter length in a time of 67,49 secs.

Neptune's Rain – labelled a Gr1 filly by her trainer recently – continues to impress, while last year's winner The Secret Is Out also did her best work late to grab third, ahead of Anime.

Magical Wonderland finished in fifth and just over a length off. She will come on with this run under the belt.

Bred and raced by Maine Chance Farms, Sommerlied is by Var (Forest Wildcat) out of Sommermarchen (Pentire – Simply Red by Dashing Blade), who won at 1850m in Germany from two starts, and was retired injured. She is a half-sister to four stakes winners.

Sommerlied never runs a place but this was her biggest success to date. She has won 6 races from 9 starts for stakes of R525 625.

Undeterred by a powerful Cape challenge and the threat of ominous stormy weather conditions, Tara Laing had Star Burst Galaxy in fine fettle for her assault on the R150 000 Listed Lady's Pendant and the 4yo duly led all the way to score an easy win over the turf 1200m in a time of 69,87 secs.

Avontuur-sponsored Callan Murray has built up a good understanding with the flying filly and the young rider kept his mount well balanced all the way to the wire as Our Destiny challenged briefly. The winner had 2,25 lengths to spare at the post as she picked up a deserved black type credit.

Her form shows that she has only been out of the money once in a career that dates back to December 2015, when she made a winning debut as a 2yo for Mike Azzie at Turffontein.

Justin Snaith's Angel's Trumpet blew her chances when losing valuable ground at the jump.

Bred by Ian Heyns, Star Burst Galaxy is a daughter of Var (Forest Wildcat) out of the three-time winning Majestic Star (Doowaley).

She is a half-sister to Justin Snaith's promising 2017 Gr3 Victress Stakes winner, Star Express.

Originally purchased by Mayfair Speculators off the 2015 Emperors Palace Select Yearling Sale for R800 000, she changed hands recently following the unbundling of the SA champion owners. Star Burst Galaxy now races for Cape-based Etienne Braun and Paul Loomes, who resides in KZN.

Star Burst Galaxy has now won 7 races with 12 places from 20 starts for stakes of R577 050.

Richard Fourie is riding with almost nonchalant confidence at the moment and his powerful unflustered style suits a range of horses – and trainers it seems, with his five winners being provided by four different yards.

His ride on the long overdue Speedpoint for Joey Ramsden in the non black-type support feature at Kenilworth on Saturday was superb.

The Var colt, who has played the frustrating bridemaid and had only won once previously, was relaxed in midfield as What A Winner and Shufoog showed good toe early.

The latter, a flashy chestnut daughter of Star Witness, showed resolve under her handy galloping weight as she moved forward strongly down the rail in the final stages, but Fourie didn't even need his crop as he pushed Speedpoint to lead inside the distance.

The 33-10 Speedpoint charged home to register 58,71 secs for the 1000m and beat the gutsy Mike de Kock filly Shufoog by just over a half length.

Bred by Drakenstein Stud, the well named Speedpoint is a son of Var (Forest Wildcat) out of the ill-fated Durban July winner Big City Life's full-sister, Cash Register (Casey Tibbs). The latter, a dual stakes winner, won the Gr3 Final Fling Stakes at her peak when trained by Glen Kotzen.

A R700 000 buy from the 2016 Emperors Palace Select Yearling Sale, Speedpoint races for Brian and Kathy Finch and has won 2 races with 4 places from 8 starts for stakes of R240 725.

Winner Speedpoint (best handicapped) raced 4th; led 150m Runner-up Shufoog (2nd best handicapped) was slow into stride; raced sixth less than 2 lengths behind the winner; led 300m; headed 150m; kept on strongly

Third Al Mariachi raced alongside the winner in fourth; beaten a length **Time:** Although this was by far the fastest of the 4 x 1000m races, comparatively the time was not a particularly fast one.

A Summer Song

The KZN raiding team of Dennis Drier and Sean Veale broke their 2017 Cape summer season ice with an impressive victory by the exciting Var flyer Sommerlied in Saturday's R150 000 Listed Laisserfaire Stakes (F&M) over the Kenilworth 1100m straight.

With good wins over the seasoned male speed merchants Brutal Force and Sergeant Hardy — as well as the Scottsville 1000m record to her credit — it was surprising to see Sommerlied so easy to back at 7's. But to be fair, some may have noted that the sole blot on her copybook was an inexplicably poor run at Kenilworth on 10 December 2016, where she was examined by the Vet post race. She was notably rested seven months after that below par effort. So something went wrong.

The Drier summer string have also looked to be in need of a feet-finding first run and with whispers about the Crawford star Quick Brown Fox working up a storm, the Var flyer was allowed to drift.

But the enthusiastic Sean Veale had other plans for Sommerlied fans and he produced the Durban Dash winner late in proceedings to give the high-riding Maine Chance Farms team their second feature success in 72 hours, after Girl On The Run won the Gr3 Victory Moon Stakes at Turffontein on Thursday.

Under a confident ride by her regular pilot, Sommerlied swept through the middle to get the better of Casual Diamond by a long neck in a time of 64,98 secs.

Sommerlied has won 5 of her 6 starts for stakes of R369 375. Bred and raced by Maine Chance Farms, she is by champion Var (Forest Wildcat) out of Sommermarchen (Pentire – Simply Red by Dashing Blade), who won at 1850m in Germany from two starts, and was retired injured. She is a half-sister to four stakes winners.

Laisserfaire Stakes (F&M) (L) 1100m

Winner Sommerlied raced 2nd; ran on strongly to lead 60m Runner-up Casual Diamond raced fourth and held every chance; just beaten

Third Felicity Flyer raced in the rear 4 lengths off the pace early; ran on well: narrowly beaten

Time: One of just two races down the straight, the time was a good one. We gave the third (prev 71/72/67/74/84) 86 which makes the winner (prev 80/86/60/90/94) 101 and the runner-up (prev 73/79/81/87/91) 90
